**North Central Region Playoffs:** The #7 seed St. Cloud State will face the #2 seed Minnesota State-Moorhead in the first round of the North Central Region Playoffs on Friday, March 11 at 2:00 pm. The second round will be played on March 12 and the North Central Region Championship game will be played on March 14.

**North Central Region First Round Pairings:** St. Cloud State and Minnesota State-Moorhead, along with six other nominated teams, will be vying for the North Central Region title and a national playoff berth. All games will be played at #1 seed North Dakota at the Betty Engelstad Center. Here are the first round pairings:

- 2:00 p.m. - #2 Minn. State Moorhead (24-6) vs. #7 St. Cloud State (20-9)

- 6:00 p.m. - #8 Fort Hays State (22-7) vs #1 North Dakota (24-5)

**Tickets:** Tickets for North Central Region Playoffs are on sale through the University of North Dakota. To purchase, call the UND ticket office at (701)777-4689.

**On the Radio:** Friday's game will air on 1240 AM WJON with Jay Caldwell and Denise Stang will calling the action. 88.1 FM KVSC will also be in attendance and will be airing a live commentary of the game. The pre-game show begins ten minutes prior to tip-off.

**NCC Finish:** The Huskies finished fourth in the regular season NCC standings with a 6-6 record. North Dakota, the 2003-04 Wells Fargo Champion, won the regular season title with a 10-2 record. Minnesota Duluth finished in second place with an 8-4 league record and Augustana came in third place, also 6-6 in the NCC.

**Head Coach: Dr. Lori Ulferts** (North Dakota, 1983) is in her eleventh season with the Huskies and 20th season as a collegiate head coach. **She has compiled a 139-135 record in 10 seasons at SCSU and has amassed a 291-224 record in 19 years as a head coach. Dr. Ulferts recorded her 300th career win against the**

**University of Minnesota-Crookston on Dec. 19, 2004 with a 92-73 victory.** Under her guidance the Huskies reached the 2001 NCAA North Central Region Tournament Semi-Finals before falling to the University of North Dakota, 76-63. That season the Huskies posted a 21-9 record, the best for a Husky team since the 1989-90 team posted a 23-5 overall record and was Co-NCC Champions. Before coming to St. Cloud, Ulferts coached at MN-Crookston (four seasons) and MN-State, Moorhead (five seasons). She is a two-time Northern Sun Conference Coach of the Year.

**Assistant Coaching Staff: Mike Jewett** (Augustana College, 1994) begins his first year as Coach Ulferts' top assistant at SCSU. Prior to joining the SCSU staff, Jewett was the head women's basketball coach at Franklin College in Franklin, Indiana for 3 seasons (2001-2004) where he compiled a 62-20 overall record. In 2004 he led his team to the second round of the NCAA Division III tournament, won the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC), and was named the HCAC Coach of the Year.

**Megan Taylor** (Iowa State, 2002) will serve as the graduate assistant coach. She is the all-time Minnesota Girls High School leading scorer and in December had her jersey retired at Iowa State, where she was a four-year standout.

**Team Captains:** Senior guards Molly Jensen (Minnetonka) and Katie Huschle (Eden Valley) and junior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall) will serve as the Husky captains in 2004-05.

**2003-04 Record:** The Huskies posted a 17-11 overall record and finished fifth in the North Central Conference with a 7-7 record. In the NCAA Division II statistics, St. Cloud State ranked 6th in free throw percentage with 78.0% and ranked first in the NCC with 77.6% free throws. The Huskies ended their season with a loss in first-round action in the 2004 Wells Fargo Tournament at the University of South Dakota on March 2. North Dakota State (11-3) won the NCC regular season while the University of North Dakota (10-4) claimed the NCC Wells Fargo Finals.

**2004 All-Tournament Team Honors:** Erika Quigley (Grand Valley State Days Inn Tournament Most Valuable Player and All-Tournament Team, and American Family Insurance Classic All-Tournament Team in Duluth). Sascha Hansen (Grand Valley State Days Inn All-Tournament Team, American Family Insurance Classic All-Tournament Team in Duluth, Wells Fargo Finals All-Tournament Team in North Dakota).

## Huskies Receive 7th Place Final Region Ranking:

St. Cloud State hung on to 7th place in the North Central Region, receiving a berth in the NCAA North Central Regional Playoffs. The decision was announced the evening of Sunday, March 6.

