2005-06 SCSU MEN'S BASKETBALL NEWS

Release Date: February 27, 2006

WELLS FARGO FINALS QUARTERFINAL: The St. Cloud State University men's basketball team will host the University of Nebraska-Omaha in a Wells Fargo Finals Quarterfinal game Wednesday, March 1 at 8:00 p.m. in Halenbeck Hall (6,927) on the SCSU campus. The Huskies are the #2 seed and UNO the #7 seed for the tournament. The winner will advance to the semi-finals on Saturday, March 4 in Mankato and play the winner of the #3 South Dakota vs. #6 North Dakota game. The game is part of a Wells Fargo Finals doubleheader at Halenbeck, as the SCSU women will host Minnesota State University Mankato at 6:00 p.m.

THE RECORDS: St. Cloud State, ranked fifth in the North Central Region, is 18-9 overall and 8-4 in the North Central Conference. Nebraska-Omaha is 15-15 overall and 4-8 in the NCC.

HUSKIES SECOND IN NCC: St. Cloud State finished second in the NCC standings, the best finish for the Huskies since winning the regular season title in 2003. This is the third second place finish for the Huskies under current head coach Kevin Schlagel.

SERIES RECORD: St. Cloud State is 2-0 against the Mavericks this season, including an 83-81 overtime win in Omaha and an 83-64 victory at Halenbeck on Feb. 9. The Huskies lead the all-time series 31-22 and are 6-4 against UNO over the last ten games.

WELLS FARGO FINALS PAIRINGS: Minnesota State University is the NCC champion and top seed for the Wells Fargo Finals and will host the semifinals and finals on Saturday and Sunday, March 4-5. The quarterfinals will be played at the site of the higher seed on Wednesday, March 1.

2004-05 RESULTS: The St. Cloud State University men's basketball team completed the 2004-05 season with a 21-8 overall record. The Huskies finished third in the North Central Conference with a 7-5 record. SCSU advanced to the semifinals of the Wells Fargo Finals where the Huskies season came to an end in an 80-56 loss to the University of South Dakota.

TEAM CAPTAINS: St. Cloud State seniors Matt Siegle (Long Prairie) and Pat Weihert (Watertown, WI) will captain the 2005-06 Huskies.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

SCSU HEAD COACH KEVIN SCHLAGEL: Kevin Schlagel (St. Cloud State, 1976) is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Huskies. **He has a current won/loss record of 177-79 overall in his eight seasons with the Huskies.** He has produced the third most wins all-time among SCSU men's basketball coaches, behind Butch Raymond (231) and Red Severson (209). Schlagel collected his 150th career win on Jan. 4 against Trinity College. He has also compiled an 82-50 record in NCC games in eight seasons (includes 2004-05 record), two Wells Fargo Finals Championships in 2001 and 2003, and a regular season NCC title in 2003. Schlagel was voted the 2003 NCC Coach of the Year. Three times he has led the Huskies to the NCAA tournament and is 2-3 in tournament games coached. Prior to becoming the head coach, Schlagel was the top SCSU assistant coach for 17 seasons.



ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: Coach Matt Reimer (Central College) is in his ninth season as the top assistant to Coach Schlagel. Reimer also served for two seasons as a graduate assistant coach under Butch Raymond in 1995-96 and 1996-97, bringing his overall experience with the Huskies to ten seasons. Prior to SCSU, Reimer served as an assistant basketball coach at New London-Spicer High School for four seasons. Cory Schlagel (St. Thomas Univ.) returns for his second season as a graduate assistant coach with the Huskies. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Schlagel was an assistant baseball and girls basketball coach, and math teacher at Rush City High School. Andrew Cone will also assist the Huskies. He is a former South Dakota State player and graduate assistant coach for the Jackrabbits. Cone played on four NCAA tournament and two North Central Conference Championship teams.

