PEPSI TIP-OFF: The 2009-10 St. Cloud State Women's Basketball season continues this Friday and Saturday, Nov. 20-21 at the Minnesota State Pepsi Tip-Off Tournament. The Huskies will play Waldorf College at 1:00 p.m. on Friday and Grand View College at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday. The games will be played in the Taylor Center on the Minnesota State University campus in Mankato, Minn.

FOR THE RECORD: St. Cloud State is 1-0 following a 90-79 season opening win over the University of Wisconsin-Stout last Sunday. Waldorf College brings a 2-4 record into Friday's game. Grand View College enters the week with a 4-2 record and will play two games before facing the Huskies.

Head Coach Lori Fish

Lori Fish begins her second season as head coach of the St. Cloud State women's basketball team in 2009-10, and her sixth overall as a collegiate coach.

Fish, a St. Cloud native, became the eighth coach in the history of the women's basketball program in July of 2008. She is very familiar with Husky basketball as she was an assistant coach under Dr. Lori Ulferts from 1999 to 2004.

In her first season with the Huskies, Fish guided St. Cloud State to a 22-9 overall record, won the 2009 NSIC Sanford Health Tournament Championship, and an NCAA Division II Central Region Tournament appearance.

Fish has compiled a five-year career record of 84-62. She brings 18 years of coaching experience, including 16 years at the collegiate level to the Huskies' program. During her career she has coached teams that have made six NCAA Division II National Tournament appearances including the 2009 St. Cloud State women.

A familiar name to the St. Cloud area, Fish grew up in St. Cloud and attended St. Cloud Tech High School. Following her graduation from Tech, she went on to play basketball at South Dakota State and competed against the Huskies in the North Central Conference.

After assistant coaching stints at Eastern Illinois, South Dakota State and St. Cloud State, Fish was named the head coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato in 2004. She quickly distinguished herself as a rising young coach and in 2007-08, her final season with the Mavericks, led her team to a 23-9 record and the championship game of the NCAA Division II North Central Region Tournament. She compiled a 62-53 won/loss record with the Mavericks.

Game Notes

SERIES RECORDS: The Huskies and Waldorf College played during the 2005-06 season for the only meeting in the series and St. Cloud State came away with a 99-42 win. St. Cloud State and Grand View College will be playing for the 13th time since the 1978 season. The Huskies lead the series 7-5. The last meeting between the two teams was during the 1983-84 season and resulted in a 73-67 SCSU win.

ST. CLOUD STATE NOTES: Junior guard **Talisha Barlow** (Little Canada) opened the season with a career high 31 points against UW-Stout. She eclipsed her previous high of 28 points scored in the final game of last season in the NCAA Tournament against Fort Lewis College...sophomore forward **Aaryn Booker** (Minneapolis) scored a career high 18 points in the game and led the Huskies with 11 rebounds...six newcomers gained playing time in the season opener...first year players **Lauren Carew** (Fargo, N.D.) and **Nicole Anderson** (Cannon Falls) were in the starting line-up. Carew scored five points and had three rebounds at center. Anderson had seven steals, six rebounds, five assists, and five points in her collegiate debut...first year guard **Amanda Wagner** (Webster) scored 14 points and had a game high eight steals (the single game school record for steals is 10)...sophomore guard **Becca Friestleben**

(Victoria), in her first collegiate start scored eight points...the Huskies shot 81.1 percent from the free throw line making 43 of 53 attempts and collected 20 steals.

ABOUT ST. CLOUD STATE: After a successful 2008-09 campaign with first year coach Lori Fish guiding the Huskies to a 22-9 overall record, the 2009 NSIC/Sanford Health Tournament Championship, and an NCAA Division II Central Region Tournament berth, St. Cloud State looks to a young squad to continue the Huskies success. The 2009-10 Huskies have nine first year players on the squad and four sophomores that make up the majority of the team. St. Cloud State returns one starter from a year ago in junior guard Talisha Barlow (Little Canada). Barlow averaged 15.4 points per game in her sophomore campaign. She was named to the All-NSIC Second Team, the Daktronics All-Central Region Second Team and the NSIC/Sanford Health All-Tournament team. Barlow started all 31 games during the season and has a 59-game starting streak. She has scored 785 points in her career. Sophomore forward Aaryn Booker (Minneapolis) played in all 31 games last season and averaged 4.9 points and 4.4 rebounds for the Huskies. Other returning players with playing time include sophomores Becca Friestleben (Victoria) and Christina Steele

