## 2005-06 SCSU MEN'S BASKETBALL NEWS

Release Date: February 7, 2006

**HUSKIES HOME FOR TWO NCC GAMES:** The St. Cloud State University men's basketball team will play the Huskies final two home North Central Conference games of the 2005-06 season on Thursday, February 9 and Saturday, February 11. SCSU will host the University of Nebraska-Omaha on Thursday and the University of South Dakota on Saturday. Both games are scheduled for 8:00 p.m. tip-offs in Halenbeck Hall (6,927).

**THE RECORDS:** St. Cloud State, ranked tenth in the North Central Region, brings a five game win streak into the week. The Huskies are 15-7 overall and 6-2 in the NCC. SCSU is at the top of the NCC standings this week with a half game lead over Minnesota State University Mankato. Nebraska-Omaha enters the week with a 13-12 overall record and a 2-5 mark in the NCC, and are in seventh place. South Dakota is 15-6 overall and 4-3 in the NCC, good for third place. The Coyotes will play at Minnesota State on Thursday.

**SERIES RECORD:** St. Cloud State has a 30-22 advantage in the UNO series including an 83-81 overtime win in Omaha on Jan. 26. The teams are 5-5 against each other over the last ten games. South Dakota holds a 27-26 series edge over the Huskies and have won six straight against SCSU. The Coyotes beat the Huskies three times last season, including an 80-56 win in the semi final game of the Wells Fargo Finals. USD went on to win the post season championship. The last SCSU win over USD was in 2002-03 when the teams split in league play and SCSU won 84-79 in Vermillion. SCSU went on to win the NCC regular season and Wells Fargo championship.

**WIN STREAK:** St. Cloud State is on a five game winning streak, its longest of the season, and the longest since snapping off an eight game win streak in December and January of last year. It is the longest NCC win streak for the Huskies, since posting a five game league win streak during the 2002-03 season, the year SCSU won the league title and Wells Fargo Finals. The longest, most recent NCC win streak, was eight games during the 1999-2000 season. That year the Huskies won the final eight games of the regular season and advanced to the North Central Region tournament.

**TICKETS:** Tickets are \$10 for adults and \$5 for children age 2 and older. SCSU students are admitted free of charge with a valid SCSU ID. For ticket information call, 320-308-2173 or 1-877-SCSUTIX.

**2004-05 RESULTS:** The St. Cloud State University men's basketball team completed the 2004-05 season with a 21-8 overall record. The Huskies finished third in the North Central Conference with a 7-5 record. SCSU advanced to the semifinals of the Wells Fargo Finals where the Huskies season came to an end in an 80-56 loss to the University of South Dakota.

**TEAM CAPTAINS:** St. Cloud State seniors Matt Siegle (Long Prairie) and Pat Weihert (Watertown, WI) will captain the 2005-06 Huskies.

## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**SCSU HEAD COACH KEVIN SCHLAGEL:** Kevin Schlagel (St. Cloud State, 1976) is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Huskies. **He has a current won/loss record of 174-77 overall in his eight seasons with the Huskies.** He has produced the third most wins all-time among SCSU men's basketball coaches, behind Butch Raymond (231) and Red Severson (209). Schlagel collected his 150th career win on Jan. 4 against Trinity College. He has also compiled an 82-50 record in NCC games in eight seasons (includes 2004-05 record), two Wells Fargo Finals Championships in 2001 and 2003, and a regular season NCC title in 2003. Schlagel was voted the 2003 NCC Coach of the Year. Three times he has led the Huskies to the NCAA tournament and is 2-3 in tournament games coached. Prior to becoming the head coach, Schlagel was the top SCSU assistant coach for 17 seasons.



**ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF:** Coach Matt Reimer (Central College) is in his ninth season as the top assistant to Coach Schlagel. Reimer also served for two seasons as a graduate assistant coach under Butch Raymond in 1995-96 and 1996-97, bringing his overall experience with the Huskies to ten seasons. Prior to SCSU, Reimer served as an assistant basketball coach at New London-Spicer High School for four seasons. Cory Schlagel (St. Thomas Univ.) returns for his second season as a graduate assistant coach with the Huskies. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Schlagel was an assistant baseball and girls basketball coach, and math teacher at Rush City High School. Andrew Cone will also assist the Huskies. He is a former South Dakota State player and graduate assistant coach for the Jackrabbits. Cone played on four NCAA tournament and two North Central Conference Championship teams.

**SCSU LAST WEEK:** The Huskies are coming off two NCC road wins last week as SCSU defeated North Dakota 81-70 last Thursday and Minnesota State University Mankato 67-53 last Saturday.

