2006 NCAA DIVISION II ELITE EIGHT: For the second straight year, St. Cloud State University will participate in the NCAA Division II Elite Eight in Hot Springs, Arkansas. The 12th-ranked St. Cloud State Huskies (28-4) will play 20th-ranked Shaw University (29-4) on Wednesday, March 22 at 12 noon central time in the first quarterfinal game. The other quarterfinals will be played at 2:00, 6:00 and 8:00 p.m. The semifinals will be played on Thursday, March 23 at 7:00 and 9:30 p.m. The Championship game is scheduled for 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 25. The Elite Eight is hosted by Henderson State University.

Head Coach: Dr. Lori Ulferts (North Dakota, 1983) is in her twelfth season with the Huskies and 21st season as a collegiate head coach. **She has compiled a 190-149 record at SCSU and has amassed a career record of 340-238.** Dr. Ulferts recorded her 300th career win against the

University of Minnesota-Crookston on Dec. 19, 2004 with a 92-73 victory. Under her guidance, the Huskies will make back to back Elite Eight appearances. Last year, SCSU went 23-10, winning the 2005 North Central Region title and earning a berth at the NCAA Elite Eight, the first under Head Coach Ulferts and the fifth in school history. The Huskies were defeated by Merrimack College in the final seconds of the Quarterfinal game, falling 78-79. The Huskies also reached the NCAA North Central Region Tournament in 2000-01 but fell to the University of North Dakota in the semifinal round, 63-76. Before coming to St. Cloud, Ulferts coached at MN-Crookston (four seasons) and MN-State, Moorhead (five seasons). She is a two-time Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year.

Assistant Coaches: Mike Jewett is in his second year as Coach Ulferts' top assistant at SCSU. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Jewett was the head women's basketball coach at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana for 3 seasons (2001-2004), where he compiled a 62-20 overall record. In 2004 he led his team to the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament, won the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), and was named the HCAC Coach of the Year. Jewett has also served as an assistant coach at Augustana College and has high school head coaching experience. **Megan Taylor** (Iowa State, 2002) is in her second season as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU. At Iowa State, Taylor was a four-time All-Conference Player, an All-American, and in 1998 she was named the Big 12 Freshman of the year. She is the state of Minnesota's second leading scorer for girls' and boys' basketball with 3,300 career points. **Katie Huschle** is in her first season as a student assistant coach for the Huskies. Huschle was the third-leading scorer for SCSU last season, averaging 11.5 points, and led the team in steals with 67. Huschle became St. Cloud State's 22nd member of the 1,000 Point Club on March 4, 2005 against North Dakota. She wrapped up her career with 1,043 points scored.

Team Captains: Seniors Sascha Hansen (Marshall, MN) and April Carlson (Hugo, MN) are the Husky captains for 2005-06.

About St. Cloud State University: St. Cloud State is located in central Minnesota along the banks of the Mississippi river 75 miles northwest of the Twin Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul. SCSU is a member of the North Central Conference and NCAA Division II in all but two of its sports. In men's and women's ice hockey, SCSU is a member of the Western College Hockey Association (WCHA) and NCAA Division I. SCSU supports 21 sports teams, 11 women's and ten men's.

North Central Conference Finish: St. Cloud State finished second in the North Central Conference with a 9-3 record behind the University of North Dakota. UND finished the league race with a 12-0 record and went on to claim the NCC Wells Fargo Finals title. SCSU's league losses were to North Dakota twice and once to Augustana College.

Sixth NCAA Elite Eight Appearance: The 2006 NCAA Division II Elite Eight marks the second straight and sixth overall national tournament appearance for the Huskies. The Huskies advanced to the quarterfinals in 2005, 1989, 1985, 1984, and 1983. This is the second time that SCSU has played in an Elite Eight tournament under the current format. In the first four tournaments, SCSU played at the home sites of the competing teams. The Huskies are 0-5 in NCAA quarterfinal games. Last season, SCSU lost to Merrimack College 79-78. In 1989, SCSU lost to Central Missouri State, 87-71 in St. Cloud. In 1985, SCSU lost to Cal Poly Pomona, 71-59 in St. Cloud and Pomona went on to win the national championship. In 1984, SCSU lost at the University of Dayton, 80-56, and in 1983 lost to Central Missouri State, 65-63 in St. Cloud.

