The Games: The fourth-ranked St. Cloud State women's basketball team will have an opportunity to start up a new winning streak this week as they face two NCC opponents. They will make the trip to Sapp Fieldhouse to take on the Mavericks of Nebraska-Omaha (14-6, 1-3 NCC) on Thursday before returning to their home court for the second meeting of the season with Minnesota Duluth (16-4, 3-2 NCC) on Saturday night. Both games are set for a 6 p.m. start, with the men's games to follow at 8 p.m.

The Series: The series records with this week's upcoming opponents both highly favor SCSU. The Huskies control the series with the Mavericks by a margin of 25-18. SCSU is on a current four-game winning streak against UNO. With the addition of the win posted against Minnesota Duluth earlier this season, the series with UMD now stands at 34-19 in favor of SCSU. The Husky win was the second consecutive victory posted against the Bulldogs.

On the Radio: Throughout the season, SCSU's women's basketball games will air on local radio with Sports Director Jay Caldwell calling the action. Select games will also be aired live on 88.1 FM KVSC and can be reached through www.kvsc.org. This week's games will air on 1240 WJON. The games can also be heard via the web at the St. Cloud State athletics web site at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics by clicking on the Listen to Husky Sports! icon. The pre-game show begins ten minutes prior to tip-off.

The Lori Ulferts Show: The Lori Ulferts Show will air every Thursday throughout the 2005-06 season. Join Lori Ulferts and Jay Caldwell at 1:45 Thursdays on AM 1390 The Fan.

2004-05 Finish: The Huskies had one of the best seasons in school history last season, winning the 2005 North Central Region Championship and advancing to the Elite Eight in Hot Springs, AR. They finished the season with a 23-10 overall record and were 6-6 in the NCC. Sophomore Erika Quigley received All-America status from both the WBCA and Daktronics, Inc.

Team Captains: Seniors April Carlson and Sascha Hansen will serve as St. Cloud State team captains for the 2005-06 season.

Head Coach: Dr. Lori Ulferts (North Dakota, 1983) is in her twelfth season with the Huskies and 21st season as a collegiate head coach. **She has compiled a 179-146 record at SCSU and has amassed a career record of 331-235.** Dr. Ulferts recorded her 300th career win against the University of Minnesota-Crookston on Dec. 19, 2004 with a 92-73 victory. Under her guidance, the Huskies went 23-10 last season, winning the 2005 North Central Region title and earning a berth at the NCAA Elite Eight, the first under Head Coach Ulferts and the fifth in school history. The Huskies were defeated by Merrimack College in the final seconds of the Quarterfinal game, falling 78-79. The Huskies also reached the NCAA North Central Region Tournament in 2000-01 but fell to the University of North Dakota in the semifinal round, 63-76. Before coming to St. Cloud, Ulferts coached at MN-Crookston (four seasons) and MN-State, Moorhead (five seasons). She is a two-time Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year.

Assistant Coaches: Mike Jewett begins his second year as Coach Ulferts' top assistant at SCSU. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Jewett was the head women's basketball coach at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana for 3 seasons (2001-2004), where he compiled a 62-20 overall record. In 2004 he led his team to the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament, won the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), and was named the HCAC Coach of the Year. Jewett has also served as an assistant coach at Augustana College and has high school head coaching experience. **Megan Taylor** (Iowa State, 2002) begins her second season as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU. At Iowa State, Taylor was a 4-time All-Conference Player, an All-American, and in 1998 she was named the Big 12 Freshman of the year. She is the state of Minnesota's second leading scorer for girls' and boys' basketball with 3,300 career points. **Katie Huschle** begins her first season as a student assistant coach for the Huskies. Huschle was the third-leading scorer for SCSU last season, averaging 11.5 points, and led the team in steals with 67. Huschle became St. Cloud State's 22nd member of the 1,000 Point Club on March 4, 2005 against North Dakota. She wrapped up her career with 1,043 points scored.

Huskies Remain #4: The St. Cloud State Huskies, stayed at #4 in the USA Today/ESPN Division II Top 25 Coaches' Poll, released Tuesday. They are one of three NCC schools on the list. North Dakota (20-2) maintains a #2 ranking while Minnesota Duluth (16-4) dropped one spot to #21.