SCSU LAST WEEK: The Huskies are coming off an 85-67 loss at the University of South Dakota. The Huskies got to fouling and turning the ball over early and found themselves down 17-10 at the midway point of the first half. USD's Turner Trofholz scored 14 of the team's first 22 points and was the main reason for St. Cloud's foul woes. The tide changed at the eight minute mark, when the calls started to go SCSU's way and the shots began to fall. The Huskies forced USD to hit shots from the charity stripe while they plugged away from the field. Matt Siegle and Eric Bergstrom both put up old-fashioned three-point plays to bring the Huskies back to within four, 25-29 with 3:59 to play. The trend did not last though, and USD went on an 11-5 run to close out the half, pushing the score to 40-30. St. Cloud State worked hard to maintain Trofholz early in the second half and give themselves a shot at the game. A Sullivan three-pointer followed by a defensive stop and a Siegle jumper brought the Huskies to within five points, 46-41 with 16:15 remaining. The Huskies, who had been shooting 50% in the half, hit an offensive dry spell and failed to hit a field goal for three minutes midway through the half. The Coyotes took the opportunity to push the scoring margin to 14 points by the 6:19 mark. USD continued to feed the ball to Trofholz, who scored or drew a foul nearly every time. Craig Coenen picked up his fifth foul against Trofholz at the 5:35 mark with the score set at 69-55. The Huskies could not get any closer as USD wrapped the game up with an 18-point victory, 85-67. Senior Matt Siegle did his part, scoring 27 points and pulling down 18 boards. Dreas was the only other Husky to score in double digits, finishing with 13 points. The Huskies shot 40.4% from the field. Trofholz led USD with 30 points and eight rebounds. Jesse Becker hit three three-pointers on his way to 21 points and five assists. The Coyotes shot 47.3% from the field.

HUSKY PLAYER NOTES:

SENIOR CENTER ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE MATT SIEGLE: Siegle was named the North Central Conference Player of the Week for the third time this season, following his performance at the University of South Dakota where he recorded his ninth double-double of the season with a 27 point, 18 rebound performance last Saturday. He shot 11-of-21 from the field, made five-of-six free throws, and had 12 defensive rebounds. Siegle has scored in double figures in 16 straight games and 24 total this season. Siegle is averaging 14.6 points and 8.6 rebounds per game, and has started all 27 games. He ranks second in the NCC in rebounding and blocked shots this week and is third in field goal shooting percentage and fourth in league scoring. He joined SCSU's 1,000 point and 500 rebound club on Jan. 7. He is the 31st player to score 1,000 points as a Husky and the 14th to garner 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in a career. He has played in 112 career games which ranks 13th on the all-time games played chart. He has 1,212 career points (21st) and 640 career rebounds (12th all-time). He was named the NCC Player of the Week on Jan. 3 and 30. He pulled down a career high 20 rebounds in SCSU's win over Wayne State on Jan. 2 and had a career high six assists versus North Dakota on Feb. 2.



SOPHOMORE GUARD DAVID DREAS: Dreas leads the NCC in league scoring, is second in three-point baskets made, third in assists, and fourth in free throw shooting percentage. Last week, he scored 13 points at South Dakota. He leads the Huskies in scoring with 18.5 points per game and has 111 assists. He has started all 27 games. Dreas has scored in double figures in 14 straight games and 24 this season. He is shooting 89.6 percent from the free throw line and last week ranked seventh in the NCAA Division II in free throw shooting percentage and tenth in three-point field goal shooting percentage. He has scored 665 career points and has moved into the top 20 in all-time assists with 189 (18th). He recorded a career high ten assists against Glenville State on Nov. 19. Dreas was named the NCC Player of the Week on Jan. 9 and 30.

JUNIOR FORWARD ADAM SULLIVAN: Sullivan tallied eight points, two rebounds and two assist against USD on Saturday. He has started all 27 games and averages 12.1 points and 4.7 rebounds per game. He has scored in double figures in 11 of the last 15 games. This week he leads the NCC in three-point field goal percentage and three-point field goals made, and is second in field goal shooting. Sullivan is a two-time NCC Player of the Week this season, earning the honor on Jan. 23 and February 13. He reached 500 career points over the weekend and has 504 heading into Wednesday's game. He scored a career high 23 points against Bemidji State on Nov. 29 and had a career high 16 rebounds against North Dakota on Jan. 21.

