### MAVERICKS BLOW OUT OF TOWN WITH FOUR GAME SWEEP OF HUSKIES:

With Minnesota State splitting with Minnesota Duluth this weekend, St. Cloud State had a golden opportunity to climb the ladder in the NCC standings. The Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks had other ideas. The #23/30 Mavericks swept SCSU Monday at Faber Field and Tuesday in Cold Spring to remain undefeated in the NCC.

#### Game One:

Starter Pat DeLaHunt (Apple Valley) mowed through the UNO lineup the first time through, but the Mavs made the necessary adjustments the second time around, putting up six runs in the third. The Mavs left no doubts after putting up another four runs in the fourth off reliever Graham Parson (Hibbing). The Huskies managed just three hits, striking out nine times on the afternoon in the 11-1 loss. The lone bright spot came in the form of reliever Jeff Althoff (Delano) who struck out four in three innings of relief.

#### Game Two:

The Mavs wasted no time jumping on David Deminsky (Sartell), scoring two runs in both the first and second innings. Kyle Resser (Bonney Lake, Wash.) picked up the only Husky RBI in the first, but that was all SCSU would muster off Dustin Koca, who struck out 14 Huskies in a complete game, 8-1 win.

#### Game Three:

With the Mavs down to their last strike, and the Huskies ahead 5-4, it looked as if SCSU would steal a game from UNO. But after a walk, an error and two singles, the Mavs came away with a 6-5 victory. After the teams traded four-spots in the first both starters settled down to put up zeros until the fifth when Resser blasted a solo home run to put the Huskies ahead. Chris Koenig (St. Cloud) recovered nicely on the mound after the first, allowing just four hits after the first inning. Tim Radmacher (Rosemount) did not allow an earned run, but took the tough-luck

loss for the Huskies.

#### Game Four:

The Huskies fell behind early once again in the series finale and could not recover as the Mavs took a 8-1 victory. SCSU was led by Nate Johnson (Austin) who went 2-3 and scored the lone run for SCSU. The Huskies could not get the big hit stranding 11 men on base, concluding a frustrating series in which they only recorded 16 hits and batted .165.

**RESSER KEEPS IT GOING:** One of the few bright spots on the weekend was Kyle Resser. The senior batted .500 (5-10) with two home runs and three RBIs. Resser slugged an astronomical 1.300 in the series and scored four of the eight Husky runs on the series. On top of all that, he extended his season-high hitting streak to 20 games, with at least one hit in each game.

#### HUSKIES READY FOR FINAL NCC TOURNAMENT:

St. Cloud State will play North Dakota this weekend before getting ready for the final NCC Baseball Tournament in the league's history. As of now the Huskies have a firm grasp on the third seed, with any combination of three Husky wins and UMD losses cementing that status. This year the tournament will take place in Omaha at the Ball Park at Boys Town.

**RECORD WATCH:** Tim Scott (Ely) and Chris Koenig both tied the SCSU single season record for games started against UNO. Both pitchers made their 11th start and should both break the record the weekend against UND... Mitchell Staley needs to make two appearances in the Huskies final games, as he sits one away from the single season appearances record which sits at 16... Kyle Resser needs two doubles to break the single season doubles mark (15) and sits 10 away from hits (69) and five from singles (44).

# 2008 COACHING STAFF



**Coach Dolan**

Coach Pat Dolan officially began his tenure with SCSU on June 15th, 2007. He brings a wealth of baseball success. In Dolan's 16 years as a head coach his teams have captured an amazing 10 conference regular season championships. During this span he has compiled a 583-324 overall record with 301 wins in 11 years at the college level and 282 wins at the American Legion level. In his collegiate career, Dolan has made stops at Dakota

State, Belmont Abbey (N.C.), St. Andrew's (N.C.), and Itasca CC



**Coach Pratt**

Pratt will return to the SCSU dugout in 2007-08. A former standout player for the Huskies from 1985-88, Pratt owns six team pitching records and served as a captain for two seasons at SCSU. Pratt went on to serve for three seasons as the squads pitching coach from 1989-91. The Huskies won the 1989 conference championship and the 1991 NCC tournament title. SCSU also advanced to the NCAA tournament in 1991 with Pratt on staff.



**Coach Picha**

Longtime Central Minnesota prep baseball skipper Ken Picha will join the St. Cloud State University baseball staff as an assistant coach in 2007-08. Picha served as the head varsity baseball coach at nearby Melrose High School for 29 years (1979-2007) and compiled an impressive 427-181 career record. He ranks eighth on the all-time win list among Minnesota high school baseball coaches, and his .702 career winning percentage ranks sixth among Minnesota

high school coaches who have a minimum of 350 wins. His Melrose teams won 11 conference titles, seven district championships and his squads advanced to four state tournaments. His 1997 and 1998 teams finished second in the state baseball tournaments.

Brueske will serve as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU in 2007-08. Brueske graduated from North Dakota State University

with a Bachelor's of Science in business administration in 2003. While there, Brueske was a four-year standout for the Bison baseball team. In 2001, Brueske led the North Central Conference in hitting with a .526 average. Also in 2001, he was named to the All-NCC second team, was 17th in the nation with a .787 slugging percentage and ranked 27th nationally with a .436 batting average. Brueske signed a professional contract with the River City Rascals of the Frontier League and currently ranks in the

top ten in multiple NDSU career and single-season records.

The only offensive category the Huskies can claim the top spot in is triples, as SCSU is tied with Omaha with 15 on the year. Nate Hammes (Lake Elmo) holds down second in the league with four triples on the season.

**FINDING THE ZONE:** As far as the NCC goes, the Huskies have been the best at pounding the strike zone, allowing the least walks of any team with just 107 (3.43 per game).

**AROUND THE NCC:** Nebraska-Omaha's sweep over the Huskies moved its magic number to clinch the North Central Conference

regular season title to one. UMD played Minnesota State tough last weekend, as the two teams' split both doubleheaders. Augustana climbed out of the NCC cellar by taking the last three games of the series after being shutout in game one.
