### HUSKIES USE LONG BALL TO TAKE THREE OF FOUR GAMES FROM NORTH DAKOTA:

St. Cloud State used 11 home runs, five of which came from Kyle Resser (Bonney Lake, Wash.) to take three of four games from North Dakota in Grand Forks this past weekend. 19 of the 33 Husky runs came via the long ball as Resser doubled his season total to 10. With the series victory the Huskies also ensured their first winning season since 2001.

#### Game One:

St. Cloud State used a five-run second and five late runs to pull away for a 10-4 victory in the series opener. Resser connected for two home runs, while Ryan Sturm (Springfield) and Sam Radbill (Milwaukee, Wis.) added long balls as well. Pat DeLaHunt (Apple Valley) won his fourth game while Matt Swanson (Upsala) picked up his first save.

#### Game Two:

The Huskies needed a four-run seventh inning to come from behind to sweep Friday's doubleheader with a 7-5 victory. Down by one run in the seventh, Mic Johnson (Fergus Falls) blasted a two-run shot to put the Huskies up for good. Radbill followed four batters later for another two-run shot to provide some insurance for SCSU. All the Husky runs were scored via the long ball as Resser and Cody Forrester (San Diego) both added home runs. Forrester's was the first of season. Tim Radmacher (Rosemount) notched his third win while Mitchell Staley (Brooklyn, Wis.) recorded his fourth save.

#### Game Three:

SCSU used a 16-hit barrage to take a 12-5 contest from UND on Saturday. After a shaky first, Chris Koenig (St. Cloud) settled down to allow just two runs on four hits over the last six innings for his fifth win and second complete game of the season. Resser and Johnson homered yet again while Forrester went 3-4 with a pair of runs and RBIs.

#### Game Four:

The Huskies had the comeback tables

turned on them as UND scored four in the bottom of the sixth for a 7-4 victory. A Nate Hammes (Lake Elmo) double in the first and Resser's fifth home run of the weekend in the fourth accounted for the Husky runs, while Tim Scott (Ely) took the loss.

### PAIRINGS SET FOR LAST NCC TOURNAMENT:

St. Cloud State earned the league's third seed heading into Thursday's NCC Tournament opener. The Huskies will face #6 North Dakota in a rematch of last weekend at Seymour Smith Field in Omaha. If they win, they will face #2 Minnesota State later that evening. The tournament's winner will receive an automatic bid to the Central Region Tournament.

**RESSER WATCH:** Coming up on what may be the final weekend of the season Kyle Resser is painfully close to numerous SCSU single season records. To top off his stellar season, Resser is currently on a 23-game hit streak.

### PITCHING RECORDS FALL AS WELL:

A couple of pitching records fell this weekend as well, as Mitchell Staley tied the single season appearances record with 17 on the season. Chris Koenig and Tim Scott both surpassed the games started mark of 11 with their 12 of the season. Koenig needs to pitch three and two-thirds innings more to break the innings pitched mark of 67. Both the games started and IP records were previously held by current pitching coach Pete Pratt. One career record that looks as if it will fall, is the opponents batting average, as Staley is currently first on the all-time list, holding other teams to a .270 average over his three years at SCSU.

# 2008 COACHING STAFF



**Coach Dolan**

Coach Pat Dolan officially began his tenure with SCSU on June 15th, 2007. He brings a wealth of baseball success. In Dolan's 16 years as a head coach his teams have captured an amazing 10 conference regular season championships. During this span he has compiled a 583-324 overall record with 301 wins in 11 years at the college level and 282 wins at the American Legion level. In his collegiate career, Dolan has made stops at Dakota

State, Belmont Abbey (N.C.), St. Andrew's (N.C.), and Itasca CC



**Coach Pratt**

Pratt will return to the SCSU dugout in 2007-08. A former standout player for the Huskies from 1985-88, Pratt owns six team pitching records and served as a captain for two seasons at SCSU. Pratt went on to serve for three seasons as the squads pitching coach from 1989-91. The Huskies won the 1989 conference championship and the 1991 NCC tournament title. SCSU also advanced to the NCAA tournament in 1991 with Pratt on staff.



**Coach Picha**

Longtime Central Minnesota prep baseball skipper Ken Picha will join the St. Cloud State University baseball staff as an assistant coach in 2007-08. Picha served as the head varsity baseball coach at nearby Melrose High School for 29 years (1979-2007) and compiled an impressive 427-181 career record. He ranks eighth on the all-time win list among Minnesota high school baseball coaches, and his .702 career winning percentage ranks sixth among Minnesota

high school coaches who have a minimum of 350 wins. His Melrose teams won 11 conference titles, seven district championships and his squads advanced to four state tournaments. His 1997 and 1998 teams finished second in the state baseball tournaments.

Brueske will serve as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU in 2007-08. Brueske graduated from North Dakota State University with a Bachelor's of Science in business administration in 2003. While there, Brueske was a four-year standout for the Bison baseball team. In 2001, Brueske led the North Central Conference in hitting with a .526 average. Also in 2001, he was named to the All-NCC second team, was 17th in the nation with a .787 slugging percentage and ranked 27th nationally with a .436 batting average. Brueske signed a professional contract with the River City Rascals of the Frontier League and currently ranks in the

### THOMPSON TATTOED:

One individual career record that fell this year went to Bruce Thompson (Maplewood) the junior has been hit by six pitches this season, bringing his career total to 17, a new Husky record.

Augustana took three of four games from UMD by scoring 56 runs on the weekend to leap frog from last to fourth in the final standings. SCSU narrowly missed a weekend sweep of North Dakota, allowing a sixth inning comeback by UND in game four, to take three games on the weekend.

### FINDING THE ZONE:

Overall, the Huskies have been the best in the NCC at pounding the strike zone, allowing the least walks of any team with just 122 - a pace of 2.65 per game.