Six Region Titles: St. Cloud State's upset win over top ranked University of North Dakota, 75-69, on UND's home court marked the sixth NCAA regional championship for the Huskies. SCSU was the number three team in the region and advanced with wins over Augustana College, 82-69, and Concordia-St. Paul, 96-89. SCSU is 6-1 all-time in Region title games. Last year, the Huskies defeated Concordia-St. Paul, 81-70 for the trip to the Elite Eight. The Huskies won region titles in 2006, 2005, 1989, 1985, 1984, and 1983, and lost in the 1987 region championship game. SCSU has a 14-9 record in NCAA tournament regional and Elite Eight play.

The NCC in the Elite Eight: The North Central Conference is the only conference to advance a women's basketball team out of the North Central Region every year since the creation of the regional system in 1983 (23 years). In 1991 North Dakota State became the first NCC team to win the national championship. An NCC team appeared in 11 consecutive championship games from 1991 to 2001 and a conference school has won nine of the last 15 NCAA Division II titles. The last national champion from the NCC was South Dakota State in 2003. NDSU won five DII championships (1991, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996) and the University of North Dakota won three straight NCAA titles in 1997, 1998 and 1999. Both South Dakota State and North Dakota State have moved up to the NCAA Division I ranks.

Senior Sascha Hansen: Named Most Outstanding Player of the North Central Region Tournament...All-NCC in 2005 and 2006...three-year team captain...four-year starter...scored 28 points and had six assists in region championship game against North Dakota...NCC Player of the Week...averages 15.3 ppg...team leader in assists with 181...career three-point field goals made record holder...season record holder for three-point field goals made...Academic All-NCC and NCC Commissioner's Honor Roll...ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Second Team...Daktronics Inc., North Central Region Second Team...has made more career starts (119) than any other player in school history...surpassed the 1,000 point mark of her career this season and became one of just three players in school history to post over 1,000 points (1,354) and 400 (481) assists...career highs are 32 points (UMC, 12/11/04), 12 rebounds (SMSU, 12/7/04), and 12 assists (PLNU, 11/26/05).



Senior April Carlson: 2005-06 co-captain...has played in 119 career games...became a starter midway through sophomore season...will play in her 120th career game on Wednesday...has missed just one game in her career and has made 89 starts...averaging a career high 7.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per game this season...known for her defensive efforts on the hardcourt and is second on the team in steals with 49...posted career highs earlier this season with 18 points against Northern Michigan on November 25, 2005 and 12 rebounds against South Dakota on February 11, 2006.



Junior Shannon Francis: Francis is averaging 13.0 points and 4.7 rebounds for the Huskies this season...has climbed to the top of SCSU's career free throw percentage list with a mark of 87.3% after shooting 88.9% from the line this season...had a career high 29 points against Minnesota State on January 12, 2006...tied SCSU's single game free throw performance by hitting 11 of 11 shots against MSU...long range threat, having hit 53 three's this season and 144 in her career...nearing the 1,000 point career mark...currently at 981 career points...named to NCC Commissioner's Academic Honor roll.



Junior Erika Quigley: 2006 Daktronics Inc., North Central Region Player of the Year... All-North Central Region Tournament team in 2006 (named Most Outstanding Player in 2005 Region Tournament)...three-time All-NCC team selection...finalist for 2006 WBCA Kodak All-American honors...2005 WBCA Kodak All-American...five-time NCC Player of the Week in 2006...leads team in scoring and rebounding with 22.5 ppg and 12.8 rpg...set a new league record for junior rebounding with 13.3 rpg in the regular season...career figures have put her on top of both SCSU's career scoring average (21.5 ppg) and rebounding average (11.6 rpg) charts...career high scoring performance stands at 37 points against Southwest Minnesota State on December 7, 2004...recorded a career high 22 rebounds in the second game of the season against Wisconsin-Stout...currently ranks second all-time in scoring with 1,849 career points (career record is 2,349)...ranks second all-time in rebounding with 995 career boards (career record is 1,074)...will become third player in SCSU history to record over 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career.



