Wells Fargo Finals Quarterfinal: The number four seed St. Cloud State University (19-8, 6-6 NCC) will host number five seed Minnesota State (11-15, 5-7 NCC) in the quarterfinals of the 2005 Wells Fargo Finals NCC Tournament on Tuesday, March 1 at 6:00 p.m. at Halenbeck Hall (6,927) on the SCSU campus. The winner will advance to the semi-finals on Friday, March 4 and face number one seed North Dakota. The semis and championship game will be played at the site of #1 North Dakota.

Tickets: Tickets for the Wells Fargo Quarterfinal game will go on sale Monday morning at 9:00 a.m. Tickets can be purchased at the SCSU Athletic Office in the National Hockey Center. Ticket prices are \$10 for adults and \$5 for youth age 2 and older and all college students including SCSU students. For more ticket information, call 1-877-SCSUTIX or (320)308-2137.

On the Radio: Tuesday's game will air on AM 1240 WJON. Sports Director Jay Caldwell will call the action. The game will also be aired live on 88.1 FM KVSC and can also be reached through www.kvsc.org. The game can also be heard via the web at www.wjon.com or they can be accessed from the St. Cloud State athletics web site at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics by clicking on the Listen to Husky Sports! icon. The pre-game show begins ten minutes prior to tip-off.

Head Coach: Dr. Lori Ulferts (North Dakota, 1983) is in her eleventh season with the Huskies and 20th season as a collegiate head coach. **She has compiled a 139-135 record in 10 seasons at SCSU and has amassed a 291-224 record in 19 years as a head coach. Dr. Ulferts recorded her 300th career win against the**

University of Minnesota-Crookston on Dec. 19, 2004 with a 92-73 victory. Under her guidance the Huskies reached the 2001 NCAA North Central Region Tournament Semi-Finals before falling to the University of North Dakota, 76-63. That season the Huskies posted a 21-9 record, the best for a Husky team since the 1989-90 team posted a 23-5 overall record and was Co-NCC Champions. Before coming to St. Cloud, Ulferts coached at MN-Crookston (four seasons) and MN-State, Moorhead (five seasons). She is a two-time Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year.

Assistant Coaching Staff: Mike Jewett (Augustana College, 1994) begins his first year as Coach Ulferts' top assistant at SCSU. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Jewett was the head women's basketball coach at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana for 3 seasons (2001-2004) where he compiled a 62-20 overall record. In 2004 he led his team to the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament, won the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), and was named the HCAC Coach of the Year.

Megan Taylor (Iowa State, 2002) will serve as the graduate assistant coach. She is the all-time Minnesota Girls High School leading scorer and in December had her jersey retired at Iowa State, where she was a four-year standout.

Team Captains: Senior guards Molly Jensen (Minnetonka) and Katie Huschle (Eden Valley) and junior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall) will serve as the Husky captains in 2004-05.

2003-04 Record: The Huskies posted a 17-11 overall record and finished fifth in the North Central Conference with a 7-7 record. In the NCAA Division II statistics, St. Cloud State ranked 6th in free throw percentage with 78.0% and ranked first in the NCC with 77.6% free throws. The Huskies ended their season with a loss in first-round action in the 2004 Wells Fargo Tournament at the University of South Dakota on March 2. North Dakota State (11-3) won the NCC regular season while the University of North Dakota (10-4) claimed the NCC Wells Fargo Finals.

Senior Molly Jensen: Senior guard Molly Jensen (Minnetonka) will play in her 110th game as a Husky on Tuesday. She has seen playing time in every game since joining the squad in 2001. In her four-year stint at SCSU, Jensen has scored 564 points and has recorded 115 steals. She currently ranks fourth on the team in assists with 44 on the season and has 170 on her career. Jensen scored a career high 18 points on January 31, 2003 against the University of Nebraska-Omaha. Also against UNO on January 27, 2005, Jensen pulled down a career high 9 rebounds.