**Senior Molly Jensen:** Senior guard Molly Jensen (Minnetonka) will play in her 112th game as a Husky on Friday. She has seen playing time in every game since joining the squad in 2001. In her four-year stint at SCSU, Jensen has scored 570 points and has recorded 118 steals. She currently ranks fourth on the team in assists with 49 on the season and has 175 on her career. Jensen scored a career high 18 points on January 31, 2003 against the University of Nebraska-Omaha. Also against UNO, on January 27, 2005, Jensen pulled down a career high 9 rebounds.

**Senior Katie Huschle:** Senior guard Katie Huschle (Eden Valley), reached the 1,000 point mark of her career in last weekend's game against North Dakota. She is the third-leading scorer for the Huskies this season with 342 total points and an average of 11.8 points per game. She has dished out a team high 135 assists on the season. Huschle ranks 6th in Division II rankings for free throw shooting percentage with a mark of 87.9 percent. She ranks second in the NCC with 87.5%. Huschle also ranks among SCSU's top-leading players in several categories. She is currently third for all-time free throw percentage with 80.5%, fourth in three-point field goal percentage (37.4%), fifth in three-pointers made (88), and seventh in both three-point field goal attempts (235) and assists (336). Huschle received NCC Player of the Week honors on December 22. She scored a career high 30 points, including 4 three-pointers, on February 12 against South Dakota. She set her career assist record at 9 on January 29, 2005 against Minnesota Duluth. Huschle was named Academic All-NCC Honorable Mention in 2002-03. Huschle is a 2004-05 team captain.

**Senior Krista Kettner:** Kettner (Nicollet) is a two-year member of the Husky squad as she transferred from Iowa Lakes Community College in 2003. She has proven to be a valuable player from the bench, having seen playing time in 47 games. Kettner is averaging 2.6 points and 1.2 rebounds per game this season. She scored a career high 16 points against Augustana on February 17, 2005.

**Junior Sascha Hansen:** Junior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall) has been an invaluable addition to the SCSU team since her arrival, having played in and started every game for the past three years. Hansen is the second-leading scorer for the Huskies this season with an average of 12.2 points per game (353 total points) and is the second-leading Husky in assists with 124. Hansen currently ranks first in the nation for three-point field goal percentage with 48.8% (60-of-123) and leads the NCC in the category with 49.2% (63-of-128). Among the all-time SCSU leaders, Hansen ranks second for three-point field goal percentage, connecting with 42.0% (110-262) 3FGs in her career. She ranks third for all-time three-pointers made with 110, fourth for free throw percentage with 79.3% (226-of-285), and seventh for three-point attempts with 262 shots taken. Hansen has made the 2004-05 season the best of her career, setting new personal bests in scoring (32 vs UM-Crookston, 12/11/04), rebounding (12 vs SMSU, 12/7/04), and assists (9 vs. Augustana, 1/15/05). Hansen is a two-time team captain.

**Junior April Carlson:** Junior guard April Carlson (Hugo) has been a strong presence in the Husky backcourt this season, making starts in all but one game in 2004-05. Carlson is averaging 4.9 points and 3.9 rebounds per game. She has come up with 33 steals on the season and is known for her aggressive defensive skills. Carlson scored a career high 14 points against UC-San Diego on December 30, 2004.



**Sophomore Shannon Francis:** Shannon Francis (Mahnomen) ranks fourth on the team for scoring with an average of 10.3 points per game. She has played in every game of her career and has started in all but 5 games. Having hit 83 threes on her career, Francis provides SCSU with firepower from beyond the arc. She already resides at #8 on SCSU's all-time made three-pointers list. Francis scored a career high 22 points against Nebraska-Omaha on January 27, 2005.

**Sophomore Laura Legge:** Laura Legge (Aberdeen, SD) has come off the bench to see action in 26 games this season. She is averaging 2.3 points per game this season. Legge scored a season and career high 18 points on November 27, 2004 against Michigan Tech.

**Sophomore Erika Quigley:** Sophomore center Erika Quigley (Duluth) has dominated the NCC this season. As both the leading scorer and rebounder for the Huskies, Quigley is averaging 22.5 points and 12.1 rebounds per game. Quigley nailed her 1,000th career point on March 1, becoming just the third player in SCSU history to hit the 1,000-point mark as a sophomore. Quigley currently ranks second in the NCAA in rebounding (12.5 rpg), fourth in scoring (22.7 ppg), and 14th in blocked shots per game (2.6). She leads the NCC in scoring, rebounding, and blocked shots. Quigley set a personal season and career scoring record of 37 points against SMSU on December 7, 2004, just one point shy of SCSU's game-high scoring record of 38 points. She set a new school record for rebounds in a single season with 352. Quigley has been named NCC Player of the Week four times this season and has posted a conference high 20 double-doubles. She has also been named to the 2005 Daktronics, Inc. All-North Central Region First Team.

