HUSKIES REMAIN IN THIRD IN NCC; DROP THREE TOUGH GAMES TO MAVERICKS:

With only one game separating Minnesota State and the Huskies coming into this weekend's NCC series, the Mavericks distanced themselves from SCSU taking three of four games. The four games in the series were decided by a combined seven runs, with all but game three being decided by one run.

Game One:

Pitching was the story in the weekend's doubleheader, as David Deminsky (Sartell) took the tough-luck, complete game loss in game one on Friday. Deminsky faced just six over minimum, striking out six Mavericks. Ryan Sturm (Springfield) provided both RBI's in the 3-2 loss, scoring Mic Johnson (Fergus Falls) on a single in the first and a groundout in the fifth. The Huskies could not capitalize with runners on as they stranded nine in the game.

Game Two:

Chris Koenig (St. Cloud) and Matt Swanson (Upsala) combined to hold MSU to just five hits in the nightcap, but could not overcome seven more stranded runners by the Husky bats. Nate Johnson (Austin) drove in Cody Forrester (San Diego, Calif.) for the only Husky run in the seventh, but could not complete a late comeback, falling 2-1.

Game Three:

The Huskies fell behind 4-0 in the first but stormed back to tie things up via a Nate Johnson (Austin) three-run home run and a Nate Hammes (Lake Elmo) solo shot. The Mavs immediately put up four runs after the Huskies equalized and went on to a 10-6 victory. Kyle Resser (Bonney Lake, Wash.) was 2-4 and Sam Radbil was a perfect 2-2.

Game Four:

Pat DeLaHunt's (Apple Valley) strong outing allowed the Huskies to salvage one victory in the four-game set with Minnesota State. DeLaHunt went five-plus innings allowing just three earned runs. Tim Radmacher (Rosemount) picked up his fourth save of the season

throwing two innings of scoreless baseball. Resser and Sturm led the Huskies from the middle of the lineup as both went 2-4 with Sturm adding his third home run of the year.

Coach Dolan

Coach Pat Dolan officially began his tenure with SCSU on June 15th, 2007. He brings a wealth of baseball success. In Dolan's 16 years as a head coach his teams have captured an amazing 10 conference regular season championships. During this span he has compiled a 583-324 overall record with 301 wins in 11 years at the college level and 282 wins at the American Legion level. In his collegiate career, Dolan has made stops at Dakota

State, Belmont Abbey (N.C.), St. Andrew's (N.C.), and Itasca CC



Coach Pratt

Pratt will return to the SCSU dugout in 2007-08. A former standout player for the Huskies from 1985-88, Pratt owns six team pitching records and served as a captain for two seasons at SCSU. Pratt went on to serve for three seasons as the squads pitching coach from 1989-91. The Huskies won the 1989 conference championship and the 1991 NCC tournament title. SCSU also advanced to the NCAA tournament in 1991 with Pratt on staff.



Coach Picha

Longtime Central Minnesota prep baseball skipper Ken Picha will join the St. Cloud State University baseball staff as an assistant coach in 2007-08. Picha served as the head varsity baseball coach at nearby Melrose High School for 29 years (1979-2007) and compiled an impressive 427-181 career record. He ranks eighth on the all-time win list among Minnesota high school baseball coaches, and his .702 career winning percentage ranks sixth among Minnesota

high school coaches who have a minimum of 350 wins. His Melrose teams won 11 conference titles, seven district championships and his squads advanced to four state tournaments. His 1997 and 1998 teams finished second in the state baseball tournaments.

Brueske will serve as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU in 2007-08. Brueske graduated from North Dakota State University with a Bachelor's of Science in business administration in 2003. While there, Brueske was a four-year standout for the Bison baseball team. In 2001, Brueske led the North Central Conference in hitting with a .526 average. Also in 2001, he was named to the All-NCC second team, was 17th in the nation with a .787 slugging percentage and ranked 27th nationally with a .436 batting average. Brueske signed a professional contract with the River City Rascals of the Frontier League and currently ranks in the

top ten in multiple NDSU career and single-season records.

RESSER ON A TEAR: Kyle Resser is currently in the midst of a 14-game hitting streak, dating back to March 29. Over that span, Resser is hitting .469 (23-49) with two home runs and 13 RBI to go along with nine multi-hit games.

HUSKIES #6 IN CENTRAL: SCSU was ranked sixth in the first NCAA Central Region Poll. The top six teams in the poll at the end of the season qualify for post-season play.

AROUND THE NCC: Nebraska-Omaha inched away from Minnesota State, picking up a game in the standings by putting up 45 runs in four games to sweep Augustana this weekend. Duluth and North Dakota

got out of a tie in the cellar by splitting a doubleheader in Duluth and Grand Forks as the two teams combined for 78 runs in the two games.

The SCSU/Minnesota State series featured three, one-run games including 3-2 and 2-1 pitcher's duals on Friday and a 5-4 game won by the Huskies on Sunday.

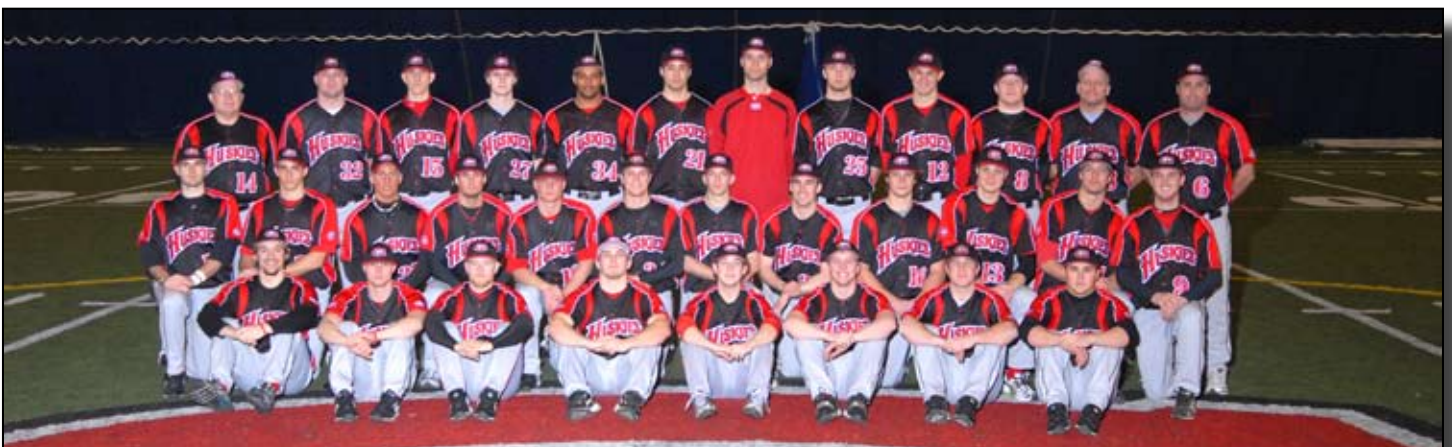
