2005 NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Elite Eight:

The 17th-ranked St. Cloud State University (23-9) women's basketball team will play 7th-ranked Merrimack University (28-5) in the quarterfinals of the 2005 NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Elite Eight, Wednesday, March 23 at 12 noon. The Elite Eight will be played at the Summit Arena in Hot Springs, Arkansas and is hosted by Henderson State University. The semi finals will be played on Thursday, March 24 at 6:00 and 8:00 p.m. The championship game will be played at 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 26.



On the Radio: St. Cloud State will have two radio stations covering the Elite Eight. **WJON AM 1240** with sports director Jay Caldwell calling the game along with Denise Stang will broadcast the Huskies games from the Elite Eight. **KVSC 88.1 FM**, the St. Cloud State University campus station will also air the Husky games. Curt Carstensen and John Hadden will call the action. The games can also be heard via the web at www.kvsc.org; www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics; and www.wjon.com. Other media attending from St. Cloud include Mick Hatten, St. Cloud Times sports writer and Joshua Fox, University Chronicle sports writer.

Television Broadcast: The semifinal and championship games of the Elite Eight will be televised. The semifinal games will be televised on ESPNU (DirecTV 609 and selected cable systems). The championship game will be aired live on ESPN2.

Head Coach: Dr. Lori Ulferts (North Dakota, 1983) is in her eleventh season with the Huskies and 20th season as a collegiate head coach. **She has compiled a current record of 161-144 at SCSU and has amassed a 313-233 record in 19 plus years as a head coach. Dr. Ulferts recorded her 300th career win against the**

University of Minnesota-Crookston on Dec. 19, 2004 with a 92-73 victory. Under her guidance the Huskies reached the 2001 NCAA North Central Region Tournament Semi-Finals before falling to the University of North Dakota, 76-63. That season the Huskies posted a 21-9 record, the best for a Husky team since the 1989-90 team posted a 23-5 overall record and was Co-NCC Champions. Before coming to St. Cloud, Ulferts coached at UM-Crookston (four seasons) and MN-State, Moorhead (five seasons). She is a two-time Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year.

Assistant Coaching Staff: Mike Jewett (Augustana College, 1994) begins his first year as Coach Ulferts' top assistant at SCSU. Jewett was the head women's basketball coach at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana for three seasons (2001-2004) where he compiled a 62-20 overall record. In 2004 he led his team to the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament, won the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), and was named the HCAC Coach of the Year.

Megan Taylor (Iowa State, 2002) will serve as the graduate assistant coach. She is the all-time Minnesota Girls High School leading scorer (record was broken during 04-05) and in December had her jersey retired at Iowa State, where she was a four-year standout.

Team Captains: Senior guards Molly Jensen (Minnetonka) and Katie Huschle (Eden Valley) and junior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall) are the Husky captains in 2004-05.

2003-04 Record: The Huskies posted a 17-11 overall record and finished fifth in the North Central Conference with a 7-7 record. The Huskies ended their season with a loss in first-round action in the 2004 Wells Fargo Tournament at the University of South Dakota on March 2. North Dakota State (11-3) won the NCC regular season while the University of North Dakota (10-4) claimed the NCC Wells Fargo Finals.

Fifth NCAA Elite Eight Appearance: The 2005 Elite Eight marks the fifth NCAA Division II quarterfinal appearance for an SCSU women's basketball team. The Huskies advanced to the quarterfinals in 1989, 1985, 1984, and 1983. This is the first time that SCSU has played in an Elite Eight tournament under the current format. In the four previous appearances, SCSU played at home sites of the competing teams. The Huskies are 0-4 in NCAA quarterfinal games. In 1989, SCSU lost to Central Missouri State, 87-71 in St. Cloud. In 1985, the Huskies lost to Cal Poly Pomona, 71-59 in St. Cloud. Pomona went on to win the 1985 NCAA Championship. In 1984, SCSU lost at the University of Dayton, 80-56, and in 1983 lost to Central Missouri State, 65-63 in St. Cloud.

