North Central Conference Action: St. Cloud State (14-4, 2-2 NCC) will return home for a North Central Conference doubleheader against the University of Nebraska-Omaha (16-3, 2-2 NCC) on Thursday, January 27, at 8:00 p.m. at Halenbeck Hall. On Saturday, January 29, the Huskies will travel to the University of Minnesota Duluth (10-10, 2-3 NCC) for more league action. The tip-off is scheduled for 8:00 p.m. at Romano Gymnasium on the UMD campus.

Series Record: Thursday will mark the 50th meeting between the Huskies and UNO Mavericks. SCSU leads the all-time series 28-21. Last year, UNO swept the Huskies, winning in Omaha 78-69 and in St. Cloud 77-67. St. Cloud State is 37-28 all-time against UMD, including a 75-71 win earlier in January against the Bulldogs. The Huskies have won four straight in the UMD series.

On the Radio: This week's basketball will air on AM 1240 WJON. Sports Director Jay Caldwell will call the action. Head Coach: Kevin Schlagel (St. Cloud State, 1976) is in his eighth season as the head coach of the Huskies. He has a current won/loss record of 152-66 overall in his seven plus seasons with the Huskies. Schlagel collected his 150th career win on Jan. 4 against Trinity College. He has also compiled a 75-45 record in NCC games (thru seven seasons), two Wells Fargo Finals Champoinships in 2001 and 2003, and a regular season NCC title in 2003. Schlagel was voted the 2003 NCC Coach of the Year. Three times he has led the Huskies to the NCAA tournament and is 2-3 in tournament games coached. Prior to becoming the head coach, Schlagel was the top SCSU assistant coach for 17 seasons.



Kevin Schlagel Show: Listen to the Kevin Schlagel Show every Thursday afternoon at 4:40 on WJON AM 1240. The show is aired weekly and features SCSU head coach Kevin Schlagel and WJON Sports Director Jay Caldwell.

Assistant Coaching Staff: Matt Reimer (Central College) is in his eighth season as the top assistant to Coach Schlagel. Reimer also served for two seasons as a graduate assistant coach under Butch Raymond in 1995-96 and 1996-97, bringing his overall experience with the Huskies to nine seasons. Prior to SCSU, Reimer served as an assistant basketball coach at New London-Spicer High School for four seasons. Cory Schlagel (St. Thomas Univ.) begins his first season as a graduate assistant coach with the Huskies. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Schlagel was an assistant baseball and girls basketball coach, and math teacher at Rush City High School.

Team Captains: Senior guard Nate Miller (Little Falls) and senior forward Steve Trull (Crystal Lake, IL) will serve as the Husky captains in 2004-05.

Last Year in the NCC: The Huskies posted a 17-11 overall record and finished tied for fifth in the North Central Conference with a 7-7 record. The University of Nebraska-Omaha won both the NCC regular season (10-4) and the NCC Wells Fargo Finals.

Miller Moves Up the Charts: Senior guard Nate Miller (Little Falls) led the Huskies last Saturday in their 83-77 loss at North Dakota. Miller had a team high 17 points and four assists. He played in his 105th career game and made his 57th career start at UND. Miller has played in every game of his collegiate career and made 54 straight starts. Miller leads the Huskies in scoring, averaging 17.4 ppg and steals with 44. He scored a season high 28 points in the SCSU win at Wayne State on 1/2/05 and has scored in double figures 15 times this season. Miller became the 30th member of the SCSU 1,000 point club on November 27th against Michigan Tech and currently has 1,237 points in his career with the Huskies, which ranks him 17th all-time. Miller also ranks among the career leaders in three-point field goals made, assists, and steals. Miller currently ranks second in career steals with 196, fifth in three-point field goals made with 165, and tenth in assists with 313. This week, Miller leads the NCC in assist/turnover ratio and minutes played. He is second in steals, third in assists, fourth in scoring, and fifth in three-point field goals made.

Top Gun Trull: Senior forward Steve Trull (Crystal Lake, IL) had another solid NCC outing with 16 points and four rebounds against UND on Saturday. He is averaging 13 points in league outings and has scored in double figures in three straight games. Trull has started in 77 straight games for the Huskies and played in 98 career games. He started all the games of the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons. He has held a shooting percentage of 57 percent or better throughout his career with his current career mark at 62.3 percent. This week Trull leads the NCC in field goal shooting percentage at .710, and is fourth in minutes played. Trull is a two-time NCC Player of the Week this year. He earned the honor last week (Jan. 11) and Jan. 3. Overall, Trull is averaging 10.5 points and a team high 6.3 rebounds. He has scored in double figures in ten games this season.

