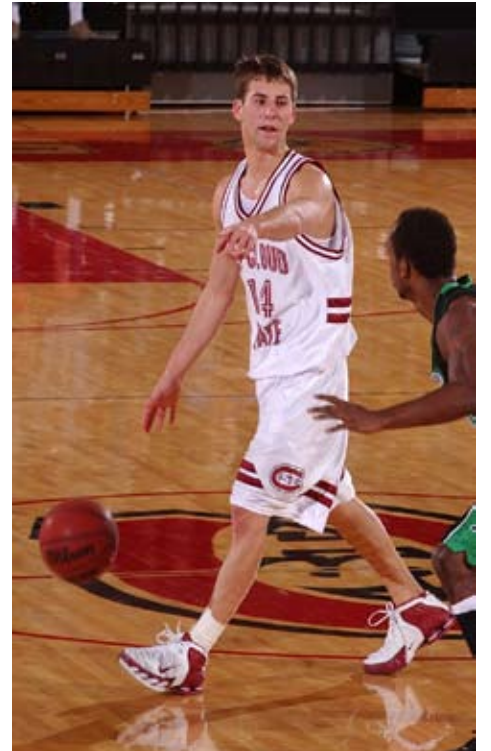
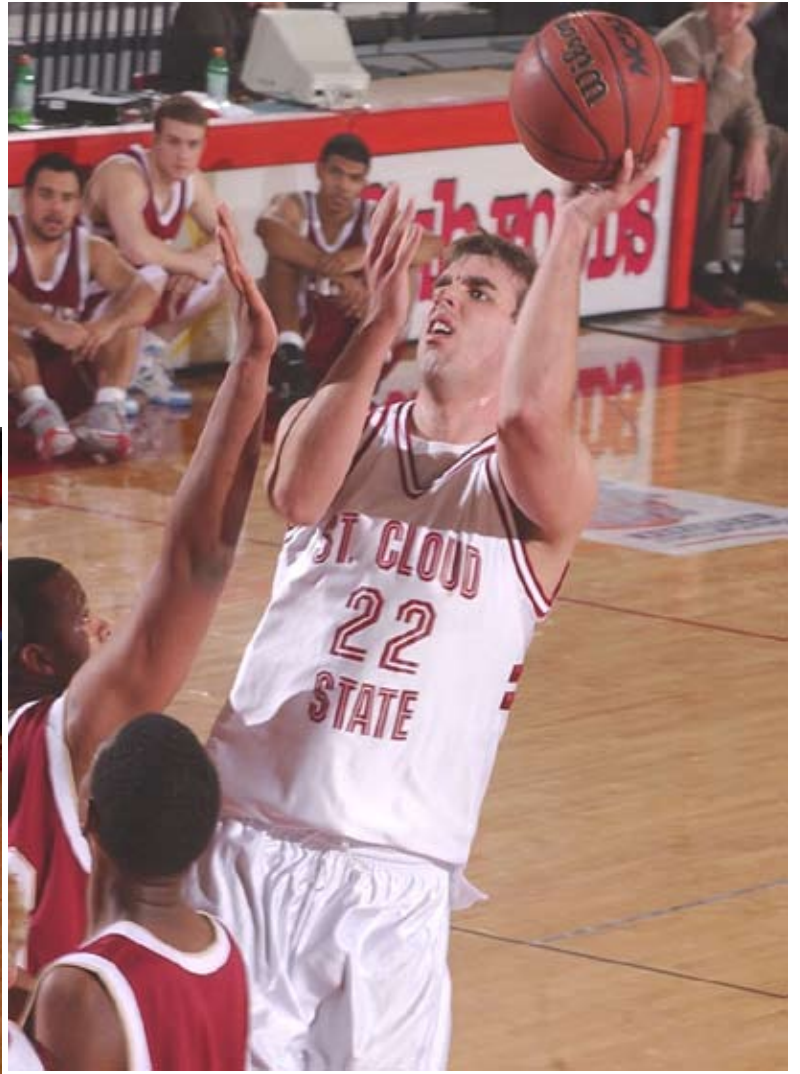

2005-06 SCSU MEN'S BASKETBALL NEWS

Release Date: March 6, 2006

NORTH CENTRAL REGION TOURNAMENT ACTION: The St. Cloud State University men's basketball team has earned a bid to the 2006 NCAA Division II North Central Region Tournament to be played March 11, 12 and 14 in McCowan Gymnasium on the campus of Winona State University. The Huskies, the #7 seed in the tournament will play the #2 seed Fort Hays State in a quarterfinal game at 2:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 11.