Five Region Titles: St. Cloud State's 81-70 win over Concordia St. Paul in last week's North Central Region title game marked the fifth NCAA regional championship for the Huskies. The last time the Huskies advanced was in 1989. That year, the Huskies won the Region Title with an 87-80 victory over North Dakota State. SCSU is 5-1 all-time in Region title games. The Huskies won region titles in 1989, 1985, 1984, and 1983 and lost in the 1987 region championship game. SCSU has an all-time record of 11-9 in NCAA tournament games, including the three wins in this year's regional. The 2005 North Central Region Tournament marked the ninth NCAA tournament appearance for the Huskies.

North Central Conference Finish: The Huskies finished fourth in the regular season NCC standings with a 6-6 record. North Dakota, the 2003-04 Wells Fargo Champion, won the regular season title with a 10-2 record. Minnesota Duluth finished in second place with an 8-4 league record and Augustana came in third place, also 6-6 in the NCC.

The NCC in the Elite Eight: The North Central Conference has been represented in the Elite Eight since the regionalization format began in 1982. In 1991 North Dakota State became the first NCC team to win the national championship. An NCC team appeared in 11 consecutive championship games from 1991 to 2001 and a conference school has won nine of the last 14 NCAA Division II titles. The last national champion from the NCC was South Dakota State in 2003. North Dakota State won five Division II championships (1991, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996) and the University of North Dakota, 2005 Conference and Wells Fargo Finals Champions, won three straight NCAA titles in 1997, 1998, and 1999. South Dakota State and North Dakota State have moved on to the NCAA Division I ranks.

2005 Notes: SCSU has won three straight games and is 8-2 over the last ten games of the season. The Huskies have played one team in the Elite Eight field this season. SCSU defeated Grand Valley State 74-73 in overtime at the Grand Valley State University tournament on November 19, 2004. It was the second game of the season for the Huskies. SCSU trailed 33-20 at the half and came from behind in the second half. The Huskies took a 67-65 lead with :56 left in regulation on a Shannon Francis steal and layup. Jaida Bourke made two free throws for Grand Valley to tie the game at 67. With 16 seconds left Erika Quigley scored underneath to give SCSU a 69-67 lead. Bourke came through again with a jumper and seven seconds left to send the game into



overtime. SCSU took a 74-71 lead on a Molly Jensen layup midway through the overtime. At 2:18 Bourke made a layup to close to 74-73. An Erika Quigley blocked shot and rebound with :11 seconds left preserved the Husky win.

Senior Molly Jensen: Senior guard Molly Jensen (Minnetonka) has played in every game of her collegiate career, a total of 114. In her four-year stint at SCSU, Jensen has scored 591 points and has recorded 181 assists and 122 steals. She currently averages 5.4 points and 3.0 rebounds per game. She is a two-time Honorable Mention NCC All-Academic team member. Jensen scored a career high 18 points on January 31, 2003 against the University of Nebraska-Omaha. Jensen recorded a career high 10 rebounds against Minnesota Duluth on Saturday, March 12, 2005.

Senior Katie Huschle: Senior guard Katie Huschle (Eden Valley), reached the 1,000 point mark of her career on March 4, 2005 against North Dakota. She is the third-leading scorer for the Huskies this season averaging of 11.3 points per game. She has dished out a team high 144 assists on the season. Huschle ranks 7th in Division II rankings for free throw shooting percentage with a mark of 88.0 (103-117) percent. Huschle also ranks among SCSU's top-15 players in several career categories including assists, steals, free throws made, free throw percentage, three-point field goal percentage, and three-point field goals made. Huschle received NCC Player of the Week honors on December 22. She scored a career high 30 points, including 4 three-pointers, on February 12 against South Dakota. She set her career assist record at 9 on January 29, 2005 against Minnesota Duluth. Huschle is a 2004-05 team captain. She is an Honorable Mention All-NCC pick and Academic All-NCC team member.