Senior Katie Huschle: Senior guard Katie Huschle (Eden Valley), with 979 career points, is just 21 points away from hitting the 1,000 point mark of her career. She is the third-leading scorer for the Huskies this season with 315 total points and an average of 11.7 points per game. She has dished out a team high 128 assists on the season. Huschle ranks 11th in Division II rankings for free throw shooting percentage with a mark of 88.2 percent. She ranks second in the NCC with 87.9%. Huschle also ranks among SCSU's top-leading players in several categories. She is currently third for all-time free throw percentage with 80.5%, fourth in three-point field goal percentage (37.5%), and seventh in both three-point field goal attempts (232) and assists (329). Huschle received NCC Player of the Week honors on December 22. Huschle scored a career high 30 points, including 4 three-pointers, in Saturday's conference finale game against South Dakota. She set her career assist record at 9 on January 29, 2005 against Minnesota Duluth. Huschle was named Academic All-NCC Honorable Mention in 2002-03. Huschle is a 2004-05 team captain.

Senior Krista Kettner: Kettner (Nicollet) is a two-year member of the Husky squad as she transferred from Iowa Lakes Community College in 2003. She has proven to be a valuable player from the bench, having seen playing time in 45 games. Kettner is averaging 2.7 points and 1.2 rebounds per game this season. She scored a career high 16 points against Augustana on February 17, 2005.

Junior Sascha Hansen: Junior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall) has been an invaluable addition to the SCSU team since her arrival, having played in and started every game for the past three years. Hansen is the second-leading scorer for the Huskies this season with an average of 12.1 points per game (328 total points) and is the second-leading Husky in assists with 114. Hansen currently ranks second in the nation for three-point field goal percentage with 47.9% (56-of-117) and leads the NCC in the category with 48.8% (60-of-123). Among the all-time SCSU leaders, Hansen has taken over the number one position for three-point field goal percentage, hitting 41.6% (107-257) in her career. She ranks fourth for all-time three-pointers made with 107, fourth for free throw percentage with 79.1% (220-of-278), and seventh for three-point attempts with 257 shots taken. Hansen has made the 2004-05 season the best of her career, setting new personal bests in scoring (32 vs UM-Crookston, 12/11/04), rebounding (12 vs SMSU, 12/7/04), and assists (9 vs. Augustana, 1/15/05). Hansen is a two-time team captain.

Junior April Carlson: Junior guard April Carlson (Hugo) has been a strong presence in the Husky backcourt this season, making starts in all but one game in 2004-05. Carlson is averaging 4.8 points and 4.0 rebounds per game. She has come up with 30 steals on the season and is known for her aggressive defensive skills. Carlson scored a career high 14 points against UC-San Diego on December 30, 2004.



Sophomore Shannon Francis: Shannon Francis (Mahnomen) ranks fourth on the team for scoring with an average of 10.0 points per game. She has played in every game of her career and has started in all but 5 games. Having hit 80 threes on her career, Francis provides SCSU with firepower from beyond the arc. She already resides at #9 on SCSU's all-time made three-pointers list. Francis scored a career high 22 points against Nebraska-Omaha on January 27, 2005.

Sophomore Laura Legge: Laura Legge (Aberdeen, SD) has come off the bench to see action in 24 games this season. She is averaging 2.5 points per game this season. Legge scored a season and career high 18 points on November 27, 2004 against Michigan Tech.