SOPHOMORE GUARD ERIC GREENE: Greene has made 23 starts this season, including all 12 NCC games. He is averaging 7.0 points and 2.4 rebounds. He has played in all 27 Husky games this season and is averaging 25.9 minutes of playing time. Greene had a season and career high five assists against UNO on Feb. 9. He pulled down a career high nine rebounds against Minnesota State on February 4.

JUNIOR FORWARD KELLY BYRNE: Byrne has started the last ten games for the Huskies and 14 this season. He is averaging 7.2 points and 3.3 rebounds. He has scored in double figures ten times this season including a career high 19 points against Winona State on Nov. 25.

OFF THE BENCH.....FIRST YEAR FORWARD BOBBY MORROW: Morrow scored a career high 17 points for the Huskies on February 2 at UND. He has played in 26 games and made five starts this season.

JUNIOR CENTER ERIC BERGSTROM: Bergstrom, the tallest player on the roster at seven foot, has played in 25 games and made two starts. He had a career high ten rebounds at UMD and a season high 14 points at Concordia, St. Paul on Dec. 29.

FIRST YEAR FORWARD CRAIG COENEN: Coenen has played in all 27 games this season and made seven starts for the Huskies. He averages 4.2 points and 3.1 rebounds. Coenen scored a season and career high 12 points twice this season, including 12 against Colorado State, Pueblo on Dec. 29. He tallied a career high eight rebounds against Upper Iowa on Feb. 20. In his collegiate debut on Nov. 15, he scored six points and had seven rebounds.

SOPHOMORE GUARD DUSTY WABISZEWSKI: Wabiszewski has played well off the bench for the Huskies. He has played in all 27 games and averages 16.2 minutes of playing time. He ranks second on the team in assists with 80 and is averaging 3.7 points per game. He had a career high nine assists against Dakota State on December 3.

DREAS NAMED TO ALL-CLASSIC TEAM: St. Cloud State guard David Dreas was named to the five-player SCSU American Family Insurance Hoopster All-Classic Team. He was joined by Kenneth Pointer and Karl Marxhausen of Concordia, St. Paul, and Craig Schafer and Paul Henrichs of St. John's. Henrichs was named the MVP of the Classic.

HEAD COACH: University of Nebraska-Omaha head coach Derrin Hansen is in his first season at the helm of the Mavericks and eighth season overall with the program. For the past seven seasons, he has been an assistant coach and was named the head coach in July.

NEBRASKA-OMAHA NOTES: UNO has won two in a row and are 2-6 over their last eight games. UNO's wins were over Minnesota Duluth last Thursday, 66-58 and Minnesota State Mankato on Saturday, 68-64. The Mavericks have had to juggle the line-up several times this season due to illness and injury. UNO is led in scoring by Calvin Kapels with 15.2 point per game. Curtis Ryan leads the team in rebounding with 7.2 boards per game.

WHEN THEY LAST MET: The Huskies posted an 83-64 win over UNO on February 9 at Halenbeck Hall. The Huskies had an outstanding second half of shooting. After taking a 37-31 half time lead, SCSU shot 68 percent from the field, 80 percent (8 of 10) from three point range, and made all four free throw attempts. SCSU finished the game shooting 51.8 percent from the field and 56.5 from three point range. On the other side of the box score, UNO shot 39 percent from the field and 38.9 from three point range.

On January 26, SCSU left Omaha with an 83-81 overtime win. In that game, Calvin Kapels and David Dreas stole the show, as Kapels finished with 37 points and Dreas with a career high 36 points. With a five point deficit and :43 left on the overtime clock, UNO star Calvin Kapels stepped up to the charity stripe after being fouled while attempting a three-point shot. The senior hit all three shots to bring the game back to a one-shot margin. The Huskies turned the ball over with just over :32 seconds remaining and gave UNO one more chance to tie the game or take a lead. In the end, they had three more chances to score, but no shooters could find their mark and the Huskies came out on top, 83-81.

