David Dreas Named All-NCC:

Sioux Falls, S.D. – St. Cloud State University men's basketball senior guard David Dreas has been named today Mar. 11, to the All-North Central Conference team for the third consecutive season. Dreas is the only three-time honoree on the 11-member team.

A Winona native, Dreas finished his senior campaign scoring 17.8 points per game, which at seasons end, was the best mark in the NCC. In conference games he was just as dominant scoring 17.0 points per game, which was fourth in league games.

Dreas's season stat line also included a 40% standard from behind the arc where he made a team high 73 three-pointers, a 76% mark shooting from the field, 3.1 rebounds per game, 75 assists, and 58 steals.

In conference play his .815 free throw percentage ranked him eighth in the league and his 28 three-point baskets made was good enough for second.

The signature game of the season for Dreas came on Jan. 26 on the road against Minnesota Duluth where he poured in 31 points to lead the Huskies in a come from behind 82-73 win. The 31 points was a season high for Dreas and the Huskies, and 21 came in the second half on 6-6 shooting, including 3-3 from the three-point line, as SCSU erased a four-point halftime deficit and scored 50 second half points to earn the win.

15 times this season he led the Huskies in scoring and finished in double figures in all but four games. On 14 occasions he scored 20 points or better. Throughout the season Dreas was climbing up the SCSU career scoring chart, to his final spot at second place all-time. Just the second player in team history to score 1,800 career points, Dreas finishes with 1,802.

Also this season he became the school leader in career three-point baskets made and attempted. Dreas hit 250 of 623 career three-point baskets to become the most prolific Husky form behind the arc. He finishes his career in the top-10 of nearly every statistical category.

The Huskies finished the 2007-08 season with a 17-11 overall record and a 5-7 mark in the North Central Conference.

St. Cloud State University is the largest member of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MnSCU) system. Founded in 1869, and located in St. Cloud, Minn. along the banks of the scenic Mississippi River, SCSU boasts an enrollment of 16,000 students and is a member of NCAA Division II athletics where they compete in the North Central Conference (NCC).
