Regular Season NCC Home Finale: The Huskies (20-2, 6-2 NCC) will wrap up their regular season home conference schedule this week. They host the University of Nebraska-Omaha (16-8, 2-5 NCC) on Thursday night and the University of South Dakota (14-8, 2-5 NCC) on Saturday night. Both games are slated for a 6 p.m. start with the men's games to follow at 8 p.m.

The Series: SCSU has shaken off the UNO Mavericks in each of the last five and 10 of the last 12 meetings. They posted a 25-point win on UNO's home turf in their first bout this season and will look to sweep the series for the third straight year with a home win on Thursday. The series record with the Coyotes stands at 24-23 in favor of USD. The Huskies fell to South Dakota in their last regular season game played last year by a score of 88-96. This will be the first meeting between the two teams this season.

On the Radio: Throughout the season, SCSU's women's basketball games will air on local radio with Sports Director Jay Caldwell calling the action. Select games will also be aired live on 88.1 FM KVSC and can be reached through www.kvsc.org. This week's games will air on 1240 WJON. The games can also be heard via the web at the St. Cloud State athletics web site at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics by clicking on the Listen to Husky Sports! icon. The pre-game show begins ten minutes prior to tip-off.

The Lori Ulferts Show: The Lori Ulferts Show will air every Thursday throughout the 2005-06 season. Join Lori Ulferts and Jay Caldwell at 1:45 Thursdays on AM 1390 The Fan.

2004-05 Finish: The Huskies had one of the best seasons in school history last season, winning the 2005 North Central Region Championship and advancing to the Elite Eight in Hot Springs, AR. They finished the season with a 23-10 overall record and were 6-6 in the NCC. Sophomore Erika Quigley received All-America status from both the WBCA and Daktronics, Inc.

Team Captains: Seniors April Carlson and Sascha Hansen will serve as St. Cloud State team captains for the 2005-06 season.

Head Coach: Dr. Lori Ulferts (North Dakota, 1983) is in her twelfth season with the Huskies and 21st season as a collegiate head coach. **She has compiled a 182-147 record at SCSU and has amassed a career record of 331-235.** Dr. Ulferts recorded her 300th career win against the University of Minnesota-Crookston on Dec. 19,

2004 with a 92-73 victory. Under her guidance, the Huskies went 23-10 last season, winning the 2005 North Central Region title and earning a berth at the NCAA Elite Eight, the first under Head Coach Ulferts and the fifth in school history. The Huskies were defeated by Merrimack College in the final seconds of the Quarterfinal game, falling 78-79. The Huskies also reached the NCAA North Central Region Tournament in 2000-01 but fell to the University of North Dakota in the semifinal round, 63-76. Before coming to St. Cloud, Ulferts coached at MN-Crookston (four seasons) and MN-State, Moorhead (five seasons). She is a two-time Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year.

Assistant Coaches: Mike Jewett begins his second year as Coach Ulferts' top assistant at SCSU. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Jewett was the head women's basketball coach at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana for 3 seasons (2001-2004), where he compiled a 62-20 overall record. In 2004 he led his team to the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament, won the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), and was named the HCAC Coach of the Year. Jewett has also served as an assistant coach at Augustana College and has high school head coaching experience. **Megan Taylor** (Iowa State, 2002) begins her second season as a graduate assistant coach at SCSU. At Iowa State, Taylor was a 4-time All-Conference Player, an All-American, and in 1998 she was named the Big 12 Freshman of the year. She is the state of Minnesota's second leading scorer for girls' and boys' basketball with 3,300 career points. **Katie Huschle** begins her first season as a student assistant coach for the Huskies. Huschle was the third-leading scorer for SCSU last season, averaging 11.5 points, and led the team in steals with 67. Huschle became St. Cloud State's 22nd member of the 1,000 Point Club on March 4, 2005 against North Dakota. She wrapped up her career with 1,043 points scored.