WELLS FARGO FINALS HISTORY: St. Cloud State has won two Wells Fargo Finals Championships since the post season tournament began in 2001. SCSU won the inaugural tournament championship in 2001 and again in 2003. The Huskies have an 8-3 record in Wells Fargo Finals games played. This will be the second Wells Fargo Tournament game between the Huskies and Mavericks of UNO. SCSU defeated UNO in 2003, 88-78 in the championship game played at Halenbeck Hall. St. Cloud State has advanced to the semifinal round of the Wells Fargo Finals in four of the five tournaments played.

HUSKY WIN STREAK: St. Cloud State had a seven game win streak that helped them to their second place NCC finish. The win streak was the longest since snapping off an eight game win streak in December and January of last year. It was the longest NCC win streak for the Huskies, since posting a five game league win streak during the 2002-03 season, the year SCSU won the league title and Wells Fargo Finals. The longest, most recent NCC win streak, was eight games during the 1999-2000 season. That year the Huskies won the final eight games of the regular season and advanced to the North Central Region tournament.

HUSKIES IN THE NCC STATS: As a team, the Huskies ranked first or second in ten of the NCC statistical categories for league games played. SCSU leads the NCC in scoring offense (80.0), field goal percentage (.481), three-point field goal percentage (.427), and three-point field goals made (8.83). The Huskies rank second in scoring margin, free throw percentage, field goal percent defense, blocked shots, assist/turnover ratio, and defensive rebounds.

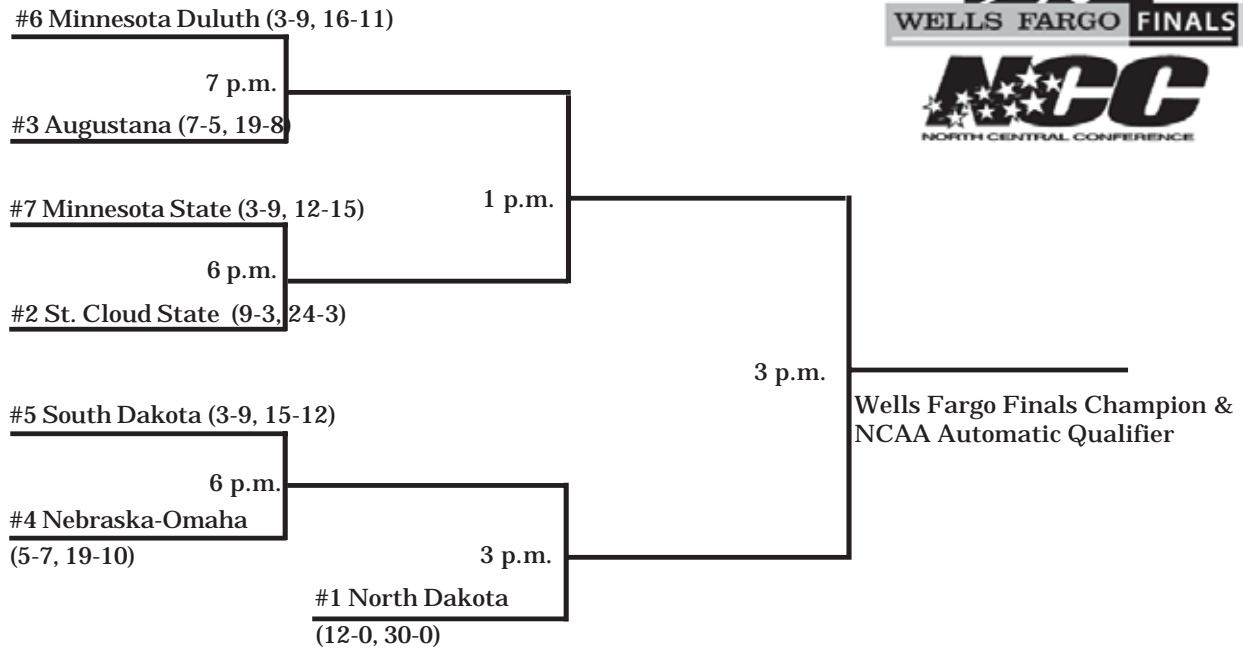
