HUSKIES TAKE THREE OF FOUR IN IOWA:

The St. Cloud State Baseball Team had another solid weekend, as the Huskies split with Morningside and swept Briar Cliff Saturday and Sunday in Sioux City, Iowa.

SCSU was originally scheduled to play the University of Sioux Falls in Sioux Falls, S.D., but inclement weather and field conditions forced the rescheduling of the four games against the two Iowa clubs.

Game One

Tim Scott (Ely) threw a complete game, allowing one earned run and striking out six in a 3-1 loss to Morningside. The lone Husky run came via a Nate Hammes (Lake Elmo) home run in the seventh inning.

Game Two

Game two saw the Huskies ride a four-run fourth to lift Pat DeLaHunt (Apple Valley) to his first victory of the year in a 5-4 victory over Briar Cliff. Brandon Peyer (Reedsburg, Wis.) hit his first career home run and was the only Husky to have a multi-hit game on the day with a 2-3, two-RBI performance.

Game Three

The bats came alive as the Huskies rode a six-spot in the top of the first to beat Morningside 10-4. Chris Koenig (St. Cloud) picked up his fourth win of the season and Hammes started a fine day by going 3-3 with two RBI.

Game Four

Game four saw another 10-run effort by the SCSU offense as the Huskies cruised to a 10-2 victory over Briar Cliff. David Deminsky (Sartell) pitched a gem, allowing one earned run while striking out eight for his second victory of the season.

Hammes, Nate Johnson (Austin) and Mic Johnson (Fergus Falls) all had three hits while Hammes and Sam Radbil (Milwaukee, Wis.) added three RBIs apiece.

HUSKIES AT HOME IN THE DOME:

Three of SCSU's next four dates will take place in the cozy confines of the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome in

Minneapolis, where SCSU is 0-2 this season. The Huskies could get up to six games at the home of the Minnesota Twins and Vikings over the next two weeks, as their next game will feature Division I opponent North Dakota State this Saturday in the Twin Cities. Dates against Bemidji State and Wisconsin-Whitewater will follow on March 27 and 29 respectively.

HOME RUN CLUB: A pair of Huskies blasted their first career home runs this weekend in Sioux City. Redshirt freshman Brandon Peyer hit what was a game-deciding two-run home run against Briar Cliff on Saturday, while Sam Radbil had a three-run blast Sunday against the same BCU squad.

KOENIG NABS FOURTH VICTORY: Chris Koenig earned his fourth win of the season in Sunday's first game against Morningside. The win for Koenig matches last year's team leader in wins (Adam McGrane) who put up four throughout the course of the whole season.

STALEY THE STOPPER: Senior Mitchell Staley (Brooklyn, Wis.) has been an anchor at the back of the SCSU bullpen in 2008. Staley matched last year's team leader for saves (Adam McGrane) with his third over Briar Cliff on Saturday. Tim Radmacher (Rosemount) is right on his heels with two, as the pair have teamed up to be a solid right-left combo for SCSU.

HAMMES HAMMERS AWAY: Nate Hammes has been the catalyst for SCSU's offense of late. The sophomore has hits in six of his last seven games and is batting .478 (11-23) with a home run and seven RBIs.

Coach Dolan

Coach Pat Dolan officially began his tenure with SCSU on June 15th, 2007. He brings a wealth of baseball success. In Dolan's 16 years as a head coach his teams have captured an amazing 10 conference regular season championships. During this span he has compiled a 583-324 overall record with 301 wins in 11 years at the college level and 282 wins at the American Legion level. In his collegiate career, Dolan has made stops at Dakota

State, Belmont Abbey (N.C.), St. Andrew's (N.C.), and Itasca CC



Coach Pratt

Pratt will return to the SCSU dugout in 2007-08. A former standout player for the Huskies from 1985-88, Pratt owns six team pitching records and served as a captain for two seasons at SCSU. Pratt went on to serve for three seasons as the squads pitching coach from 1989-91. The Huskies won the 1989 conference championship and the 1991 NCC tournament title. SCSU also advanced to the NCAA tournament in 1991 with Pratt on staff.



Coach Picha

Longtime Central Minnesota prep baseball skipper Ken Picha will join the St. Cloud State University baseball staff as an assistant coach in 2007-08. Picha served as the head varsity baseball coach at nearby Melrose High School for 29 years (1979-2007) and compiled an impressive 427-181 career record. He ranks eighth on the all-time win list among Minnesota high school baseball coaches, and his .702 career winning percentage ranks sixth among Minnesota

high school coaches who have a minimum of 350 wins. His Melrose teams won 11 conference titles, seven district championships and his squads advanced to four state tournaments. His 1997 and 1998 teams finished second in the state baseball tournaments.

Brueske will serve as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU in 2007-08. Brueske graduated from North Dakota State University with a Bachelor's of Science in business administration in 2003. While there, Brueske was a four-year standout for the Bison baseball team. In 2001, Brueske led the North Central Conference in hitting with a .526 average. Also in 2001, he was named to the All-NCC second team, was 17th in the nation with a .787 slugging percentage and ranked 27th nationally with a .436 batting average. Brueske signed a professional contract with the River City Rascals of the Frontier League and currently ranks in the

RUNNIN' HUSKIES: The basepaths have been much more active this season for the Huskies, as SCSU has 26 stolen bases on the season, compared to 37 all of last year. Sam Radbil and Nate Johnson are tied for the team lead with five apiece.

BRUESKE THE BAT: Assistant coach Jason Brueske will be an assistant coach for the '08 St. Cloud River Bats. Brueske is in his second season with the SCSU club.

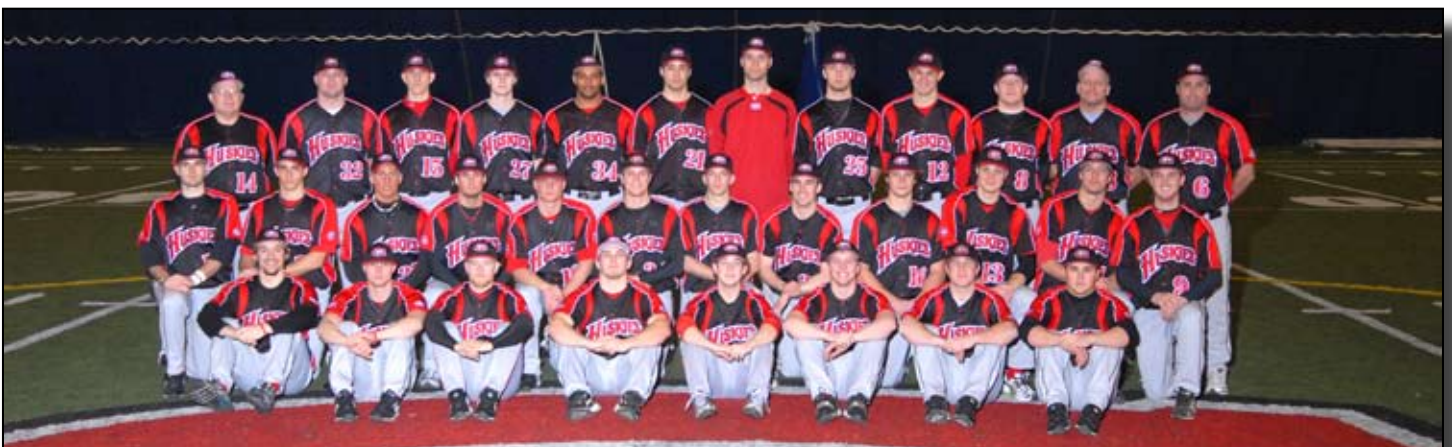
