Dear St. Cloud State Student,

Student Health Services is excited to welcome you to St. Cloud State University! All students have access to a medical clinic, pharmacy and physical therapy services, all located on campus. We are staffed with board-certified family practice physicians and nurse practitioners.

The pharmacy offers online prescription refills and low cost, non-prescription medications. Students can pick up prescriptions for themselves and their dependents conveniently on campus. The pharmacy is only able to honor prescriptions written in the United States. To continue the get refills of the medication, you can make an appointment with one of our medical providers.

As a new patient to our medical clinic, incoming students are encouraged to log-in to the online health information portal. Within the portal, you may enter your health history, schedule appointments, and read or send secure messages to your healthcare provider. This is also where you will view your immunizations and bills. Doing this prior to your first appointment saves time. Information to access the health information portal is below.

If you have any medical or mental health concerns to discuss with a healthcare provider, we encourage you to make an initial appointment as soon as you arrive. We will help determine if your health needs can be served at Student Health Services, or if you will need a referral to a specialist in the community.

Before you arrive:

- Complete [Student Immunization Form](http://www.stcloudstate.edu/healthservices/immunization.aspx) for MMR & Td (www.stcloudstate.edu/healthservices/immunization.aspx)
- Collect records of any past tuberculosis evaluation and treatment, chest x-ray results

When you arrive:

During your first week on campus, you will be required to come to Student Health Services for a tuberculosis screening.

- During this visit, you will be meeting with a healthcare provider to assess your risk for Tuberculosis (TB) and determine your need for TB testing. As part of this process, we will need to know if you have had a prior tuberculosis screening or treatment. Please bring any records related to TB testing or treatment (see above).
- If you have not completed the online Student Immunization Form already, we will review your immunization records during this meeting (see above).