Take Five: The St. Cloud State Huskies, with a 20-2 overall record, are now ranked #5 in the USA Today/ESPN Division II Top 25 Coaches' Poll, released Tuesday. North Dakota (25-0) maintains a #2 ranking while Minnesota Duluth (16-7) has dropped out of the poll.

Huskies in the Nation: The Huskies rank among the top ten teams in the nation on five fronts: Scoring Offense (2nd, 85.5 ppg), Scoring Margin (5th, +23.0), Field Goal Pct (6th, 47.5%), Three-Point Field Goal Pct (9th, 38.7%),

Quigley: Rebounding (5th, 12.2/g), Scoring (5th, 22.4 ppg), Blocked Shots (8th, 3.2/g), Field Goal Pct (16th, 56.6%).

Hansen: Assists (11th, 6.0/g), Three-Point FG Pct (11th, 43.1%).

Another NCC Honor for Quigley: For the fourth time this season, SCSU's Erika Quigley (Duluth, MN) was declared NCC Player of the Week. Quigley will share this week's honor with upcoming foe Ashley Robinette of South Dakota. Quigley averaged 28.5 points, 13.0 rebounds, and 2.5 blocks per game in contests with North Dakota and Minnesota State. Quigley hit 60.5% (23-of-38) of her field goals and all 11 free throws in the two games. Against Minnesota State, Quigley shot 73.3% and pulled down 17 rebounds.



Husky Replay: The fourth-ranked Huskies battled second-ranked UND last Thursday night in front of 3,064 fans, the first sellout crowd in Betty Engelstad Center history. The undersized Huskies made several runs at UND, but a mixture of poor shooting and lack of rebounds gave SCSU their first road loss of the season and their 14th consecutive loss to UND, 74-63.

The Huskies took one lead early in the first half but it did not take long for UND to open up a reasonable scoring margin. The Huskies made a run to get back within two, but UND, shooting 51.6% from the field in the first half, went up 43-29 at the intermission.

The Huskies came out of the locker room to make four consecutive defensive stops and hit the first three field goals of the second half to push the score to 35-43. UND struggled from the field and the Huskies narrowed the gap. They trailed by seven 60-67 as late as the 2:17 mark, left on the clock, but were unable to close the game out with a win, losing 74-63.

Quigley had 31 points and nine rebounds, along with three blocked shots. Francis had 12 points and five rebounds, while Rengel came in second on the team on the boards with eight. SCSU shot 39.1% from the field and were out-rebounded 34-49.

UND was led by Boese with 21 points and nine rebounds. Langen had 17 points and nine rebounds. The team's cool second half shooting brought their game total down to 37.5%.

SCSU went on to gain their 20th win of the season on Saturday against Minnesota State. They shot 62.5% in the first half, going up 42-20 by the intermission. The Mavericks shot just 20.0% in the same time.

The roles were reversed in the opening minutes of the second half, with MSU hitting 50% of their shots while the Huskies connected on just 30%. Despite turning the ball over a season-high 27 times, the Huskies kept MSU at bay and went on to win the game 77-55.

Quigley led SCSU with her 15th double-double of the season, 26 points and 17 rebounds. Francis and Hansen had 13 points each, while Rengel added 10 points and had eight boards. The Huskies came out on top of the rebounding column, 45-35.

Arin Andrews led MSU with 15 points. Johnson and Wahl had 11 and 10 points respectively, while Alex Andrews led the team with seven rebounds. MSU shot 33.8% and had 15 steals.

SCSU To Honor Its Seniors: Senior co-captains April Carlson and Sascha Hansen will be honored Saturday night as they play their last regular season NCC game at Halenbeck Hall. Carlson and Hansen joined the team in 2002-03 and have seen quite a turnaround since their inaugural season when the Huskies went 8-19 overall and 3-13 in the NCC. They have been integral components to the Huskies' recent success, reaching the NCAA Elite Eight last season and pushing the team to a consistent No.-4 national ranking this season.

