2005-06 SCSU MEN'S BASKETBALL NEWS

Release Date: December 19, 2005

THREE GAMES ON TAP OVER HOLIDAYS: The St. Cloud State University men's basketball team will play three non-conference games between Dec. 20 and Jan. 2. The Huskies open the Holiday week with a non-conference game at Concordia, St. Paul on Tuesday, Dec. 20. The tip-off is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. On Thursday, Dec. 29, the Huskies will host Colorado State University-Pueblo at 7:00 p.m. at Halenbeck Hall (6,927). SCSU will ring in the new year on Jan. 2 with a 7:30 tip-off against Wayne State College (NE). A high school pre-lim game will be played at 6:00 p.m. on Jan. 2.

THE RECORDS: St. Cloud State brings a 7-4 overall record into the Holiday schedule. Concordia, St. Paul is 8-2 overall. Colorado State-Pueblo brings a 5-5 overall record into the Dec. 29 game and Wayne State brings a 2-5 mark into the New Year's contest.

SERIES RECORDS: St. Cloud State leads the all-time series with Concordia, St. Paul 6-0. The last time these two teams met was exactly a year ago on Dec. 20, a 67-62 Husky win. This will be the second game played between the Huskies and Colorado State-Pueblo. The Thunderwolves defeated SCSU 70-59 last year in Pueblo. The Huskies are 4-2 against Wayne State, including a 78-80 loss to the Wildcats in the second game of this season, Nov. 18 at the Minnesota State, Mankato Tip-Off.

NCC OPENER NEARS: The Huskies will open North Central Conference play on Saturday, January 7 at the University of Minnesota Duluth. SCSU and the Bulldogs will tip-off at 3:00 p.m. in Romano Gymnasium on the UMD campus. All seven league teams will open play on Jan. 5 and Jan. 7. Nebraska-Omaha is the defending NCC Champion and South Dakota the Wells Fargo Finals Champion.

MEDIA COVERAGE: St. Cloud State men's basketball can be heard on WJON AM 1240 Radio or 1390 AM The Fan during the 2005-06 season. Sports Director Jay Caldwell will call all of the games home and away. All three upcoming games will air on WJON. The broadcasts can also be heard via the web at www.StCloudState.edu/athletics.

THE KEVIN SCHLAGEL SHOW: Listen to the Kevin Schlagel Show every Wednesday afternoon throughout the season on AM 1390 The Fan. Coach Schlagel and Jay Caldwell will talk Husky men's basketball every Wednesday afternoon at 1:30.

2004-05 RESULTS: The St. Cloud State University men's basketball team completed the 2004-05 season with a 21-8 overall record. The Huskies finished third in the North Central Conference with a 7-5 record. SCSU advanced to the semifinals of the Wells Fargo Finals where the Huskies season came to an end in an 80-56 loss to the University of South Dakota.

TEAM CAPTAINS: St. Cloud State seniors Matt Siegle (Long Prairie) and Pat Weihert (Watertown, WI) will captain the 2005-06 Huskies.

AMERICAN FAMILY INSURANCE HUSKY HOOPSTER CLASSIC: For the first time in the Kevin Schlagel head coaching era, the Huskies hosted a four team classic. SCSU unveiled the American Family Insurance Husky Hoopster Classic on December 9 & 10 at Halenbeck Hall. Concordia, St. Paul posted a 2-0 record in the Classic with a 91-69 win over St. John's and an 86-46 victory over Johnson & Wales. The Huskies and St. John's posted 1-1 records and SCSU defeated Johnson & Wales 90-40 and lost to SJU 72-67. Johnson & Wales went 0-2 in the Classic

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

SCSU HEAD COACH KEVIN SCHLAGEL: Kevin Schlagel (St. Cloud State, 1976) is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Huskies. **He has a current won/loss record of 166-74 overall in his eight seasons with the Huskies.** He has produced the third most wins all-time among SCSU men's basketball coaches, behind Butch Raymond (231) and Red Severson (209). Schlagel collected his 150th career win on Jan. 4 against Trinity College. He has also compiled an 82-50 record in NCC games in eight seasons (includes 2004-05 record), two Wells Fargo Finals Championships in 2001 and 2003, and a regular season NCC title in 2003. Schlagel was voted the 2003 NCC Coach of the Year. Three times he has led the Huskies to the NCAA tournament and is 2-3 in tournament games coached. Prior to becoming the head coach, Schlagel was the top SCSU assistant coach for 17 seasons.



ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: Coach Matt Reimer (Central College) is in his ninth season as the top assistant to Coach Schlagel. Reimer also served for two seasons as a graduate assistant coach under Butch Raymond in 1995-96 and 1996-97, bringing his overall experience with the Huskies to ten seasons. Prior to SCSU, Reimer served as an assistant basketball coach at New London-Spicer High School for four seasons. Cory Schlagel (St. Thomas Univ.) returns for his second season as a graduate assistant coach with the Huskies. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Schlagel was an assistant baseball and girls basketball coach, and math teacher at Rush City High School. Andrew Cone will also assist the Huskies. He is a former South Dakota State player and graduate assistant coach for the Jackrabbits. Cone played on four NCAA tournament and two North Central Conference Championship teams.

SCSU LAST WEEK: The Huskies posted a 1-1 record last week with a 67-57 loss at Southwest Minnesota State and a 73-65 win against the University of Minnesota-Crookston at home.