**Sophomore Sarah Cotner:** Due to a back injury, sophomore forward Cotner (Stillwater) has been sidelined for the majority of the season. She played in 8 games at the beginning of the season and was averaging 2.1 points and 1.3 rebounds.

**Freshman Maggie Youngberg:** Freshman guard Maggie Youngberg (Yankton, SD) has been active in 23 games this season. She has hit 7-of-14 three-pointers to gain a .500 record from long distance. Youngberg has a 1.6 point-per-game shooting average. She recorded a personal high 8 points against North Central University on December 9, 2004.

**Freshman Kayla Rengel:** Rengel (St. Cloud) has been a poignant force from the bench this season. Averaging 7.6 points and 3.7 rebounds in 25 games, Rengel has both the ability to cover space down low and the efficiency to nail field goals from the wing. She has taken over the top position for SCSU's all-time three-point field goal percentage list with 45.5% (30-of-66). She has also connected with 55.7% of all field goals (68-of-122). Rengel scored a career high 21 points against Augustana on January 15, 2005. She also pulled down 10 rebounds on February 12, 2005 against South Dakota.

**Husky Replay:** The Huskies suffered a semifinal loss to North Dakota, 82-84, in Grand Forks Friday night. The loss extends SCSU's 5-season losing streak with UND to 12 games. The semifinal matchup between #4 ranked St. Cloud and the regular NCC champs North Dakota was a fast-paced, rough-and-tough battle that was decided in the final seconds of the game. SCSU and UND battled for the lead throughout the first half, with the score tied 7 times. Both teams were actively involved in shoving matches to gain ground in the paint, resulting in more than 20 free throws being shot in the first half. Despite tough defensive pressure from both teams, shooters with hands in their face still managed to connect on shots, with the Huskies shooting 46.7% in the first half and UND going for 47.1%. UND tried to make a push in the final minutes of the half to widen the scoring margin, but the Huskies fought back to keep the halftime score to within four points, trailing 38-42. St. Cloud came out of the gates in the second period with intensity on defense, holding UND to one basket in the first four minutes. UND then went on several runs to lengthen their lead, but SCSU fought back to get within a point. This type of play continued throughout the second half, with UND jumping ahead and SCSU fighting back to close the gap. A feed from Hansen to Erika Quigley on an inbound play tied the game up at 64 with 7:56 remaining. Down by three points with 1:12 remaining, Hansen drove hard to the basket, sinking a shot as the whistle blew. Hoping to convert a three-point play to tie the game, Husky fans jumped out of their seats as an offensive foul was charged and the possession changed hands to UND. Still down by 3 and the play clock dwindling down, Francis drove through the lane to the hole at the :38 mark, bringing the score to 79-80. The Huskies were forced to foul and UND hit two key free throws to bring the score to 82-79 in favor of UND. The Huskies had an opportunity to tie the game with a three-pointer, but an off-aim shot and a key defensive rebound by Chelsea Hausauer, followed soon after by an SCSU foul, put North Dakota back on the line, where they took an 84-79 lead with just :06 remaining. A three-point shot by Kayla Rengel found the inside of the hoop at the buzzer, but the Huskies were unable to tie the game and fell 82-84. Quigley and Hansen led the Huskies with 22 points each and Huschle followed with 14. Francis also added 10 and Rengel finished with 8. Huschle and Quigley each had a team high 6 rebounds. The rebounds for Quigley were enough to set a new school record for the top single-season rebounding performance. Quigley surpassed Bonnie Hendrickson's record of 348 rebounds from 1982-83, and currently sits with 352 boards on the season. North Dakota was led in scoring and rebounding by Ashley Langen with 29 points and nine rebounds. Kristi Boese finished with 17 points and 8 boards.



**Husky Notes:**

**All-NCC:** Three Huskies have been distinguished among the top players in the NCC. Junior Sascha Hansen and sophomore Erika Quigley have been named to the All-North Central Conference Team. Hansen is averaging 12.2 points and 4.6 rebounds per game. She leads the nation in three-point shooting percentage with 48.8%. Quigley is averaging 22.5 points and 12.1 rebounds per game. She leads the NCC in scoring, rebounding, and blocked shots and is ranked nationally in three categories. Senior Katie Huschle was named All-NCC Honorable Mention.

**Region Honors:** Sophomore center Erika Quigley has been named to the 2005 Daktronics All-North Central Region First Team. Quigley leads the Huskies in scoring and rebounding for the second year running. She set the NCC record this year for sophomore scoring with a 22.5 points per game average and tied the sophomore rebounding record with a mark of 12.1 rebounds per game.

