David Dreas Honored By NCC:

Sioux Falls, S.D. – St. Cloud State senior guard David Dreas (Winona) was named North Central Conference men's basketball player of the week today, announced by the league office.

This is the second honor of the season for Dreas, as he was first named on Jan. 7, and the sixth in his career at St. Cloud State. It comes after a week where Dreas led the Huskies to two wins, and set a few SCSU season high marks along the way. In the Huskies 88-71 win over MSU Moorhead on Jan. 22 and their 82-73 win against Minnesota Duluth on Jan. 26 Dreas averaged 27.0 points, 5.5 assists, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 steals, and shot .581 from the field including .632 from behind the arc.

In the win over MSUM Dreas hit a SCSU season high seven three-pointers on his way to 23 points and handed out a season high nine assists along the way. He also led the Huskies to a season high 14 three-pointers made in the game.

This past Saturday against Minnesota Duluth, Dreas had possibly his best performance of the season scoring 31 points on 10-14 (.714) shooting, including 21 in the second half where the Huskies scored 50 points and erased a four-point halftime deficit.

Dreas is the second leading scorer in the NCC (18.5 ppg), less that a point behind first place but nearly two-points ahead of second place, and has been rising up the Huskies all-time scoring list where he currently sits in fourth place as one of just four Huskies all time to net over 1,600 career points.

Dreas has been the Huskies leading scorer for the past two season's and last season finished second in the NCC in scoring at 19.0 points per game, just a tenth of a point behind the league leader's 19.1. Following last season he was honored by being named All-NCC and second team All-North Central Region.

Next on the docket for the Huskies is a trip to Omaha, Neb. for a clash with #16 Nebraska-Omaha on Feb. 2 at 4:00 pm. This will be the first meeting of the season between the 14-5, 3-2 Huskies and the 16-3, 2-2 Mavericks.

St. Cloud State University is the largest member of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MnS-CU) system. Founded in 1869, and located in St. Cloud, Minn. along the banks of the scenic Mississippi River, SCSU boasts an enrollment of 16,000 students and is a member of NCAA Division II athletics where they compete in the North Central Conference (NCC).