Giving It Up: Senior Sascha Hansen (Marshall, MN) can be counted on to set up her teammates for a bucket. Hansen has dished out 126 assists this season, good for second in the NCC and 11th in the nation. She is not completely selfless on the court, however. Hansen is the second-leading scorer for the high-powered Huskies with an average 14.9 points per game. With 1,193 points and 426 assists in her career, Hansen is one of just three SCSU players to break both the 1,000 point and 400 assist mark.

Walk The Line: Junior Shannon Francis (Mahnomon, MN) has shown upperclassman composure from the line this season. She currently leads the NCC for free throw percentage with a mark of 88.3% (53-of-60). She has been even better in league games played, connecting on 92.6% of free shots. Francis tops SCSU's career free throw percentage list after hitting 118 of 136 shots from the line for a career figure of 86.8%.

Quigley leads the NCC Double-Double Honor Roll after posting double-double figures 15 times this season.

Nebraska-Omaha Notes

The Mavericks shot out of the 2005-06 gates on their way to a 14-3 record before entering conference play. UNO, who finished second to last in the NCC last season with a 4-8 league marking, has carried over last year's conference woes, posting a current 2-5 record that puts them near the bottom in the NCC race. The team's set of conference wins have come at the cost of South Dakota, including a recent overtime thriller that was decided by two points.

Nebraska-Omaha entered conference play with a 75.1 point per game average, but have scored just 64.7 points in NCC bouts. Their field goal rates stand at 44.3% overall, but just 39.2% against conference opponents. The only statistical category that has improved since NCC play began is their free throw percentage, which tops all conference teams at 76.1%.

The Mavericks had a strong first-half showing against the Huskies earlier this season and trailed by just five points at the half. UNO was unable to contain SCSU shooters in the second half, however, and the team was outscored 27-47 on their way to a 60-85 loss. Senior forward JJ Smith was the only UNO player to score double digits, finishing the game with 15 points. The Mavericks shot 34.8% from the field and just 16.7% from three point range. For SCSU, Shannon Francis hit 3-of-3 shots from beyond the arc and led the Huskies with 22 points and nine rebounds. The Huskies shot 48.5% from the field and 63.6% from long range.

The Mavericks have three players currently averaging 10+ points. JJ Smith tops the list with 14.3 ppg, followed by Karen Thies with 12.1 and Ashley Freerksen with 11.0. Thies leads the team on the boards with 6.1 rebounds per game and comes in first in the NCC for steals with 64.

South Dakota Notes

Despite a 2-5 North Central Conference record, the South Dakota women's basketball team (14-8 overall) is picking up steam as they head into the end of the conference season with playoffs just around the corner. The two Coyote conference wins have come against a nationally-ranked Minnesota Duluth, who is playing their third week without All-American Lindsey Dietz. The Coyotes have defeated UMD by a thin six points in the two combined games, showing that they can push forward to outlast tough competitors.

South Dakota is a young team learning to compete in the NCC. Their strength comes mainly from their outside game, where the Coyotes thrive from three-point range. USD leads all NCC teams by sinking an average 8.59 threes per game. Junior Vanessa Yanez is most likely to drain the three, she averages a league-high 2.41 made threes per game. Ashley Bjorkman will also launch the long shot, averaging 1.95 threes per game.

While USD is most powerful from beyond the arc, their inside game should not be ignored. Freshman center Bridget Yoerger will get down and dirty in the paint, where she leads the team on both the scoring and rebounding fronts with 13.0 points and 5.8 rebounds per game. Sophomore Ashley Robinette has become a force to reckon with in conference battles, where she has broken into the starting lineup and is averaging 21.0 points per game. She led the team with a career high 30 points in USD's most recent win over UMD. The 5-11 forward hit 4-of-4 threes and did not miss a shot until the 8:00 minute mark of the second half, the only shot she missed on her way to a 9-of-10 field goal performance.

The Coyotes pulled off an upset in their last meeting with the Huskies, a 2004-05 regular season finale that gave USD a 96-88 win. The win broke a 23-23 series stalemate and gave the Coyotes a one-game edge over the Huskies.