Siegle Second in Scoring: Junior center Matt Siegle (Long Prairie) was one of four starters to score in double figures for the Huskies against UND on Saturday. He finished the game with 13 points. He is second in SCSU scoring this week, averaging 11.3 points per game. He also averages 4.1 rebounds. Earlier in the season he pulled down a career high 12 rebounds against Minnesota-Crookston on December 1. Siegle also had a career scoring night when he scored a career high 40 points in the SCSU win over St. Michael's. His 40 points was the first for a Husky since Nate Miller scored 41 points against Central Washington University on November 22, 2003. He has scored in double figures in four of the Huskies last five games. This week, he ranks sixth in the NCC in steals.

Sullivan Slowed Down: Sophomore guard Adam Sullivan (Green Bay, WI) returned to the starting line-up Saturday night after missing a start at Augustana with a sore back. Sullivan has started in 14 games for the Huskies and averages 7.7 points. He had a season and career high 17 points against Bemidji State and pulled in a career high seven rebounds against Upper Iowa University.

Hanson Hits Career High: Sophomore forward Matt Hanson (Plymouth) led the Huskies with 17 points against UND on Saturday night. He was six of 12 from the field and two-of-four from three-point range. He is averaging 10.3 points per game and has made 17 starts. Hanson scored a career high 19 points in the Huskies 79-60 win at Augustana earlier this year. He scored his first double-double of the season (18 pts, 11 reb.) against Northern Michigan on Dec. 30. Hanson has scored in double figures in four straight games. He leads the NCC in three-point field goal shooting percentage (.750), is fifth in field goal percentage, seventh in rebounding, eighth in scoring, and ninth in minutes played.



Evans Hot Off the Bench: Senior forward Brad Evans (Appleton, WI) has been a solid player off the bench for the Huskies. On Saturday, he dropped in eight points on three-of-six field goal shooting in 11 minutes off the bench. He has scored in double figures in three of the Huskies last five games. He scored a season high 12 points and eight rebounds against UMD. Evans is averaging 5.5 points and 3.6 rebounds. He ranks second in the NCC in three points field goal percent shooting with a .700 mark.

Weekend Replay: University of North Dakota senior center Todd Rypkema scored 26 points and 11 rebounds to lead UND past St. Cloud State University 83-77 in North Central Conference men's basketball action Saturday night in Grand Forks. All five UND starters scored in double figures in a game which UND led 37-33 at the half. SCSU led by as many as six points in the first half but a 17-7 UND run gave the home team the half time lead.

The game stayed close throughout the second half as twice St. Cloud State cut the UND lead to one point, the last time at the 6:21 mark. UND went on a 20-6 run to lead 81-66 with :45 seconds left in the game. SCSU cut the UND lead with several quick baskets but time ran out on the Huskies. Four SCSU starters scored in double figures led by senior guard Nate Miller (Little Falls) and sophomore forward Matt Hanson (Plymouth) with 17 points each. Senior forward Steve Trull (Crystal Lake, IL) added 16 points and junior center Matt Siegle (Long Prairie) notched 13 points. North Dakota shot 60 percent from the field. Forward Mike Johnson had 11 points and ten rebounds.

Husky Team Notes: The Huskies are 6-0 at home this season. SCSU is 86-23 on its home court since Schlagel became the head coach in 1997-98. SCSU is averaging 77.9 points per game and 35.0 rebounds per game. The Huskies are allowing an average of 67.8 points and 34.2 rebounds per outing. SCSU is a solid shooting team, making 48.4 percent of their shots from the field, including 38.9 percent from three-point range. The Huskies have shot over 45 percent from the field in 12 games this season. Only two opponents have shot over 50 percent from the field against the Huskies this season. New Mexico Highlands shot 50 percent for the game, which the Huskies won 92-78 and North Dakota shot 60 percent in last Saturday's game. SCSU has made a season high 11 three-point baskets twice this season, against New Mexico Highlands and Augustana College.

Huskies in the NCC: After four league games, SCSU leads the NCC in field goal percentage with a .465 mark and turnover margin.

Nebraska-Omaha posted a 14-1 non-conference record with the lone Maverick loss to Colorado State. Since opening NCC play, UNO has defeated Augustana, lost back-to-back games to North Dakota, and beat South Dakota for a 2-2 league mark. UNO leads the NCC in scoring defense, blocked shots and steals. Senior guard Abdul Mills leads the Mavericks in scoring, averaging 12.8 points per game. Junior forward Ryan Curtis is the top rebounder with 6.9 per game. Senior center Levy Jones has 27 blocked shots and junior center Chris DeSpain 19.

Since playing at St. Cloud State on January 8, the Bulldogs have won three of four games, including a 74-73 win over South Dakota last Saturday night. Junior guard Sean Seaman leads the Bulldogs in scoring, averaging 17.6 points per game. He is shooting 50.8 percent from the field and 50.6 percent from three-point range (40-79). Junior forward John Emerson averages 16.2 points per game. Sophomore forward Bryan Foss leads the team in rebounding with 7.5 boards per game and averages 10.9 points.