Sophomore Erika Quigley: Sophomore center Erika Quigley (Duluth) has dominated the NCC this season. She set the NCC record for sophomore scoring with her average of 22.5 ppg and tied the mark for sophomore rebounding with 12.8 rpg in league games. As both the leading scorer and rebounder for the Huskies, Quigley is averaging 22.7 points and 12.5 rebounds per game. Quigley currently ranks second in the NCAA in rebounding (12.5 rpg), fifth in scoring (23.0 ppg), 14th in blocked shots per game (2.7), and 28th in field goal shooting percentage (55.1). She leads the NCC in scoring, rebounding, blocked shots, and defensive rebounds. Quigley set a personal season and career scoring record of 37 points against SMSU on December 7, 2004, just one point shy of SCSU's game-high scoring record of 38 points. With 993 career points, Quigley is set to break the 1,000 point mark before the end of the season. If she does so, Quigley will be just the third Husky to reach this milestone as a sophomore. Quigley was named Freshman of the Year last year, has been named NCC Player of the Week four times this season, and has posted a conference high 20 double-doubles. She is 10 rebounds shy of breaking the school record for most rebounds in a single season (348).

Sophomore Sarah Cotner: Due to a back injury, sophomore forward Cotner (Stillwater) has been sidelined for the majority of the season. She played in 8 games at the beginning of the season and was averaging 2.1 points and 1.3 rebounds.

Freshman Maggie Youngberg: Freshman guard Maggie Youngberg (Yankton, SD) has been active in 21 games this season. She has hit 7-of-14 three-pointers to gain a .500 record from long distance. Youngberg has a 1.8 point-per-game shooting average. She recorded a personal high 8 points against North Central University on December 9, 2004.

Freshman Kayla Rengel: Rengel (St. Cloud) has been a poignant force from the bench this season. Averaging 7.4 points and 3.6 rebounds in 23 games, Rengel has both the ability to cover space down low and the efficiency to nail field goals from the wing. She has a 45.8 three-point percentage (27-of-59) and has hit 55.0% of all field goals (61-of-111). Rengel scored a career high 21 points against Augustana on January 15, 2005. She also pulled down 10 rebounds on February 12, 2005 against South Dakota.

Husky Replay: The Huskies are entering post-season play after ending a four game winning streak with a loss Saturday night to South Dakota, 88-96. The game was a virtual shootout contest with SCSU finishing with 51.5% made field goals and 52.4% made threes. USD shot for 58.2% and hit 57.1% of three-pointers. SCSU started out slow, however, hitting just 2 of their first 10 field goals. USD, the national leader for three-pointers made per game, started the game red hot from beyond the arc. Midway through the first half, the Coyotes were 5-for-6 from the distance. The Huskies recovered from an 18-point deficit in the final 5 minutes of the first half to trail by just seven points at halftime, 46-39. The second half is when the long-range shooting really heated up. At one point early in the half, South Dakota hit four consecutive threes during the same time that three of SCSU's four field goals came from behind the line, resulting in the teams combining for 7 of 8 field goals being three-pointers. The teams went nearly shot-for-shot with each other, with the Huskies unable to close the gap and trailing by an average of 7 points. The rough-and-tough play continued and 11 called Husky fouls resulted in 15 made free throws by USD, which would turn out to be the difference in the game.

South Dakota nailed 12 three-pointers on the night while the Huskies hit 11, including four each from Katie Huschle and Sascha Hansen. The 11 made threes is one shy of SCSU's team record of 12 made field goals in one game. The Huskies had a slight edge on made field goals, hitting 34 total while USD had 32. The Coyotes hit 20 free throws while the Huskies hit just 9. Senior Katie Huschle, celebrating her 22nd birthday, led the Huskies in scoring with a new personal career high 30 points. Sascha Hansen added 16 points and 6 rebounds while Erika Quigley led in rebounds with 7.

The disappointing loss dropped SCSU to #4 in the conference and has serious implications for Regional playoffs.

Minnesota State Notes

Minnesota State has posted an improved 11-15 overall and 5-7 NCC record this season. Leading the charge for the Mavericks is junior center Arin Andrews, averaging 12.9 points and 7.5 rebounds per game. Senior guard Kelli Freeman is the second-leading scorer with an average 12.6 points per game. Freeman has connected on 71 three-point shots this season. Junior Stacie Johnson is the MSU assist leader with 112. The Mavericks, qualifying for the Wells Fargo Finals Tournament for just the second time, are under the helm of new head coach Lori Fish.