THE RECORDS: St. Cloud State brings a 20-10 overall record into the North Central Region Tournament. Fort Hays State, a member of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference brings a 26-3 record to the dance.

TICKETS: An All-Tournament pass is available for \$24 for adults and \$12 for students and seniors. Single game tickets are \$8 for adults and \$4 for seniors and students. For ticket purchases and information call 507-457-5210.

NINTH NCAA PLAYOFF APPEARANCE: The Huskies will be making their ninth NCAA playoff appearance. The first SCSU appearance in an NCAA regional was in 1973-74 and the last appearance was in the 2002-03 season. In 2003, the Huskies were the number two seed and defeated the University of North Dakota 74-69 in the quarters. The Huskies then lost to Metro State 75-63 in the semis.

HUSKIES SECOND IN NCC: St. Cloud State finished second in the NCC standings, the best finish for the Huskies since winning the regular season title in 2003. This is the third second place finish for the Huskies under current head coach Kevin Schlagel. The Huskies also finished second in the Wells Fargo Finals Tournament. SCSU defeated Nebraska-Omaha 96-84 and South Dakota 85-69 to advance to the Championship game where the Huskies lost to host Minnesota State University Mankato 78-69.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

SCSU HEAD COACH KEVIN SCHLAGEL: Kevin Schlagel (St. Cloud State, 1976) is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Huskies. **He has a current won/loss record of 179-80 overall in his eight seasons with the Huskies.** He has produced the third most wins all-time among SCSU men's basketball coaches, behind Butch Raymond (231) and Red Severson (209). Schlagel collected his 150th career win on Jan. 4 against Trinity College. He has also compiled an 82-50 record in NCC games in eight seasons (includes 2004-05 record), two Wells Fargo Finals Championships in 2001 and 2003, and a regular season NCC title in 2003. Schlagel was voted the 2003 NCC Coach of the Year. Three times he has led the Huskies to the NCAA tournament and is 2-3 in tournament games coached. Prior to becoming the head coach, Schlagel was the top SCSU assistant coach for 17 seasons.



ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: Coach Matt Reimer (Central College) is in his ninth season as the top assistant to Coach Schlagel. Reimer also served for two seasons as a graduate assistant coach under Butch Raymond in 1995-96 and 1996-97, bringing his overall experience with the Huskies to ten seasons. Prior to SCSU, Reimer served as an assistant basketball coach at New London-Spicer High School for four seasons. Cory Schlagel (St. Thomas Univ.) returns for his second season as a graduate assistant coach with the Huskies. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Schlagel was an assistant baseball and girls basketball coach, and math teacher at Rush City High School. Andrew Cone will also assist the Huskies. He is a former South Dakota State player and graduate assistant coach for the Jackrabbits. Cone played on four NCAA tournament and two North Central Conference Championship teams.

THREE NAMED TO ALL-NCC TEAM: Three St. Cloud State players have been named to the 2005-06 All-North Central Conference Team. All three players are first time team members. Sophomore guard David Dreas, junior guard/forward Adam Sullivan, and senior center Matt Siegle have been honored by the league. Dreas is the only sophomore on the team, while Sullivan is one of only two juniors to be honored.

DREAS AND SIEGLE NAMED TO WELLS FARGO FINALS ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Dreas and Siegle were named to the six member Wells Fargo Finals All-Tournament team on Sunday. Dreas scored 59 points and dished out 13 assists in three tournament games. Siegle tallied 65 points, 25 rebounds and ten assists over three games.

HUSKIES POST SEVEN GAME WIN STREAK DURING SEASON: St. Cloud State had a seven game win streak that helped them to their second place NCC finish. The win streak was the longest since snapping off an eight game win streak in December and January of last year. It was the longest NCC win streak for the Huskies, since posting a five game league win streak during the 2002-03 season, the year SCSU won the league title and Wells Fargo Finals. The longest, most recent NCC win streak, was eight games during the 1999-2000 season. That year the Huskies won the final eight games of the regular season and advanced to the North Central Region tournament.

20-WIN SEASON: The Huskies have posted their fifth 20-win season in the last six years under current head coach Kevin Schlagel. It is only the 12th 20-win season in the history of SCSU men's basketball. The Huskies first 20-win season was in 1958-59 under Red Severson (21-5). Severson had three 20-win seasons and Butch Raymond four 20-win seasons as head coach of the Huskies.

