- ✓ Huskies and Jackrabbits are former members of the North Central Conference. The last time these teams met was during the 2003-04 season in NCC play. The teams split with SCSU winning 77-67 and SDSU winning 101-86.
- ✓ South Dakota State leads the all-time series since 1976, 30-22.
- ✓ St. Cloud State head coach Lori Fish and assistant coach Megan Vogel are former SDSU basketball standouts. Fish is a former assistant coach at SDSU and Vogel was a graduate assistant coach for the Jackrabbits during the 2007-08 season.
- ✓ Huskies are third-year members of the NCAA Division II Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC).
- ✓ South Dakota State is a member of the NCAA Division I Summit League.
- ✓ Huskies posted a 10-17 overall record in 2009-10 and finished 13th in the NSIC with a 5-15 mark.
- ✓ South Dakota State went 22-11 overall and 14-4 in The Summit League. The Jackrabbits won the Summit League postseason tournament and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the second straight year.
- ✓ The Huskies return 10 letterwinners from the 2009-10 season including five players with starting experience.
- ✓ South Dakota State returns nine letterwinners including three starters.
- ✓ The Jackrabbits are ranked 15th in the preseason Women's Mid-Major Top 25 poll sponsored by CollegeInsider.com released on Oct. 27.

Coaching Staff

Head Coach Lori Fish

Lori Fish begins her third season as head coach of the St. Cloud State women's basketball team and seventh overall as a collegiate coach in 2010-11.



Fish, a St. Cloud native, became the eighth coach in the history of the women's basketball program in July of 2008. She is very familiar with Husky basketball as she was an assistant coach under Dr. Lori Ulferts from 1999 to 2004.

In her first season with the Huskies, Fish guided St. Cloud State to a 22-9 overall record, won the 2009 NSIC Sanford Health Tournament Championship, and an NCAA Division II Central Region Tournament appearance.

In 2009-10, the Huskies went 10-17 overall and 5-15 in the NSIC.

Fish has compiled a six-year career record of 94-79. During her career she has coached teams that have made six NCAA Division II National Tournament appearances including the 2009 St. Cloud State women.

A familiar name to the St. Cloud area, Fish grew up in St. Cloud and attended St. Cloud Tech High School. Following her graduation from Tech, she went on to play basketball at South Dakota State and competed against the Huskies in the North Central Conference.

After assistant coaching stints at Eastern Illinois, South Dakota State and St. Cloud State, Fish was named the head coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato in 2004. She quickly

distinguished herself as a rising young coach and in 2007-08, her final season with the Mavericks, led her team to a 23-9 record and the championship game of the NCAA Division II North Central Region Tournament. She compiled a 62-53 won/loss record with the Mavericks.

Assistant Coaches

Megan Vogel joined the women's basketball staff on July 1, 2010.



A native of St. Peter, Minn., Vogel graduated from South Dakota State University with a degree in HPER and was a four-year standout on the basketball court for the Jackrabbits. Vogel left SDSU as the second leading scorer in school history with 1,850 points, third all-time in three-point field goals with 194, and fifth all-time in rebounds with 783. She led the Jackrabbits to their first ever Division I post season tournament, advancing to the WNIT quarterfinals.

Upon graduation from SDSU, Vogel was drafted 19th overall in the 2007 WNBA draft by the Washington Mystics. During her season with the

Mystics, Vogel assisted with scouting and film breakdown of opponents. In 2008, she played for WWK Donau Ries of the German 1st League and led her team in scoring and rebounding.

Vogel's coaching experiences include serving as a volunteer assistant at Minnesota State University, Mankato in 2009-10, as a volunteer assistant at St. Peter High School in 2009 and as a graduate assistant coach at South Dakota State during the 2007-08 season.

Alanna Wahl



completed her first season as a graduate assistant coach in 2009-10. Wahl played four years at Minnesota State University and earned a degree in physical education with a minor in coaching. She was an NCC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll student and the recipient of the 2007 "Maverick Achievement Award".

St. Cloud State Basketball Notes and News

2009-10 SEASON RECAP: The 2009-10 Huskies posted a 10-17 overall record and finished 5-15 in the NSIC, for a 13th place finish. St. Cloud State started the season with wins in three of their first four games including the NSIC opener, a 78-69 win over the University of Mary. The Huskies finished the season with two wins over their final four games.

THE 2010-11 HUSKIES: St. Cloud State enters the 2010-11 season with ten returning players from last season. The roster includes four newcomers, six sophomores, three juniors and one senior. Senior guard Talisha Barlow (Little Canada) was the Huskies leading scorer and rebounder last season. She averaged 14.7 points and 4.6 rebounds per game.

