NORTH CENTRAL REGION PLAYOFFS: The #3 seed St. Cloud State Huskies will face a familiar foe in #6 seed Augustana College in the first round of the NCAA Division II North Central Region Playoffs. The game will be held at the Betty Engelstad Center on Friday, March 10 and will tip off at 6:00 p.m. The second round will be played on Saturday, March 11 and the North Central Region Championship game will be played on Monday, March 13.

Head Coach: Dr. Lori Ulferts (North Dakota, 1983) is in her twelfth season with the Huskies and 21st season as a collegiate head coach. **She has compiled a 187-149 record at SCSU and has amassed a career record of 339-238.** Dr. Ulferts recorded her 300th career win against the University of Minnesota-Crookston on Dec. 19, 2004 with a 92-73 victory. Under her guidance, the Huskies went 23-10 last season, winning the 2005 North Central Region title and earning a berth at the NCAA Elite Eight, the first under Head Coach Ulferts and the fifth in school history. The Huskies were defeated by Merrimack College in the final seconds of the Quarterfinal game, falling 78-79. The Huskies also reached the NCAA North Central Region Tournament in 2000-01 but fell to the University of North Dakota in the semifinal round, 63-76. Before coming to St. Cloud, Ulferts coached at MN-Crookston (four seasons) and MN-State, Moorhead (five seasons). She is a two-time Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year.

Assistant Coaches: Mike Jewett begins his second year as Coach Ulferts' top assistant at SCSU. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Jewett was the head women's basketball coach at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana for 3 seasons (2001-2004), where he compiled a 62-20 overall record. In 2004 he led his team to the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament, won the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), and was named the HCAC Coach of the Year. Jewett has also served as an assistant coach at Augustana College and has high school head coaching experience. **Megan Taylor** (Iowa State, 2002) begins her second season as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU. At Iowa State, Taylor was a 4-time All-Conference Player, an All-American, and in 1998 she was named the Big 12 Freshman of the year. She is the state of Minnesota's second leading scorer for girls' and boys' basketball with 3,300 career points. **Katie Huschle** begins her first season as a student assistant coach for the Huskies. Huschle was the third-leading scorer for SCSU last season, averaging 11.5 points, and led the team in steals with 67. Huschle became St. Cloud State's 22nd member of the 1,000 Point Club on March 4, 2005 against North Dakota. She wrapped up her career with 1,043 points scored.

Team Captains: Seniors Sascha Hansen (Marshall, MN) and April Carlson (Hugo, MN) will serve as the Husky captains for 2005-06.

three-time All-NCC selection, while Hansen has received the honor twice in her career.

Huskies in the Nation: The Huskies rank among the top ten teams in the nation on four fronts:

Scoring Offense (2nd, 83.6 ppg),
 Scoring Margin (8th, +20.9),
 Field Goal Pct (8th, 46.8%)
 Three-Point Field Goal Pct (8th, 38.1%)

Several individual Husky players are featured as top national leaders in the following categories:

Quigley: Rebounding (4th, 12.7/g), Scoring (5th, 22.4 ppg), Blocked Shots (8th, 3.2/g), Field Goal Pct (31st, 54.2%).

Hansen: Assists (12th, 5.9/g), Three-Point FG Pct (17th, 41.3%).



Senior Sascha Hansen: With 116 games under her belt, senior Sascha Hansen (Marshall, MN) has made more career starts than any other player in school history. A three-time team captain, Hansen is currently SCSU's second-leading scorer, averaging 14.5 points and 5.9 assists per game. This season, Hansen surpassed the 1,000 point mark of her career, set a new school record for three-pointers made in a career, and became one of just three players in school history to post over 1,000 points and 400 assists. On her career record, Hansen has posted 1,287 points, 464 assists, and 169 three-pointers from 40.8% shooting. Her career highs are 32 points (UMC, 12/11/04), 12 rebounds (SMSU, 12/7/04), and 12 assists (PLNU, 11/26/05).



Senior April Carlson: 2005-06 co-captain April Carlson will play in her 117th career game on Friday night. She has missed just one game in her career and has made 86 starts. Carlson is averaging career high figures of 7.0 points and 4.9 rebounds per game this season. She is known for her defensive efforts on the hardwood and is second on the team in steals with 47. She posted career highs earlier this season with 18 points against Northern Michigan on November 25, 2005 and 12 rebounds against South Dakota on February 11, 2006.



Junior Shannon Francis: Junior Shannon Francis is averaging 13.3 points and 4.9 rebounds for the Huskies this season. She has climbed to the top of SCSU's career free throw percentage list with a mark of 86.3% after shooting 87.1% from the line this season. Francis had a career high 29 points against Minnesota State on January 12, 2006. In that game, Francis tied SCSU's single game free throw performance by hitting 11 of 11 shots from the charity stripe. Francis is also one of SCSU's greatest threats from long range, having hit 51 threes this season and 142 in her career.



