The Matchups: The fourth-ranked St. Cloud State women's basketball team (19-1, 5-1 NCC) will have their second opportunity of the season to face off with second-ranked North Dakota (23-0, 6-0 NCC) on Thursday night. The game will be held in the Betty Engelstad Center with a tip-off time of 6 pm. The Huskies will travel for another NCC road game on Saturday, this time against Minnesota State (10-11, 1-5 NCC). The game is slated for a 2 pm start in the Taylor Center.

The Series: Following their loss to North Dakota earlier this season, the Huskies slipped another notch in the series, which now stands at 37-15 in favor of UND. The Huskies will look to end a 13-game losing streak with UND by claiming their first win in the Betty Engelstad Arena. Against Minnesota State, the Huskies have been victorious in 51 of the 85 games played between the teams. They are on a current 15-game winning streak and have won 17 of the last 20 games against the Mavericks.

On the Radio: Throughout the season, SCSU's women's basketball games will air on local radio with Sports Director Jay Caldwell calling the action. Select games will also be aired live on 88.1 FM KVSC and can be reached through www.kvsc.org. This week's games will air on 1240 WJON. The games can also be heard via the web at the St. Cloud State athletics web site at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics by clicking on the Listen to Husky Sports! icon. The pre-game show begins ten minutes prior to tip-off.

The Lori Ulferts Show: The Lori Ulferts Show will air every Thursday throughout the 2005-06 season. Join Lori Ulferts and Jay Caldwell at 1:45 Thursdays on AM 1390 The Fan.

2004-05 Finish: The Huskies had one of the best seasons in school history last season, winning the 2005 North Central Region Championship and advancing to the Elite Eight in Hot Springs, AR. They finished the season with a 23-10 overall record and were 6-6 in the NCC. Sophomore Erika Quigley received All-America status from both the WBCA and Daktronics, Inc.

Team Captains: Seniors April Carlson and Sascha Hansen will serve as St. Cloud State team captains for the 2005-06 season.

Head Coach: Dr. Lori Ulferts (North Dakota, 1983) is in her twelfth season with the Huskies and 21st season as a collegiate head coach. **She has compiled a 179-146 record at SCSU and has amassed a career record of 331-235.** Dr. Ulferts recorded her 300th career win against the University of Minnesota-Crookston on Dec. 19,

2004 with a 92-73 victory. Under her guidance, the Huskies went 23-10 last season, winning the 2005 North Central Region title and earning a berth at the NCAA Elite Eight, the first under Head Coach Ulferts and the fifth in school history. The Huskies were defeated by Merrimack College in the final seconds of the Quarterfinal game, falling 78-79. The Huskies also reached the NCAA North Central Region Tournament in 2000-01 but fell to the University of North Dakota in the semifinal round, 63-76. Before coming to St. Cloud, Ulferts coached at MN-Crookston (four seasons) and MN-State, Moorhead (five seasons). She is a two-time Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year.

Assistant Coaches: Mike Jewett begins his second year as Coach Ulferts' top assistant at SCSU. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Jewett was the head women's basketball coach at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana for 3 seasons (2001-2004), where he compiled a 62-20 overall record. In 2004 he led his team to the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament, won the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), and was named the HCAC Coach of the Year. Jewett has also served as an assistant coach at Augustana College and has high school head coaching experience. **Megan Taylor** (Iowa State, 2002) begins her second season as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU. At Iowa State, Taylor was a 4-time All-Conference Player, an All-American, and in 1998 she was named the Big 12 Freshman of the year. She is the state of Minnesota's second leading scorer for girls' and boys' basketball with 3,300 career points. **Katie Huschle** begins her first season as a student assistant coach for the Huskies. Huschle was the third-leading scorer for SCSU last season, averaging 11.5 points, and led the team in steals with 67. Huschle became St. Cloud State's 22nd member of the 1,000 Point Club on March 4, 2005 against North Dakota. She wrapped up her career with 1,043 points scored.

Stagnant Nation: The St. Cloud State Huskies, was ranked at #4 in the USA Today/ESPN Division II Top 25 Coaches' Poll, released Tuesday, for the fourth consecutive week. They are one of three NCC schools on the list. North Dakota (23-2) maintains a #2 ranking while Minnesota Duluth (16-5) dropped to #23.

Huskies in the Nation: The Huskies rank among the top ten teams in the nation on five fronts: Scoring Offense (2nd, 87.1 ppg), Scoring Margin (4th, +25.2), Win-Lost Pct (4th, 95.0%), Field Goal Pct (5th, 47.6%), Three-Point Field Goal Pct (7th, 39.3%),

The Huskies are also ranked 19th in the nation for Three-Point Field Goals Per Game with 7.5.

Several individual Husky players are featured as top national leaders in the following categories:

Quigley: Rebounding (5th, 12.2/g), Scoring (8th, 21.8 ppg), Blocked Shots (8th, 3.3/g), Field Goal Pct (17th, 56.2%).

Hansen: Assists (10th, 6.2/g), Three-Point FG Pct (12th, 43.2%).



Husky Replay: St. Cloud blew out Nebraska-Omaha on Thursday night, posting an 85-60 road win. They were only up 38-33 at halftime, but opened the second half with a 12-0 run to gain a double-digit lead that was maintained for the remainder of the game. The Huskies were out-rebounded 26-19 in the first half, but fared much better in the final 20 minutes, cutting the margin to 43-42 in their favor.