Senior Krista Kettner: Kettner (Nicollet) is a two-year member of the Husky squad as she transferred from Iowa Lakes Community College in 2003. She has proven to be a valuable player from the bench, having seen playing time in 22 games this season. Kettner is averaging 2.8 points and 1.4 rebounds per game this season. She scored a career high 16 points against Augustana on February 17, 2005.

Junior Sascha Hansen: Junior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall) has been an invaluable addition to the SCSU team since her arrival, having played in and started every game for the past three years. Hansen is the second-leading scorer for the Huskies this season with an average of 11.6 points per game and is the second-leading Husky in assists with 140. Hansen currently ranks fifth in the nation for three-point field goal percentage with 46.7% (64-of-137). Hansen has made the 2004-05 season the best of her career, setting new personal bests in scoring (32 vs UM-Crookston, 12/11/04), rebounding (12 vs SMSU, 12/7/04), and assists (9 vs. Augustana, 1/15/05). She has tied the SCSU record for most three-point baskets made in a season with 64. Hansen is a two-time team captain. She is a 2005 All-North Central Conference team member and NCC Academic team member.

Junior April Carlson: Junior guard April Carlson (Hugo) has been a strong presence in the Husky front court this season, making starts in all but one game in 2004-05. Carlson is averaging 4.9 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. She has come up

with 39 steals on the season and is known for her aggressive defensive skills. Carlson scored a career high 14 points against UC-San Diego on December 30, 2004.

Sophomore Shannon Francis: Shannon Francis (Mahnomen) ranks fourth on the team for scoring with an average of 10.7 points per game. She has played in every game of her career and has started in all but five games. Francis scored a career high 22 points against Nebraska-Omaha on January 27, 2005. She also had a career high eight rebounds against Augustana College on Jan. 17. Francis has made many key three-point baskets for the Huskies this season. She was named to the 2005 North Central Region All-Tournament team.

Sophomore Laura Legge: Laura Legge (Aberdeen, SD) has come off the bench to see action in 29 games this season. She is averaging 2.1 points per game this season. Legge scored a season and career high 18 points on November 27, 2004 against Michigan Tech.

Sophomore Erika Quigley: Sophomore center Erika Quigley (Duluth) has dominated the NCC this season. As both the leading scorer and rebounder for the Huskies, Quigley is averaging 22.6 points and 12.0 rebounds per game. Quigley nailed her 1,000th career point on March 1, becoming just the third player in SCSU history to hit the 1,000-point mark as a sophomore. Quigley currently ranks fourth in the NCAA in rebounding (12.0 rpg), eighth in scoring (22.6 ppg), and 15th in blocked shots per game (2.5). She led the NCC in scoring, rebounding, and blocked shots. Quigley set a personal season and career scoring record of 37 points against SMSU on December 7, 2004, just one point shy of SCSU's game-high scoring record of 38 points. She set a new school record for rebounds in a single season with 385. Quigley has been named NCC Player of the Week four times this season and has posted a conference high 22 double-doubles. She set the sophomore record for scoring average in the NCC and tied the sophomore record for rebounding. She is the 2005 North Central Region MVP, First Team All-NCC and 2005 Daktronics, Inc. All-North Central Region First Team.

Sophomore Sarah Cotner: Due to a back injury, sophomore forward Cotner (Stillwater) has been sidelined for the majority of the season. She played in 8 games at the beginning of the season and was averaging 2.1 points and 1.3 rebounds.

Freshman Maggie Youngberg: Freshman guard Maggie Youngberg (Yankton, SD) has been active in 25 games this season. She has hit 7-of-14 three-pointers to gain a .500 record from long distance. Youngberg has a 1.6 point-per-game shooting average. She recorded a personal high 8 points against North Central University on December 9, 2004.