Junior Erika Quigley: Quigley once again leads the Huskies in scoring and rebounding with averages of 22.4 points and 12.7 rebounds per game, double-doubling in 21 of SCSU's 29 games this season. She set a new league record for junior rebounding with 13.3 rpg in the regular season. Quigley's career figures have put her on top of both SCSU's career scoring average (21.4 ppg) and rebounding average (11.5 rpg) charts. Her career high scoring performance stands at 37 points against Southwest Minnesota State on December 7, 2004. She recorded a career high 22 rebounds in the second game of the season against Wisconsin-Stout.



Sophomore Kayla Rengel: Sophomore Kayla Rengel completes SCSU's double-digit scoring list with 12.2 points per game. She leads the team in three-point percentage, connecting on 43.0% of threes this season (among players with 10+ three-point field goals). She also tops the career percentage chart, connecting on 43.9% of threes taken. With 56 swipes, Rengel also leads the team in steals this season. Rengel scored a career best 29 points against Augustana College on January 14, 2006. She has tied her personal best of 10 rebounds twice this season.

Freshman Krystal Scott: Freshman Krystal Scott (Rosemount, MN) has been SCSU's first player off the bench this season and has seen playing time in all 29 games played. She is averaging 4.3 points and 2.2 rebounds per game. Scott leads all Husky newcomers in minutes played throughout the NCC play. She scored a career high 14 points against North Central University on November 22, 2005 and recently grabbed a career high 6 boards against Minnesota State on March 1, 2006.



Freshman Brianna Nance: Nance (Minneapolis, MN) has seen playing time in 27 games this season, averaging 9.1 minutes per game. She has a 2.9 point-per-game scoring average. Nance scored a career high 13 points in the first game of the season against Minnesota Crookson on November 18, 2005.



Freshman Heather Miller: Heather Miller (Sun Prairie, WI) has played in 22 games this season and is averaging 2.1 points and 1.3 rebounds per game. She has seen more playing time as the season has progressed and is often the third bench player to be used by St. Cloud State. Miller has scored a career high six points twice this season, most recently against Nebraska-Omaha on February 9, 2006.



Freshman Katie Jensen: Katie Jensen (North English, IA) has played in 36 games this season and has made three starts. She is averaging 2.5 points and 1.6 rebounds. She has been strong from the charity stripe in her freshman campaign, sinking 86.7% of shots taken. Her career best figures come from a December 2, 2005 game against Waldorf College, when she scored seven points and had six rebounds.



Freshman Jackie Carlson: Freshman Jackie Carlson (Litchfield, MN) has been one of SCSU's strongest newcomers this season, averaging 5.9 points and 5.4 rebounds in 29 games. She is a reliable bench player who has played quality minutes for the short Husky roster. As a forward, Carlson has shown that she operates on a long shooting range, having connected on four of nine three-point attempts this season. Carlson has scored a career high 13 points three times this season, most recently against South Dakota on February 25, 2006. She has recorded two double-doubles in her freshman year, with 11 points and 10 rebounds on both occasions.

Husky Replay:

The Huskies were knocked out of NCC tournament action in the semis for the second consecutive year, this time to a feisty Augustana College. As the game came down to the wire, the Vikings' penetration on offense and SCSU's lack of scoring ended any Husky hopes of winning an NCC title this season. AC scored 13 consecutive points in the paint in the final minutes as the Huskies struggled to score at all. SCSU put up just 12 points in the final nine minutes of the game, while Ashley Holiday and her Augie supporting cast advanced to the championship round with an 80-77 semifinal win.

The Huskies started the game in a much different fashion than they ended it. Junior Shannon Francis (Mahnomens, MN) hit back-to-back threes to put the Huskies up 12-6 six minutes into the game. The Vikings took advantage of mismatches to tighten the score to 19-16 midway through the half. Francis, with four threes and Quigley with 15 points in the first half kept the Huskies ahead, although they never managed a run to extend their lead. Augie shooters got wide open looks and transition points and tied the game at 31-31 with five minutes to play in the first half. AC's Ali Adamson put in a fast break layup just before the buzzer, setting the score at 42-38 in favor of SCSU at the half.

The Huskies came out, once again, firing from long range, connecting on three triples in the first five minutes of the second half. Ashley Holiday single-handedly kept the Vikings in the game with buckets down low, although SCSU took a 55-46 lead by the 15:36 mark. Augie went on a quick 14-2 run as the Huskies continually turned the ball over and went cold on offense. AC took their first lead of the game, 56-55, on a Mary Kelling jumper at the 12:18 mark. The lead changed hands several times before the Vikings took over for good, knocking the Huskies out of the race for the NCC Title 80-77.

The loss broke several undefeated trends for SCSU. Until this afternoon, the Huskies were 23-0 when leading at the half, 19-0 when out-rebounding the opponent, and 11-0 when making seven or more three-pointers. Against Augie, the Huskies were successful in all three of these areas, but could not pull off the win. Erika Quigley scored 27 points and had five assists, but with just seven boards, was kept from posting her 22nd double-double of the year. Francis was 5-of-6 from long range and had 17 points, while Kayla Rengel had 15 points. Sascha Hansen totaled eight assists.