HUSKY TEAM NOTES....

Opening Run: St. Cloud State started the season with a school record 17-0 run. The Huskies first loss of the season was a match up of two ranked and undefeated teams when the #2 University of North Dakota squad with a record of 20-0 visited #4 SCSU (17-0) at Halenbeck Hall on January 21. UND defeated the Huskies 66-58 in front of 4,871 fans. The 17-0 season opening win streak was the longest for SCSU since the 1998-99 season when the Huskies went 9-0. Following are SCSU's longest season opening streaks.

North Central Region Tournament Honors: Senior guard Sascha Hansen and junior center Erika Quigley were named to the 2006 North Central Region All-Tournament team. Hansen was voted the Most Outstanding Player of the Tournament. Quigley was named to the Region All-Tournament team for the second straight year and last season was named the Most Outstanding Player.

Daktronics Team Honors: Quigley was named the 2006 Daktronics Inc., All-North Central Region Player of the Year headlining the five member first team. Hansen was a second team pick. Quigley was named to the All-Region team for the third straight year.

All-NCC Huskies: Quigley and Hansen were named to the 2005-06 All-North Central Conference team. Quigley is a three-time All-NCC selection, while Hansen has received the honor twice in her career.

Academics: Senior guard Sascha Hansen was named to the 2006 Academic All-NCC team. Hansen is a two-time Academic All-NCC pick and a physical education major. She was also named to the 2006 NCC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll and to the ESPN The Magazine All-District Five Academic Second Team. Junior guard Shannon Francis was also named to the 2006 NCC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll.



Sophomore Kayla Rengel: Rengel completes SCSU's double-digit scoring list with 12.2 points per game...second in three-point percentage, connecting on 41.6% of three's this season...tops the career percentage chart, connecting on 43.0% of three's taken...leads the team in steals this season with 58...scored a career best 29 points against Augustana College on January 14, 2006...career high of 11 rebounds against MSU-Moorhead on December 22, 2005.



First Year Krystal Scott: Scott (Rosemount) is SCSU's first player off the bench this season and has seen playing time in all 32 games played...averaging 4.4 points and 2.1 rebounds per game...averages 17.0 minutes per game playing time...scored a career high 14 points against North Central University on November 22, 2005 and recently grabbed a career high six boards against Minnesota State on March 1, 2006.



First Year Brianna Nance: Nance (Minneapolis) has seen playing time in 29 games this season, averaging 8.5 minutes per game... has a 2.7 point-per-game scoring average...scored a career high 13 points in the first game of the season against Minnesota-Crookston on November 18, 2005.



First Year Heather Miller: Miller (Sun Prairie, WI) has played in 24 games this season and is averaging 2.0 points and 1.3 rebounds per game...has seen more playing time as the season has progressed...scored a career high six points twice this season, most recently against Nebraska-Omaha on February 9, 2006.



First Year Katie Jensen: Jensen (North English, IA) has played in 27 games this season and has made three starts...is averaging 2.4 points and 1.5 rebounds...has been strong from the charity stripe in her freshman campaign, sinking 86.7% of shots taken...career best figures come from a December 2, 2005 game against Waldorf College, when she scored seven points and had six rebounds.



First Year Jackie Carlson: Carlson (Litchfield, MN) leads all first-year players in minutes played (17.4) and scoring with 5.7 ppg...averages 5.3 rpg...reliable bench player who has played quality minutes for the Huskies...has scored a career high 13 points three times this season, most recently against South Dakota on February 25, 2006...has recorded two double-doubles this season, with 11 points and 10 rebounds on both occasions.