Freshman Kayla Rengel: Rengel (St. Cloud) has been a poignant force from the bench this season. Averaging 7.5 points and 3.7 rebounds in 28 games, Rengel has both the ability to cover space down low and the efficiency to nail field goals from the wing. Rengel's play was key to SCSU's first round victory over MSU Moorhead, as she hit four-of-four three-pointers in the second half. Rengel scored a career high 21 points against Augustana on January 15, 2005. She also pulled down 10 rebounds on February 12, 2005 against South Dakota.



North Central Region All-Tournament: Two SCSU sophomores were named to the North Central Region All-Tournament team last Monday. Sophomore post Erika Quigley was named to the All-Tournament team and the Region MVP. Sophomore guard Shannon Francis was named to the All-Tournament team. Quigley scored 71 points and pulled down 33 rebounds over the three-game tournament. Francis scored 43 points including 20 in the championship game.

All-NCC: Three Huskies have been distinguished among the top players in the NCC. Junior Sascha Hansen and sophomore Erika Quigley have been named to the All-North Central Conference Team. Quigley set the NCC record this year for sophomore scoring with a 22.5 points per game average and tied the sophomore rebounding record with a mark of 12.1 rebounds per game. Senior Katie Huschle was named All-NCC Honorable Mention.

Region Honors: Sophomore center Erika Quigley was named to the 2005 Daktronics All-North Central Region First Team.

Books and Brawn: Four members of the St. Cloud State women's basketball team were named to the 2004-05 Academic All-NCC Team. Senior **Katie Huschle** is an Elementary Education major with a 3.41 GPA. Junior **Sascha Hansen** was named to the team after earning a 3.55 GPA as a Physical Education major. Senior **Molly Jensen** was named Honorable Mention for the second year in a row. Sophomore **Shannon Francis** was also named Honorable Mention.

Join the Club: Two SCSU players have recently been inaugurated into the 1,000 Point Club. Senior **Katie Huschle** (Eden Valley) hit her 1,000th point on Friday, March 4 against North Dakota to become the 22nd member of the SCSU 1,000 point club. Huschle is a four-year member of the St. Cloud squad. She currently ranks 21st on SCSU's all-time scoring list with 1,027 points. Sophomore **Erika Quigley** reached the 1,000 point mark on March 1 against Minnesota State. The 6-2 sophomore from Duluth is just the third Husky to reach this milestone as a sophomore, behind Bonnie Henrickson (current Kansas women's basketball coach) and Diane Scherer (SCSU's all-time leading scorer). Quigley ranks 19th in all-time scoring at SCSU with 1,104 career points.

All-Tournament: St. Cloud State junior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall) was named to the 2005 Wells Fargo Finals All-Tournament team on Saturday night. Hansen led the Huskies with 22 points, four rebounds, and four assists in SCSU's 84-82 semifinal loss to eventual tournament champion University of North Dakota. She was seven of 11 from the field, 2-of-3 from three point range and six of seven from the free throw line.

Go in' National: In the latest NCAA Division II statistical rankings, SCSU is ranked eighth in scoring offense (80.1 ppg), 20th in field goal percent (45.6), 26th in free throw percent (74.8), 32nd in scoring margin (10.7 ppg), 35th in three point field goals made (6.5), and are shooting 38.0 percent in three point field goal percentage.

About Merrimack University: Merrimack University is located in North Andover, Massachusetts. The Warriors are members of the Northeast 10 Conference and support 16 men's and women's sports teams including Division I men's and women's hockey.