The Mavericks shot a cool 34.8% from the field in the game, while SCSU posted a figure of 48.5%. They were also 63.6% from three-point range. Defensively, the Huskies came up with 14 steals against UNO.

SCSU was led by Francis with 22 points, nine rebounds, and four assists. Quigley added 16 points and nine rebounds and Jackie Carlson had 13 points and five boards.

JJ Smith led UNO with 15 points, five boards, and three assists. Lacey Deitzenauer had 10 points and led her team with seven rebounds.

The Huskies turned on the heat in the second half once again on Saturday night to down 21st-ranked Minnesota Duluth by a score of 72-54.

SCSU maintained a five point edge at the half, 29-24, and similar to Thursday night's second half start, opened the final 20 minutes with a flurry of quick field goals. A fast break layup by Kayla Rengel and a jumper by Erika Quigley capped a 6-0 run that put the home team up 35-24.

With Dietz missing from the UMD lineup, the Bulldogs looked to Winkelman to step up and lead her team on the scoring front. The junior came through midway through the final half, hitting four straight field goals for the Bulldogs to keep the score to within three possessions.

SCSU's Quigley dominated the scoring chart for seven early second half minutes, hitting six of SCSU's eight field goals. The Huskies made up for a lack of rebounding power by stripping the Bulldogs to gain extra possessions. They came up with 14 steals in the game, including 10 in the second half. The Huskies turned UMD turnovers into 22 points throughout the game, helping to stretch the scoring margin into a more comfortable lead late in the game.

With six minutes remaining in the game, the Huskies had pulled away to a 57-45 lead. The Bulldogs were unable to cut the deficit and the score continued to rise. By the final buzzer, the Huskies had posted an 18-point win, 72-54.

For SCSU, Quigley led with 19 points and Rengel had 15. Both players pulled down a team high seven rebounds and had two blocks. Rengel also hustled for five steals and dished out six assists. SCSU shot 51.7% from the field.

Winkelman topped all players with 26 of UMD's 54 points. She pulled down nine rebounds and had four steals. Kim Wagers posted double-double figures with 10 points and a team high 11 rebounds. UMD had 21 turnovers and shot just 6.3% from three-point range. The Bulldogs killed the Huskies on the boards, however, totalling 47 rebounds to SCSU's 31.

Let's Dish: Senior Sascha Hansen (Marshall, MN) can be counted on to set up her teammates for a bucket. Hansen has dished out 117 assists this season, good for second in the NCC. She is not completely selfless on the court, however. Hansen is the second-leading scorer for the high-powered Huskies with an average 15.3 points per game. With 1,171 points and 417 assists in her career, Hansen is one of just three SCSU players to break both the 1,000 point and 400 assist mark.

For Free: Junior Shannon Francis (Mahnomon, MN) has shown upperclassman composure at the charity stripe this season. She currently leads the NCC for free throw percentage with a mark of 88.5% (46-of-52). She has been even better in league games played, connecting on 94.7% of free shots. Francis tops SCSU's career free throw percentage list after hitting 111 of 128 shots from the line for a career figure of 86.7%.

**North Dakota Notes**

North Dakota, with a 23-0 overall record and 5-0 in the NCC, is one of just three undefeated Division II teams remaining in the nation. They have been ranked No. 2 in the nation for the past five weeks and have topped the North Central Region rankings since their first release.

North Dakota has topped their opponents by an average 24.3 points and 13.4 rebounds per contest this season. They score an average 82.7 points and pull down 43.9 boards per game.

These figures are good for second among North Central Conference teams, falling in behind SCSU on both accounts.

UND has been successful in grabbing more boards than their opponents, however. They currently lead the nation in rebounding margin with a mark of +13.4.

Sophomore Ashley Langen leads the team on the scoring front, averaging 19.2 points in NCC games. A formidable 6-2 center, Langen plays a physical game and uses her stature to dominate opponents. Against the Huskies this season, Langen recorded a double-double with 24 points and 13 rebounds.

Senior forward Kristi Boese leads the team in rebounds with 9.8 boards per game in NCC bouts. Boese is also averaging 14.7 points on offense. Against the Huskies, Boese scored 17 points and led the team in rebounds with 16.

Kierah Kimbrough and Carissa Jahner are UND's leading guards. Kimbrough, shooting 58.6% this season from the field, is averaging 10.9 ppg, while Jahner has pitched in with 9.7 ppg. Jahner leads the team in steals with an average of 2.13 per game.

**Minnesota State Notes**

The Mavericks started the 2005-06 season on a good foot, staying above the .500 mark until two weeks ago. They have struggled in NCC play, however, posting a league-low 1-5 record. The team won their first conference game last weekend by edging out South Dakota 65-63.

MSU is averaging 66.0 points in NCC games this season but have been outscored by an average of 11.7 points. On the season, the Mavericks are shooting 42.2%, but that figure has slipped to 38.2% in league games. MSU has averaged 37.0 rebounds in conference games played.

Senior center Arin Andrews is leading the Mavericks with 14.0 points and 8.6 rebounds per game this season. Her figures in conference games have been slightly higher, 14.8 points and 9.2 rebounds per game. Andrews ranks ninth in the NCC for shooting accuracy, connecting on 47.8% of shots taken.

Alanna Wahl, Heather Peterson, and Flecia Foster are MSU's other top guns, with 8.1, 7.9, and 7.7 points per game each, respectively. Foster leads the team in steals with 32 picks this season, while Wahl has dished out a team high 82 assists.
