Bringing in the New Year: St. Cloud State (9-2) will bring in the New Year with three non-conference games starting Thursday, December 30 when the Huskies host Northern Michigan University (4-5) at 7:00 p.m. at Halenbeck Hall. On Sunday, January 2, SCSU will play at Wayne State College Wayne, Nebraska, in an 8:00 p.m. tip-off. On Tuesday, January 4, the Huskies return to Halenbeck Hall for a non-conference match-up with Trinity College of North Dakota. Game time is 7:30 p.m.

January 4 Pre-lim Game: On January 4, a high school preliminary game will be played prior to the Husky game. St. Cloud Tech High School and St. Cloud Cathedral High School will tip-off at 6:00 p.m. at Halenbeck Hall. A ticket to the Husky game is also valid for the high school prelim game.

Series Record: St. Cloud State and Northern Michigan have played ten times since the 1954-55 season. NMU leads the all-time series 6-4. Last year at Northern Michigan, the Wildcats posted an 81-80 victory. The Huskies and Wayne State have played four times, with SCSU holding a 3-1 advantage. Last season SCSU posted a 72-71 win. The Huskies and Trinity College will be playing for the first time.

On the Radio: All three games will be aired on the radio. The Northern Michigan match-up on Dec. 30th will be aired on WJON AM 1240 Radio with Sports Director Jay Caldwell calling all of the action. The January 2nd game will air on AM 1390 The Fan, and the Jan. 4th game will return to WJON AM 1240. The games can also be heard via the web at www.wjon.com or they can be accessed from the St. Cloud State athletics web site at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics by clicking on the Listen to Husky Sports! icon. The pre-game show begins ten minutes prior to tip-off.

2003-04 Record: The Huskies posted a 17-11 overall record and finished tied for fifth in the North Central Conference with a 7-7 record. SCSU won nine of their first ten games in 2003-04 but lost five of their last seven to end the season.

Next Up: The Huskies will open the North Central Conference portion of the SCSU schedule on Saturday, January 8 against the University of Minnesota Duluth at Halenbeck Hall. Game time is 8:00 p.m.

Head Coach: Kevin Schlagel (St. Cloud State, 1976) is in his eighth season as the head coach of the Huskies. He has a current won/loss record of 147-64 overall in his seven plus seasons with the Huskies. He has also compiled a 75-45 record in NCC games, two Wells Fargo Finals Championships in 2001 and 2003, and a regular season NCC title in 2003. Schlagel was voted the 2003 NCC Coach of the Year. Three times he has led the Huskies to the NCAA tournament and is 2-3 in tournament games coached. Prior to becoming the head coach, Schlagel was the top SCSU assistant coach for 17 seasons.



Assistant Coaching Staff: Matt Reimer (Central College) is in his eighth season as the top assistant to Coach Schlagel. Reimer also served for two seasons as a graduate assistant coach under Butch Raymond in 1995-96 and 1996-97, bringing his overall experience with the Huskies to nine seasons. Prior to SCSU, Reimer served as an assistant basketball coach at New London-Spicer High School for four seasons. Cory Schlagel (St. Thomas Univ.) begins his first season as a graduate assistant coach with the Huskies. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Schlagel was an assistant baseball and girls basketball coach, and math teacher at Rush City High School.

The Huskies Last Week: St. Cloud State went 2-0 with wins at Upper Iowa University, 83-60 on Dec. 14 and a 67-62 home win over Concordia-St. Paul on Dec. 20. Senior guard Nate Miller (Little Falls) nailed a jumper with :21 seconds left and first year guard David Dreas (Winona) made two free throws with :06 seconds remaining to secure the Husky win over Concordia-St. Paul. The Huskies had double figure scoring from junior forward Pat Weihert (Watertown, WI) who sparked SCSU off the bench with 15 points and five rebounds. He was three of three in three-point field goals. Miller dropped in 13 points and senior forward Brad Evans (Appleton, WI) had 13 points. Hanson led all players with a career high 11 rebounds and tallied six points. The Huskies made seven of 11 three-point field goals and shot 63.6 percent from beyond the arc. Men's Basketball Wins at Upper Iowa Tuesday, December 14, 2004

Against Upper Iowa junior forward Joe Evert (Wanamingo) scored the go ahead basket on a jumper at 15:52 of the first half and the Huskies led 42-28 at the half. Miller led the Huskies in scoring with 18 points and four assists. Three other Huskies scored in double figures as sophomore forward Matt Hanson (Plymouth) dropped in a season high 15 points and nine rebounds. Dreas shot four of six from the field, including three of four from three point range to finish the game with 12 points. Sophomore guard Adam Sullivan (Green Bay, WI) added ten points and a career high seven rebounds.

Huskies Picked Third in NCC Men's Basketball Media Poll

Sioux Falls, SD - Minnesota State is the favored team to win the North Central Conference men's basketball championship in a preseason poll of the media.

The Mavericks posted a 2003-04 record of 18-10 overall and 7-7 in the NCC and advanced to the Wells Fargo Finals.

Nebraska-Omaha, second in the media voting totals, won the North Central Conference regular season and the Wells Fargo Finals. UNO advanced to the NCAA North Central Region tournament before falling to league foe South Dakota.

Fifteen media members responded to the 29th annual poll. Minnesota State was chosen as the champions by nine of the poll participants, finished second on three ballots, third on two ballots and sixth on one ballot. Nebraska-Omaha garnered three first-place votes while South Dakota had two first-place votes and North Dakota was picked first on one ballot.

Non-conference action opens on November 15. Conference play opens Thursday, January 6th.

2004 All-Tournament Team Honors: Nate Miller (Chuck Stephens Memorial Classic All-Tournament team in Pueblo and American Family Insurance Classic All-Tournament team in Duluth). Matt Siegle (American Family Insurance Classic All-Tournament team in Duluth).