HUSKY PLAYER NOTES:

SENIOR CENTER ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE MATT SIEGLE: Siegle was named to the All-North Central Conference Team on Monday of this week. Siegle scored a combined 39 points, 13 rebounds and eight assists over the weekend in the Wells Fargo Finals and was named to the All-Tournament team. Siegle has scored in double figures in 19 straight games and 27 total this season. Siegle is averaging 15.3 points and 8.6 rebounds per game, and has started all 30 games. He ranks first in the NCC in offensive rebounds, second in rebounding and blocked shots this week and is fifth in league scoring (overall games). He joined SCSU's 1,000 point and 500 rebound club on Jan. 7. He is the 31st player to score 1,000 points as a Husky and the 14th to garner 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in a career. He has played in 113 career games which ranks 11th (tie) on the all-time games played chart. He has 1,277 career points (16th) and 665 career rebounds (8th all-time). He was named the NCC Player of the Week on Jan. 3 and Feb. 5 and 27. He pulled down a career high 20 rebounds in SCSU's win over Wayne State on Jan. 2 and had a career high six assists versus North Dakota on Feb. 2. His career high 40 points were scored against St. Michael's College on Nov. 26, 2004.



SOPHOMORE GUARD DAVID DREAS: Dreas was named to the All-North Central Conference Team announced on Monday. Dreas has scored 72 points over the last four games including a pair of 23 point performances in the Wells Fargo Finals semi-final and championship games. He tallied a career high seven three-point baskets against Minnesota State in the championship game. He was named the Wells Fargo Finals All-Tournament team. Dreas led the NCC in league scoring (NCC games) this season and this week ranks second in free throw percentage and three-point field goal percentage and is third in overall league scoring. He leads the Huskies in scoring with 18.6 points per game and has 125 assists. He has started all 30 games. Dreas has scored in double figures in 17 straight games and 27 this season. He is shooting 88.3 percent from the free throw line and last week ranked seventh in the NCAA Division II in free throw shooting percentage and tenth in three-point field goal shooting percentage. He has scored 724 career points and has moved into the top 20 in all-time assists with 202 (17th). He recorded a career high ten assists against Glenville State on Nov. 19 of this season and his career high 36 points in scoring came on Jan. 26. Dreas was named the NCC Player of the Week on Jan. 9 and 30. Dreas was named to the five-player SCSU American Family Insurance Hoopster All-Classic Team.



JUNIOR FORWARD ADAM SULLIVAN: Sullivan was named the All-North Central Conference Team on Monday. He tallied 18 points, 13 rebounds and four assists in the Wells Fargo Finals games over the weekend. Sullivan has mastered the three this season, as he doubled his three-point baskets made from last season. In 2004-05 he hit 33 and this year has 71. He ranks 12th on the all-time three-point field goals made list at SCSU with 104. He has started all 30 games and averages 12.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per game. This week he leads the NCC in three-point field goal percentage. Sullivan is a two-time NCC Player of the Week this season, earning the honor on Jan. 23 and February 13. He reached 500 career points this season and currently has 542. He scored a career high 23 points against Bemidji State on Nov. 29 and had a career high 16 rebounds against North Dakota on Jan. 21.

SOPHOMORE GUARD ERIC GREENE: Greene had 13 points, four rebounds and five assists in the Huskies Wells Fargo Finals semifinal win over South Dakota last Saturday. He has made 25 starts this season, including all 12 NCC games. The five assists equaled his career high and season high. He is averaging 7.3 points and 2.5 rebounds. He has played in all 30 Husky games this season and is averaging 26.6 minutes of playing time. He pulled down a career high nine rebounds against Minnesota State on February 4.



JUNIOR FORWARD KELLY BYRNE: Byrne has started the last 13 games for the Huskies and 17 this season. He is averaging 7.3 points and 3.3 rebounds. He has scored in double figures ten times this season including a career high 19 points against Winona State on Nov. 25.

OFF THE BENCH.....FIRST YEAR FORWARD BOBBY MORROW: Morrow scored a career high 17 points for the Huskies on February 2 at UND. He has played in 29 games and made five starts this season.

JUNIOR CENTER ERIC BERGSTROM: Bergstrom, the tallest player on the roster at seven foot, has played in 28 games and made two starts. He had a career high ten rebounds at UMD and a season high 14 points at Concordia, St. Paul on Dec. 29.

FIRST YEAR FORWARD CRAIG COENEN: Coenen has played in all 30 games this season and made seven starts for the Huskies. He averages 4.5 points and 3.1 rebounds. Coenen scored a season and career high 12 points twice this season, including 12 against Colorado State, Pueblo on Dec. 29. He tallied a career high eight rebounds against Upper Iowa on Feb. 20. In his collegiate debut on Nov. 15, he scored six points and had seven rebounds.