How SCSU Got Here: St. Cloud State defeated the University of North Dakota, 75-69 for the North Central Region title. UND and SCSU finished one and two in the North Central Conference. UND was the top seed in the North Central Region and SCSU was the third seed. The win brought an end to a 34 game win streak for UND this season. Prior to SCSU's victory, the Huskies had lost 14 straight games to UND and 20 straight in Grand Forks. The last SCSU win in Grand Forks was on Feb. 3, 1989. During the regular season, UND defeated SCSU 66-58 in St. Cloud and 74-63 in Grand Forks. Cloud State upset UND with a solid defensive effort, limiting UND to 36 percent shooting from the field and it's two leading scorers to 12 points combined. The Huskies shot 49 percent in the game and were led by the Most Outstanding Player of the region tournament, senior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall), with a game high 28 points and six assists. Junior center Erika Quigley (Duluth) added 20 points and 11 rebounds for the Huskies.

Nationally Ranked: The Huskies were ranked in the top 12 of the USA Today/ESPN Division Coaches poll all season long and ranked as high as #4 for four straight weeks. SCSU spent the whole season ranked second in the North Central Region, until the final region pairings, when the Huskies dropped to #3.

The Elite Eight Experience: Five current members of the SCSU roster, including three starters competed for the Huskies at last year's Elite Eight. The players making the return trip are seniors Sascha Hansen and April Carlson, juniors Erika Quigley and Shannon Francis, and sophomore Kayla Rengel. Hansen, Carlson, Quigley and Francis, were all starters last year in the quarterfinal game against Merrimack College. The fifth starter, Katie Huschle, is currently a student assistant coach with the Huskies and will be on the bench when SCSU tips off.

Four Returning: Of the eight participating teams, four are making a return trip from the 2005 Elite Eight. SCSU, Shaw, Charleston and Grand Valley State are the returning teams in 2006. All four teams lost in the quarterfinals a year ago. Of note, all four teams are paired against each other in the quarterfinal round of the 2006 tournament.

SCSU Against the Field: The only team SCSU has played in the field is Grand Valley State. SCSU leads that series 2-1.

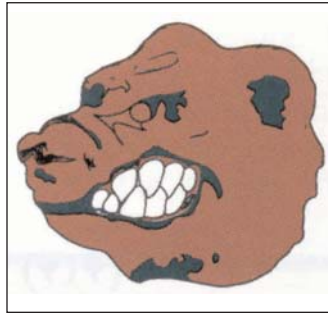

Head Coach: Shaw University head coach Jacques Curtis (Savannah State) is in his sixth season with the Lady Bears. He sports a current won/loss record of 140-46 at SU. He led SU to it's first ever Elite Eight last season. His team's have won 73 straight games in the CIAA including post season play. He was named the CIAA Coach of the Year this season.

Shaw Notes: Shaw University brings a 26-game winning streak into it's match-up with the Huskies on March 22. After starting the season with a 3-4 record, Shaw has been on a roll, winning it's fourth straight CIAA title with a 53-50 win over Johnson C. Smith University on March 4. The Lady Bears were the #1 seed in the South Atlantic Regional and defeated Newberry 53-50, North Carolina Central 80-65, and Wingate 67-64 to claim it's second straight trip to the Elite Eight. Shaw posted a 10-0 record in Eastern Division play in the CIAA. Senior guard Nastassi Boucicault is the lone returning starter from the 2005 Elite Eight team. Boucicault was named the 2005-06 Player of the Year in the CIAA and leads the Lady Bears in scoring with 15.4 points per game. She also leads the team in assists with 180 and steals with 106. Sophomore forward Nicky Souter leads the Lady Bears in rebounding with a 7.6 boards per game average and has started in 17 games. Sophomore Leslee Anderson was named the 2005 CIAA Rookie of the Year and this season has started 11 games and averages 8.0 points and 3.7 rebounds.