The Huskies shot 46.3% from the field and hit 11 three-pointers, but turned the ball over 18 times.

All five of Augustana's starters finished the game in double digits for scoring. Holiday led the team with 22 points, 16 of which came in the second half. Holiday also led the team with eight rebounds. Jessica Klein was AC's second-leading scorer with 16 points. The Vikings shot 56.7% from the field in the second half, leading to their game total of 48.5%. They also came up with 11 steals.



SCSU and the Regional Teams

#1 North Dakota (32-0): One of just two undefeated teams in the country, North Dakota will likely be the team to beat. UND defeated the Huskies twice this season and was both the regular season and North Central Conference tournament champions. The team averages 82.5 points per game, with forwards Ashley Langen (16.5 ppg, 8.9 rpg) and Kristi Boese (15.3 ppg, 8.3 rpg) leading the way. If the chance arises, the Huskies will look to break a 14-game losing streak with UND, giving SCSU's seniors their first career win over the conference foe.

#2 Wayne State (27-3): Wayne State dropped just one conference matchup on their way to the Northern Sun Conference championship this season. The Wildcats control the ball well, averaging just 13.6 lost possessions per game. They are also a hustle team that has gained 323 steals in '05-'06. Hot-shooting guard Nicole Gruntorad leads the offensive attack with 13.5 points per game, while center Kristen Humphries brings in 11.7 ppg. The Huskies have not played Northern State since 1991 and hold a 4-1 lead in the series.

#4 Northern State (24-6): Northern State center Noelle Hall is the team's leading scorer and rebounder, with averages of 15.7 points and 8.3 rebounds per game. She has 53 blocked shots on the season and is shooting a team high 55.9% from the field. NSU is also led by guard Ali Chmeliewski with 10.7 ppg and 98 assists. The Huskies have only played the Wolves once, with NSU getting the win in 1995.

#5 Regis (26-5): Regis, the regular season RMAC champs, were knocked out of their conference tournament in the first round, losing to the #8 seed Colorado Mines. The Rangers make up for a lack of rebounding might by averaging 13.2 steals and 76.4 points per game. Junior guard Diana Lopez is the team's top player with 20.6 ppg and 112 steals on the season. The Huskies have never faced Regis in the hardwood.

#7 Concordia-St. Paul (19-10): Making their way to a fourth straight NCAA North Central Region appearance, the Golden Bears are led by two seniors and a sophomore, all of whom are averaging double digits in scoring. Guard Nakia Carlisle has the highest scoring average of 14.4 ppg, although fellow guard Ashley Smith has kicked her play up a notch in the end of the season to lead CSP in scoring five of the last six games, bringing her average up to 13.7 ppg. Forward Amanda Behnke puts in 11.9 ppg and leads the team on the boards with 6.3 rebounds per game. The Huskies lead the series with CSP by a margin of 8-4, gaining an 86-70 win earlier this season.

#8 Colorado State-Pueblo (19-11): SCU-Pueblo gained an NCAA Tournament berth by overcoming a six-seed RMAC regular season ranking on their way to the Championship title. The _ average 64.6 points and 32.0 rebounds per game and are on a current five-game winning streak. Lauren Westerman leads the team from the center position with 17.7 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. St. Cloud State and CSU-Pueblo have never played each other.

#6 Augustana College (21-9)



Augustana College secured their future in the NCAA Tournament by handing the Huskies an 80-77 blow in the semifinal round of the Wells Fargo Finals. The Vikings are one of just two teams to gain a win over the Huskies this season, posting W's in two out of three meetings in 2005-06. Augie's big players killed SCSU in the second half of their last meeting and will look to do the same this weekend. Ashley Holiday, averaging 9.7 points per game this season, did the majority of the damage, scoring 16 second half points on her way to a game total of 22. She also led the team with eight rebounds. Fellow forward Jessica Klein added 16 points and six assists.

Augustana is a relatively small, but quick squad that runs the floor well and has a history of hanging tough with the Huskies. Augie shoots a low 40.9% from the field, but makes up for their lack of offense with tough defense. They have kept opponents to just 37.0% shooting from the field and a low 31.0% from long range. They average 5.9 blocked shots per game, led by Holiday with 71. They are also successful in getting picks, averaging 12.7 steals per game, including 34 against the Huskies this season.

The Vikings are led by junior guard Ali Adamson with 13.7 points and 4.1 assists per game. Andrea Seefeldt has averaged 12.3 points per game, followed by Jessica Klein with 11.9. Ashley Holiday leads the team on the boards with an average of 6.9 rebounds per game and has played well against the Huskies this season, averaging 14.0 points per game. Augie's final starter, Chelsea DeVille is a redshirt freshman posting figures of 7.3 points and 2.9 assists per game.