**Books and Brawn:** Four members of the St. Cloud State women's basketball team were named to the 2004-05 Academic All-NCC Team. Senior **Katie Huschle** is an Elementary Education major with a 3.41 GPA. Huschle is rounding out her Husky career averaging 11.8 points per game and just joined the 1,000 Point Club. Huschle is ranked sixth in the nation for free throw percentage with 87.9%. Junior **Sascha Hansen** was named to the team after earning a 3.55 GPA as a Physical Education major. Hansen is the second-leading scorer for the Huskies this season with an average 12.2 points per game. Hansen currently leads the nation for three-point field goal percentage (48.8%). She has hit 110 threes on her career. Senior **Molly Jensen** was named Honorable Mention for the second year in a row. Sophomore **Shannon Francis** was also named Honorable Mention.

**Join the Club:** Two SCSU players have recently been inaugurated into the 1,000 Point Club. Senior **Katie Huschle** (Eden Valley) hit her 1,000th point on Friday, March 4 against North Dakota. Huschle is a four-year member of the St. Cloud squad and is currently the third-leading scorer with an average 11.8 points per game. The team captain ranks 6th in the nation for free throw shooting percentage with a mark of 87.9% and is third on SCSU's all-time career free-throw shooting percentage list with 80.4%. Sophomore **Erika Quigley** reached the 1,000 point mark on March 1 against Minnesota State. The 6-2 sophomore from Duluth is just the third Husky to reach this milestone as a sophomore and becomes the 21st member of SCSU's distinguished 1,000 Point Club. Quigley is averaging 22.5 points per game and leads the NCC in scoring, rebounding, and blocked shots. She has been named to the 2005 Daktronics, Inc. All-North Central Region First Team.

**All-Tournament:** St. Cloud State junior guard Sascha Hansen (Marshall) was named to the 2005 Wells Fargo Finals All-Tournament team on Saturday night. Hansen led the Huskies with 22 points, four rebounds, and four assists in SCSU's 84-82 semifinal loss to eventual tournament champion University of North Dakota. She was seven of 11 from the field, 2-of-3 from three point range and six of seven from the free throw line.

**Goin' National:** In the latest NCAA Division II statistical rankings, SCSU junior Sascha Hansen stands out as the national leader in three-point field goal percentage with a mark of 48.8%. Sophomore Erika Quigley is second for rebounds (12.5rpg), fourth for scoring (22.7 ppg), and 14th for blocked shots (2.6/g). Senior Katie Huschle rests at sixth place in the nation for free throw percentage with 87.9%. As a team, the Huskies are sixth for three-point percentage (38.5%), eighth for scoring offense (80.5 ppg), 19th for field goal percentage (46.0%), 30th for three-pointers per game (6.7), and 35th for free throw percentage (74.1%).

**SCSU and the Regional Teams**

**#2 Minnesota State-Moorhead (23-5):** St. Cloud State has played MSU-Moorhead 35 times in the past 35 years. The Huskies have taken a lead in the overall series standings, 21-14. The two teams met on December 1 of this season in Moorhead, when the Huskies stole a game from the Dragons, winning 82-72. SCSU is currently on a five-game winning streak against MSU-M.

**#1 North Dakota (24-5):** Taking the top spot in the North Central Region, North Dakota holds a 24-5 overall record. UND finished as the regular season North Central Conference champions and also won the Wells Fargo Finals for the fifth straight year. In the overall series with SCSU, UND has shown dominance, 36-15.

**#3 Regis (Colo.) (23-6):** Regis University finished first in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference this season and second in the RMAC Finals. St. Cloud State has never played Regis.

**#4 Concordia-St. Paul (22-7):** The Golden Bears finished the regular season in second place in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference and won the NSIC Red Baron Classic Championship over MSU-Moorhead. The Huskies fell to CSP earlier this season 76-78, to set the overall record at 5-4 in favor of SCSU.

**#5 Metro State (24-6):** The Roadrunners upset #1 RMAC seed Regis in the Wells Fargo RMAC Shootout to claim the 2004-05 title. St. Cloud State has never played Metro State.

**#6 Minnesota Duluth (19-8):** In their inaugural season as members of the NCC, the Bulldogs laid claim to the second place position in the NCC regular season. They fell to #7 ranked South Dakota in the quarterfinal round of the NCC playoffs, however. The overall series record between SCSU and UMD stands at 32-19 in favor of the Huskies. UMD defeated SCSU in both meetings this season.

**#8 Fort Hays State (22-7):** Fort Hays State inched their way into the regional playoffs, claiming the last seed with an overall 22-7 record. The Tigers finished fourth in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. St. Cloud State and Fort Hays State have never played each other.