At North Dakota, senior center Matt Siegle led the Huskies with 25 points and ten rebounds, for his eighth double-double of the season, and first year guard Bobby Morrow scored a career high 17 points off the bench to lead the Huskies. Sophomore guard David Dreas added 16 points. SCSU shot 56.3 percent in the second half and finished the game at 49.2 percent shooting. SCSU out rebounded UND 38-35 in the game. North Dakota was led by Adam Jacobson with 17 points and Evan Lindahl with 12. Caro Nobles finished the game with nine points and ten rebounds.

St. Cloud State seemed to have the game in control from the beginning as Siegle scored the first six points for the Huskies and SCSU jumped out to a 13-4 lead in the opening five minutes at Minnesota State. SCSU never trailed in the game. Dreas finished the game with 18 points to lead the Huskies in scoring. He also had four assists. Siegle knocked down 16 points and seven rebounds. Greene had a career high nine rebounds to go with his nine points and four assists. Sullivan finished up with 14 points and eight rebounds. The Huskies shot 42.6 percent from the field and 42.1 percent from three point range. SCSU had a slight rebounding advantage, 44-42 in the game. The Huskies held MSU's top scorer Luke Anderson to 12 points, well below his 22.8 points per game average. Rueben Trotter led the Mavericks with 14 points and nine rebound. Chris Whitfield finished the game with nine rebounds.

**HUSKY PLAYER NOTES:**

**NCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK SENIOR CENTER MATT SIEGLE:** For the second time this season, Siegle was named the NCC Player of the Week, after leading the Huskies to two important NCC road wins, as SCSU defeated North Dakota 81-70 on Thursday and Minnesota State University Mankato 67-53 on Saturday. The wins put St. Cloud State into first place in the NCC standings. Siegle averaged 20.5 points, 8.5 rebounds, and 4.5 assists over the two games. He shot 51.7 percent from the field and 91.7 (11-12) from the free throw line. He scored 25 points and had ten rebounds against UND, marking his ninth double double of the season. He also had a career high six assists. Against MSU Mankato, he tallied 16 points and seven rebounds. He has scored in double figures in 11 straight games and 19 total this season. Siegle is averaging 13.9 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. He leads the NCC in rebounding this week. He joined SCSU's 1,000 point and 500 rebound club on Jan. 7. He is the 31st player to score 1,000 points as a Husky and the 14th to garner 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in a career. His current career marks are 1,122 points and 593 rebounds. He has made 22 starts this season. He was named the NCC Player of the Week on Jan. 3. He pulled down a career high 20 rebounds in SCSU's win over Wayne State on Jan. 2.



**SOPHOMORE GUARD DAVID DREAS:** Dreas continues to lead the Huskies in team scoring with 18.6 points per game. This week Dreas leads the NCC in league scoring Dreas has scored in double figures in nine straight games and 19 this season. He is shooting 90.7 percent from the free throw line and this week ranks sixth in the NCAA Division II in free throw shooting percentage. He recorded a career high ten assists against Glenville State on Nov. 19. Dreas was named the NCC Player of the Week on Jan. 9 and 30.

**JUNIOR GUARD ADAM SULLIVAN:** Sullivan is averaging 11.3 points and 4.8 rebounds per game this season and has started all 22 games. He has scored in double figures in seven of the last eight games. This week he leads the NCC in three-point field goal percent shooting. Sullivan was named the NCC Player of the Week on Jan. 23 following his 21 point, 16 rebound performance against UND. He scored a career high 23 points against Bemidji State on Nov. 29 and had a career high 16 rebounds against North Dakota on Jan. 21.

**SOPHOMORE GUARD ERIC GREENE:** Greene has started all eight NCC games for the Huskies plus the first ten games of the season. He has played in all 22 Husky games this season and is averaging 25.9 minutes of playing time. He averages 7.1 points and 2.5 rebounds per game. He pulled down a career high nine rebounds against Minnesota State on February 4.

**JUNIOR FORWARD KELLY BYRNE:** Byrne has started the last five games for the Huskies and nine this season. He is averaging 7.3 points and 3.2 rebounds. He has scored in double figures eight times this season including a career high 19 points against Winona State on Nov. 25.

**OFF THE BENCH.....**

**FIRST YEAR FORWARD BOBBY MORROW:** Morrow scored a career high 17 points for the Huskies on February 2 at UND. He also had six rebounds. He has played in 21 games and made five starts this season.