(Apple Valley). Friestleben, a guard, played in 23 games last season and averaged 3.7 points. A post, Steele played in 19 games and collected 48 points and 31 rebounds. Senior guards Kaylan King (Reno, Nev.) and Megan Foley (St. Cloud) saw limited playing time for the Huskies.

SECOND IN NCAA ATTENDANCE: The NCAA released its women's basketball attendance figures for the season and the Huskies were ranked 2008-09 second in NCAA Division II behind conference member Northern State University. St. Cloud State had 40,263 fans attend 13 home games for an average of 3,097. Northern State led all of NCAA Division II women's basketball with an average attendance of 3,400. The only other schools to finish above 2,000 fans per game in Division II were Washburn, Emporia State, and North Dakota. The Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) ranked second in conference attendance at the Division II level. NSIC schools overall averaged 1,045 fans per game. The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) led Division II in attendance with 1,290 fans per game.

Opponents Notes

WALDORF COLLEGE WARRIORS NOTES: The Warriors posted a 14-17 overall record last season. Denny Jerome is in his 38th season as head coach of the Warriors and has accumulated a 738-341 career record. Through six games this season Waldorf College is averaging 69.3 points per game and allowing 84.7 points. The Warriors are shooting 38 percent from the field and average 41.0 rebounds per game while giving up 45.2 rebounds an outing. Sophomore center Aubrey Draves averages 15.7 points per game. Junior guard Megan Forster has averaged 15.2 points per game and senior forward Rachel Hannam is pulling down 11.2 rebounds per game.

GRAND VIEW COLLEGE NOTES: The Vikings of Grand View College received votes in the first NAIA National Poll of the season. The Vikings opened the season with a 79-63 loss to Morningside College, the number one ranked team in the NAIA. However, Grand View avenged that loss with a 78-63 win on Nov. 13. Through six games, the Vikings are averaging 71.5 points per game and allowing 63.2 points a game. In addition, they are out-rebounding their opponents 36.8 to 32.3, and are shooting 44.6 percent from the field. First year guard Jennifer Jorgenson leads the team in scoring and rebounding with 17.3 points and 8.3 rebounds a game. First year guard Amy Vos also averages in double figures with 14.5 points and 6.2 rebounds. Head coach Garey Smith is in his ninth season with the Warriors and 27th season as a collegiate head coach.

NSIC Preseason Poll

St. Cloud, Minn. -- The 2009-10 St. Cloud State women's basketball team has been picked to finish eighth in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) Women's Basketball Preseason Coaches Poll. Defending NCAA Division II Champions Minnesota State University, Mankato has been picked as the No. 1 team.

St. Cloud State finished the 2008-09 season as the NSIC/Sanford Health Post-season Tournament Champions and advanced to the NCAA Division II North Central Region Tournament. The Huskies posted a 22-9 overall record and finished sixth in the NSIC with a 12-8 record.

St. Cloud State junior guard Talisha Barlow (Little Canada) is a player to watch. Barlow was a NSIC All-Conference Second Team pick, NSIC/Sanford Health All-Tournament team selection, and Daktronics Central Region Second Team pick last season. She ranked sixth in the NSIC in scoring with 15.2 points per game and is sixth in field goal shooting percentage. She started all 28 games last season for the Huskies and has played in 59 straight games. She led the team in field goal shooting percentage with a mark of .504. She scored a career high 28 points against Fort Lewis in the NCAA tournament on Mar. 13 and scored in double figures 27 times during the season. She had a career high 11 rebounds against Concordia-St. Paul on Mar. 8 and opened the season with a career high seven steals on Nov. 15. Barlow has scored 785 points in her career.