At Southwest Minnesota State, the Mustangs led 32-24 at half-time and SCSU had two short lived leads in the first half. The Huskies led 11-10 at the 12:29 mark and 13-12 at the 11:50 mark but were never able to regain a lead. Southwest Minnesota State led by 23 points, 59-36 midway through the second half. St. Cloud State chipped away at the Mustang lead in the final nine minutes with four three-point baskets and five-of-eight shooting from the free throw line. Southwest Minnesota State had four starters score in double figures led by Chad Orum with a game high 15 points. The Mustangs out-rebounded SCSU 32-26 and shot 47 percent from the field including 54.2 percent in the first half. St. Cloud State was led by senior center Matt Siegle (Long Prairie) with 12 points and five rebounds. Sophomore guard Dusty Wabiszewski (Appleton, WI) scored 11 points.

St. Cloud State held off a tenacious University of Minnesota-Crookston to end a two-game losing streak with a 73-65 home victory last Saturday. The Huskies and Golden Eagles traded leads early in the game but two free throws by SCSU junior forward Kelly Byrne (Ozark, MO) midway through the first half put the Huskies up 17-15 and they never trailed after that. SCSU led 41-26 at the half as sophomore guard Eric Greene (Kingston, WI) nailed a three-point basket at the buzzer. SCSU's largest lead of the game was 18 points, 59-41, at the 7:41 mark of the second half. UMC trimmed the lead to six, 68-62, with :34 seconds left in the game on a run that included nine points from junior forward Maurice Mobley. The Huskies went to the line six times in the final 33 seconds. Mobley led all players with 25 points and eight rebounds. St. Cloud State was led by Greene with 15 points, on five-of-five shooting from three point the range. The five three-point baskets are a career high for Greene, who played 15 minutes. Sophomore guard David Dreas (Winona) had 14 points and Byrne rounded out the Huskies in double figure scoring with 12 points.

HUSKY NOTES:

Sophomore guard David Dreas (Winona), junior forward Adam Sullivan (Green Bay, WI) and senior center Matt Siegle (Long Prairie) have started all 11 games for the Huskies this season.

Dreas leads the Huskies in scoring with 17.9 points per game and minutes played with a 31.3 per game average. He has scored in double figures nine times this season, including a season and career high 28 points against Dakota State. He established a career high with ten assists against Glenville State earlier this season. This week he leads the NCC in steals, is second in free throw shooting percentage, third in scoring, and fourth in field goal percentage and assists.

Siegle leads the team in rebounding with 6.5 rebounds per game and is second in team scoring with 11.8 points per game. He has scored in double figures eight times this season and posted his first double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds against St. John's. He had a career high five blocked shots against Johnson & Wales on Dec. 9. He ranks second in the NCC in blocked shots and fourth in rebounding. He has 12 blocked shots this season.

Sullivan is averaging 10.2 points and 4.7 rebounds per game for the Huskies. He equalled his season and career high with seven rebounds against Minnesota-Crookston last Saturday.

First year guard Bobby Morrow (St. Paul) has started the last two games for the Huskies. Against SWMSU he scored eight points and had one rebound. In his start against UMC, he dropped in four points and had six rebounds. He is averaging 4.4 points per game and 2.6 rebounds. He averaged 20 minutes on the court in his two starts.

First year forward Craig Coenen (Kaukauna, WI) earned his first collegiate start last Saturday and produced eight points and seven rebounds. The seven rebounds equalled his season high on the year. He has played in all 11 games and averages 14.3 minutes of playing time.

Sophomore guard Eric Greene (Kingston, WI) knocked down a career high five three-point baskets on five-of-five shooting against UMC on Saturday. His 15 points were one short of his career high 16. Greene is averaging 8.1 points per game.

OPPONENT NOTES: Concordia, St. Paul has won three straight games, including a 77-74 win over North Central Conference member Minnesota Duluth on Dec. 16. The Golden Bears have played three NCC teams, and posted wins over Augustana 66-45 and UMD, and losing to Minnesota State 78-95. Three players are averaging in double figures for CSP, led by Ty Thomas with 16.7 points and 6.1 rebounds.

Colorado State-Pueblo is a member of the Rocky Mountain Conference. The Thunderwolves are 3-3 over their last six games including a 1-2 record in league play. CSU has losses to UNO and USD of the NCC and lost to Concordia, St. Paul 42-57 on Dec. 3. Steve Raquet is the leading scorer and rebounder with 15.1 points and 12.4 rebounds.

Wayne State has lost four straight games. The Wildcats opened the season with an 80-78 win over the Huskies at the Minnesota State Tip-Off Classic and lost 73-41 the following night to MSU. Wayne then defeated Nebraska-Kearney 76-74 before hitting their current losing streak. Among the losses is a 71-60 contest to the University of South Dakota. The Wildcats are led in scoring by Tom Sherlock who averages 11.4 points and 7.4 rebounds.

TEAM NOTES: The Huskies ended a two game losing streak Saturday with a 73-65 win over Minnesota-Crookston. SCSU had not lost back-to-back non-conference games since the 2003-04 season when the Huskies lost at Southwest Minnesota State (70-84) and at Northern Michigan (80-81). Eleven of the current Huskies on the roster are in their first or second year of experience at SCSU. SCSU out rebounded UMC on Saturday, marking the fourth game this season where the Huskies have had more rebounds than their opponents. SCSU has a slight overall rebounding edge, 34.7 to 34.4 this season.