SOPHOMORE GUARD DUSTY WABISZEWSKI: Wabiszewski has come off the bench for valuable minutes in all 30 games this season. He averages 15.8 minutes of playing time. He ranks second on the team in assists with 85 and is averaging 3.5 points per game. He had a career high nine assists against Dakota State on December 3.

WELLS FARGO FINALS RECAP: The Huskies defeated the University of South Dakota 85-69 in the semifinals of the Wells Fargo Finals last Saturday. The game opened with both teams trading baskets for the first four minutes. At the 16:26 mark sophomore guard Eric Greene (Kingston, WI) nailed a three-point basket to give the Huskies a 9-8 lead and SCSU never trailed after that. In fact, SCSU held the Coyotes scoreless for the next five minutes while taking a 17-10 lead at the midway point of the first half. SCSU's lead increased to 14 points on a three-point basket from sophomore guard David Dreas (Winona) at the 4:43 mark and the Huskies went on to take a 37-24 half time lead. In the second half, SCSU posted its largest lead of the game, 24 points, at the 14:10 mark. South Dakota's Jesse Becker scored ten points in the final six minutes of the game to get to within 12 points at the 1:26 mark. USD's Turner Trofholz led all players with 30 points and 12 rebounds. SCSU was led by Siegle with 24 points, five rebounds and five assists. Dreas finished the game with 23 points and Green made three-of-four three-point attempts and finished with 13 points.

In the championship game, Minnesota State used a strong rebounding effort, first half scoring from Rueben Trotter and a second half scoring surge from Luke Anderson for the win. St. Cloud State started the game on a hot streak, shooting 61.5 percent from the field early in the half and jumping out to a 12 point lead, 27-15 at the 7:59 mark. SCSU sophomore guard David Dreas (Winona) nailed five three-point baskets for the Huskies in the first half with his fifth giving the Huskies a 33-25 lead at the 2:56 mark. But that was all that SCSU scored as MSU's Trotter scored on two layups and Paris Kyles made two free throws and then nailed a jumper with :01 second on the clock to tie the game 33-33 at the half. Luke Anderson opened the second half for the Mavericks with eight straight points to give MSU a 41-34 lead at the 17:42 mark. The MSU lead increased to 12 points, 48-36 on a pair of Anderson free throws five minutes into the half. A layup from SCSU senior center Matt Siegle (Long Prairie) followed by a Dreas three and jumper from junior Kelly Byrne (Ozark, MO) put the Huskies within five points, 48-43 at 13:35. The Huskies would get as close as five two more times in the half at 13:09 on a jumper from junior Adam Sullivan (Green Bay, WI) and tradition three-point play from freshman Bobby Morrow (Minneapolis) at the 7:10 mark. The Huskies would score ten points in the final seven minutes of the game and sent MSU to the line seven times. David Dreas led all scorers with 23 points. He made a career high seven three-point baskets. Siegle finished the game with 15 points and eight rebounds for the Huskies. SCSU shot 42.6 percent from the field and were out rebounded 41-27 by the Mavericks. Luke Anderson finished the game with 21 points and seven rebounds including 18 second half points. Trotter added 16 point and five rebounds, and Paris Kyles had 18 points and eight rebounds for the Mavericks, who shot 50%.

SCSU NORTH CENTRAL REGION TOURNAMENT NOTES....

HUSKIES IN NCAA PLAY: St. Cloud State is advancing to the NCAA post season tournament for the second time in three seasons and ninth time overall. The first Husky appearance in an NCAA regional was during the 1973-74 season and SCSU last appearance was in 2002-03. In 2003, the Huskies were the #2 seed and defeated the University of North Dakota 74-69 in the quarterfinals. SCSU fell to Metro State 75-63 in the semifinals. In 2001, the Huskies hosted the Regional tournament and advanced to the region finals where SCSU lost a heartbreaker, 67-65 to Southwest Minnesota State University. The Huskies appeared in three straight regionals in 1985-86, 1986-87, and 1987-88, and advanced to the "Elite Eight" in 1986-87. The Huskies lost to Delta State, 78-73 in overtime in an Elite Eight quarterfinal game played at Halenbeck Hall on the SCSU campus. St. Cloud State is 7-9 overall in NCAA Region Tournament Games.