Merrimack Women's Basketball: The Warriors are making their second straight NCAA Division II Elite Eight appearance. Merrimack the number one seed in the Northeast Region defeated Bridgeport 72-46, American International 76-67, and Bentley 52-44 to get to the Elite Eight. The Warriors are led in scoring by junior guard Joelle Martin, who averages 17.2 points per game. Senior guard Jenny Smith is second in scoring with a 13.2 points per game average. Senior forward/center Eileen Brosnihan leads the team in rebounding with 6.7 rebounds and puts in 11.8 points per outing. Merrimack is the 2005 Northeast 10 regular season co-champion with Southern Connecticut. Both teams posted an 18-4 record in league play. The Warriors were defeated by Bentley College, 61-53 in overtime in the Northeast 10 Tournament Championship game. Brosnihan was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Northeast Region Tournament (for the second straight year), averaging 13.3 points and 7.3 rebounds in the regional. She posted her sixth double-double of the season in the championship game against Bentley with 13 points and 12 rebounds. Merrimack has played in three straight Northeast Regional tournaments.

Merrimack in the Elite Eight: In 2004, Merrimack advanced to the Final Four of the Elite Eight for the first time in school history. The Warriors won the 2004 Northeast-10 regular season and tournament titles, as well as the Northeast Region title. Merrimack defeated Augusta State 76-68 in the Elite Eight quarters but were beat by California, Pennsylvania 89-65 in the semifinals. California, PA went on to win the 2004 National title.

Head Coach Ann McInerney: Ann McInerney is in her sixth season as head coach of the Warriors. She has compiled a current won/loss record of 118-64. She led Merrimack to their first ever NCAA region tournament in 2003. She has been an assistant coach at Bentley College and played collegiate basketball at Assumption College of the Northeast-10 Conference.

Husky Replay-SCSU Advances to Elite Eight:

The St. Cloud State women's basketball team rallied to gain an 81-70 win over Concordia-St. Paul to advance to the Elite Eight NCAA tournament. The Huskies used the final minutes of the game to make up lost ground to gain the win. Tensions remained high right down to the buzzer. "Probably at :06 seconds left, I started to enjoy the win," remarked coach Ulferts." The level of play in the starting minutes of the North Central Region championship game did not resemble that of a high caliber tournament, with both teams combining to shoot just over 30 percent from the field and turning the ball over 9 times in the first 10 minutes of the game. Concordia found wide open shooters to take an early 6-2 advantage. The Huskies responded and hit baskets in the paint to gain a 1-point edge, but turnovers gave the lead back to CSP. Struggling on defense, the Huskies found themselves at an 8 point deficit with 2:00 remaining in the first half. CSP's Nakia Carlisle took control for the Bears, driving through the lane to gain 13 first half points. Concordia finished the first half shooting an even 50.0% from the field. A combination of 9 turnovers and 29.7% shooting put the Huskies down 38-29 at the half. Concordia lengthened their lead to 11 points three minutes into the second half. The tide turned midway through the final half, however, and SCSU rallied to save their season. Back-to-back three-pointers by Francis and Carlson following an SCSU timeout brought the Huskies to within one point, 54-53 with 9:23 remaining. The Huskies improved their rebounding and began to find their mark on offense. A layup by Katie Huschle gave the Huskies their first lead of the half, 57-56. The Huskies pulled ahead 70-64 at the 3:06 mark with a drained three-pointer from Francis. Concordia followed with a three to get within three points. With one minute remaining in the game, the Huskies had a 71-68 edge and Francis headed to the free throw line where she sank both shots. An offensive rebound by Quigley put the Huskies into stall mode and CSP was forced to foul, putting the nation's seventh best free throw shooter, Huschle, at the line. After hitting two shots, the Huskies took a 75-68 lead with :48 remaining. At that point in the game, the Huskies once again proved their worth at the free throw line, hitting all 8 of the bonus shots. The Huskies walked away with an 81-70 win and a berth among the nation's Elite Eight. St. Cloud improved their shooting performance to an outstanding 65.4% in the second half. They hit 76.0% of free throws in the game, including 15-of-19 in the second half. Quigley led the Huskies with 27 points and 17 rebounds. Francis hit four threes on the night to finish with 20 points and also had 6 rebounds. The leading scorer for Concordia-St Paul was Carlisle with 28 points. Ashley Smith had 15 points and the leading rebounder was Carly Christensen with 7 boards.