Huskies in the Nation: The Huskies rank among the top ten teams in the nation on five fronts: Scoring Offense (1st, 88.1 ppg), Scoring Margin (4th, +25.6), Field Goal Pct (7th, 47.4%), Three-Point Field Goal Pct (39.3%), and Win-Lost Pct (8th, 94.4%). They are also ranked among the top 25 teams in two other categories, including Three-Point Field Goals Per Game (15th, 7.6), and Rebound Margin (23rd, +7.6).

Husky Replay: 4,871 raucous fans turned out to see #4 ranked St. Cloud State (17-1, 3-1 NCC) battle #2 ranked North Dakota (22-0, 5-0 NCC) Saturday night in Halenbeck Hall. UND was successful in shutting down the nation's highest scoring offense, keeping SCSU to well below their 89.8 point-per-game average. Only two Huskies made their mark in the scoring column in the first half, Quigley with 14 points and Hansen with 10. UND out-shot SCSU from the field, 41.8% to the Huskies' 33.9%. They hit the boards with demanding force, pulling down 44 rebounds to SCSU's 36.

The Huskies started the anticipated dual well, but dug themselves too deep of a hole by halftime. SCSU's first bucket came in extraordinary fashion, with 6-2 center Erika Quigley draining a three pointer from the top of the key. The Huskies quickly went up 7-2 after a few more field goals, but a three by UND senior Kristi Boese narrowed the margin to just two points.

Quigley hit another jumper at the 9:25 mark to put the Huskies up by five, 21-15, when their offense stalled. UND went on a 22-4 run to finish out the half. The Huskies, riding on the backs of Quigley and Hansen, found themselves down 24-37 at the half.

Going into the second half, Hansen said the team's goal was to get more people involved. They achieved their goal at the 16:30 mark, when Kayla Rengel put in a bucket from the paint. The Huskies slowly chipped away at UND's 13 point halftime lead, working harder on defense and crashing the boards to nearly even out the rebounding deficit late in the game. The Husky crowd got back into the game at the 9:51 mark when Rengel saw a cross-court opening and zipped a pass below the hoop to a waiting Carlson, who laid the ball in to pull the team back to within seven, 43-50. UND looked to score after Amy Mahlum pickpocketed Quigley, but the the Huskies made a stop to keep UND at bay.

SCSU's play of the game was soon to come. The roof of Halenbeck Hall nearly exploded at the 3:56 mark, as Francis delivered a bomb from three-point range to tie up the score at 56-56. Husky fans rejoiced at the feat, but it would be the closest the home team would come to an upset, as they were unable to ever pull out a lead. UND relied on Langen and Boese to hit key shots and, while the Huskies made several stops and forced visitor turnovers, they scoring margin would only lengthen as UND evaded an upset an posted a 66-58 win.

The Huskies were led by Quigley with her 14th double-double of the season, 26 points and 10 rebounds. Quigley also came out of the game with five steals. Hansen had 17 points, four rebounds, and six assists. The rest of the Husky roster combined for 15 points. April Carlson had nine rebounds.

North Dakota was led by Langen and Boese with 24 and 17 points, respectively. The duo also led the team on the boards, Boese collecting 16 rebounds and Langen grabbing 13. Kelsey Maffin chipped in nine points, while Carissa Jahner came up with four steals for UND.

Leading the Way:

Senior Sascha Hansen: Hansen (Marshall, MN) is second on the team for scoring with an average 15.8 points per game. She has hit 38 threes this season for a 43.2% average from beyond the arc. She surpassed the 1,000 point mark of her career on December 11 when she garnered 24 points against St. Thomas. Hansen leads the team in assists with 105 and has recently moved to #5 on SCSU's all-time assist chart, dishing out 403 in her career, including a career high 12 against PLNU on November 26.

Senior April Carlson: A native of Hugo, MN, Carlson is the defensive leader of the team. In addition, Carlson is currently averaging a career high 7.6 points per game. She topped a career scoring high with 18 points against Northern Michigan on November 25 and posted a career high 11 rebounds against Minnesota-Crookston. Carlson has hit 12 of 27 three-point shots for a .444 average.