Barlow and fellow guards Jordi Gerking (Spirit Lake, Iowa), a junior and Amanda Wagner (Webster) will captain the team in 2010-11.

Several young players with starting experience also return this season. Wagner started in 25 games and averaged 5.5 points. Sophomore guard Nicole Anderson (Cannon Falls) started 26 games and led the team in steals with 60 and assists with 54. Gerking played in every game of the 2009-10 season and averaged 12.9 minutes on the court and 3.4 points.

ALL-CONFERENCE TALISHA BARLOW: Senior guard Talisha Barlow (Little Canada) was named to the 2009-10 All-NSIC Second Team for the second straight year. Barlow led the Huskies in scoring and rebounding with 14.7 points per game and 4.6 rebounds a game. She scored in double figures in all but five of the 27 games she played this season. She shot 47.1 percent from the field and 77.8 percent from the free throw line. She has scored 20 or more points ten times during the season and had two games of 30 plus points. On Jan. 9, 2010 against Bemidji State, Barlow joined the St. Cloud State 1,000 point club. She hit a baseline jumper in the second half to become the 26th Husky to reach 1,000 points. She finished that game with 21 points, nine rebounds, and five assists. She scored a career high 31 points in the 2009-10 season opener against UW-Stout. A starter in every game in 2008-09 and 2009-10, Barlow has played in 86 straight collegiate games. With 1,183 career points, she is in 20th place on the SCSU career scoring chart.

MAKING THE GRADE: Two Huskies were named to the 2009-10 All-Academic NSIC Team. Barlow, a psychology major, and guard Jordi Gerking (Spirit Lake, Iowa) were named to the academic team. Gerking is a mass communications major.

IN THE NSIC: In the final overall conference statistics report for 2009-10, Barlow ranked seventh in scoring with her 14.7 points per game average. Then first year guard Nicole Anderson (Cannon Falls) ranked third in the league in steals with 2.22 per game and 60 on the season.

THIRD YEAR IN THE NSIC: The 2010-11 season marks the third year of membership in the NSIC. The 2009-10 Huskies posted a 10-17 record and were 5-15 for 13th place in the league. In 2008-09 the Huskies posted a 22-9 overall record, went 12-8 in the NSIC to finish in sixth place, won the NSIC Sanford Health postseason tournament, and advanced to the NCAA Division II Central Region Tournament.

THE SOUTH DAKOTA STATE CONNECTION: Both SCSU head coach Lori Fish and first-year assistant coach Megan Vogel have ties to the South Dakota State women's basketball program. Fish was a four-year standout on the Jackrabbits court from 1987 to 1990. She was a two-time All-North Central Conference player and a team captain as a senior. She scored 1,133 career points and grabbed 662 rebounds. She has both a bachelor's degree and master's degree from SDSU. From 1993 to 1995 she was a graduate assistant coach under then head coach Nancy Neiber. She returned to her alma mater in 1996 and spent three seasons as an assistant coach.

Vogel was also a four-year standout from 2004 to 2007 and a team captain. When her collegiate career concluded with the Jackrabbits, Vogel was second on the all-time scoring list with 1,850 career points, third in career three-point field goals with 194 and fifth in career rebounds with 783. She led the Jackrabbits to their first ever Division I post season tournament in 2007, advancing to the WNIT quarterfinals. Vogel was an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American®, a top 30 Finalist for the 2007 NCAA Woman of the Year Award, and a 2007 NCAA Post-Graduate Degree Scholarship Recipient. During the 2008-09 season she served as a graduate assistant coach under current SDSU head coach Aaron Johnston.

ABOUT THE JACKRABBITS: Head coach Aaron Johnston (Gustavus Adolphus College) is in his 11th season with the Jackrabbits. He has compiled a 247-76 record and his teams have advanced to NCAA Division I postseason play in each of the last four seasons. In 2007 and 2008, the Jackrabbits played in the WNIT tournament and in 2009 and 2010 advanced to the NCAA Division I tournament.

Last season, the Jackrabbits posted a 22-11 overall record and tied for second in The Summit League with a 14-4 mark. SDSU won the conference postseason tournament to advance to the NCAA tournament. The Jackrabbits lost their NCAA opening game 68-57 at Oklahoma.

The Jackrabbits return a senior backcourt in guards Kristin Rotert and Macie Michelson. Both players started in all 33 games last season. Rotert is the top returning scorer for the Jackrabbits. An All-Summit League Honorable Mention player, Rotert averaged 12.6 points and 3.8 rebounds last season. Michelson averaged 8.6 points and led the team in assists with 124.