Miller Nails 1,000: Miller became the 30th member of the SCSU 1,000 point club on November 27th against Michigan Tech. Miller currently has 1,124 points in his career with the Huskies. Miller also ranks among the career leaders in three-point field goals made, assists, and steals. Miller currently ranks fourth in career steals with 172, sixth in three-point field goals made with 153, and 11th in assists with 287. Miller has played in every game of his collegiate career, a total of 98, and has started in 50 of those games. He has made 47 straight starts. Miller leads the Huskies in scoring with 16.6 points per game. He has scored in double figures a team high nine times this season and has a season high 27 points against Minnesota-Crookston. He has scored in double figures in the last four Husky games.

Career Boards For Siegle: Siegle pulled down a career high 12 rebounds against Minnesota-Crookston on December 1. Siegle also had a career scoring night when he scored a career high 40 points in the SCSU win over St. Michael's. His 40 points was the first for a Husky since Nate Miller scored 41 points against Central Washington University on November 22, 2003. Siegle is averaging 14.4 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. He injured his ankle in the game against Bemidji State and has missed three games since the injury.

70 Starts For Trull: Senior forward and co-captain Steve Trull has started in 70 straight games for the Huskies. He started all the games of the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons. He currently has a career field goal shooting percentage of 61.2 percent and if he maintains or increases that mark will become the career record holder. Through 11 games this season, Trull is shooting 74.5 percent (35-47) from the field. Trull is averaging 8.5 points and 5.9 rebounds this season.

Eight Straight for Sullivan: Sophomore guard Adam Sullivan (Green Bay, WI) has made eight straight starts for the Huskies. He ranks third in team scoring, averaging 9.8 points and is second on the team in blocked shots with four. He pulled in a career high seven rebounds against Upper Iowa University. He accumulated 17 points and ten rebounds in the Huskies last two games.

Hanson in the Hunt: Sophomore forward Matt Hanson (Plymouth) has made ten starts for the Huskies this season. He is averaging 8.3 points and 5.9 rebounds, and is shooting 50.7 percent from the field. Hanson scored a career high 15 points versus Upper Iowa and had a career high 11 rebounds against Concordia-St. Paul.

Evert Gets Start: Senior forward Joe Evert (Wanamingo) has made three straight starts, replacing the injured Matt Siegle. In those three starts, he has scored ten points, brought down ten rebounds and handed out nine assists. He is shooting 52.4 percent from the field.

Dreas Gives an Assist: First year guard David Dreas (Winona) handed out a career high ten assists against St. Michael's earlier this season. He also had nine assists against St. John's. Dreas leads the team in assists with a season total of 40 and is second on the team in steals with 11. He scored a season and career high 12 points in the Husky win at Upper Iowa.



Career Highs: Several Huskies tallied career highs last week. Dreas notched ten points against Upper Iowa. Sullivan gained a career high seven rebounds against UIU. Junior guard Pat Weihert (Watertown, WI) had a career high 15 points off the bench against UIU. Matt Hanson had back-to-back career highs, as he scored 15 points vs. UIU and 11 rebounds vs. CSP. Sophomore center Eric Bergstrom (Milaca) had a career high eight points and four rebounds against Upper Iowa.

Husky Notes: St. Cloud State has won four straight games and six of the last seven games. The Huskies are 3-0 at home this season. SCSU is averaging 73.0 points per game and 34.1 rebounds per game. The Huskies are allowing an average of 64.8 points and 33.0 rebounds per outing. SCSU is a good shooting team, making 47.4 percent of their shots from the field, including 39.8 percent from three-point range. The Huskies have shot over 50 percent from the field in five games this season, including three of their last four games. Only one opponent has shot over 50 percent from the field against the Huskies this season. New Mexico Highlands shot 50 percent for the game, which the Huskies won 92-78.

About Northern Michigan: The Wildcats are a NCAA Division II member of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Conference, and have a 4-5 record this season. NMU has won three of its last four games including two straight wins over Northland Baptist, 87-61, and St. Norbert, 69-67, heading into the contest with SCSU. They have suffered losses to Michigan Tech, 54-55 and Minnesota Duluth, 70-57, two common opponents of the Huskies. NMU is led in scoring by sophomore forward Ricky Volcy who averages 19.0 points and 7.4 rebounds per game. NMU averages 70.0 points per game and allows 62.8. NMU is out rebounding its opponents 37.3 to 31.9. Last season, the Wildcats posted a 16-12 overall record and finished third in the GLIAC with a 10-8 mark. Three starters return from last year's squad. NMU is coached by Dean Ellis in his 19th season with the Wildcats.

About Wayne State: The Wayne State Wildcats are a NCAA Division II member of the Northern Sun Conference. Wayne State is 3-5 overall heading into the week. WSC will play South

Dakota and Nebraska-Omaha on December 28 and 29 before hosting the Huskies. The Wildcats last game was a 79-72 victory over Augustana College on Dec. 18. WSC has four players averaging in double figures led by senior center Brett Cain with 15.8 points, senior forward Brett Watson 15.4 points, senior forward Todd Klosterman with 11.9 points and a team high 6.1 rebounds, and junior guard Dusty Smith with 10.8 points. Last year WSC posted a 14-14 overall record and finished fifth in the NSC with a 8-8 mark. The Wildcats return four starters from that team. Wayne State head coach Rico Burkett is in his fifth season with the Wildcats and has a four-year record of 50-63.

About Trinity College: Trinity Bible College is located in Ellendale, North Dakota and is a member of the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA). The Lions enter the week with a 5-8 overall record and will play at Concordia-St. Paul on Jan. 3 prior to their contest with the Huskies.