Junior Shannon Francis: Francis (Mahnomen, MN) has scored

270 points this season for a 15.0 point per game average. She is one of the Huskies' greatest weapons from beyond the arc, leading the team with 39 made threes. Francis has posted career high figures in both scoring (29 vs MSU) and rebounding (10 vs BSU) this season.

Junior Erika Quigley: Quigley (Duluth, MN) leads the team with 22.2 points and 12.6 rebounds per game. She had a career high rebounding performance early in the season, grabbing 22 boards against Wisconsin-Stout. Quigley has posted double-double figures in scoring and rebounding fourteen times this season.

Sophomore Kayla Rengel: The lone sophomore of the team and St. Cloud native Kayla Rengel comes in fourth for Husky scoring and second in rebounding with 13.1 points and 6.6 rebounds per game. Rengel continues to lead SCSU's career three-point field goal percentage chart with a figure of 4% (57-of-125). She has hit a team high 47.5% of long range shots this season, connecting on 29 of 59 attempts.

**Nebraska-Omaha Notes**

The Mavericks of Nebraska-Omaha have already tied last season's games won mark at 14 with their most recent win over Upper Iowa. They have posted a 14-6 overall record and are 1-3 in the North Central Conference. They defeated South Dakota last week for their first league win with a final score of 74-60.

The Mavericks have averaged the fourth highest scoring average in the league with 75.6 points scored per game. They also come in fourth for field goal percentage (44.8%), rebounding (41.0 rpg), and scoring defense (60.5%).

On the scoring front, senior forward JJ Smith once again tops all UNO players with 14.4 points per game. She is followed closely by junior forward Ashley Freerksen, who has 12.3 points per game. Guard Karen Thies leads the team with 6.0 rebounds per game and has come up with 52 steals on the season.

Thursday's game will mark the first meeting of the season between St. Cloud and Nebraska-Omaha. The last time the teams met was on February 11th of last year, when the Huskies walked away with a narrow 68-62 victory. SCSU has won each of the past four games played against UNO and controls the overall 25-18 series record.

**Minnesota Duluth Notes**

Under new head coach Sue Fiero, the Bulldogs have seen continued success and growth of their team this season. They have received a national ranking in each of the regular season USA TODAY/ESPN Division II Coaches' Polls, and are currently ranked #21. The Bulldogs do not have the highest scoring offense, coming in fifth place in the NCC with 72.6 points per game, but they have kept their opponents to just 59.3 points per game, the second best scoring defense figure in the league.

Senior Lindsey Dietz currently leads the conference in scoring, averaging 24.3 points per game and comes in second in the NCC for rebounding with 9.2 boards per game.

With Dietz currently sidelined due to an injury and her return date unknown, the Bulldogs will have to rely more heavily on other players. Winkelman has been a solid player from the post this season, garnering 13.0 points and 5.8 rebounds per game. She has shot an average of 47.2% from the field. Justine Axtell ranks third on the team with 9.7 points and 5.7 rebounds per game. Kim Wagers, finding a starting position in Dietz's absence, fared well against USD, hitting five field goals and a free throw to finish the game with 12 points, well above her 4.3 ppg season average.

Despite a series record that heavily favors the Huskies (34-19), the Bulldogs have fared well against SCSU in recent years. Until this season, the teams had evenly split wins in the 10 most recently games played. The Huskies broke a two-game regular season slide against UMD in regional play last season, upsetting the Bulldogs to knock the team out of further tournament contention. SCSU extended their winning streak to two games by defeating the Bulldogs 92-83 in Romano Gym on the Minnesota Duluth campus just a few weeks ago. The win handed UMD their first conference loss of 2005-06.

In the game, both Winkelman and Dietz came alive to score 29 points each and combined for 13 rebounds. The Huskies kept Dietz moderately quiet in the second half, but Winkelman continued to roll. The forward sunk 6-of-6 free throws and also collected three steals.

For the Huskies, Quigley topped the list with 26 points and 13 rebounds. The standout player, however, was Hansen, who hit 6-of-8 three pointers on her way to 25 points. Hansen also dished out nine assists and had three steals that, combined with her shooting, were enough for an NCC Player of the Week honor. The Bulldogs managed ten steals in the game and out-rebounded the Huskies by a 40-30 margin.