FHSU HEAD COACH: Mark Johnson (Pittsburg State) is in his fifth season as head coach of the Tigers. He has a current won/loss record of 105-39. Prior to becoming the head coach Johnson served as the Tigers assistant coach from 1996 to 2001. Last week he was named the RMAC Coach of the Year.

TIGERS NOTES: Fort Hays State started the season on a 7-0 run before losing to Southwest Baptist 60-57. Following that loss, the Tigers snapped off an 18-game win streak before losing to Nebraska-Kearney 70-66 on Feb. 26 in the final game of the regular season. The Tigers won the regular season Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC) title. FHSU defeated New Mexico Highlands in the quarterfinals of the RMAC tournament but lost out on a bid for the tournament championship when Metropolitan State upset the Tigers 76-68 in the semifinals.....Since December 20, the Tigers have been ranked in the top ten of the NABC Division II Men's Basketball Poll and spent two weeks (Feb. 14 and 21) as the number one team in the country. The Tigers were ranked fifth in the February 28 national poll.....This will be the Tigers eighth NCAA post season appearance. The last time FHSU was in the NCAA tournament was in 2002-03. In fact, the Tigers and Huskies last two NCAA appearances have been in 2002-03 in Kearney, NE and in 2000-01 in St. Cloud. During the 1995-96 season, Fort Hays State ran the table posting a 34-0 record and winning the NCAA Division II National Championship.....Senior guard Tyrone Shephard leads the Tigers in scoring with 13.4 points per game. Last week he was named RMAC Player of the Year. He is a 48 percent field goal shooter and 78 percent free throw shooter and the 'go to' player for the Tigers. Senior forward Jeremy Atwater was named the RMAC Defensive Player of the Year just last week. He is the team leader in rebounds with 7.3 per game. Derrick Graham, a senior guard and Derrick Turner, a junior forward were named to RMAC's All-East Division Honorable Mention team.

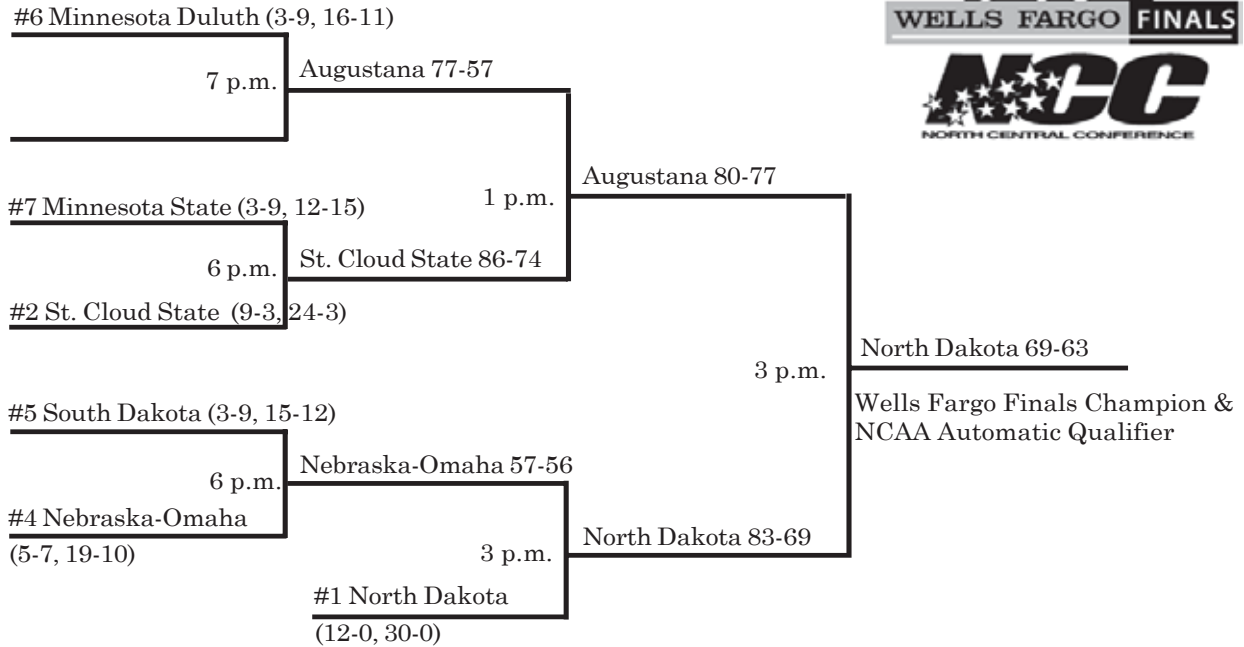