**JUNIOR CENTER ERIC BERGSTROM:** Bergstrom, the tallest player on the roster at seven foot, has played in 21 games and made two starts. He had a career high ten rebounds at UMD and a season high 14 points at Concordia, St. Paul on Dec. 29. He averages 5.3 points and 2.5 rebounds.

**FIRST YEAR FORWARD CRAIG COENEN:** Coenen has made seven starts for the Huskies this season and played in all 22 games. He scored a season and career high 12 points twice this season, including 12 against Colorado State, Pueblo on Dec. 29. In his collegiate debut on Nov. 15, he scored six points and had seven rebounds. He averages 4.2 points and 3.0 rebounds.

**SOPHOMORE GUARD DUSTY WABISZEWSKI:** Wabiszewski has played well off the bench for the Huskies. He has played in all 22 games and averages 15.0 minutes of playing time. He ranks second on the team in assists with 60 and is averaging 3.7 points per game. He had a career high nine assists against Dakota State on December 3.

**DREAS NAMED TO ALL-CLASSIC TEAM:** St. Cloud State guard David Dreas was named to the five-player SCSU American Family Insurance Hoopster All-Classic Team. He was joined by Kenneth Pointer and Karl Marxhausen of Concordia, St. Paul, and Craig Schafer and Paul Henrichs of St. John's. Henrichs was named the MVP of the Classic.

**HEAD COACH:** University of Nebraska-Omaha head coach Derrin Hansen is in his first season at the helm of the Mavericks and eighth season overall with the program. For the past seven seasons, he has been an assistant coach and was named the head coach in July.

**TEAM NOTES:** The Mavericks have lost three straight games since SCSU beat UNO 83-81 in overtime on January 26. Their conference wins have been at Augustana and at home against USD. UNO is coming off a 77-72 home loss to Augustana and an 85-76 road loss to South Dakota. Like the Huskies, UNO boasts three players with double figure scoring averages. Senior guard Calvin Kapels leads the team in scoring with 16.1 points per game. He also averaged 6.7 rebounds and is a 50 percent field goal shooter. He leads the NCC in steals and ranks third in league scoring. Senior forward Ryan Curtis drops in 12.5 points per game and leads the team in rebounds with 7.3 per game. Junior guard Zac Robinson averages 11.0 points per game. The Mavericks average 73.8 points per game to their opponents 66.5. They also have a rebounding edge over their opponents 37.1 to 34.2.

**EARLIER THIS YEAR:** In the last meeting between these two teams on Jan. 26, Kapels exploded for 37 points and the Huskies' David Dreas answered with 36 points as SCSU defeated the Mavericks 83-81 in overtime. The Huskies took command of the first half and led by as many as 18 points with five minutes left in the half. SCSU took a 45-32 lead into half time. UNO outscored the Huskies 20-7 to open the second half and tied the game at 52-52 with 12:56 left in regulation. UNO's lead increased to seven points, 66-59 at the 4:54 mark. Dreas went to work in the final five minutes, dishing out an assist and scoring ten points to tie the game 72-72 at the 1:01 mark. A Chris DeSpain tip-in gave the Mavericks a 74-72 lead with :28 seconds left. SCSU's Adam Sullivan scored with :20 seconds and after a UNO timeout, the game went to overtime. Kelly Byrne scored the first basket of overtime and SCSU held the lead to the end. However, with :43 seconds left Calvin Kapels was fouled shooting a three and made all three free throws. Following two timeouts, UNO was not able to score.

**HEAD COACH:** University of South Dakota head coach Dave Boots is in his 18th season with the Coyotes and 25th as a collegiate head coach. He entered the year with a 358-139 record at USD and a 473-202 career record.

**TEAM NOTES:** The Huskies will be playing the Coyotes for the first time this season. USD has won three of its last four games and suffered a 70-65 loss at Minnesota Duluth on Saturday. USD has lost to Augustana College at the Sioux Falls Arena, 91-78, at Nebraska-Omaha, 87-80, and UMD. Senior forward Turner Trofholz leads the way for the Coyotes. He is averaging 20.8 points and 9.7 rebounds. His teammate Eric Hall is averaging 15.5 points, followed by Jesse Becker at 12.4 points and Dustin Little with 10.4 points. The Coyotes are averaging 80.9 points per game and giving up 72.8. They are behind in the rebounding war 35.0 to 35.5. Trofholz ranks second in league rebounding and fourth in scoring. As a team USD leads the league in field goal shooting percentage and three point field goal percentage. The Coyotes also lead the league in assist/turnover ratio.
