Season Opener: The St. Cloud State University women's basketball team will take its 1-0 record on the road to the 8th Annual Minnesota State University, Mankato Pepsi Tip-Off, Nov. 21-22 in Bresnan Arena. The Huskies will play Henderson State University at 1:00 p.m. on Friday and Dakota State at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday.

For the Record: St. Cloud State is 1-0 after opening the season with a 94-39 non-conference win over the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh last Saturday. Henderson State opens the season on Nov. 18 and are 0-0. Dakota State is 1-5 overall. St. Cloud State posted an 11-17 overall record in 2007-08 and finished the final season of the North Central Conference with a 3-9 league record and a fifth place finish.

Series Record: The Pepsi Tip-Off games mark the first contests between the Huskies and Henderson State and Dakota State.

SCSU Team Captains: Senior guards Anna Cashman (Faribault) and Katie Tacheny (Woodbury), along with junior guard Megan Foley (St. Cloud) will captain the 2008-09 Huskies.

A New League: In 2008-09, the Huskies athletic program joins the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC), a 14-school league representing schools from Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska and Iowa. With the expanded conference, the Huskies will play a 20-game league schedule and follow the regular season with the NSIC Tournament. It also means that SCSU will not play every team twice in 2008-09. The Huskies will play Bemidji State, Concordia-St. Paul, Minnesota, Crookston, Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, Southwest Minnesota State University and Winona State University twice.

Head Coach Lori Fish

Lori Fish is a familiar name to the St. Cloud area. Fish grew up in St. Cloud and attended St. Cloud Tech High School. Following her graduation from Tech, she went on to play basketball at South Dakota State and competed against the Huskies in the North Central Conference.



Following the completion of an outstanding collegiate playing career where she gained First Team All-Conference honors as a junior and senior, Fish entered the coaching ranks. She started as a high school coach in Foley, Minn., for two seasons before returning to South Dakota State as a graduate assistant coach. She spent one year at NCAA Division I Eastern Illinois University and returned to SDSU as an assistant. In 1999, Lori Ulferts hired Fish as an assistant to the Husky program and she served as the recruiting and strength and conditioning coordinator under Ulferts for five seasons. In 2004, Fish became a head coach at rival Minnesota State University, Mankato. She quickly distinguished herself as a rising young coach and in 2007-08, her final season with the Mavericks, led her team to a 23-9 record and the championship game of the NCAA Division II North Central Region Tournament.

In four seasons as a collegiate head coach, Fish has compiled a 62-53 overall won/loss record.

Assistant Coaches



St. Cloud State assistant coach **Carol Thelen** is in her third season with the Huskies. An SCSU alumnus and Albany, Minn., native, Thelen had been the head girls basketball coach at DeLaSalle High School in Minneapolis since 1999.



Darby Noreen is in her rookie season with the Huskies. An Albany, Minn., native, Noreen was a standout athlete at Albany High School and the College of St. Benedict. She has been an assistant coach at both Albany and St. Ben's.



Katie Jensen will serve as a student assistant coach in 2008-09. Jensen played for the Huskies from 2005 to 2007. She is a graduate of English Valleys (IA) High School.

Game Notes

About St. Cloud State: The Huskies opened the 2008-09 season under first-year head coach Lori Fish with a 94-39 win over the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh last Saturday. The 94 points marked the highest point total for SCSU since a 1070-69 win over Mayville State on Dec. 20, 2006. The Huskies scored the opening basket and went up 23-0 before the Titans hit a jumper at the midway point of the first half. Sophomores Rachel Booth (Minneapolis) and Talish Barlow (Little Canand) had eight points and six points, respectively in the run. St. Cloud State led 47-21 at the half and shot 52.2 percent from the field and 46.2 percent from three-point range. SCSU out rebounded UW-Oshkosh 40-27. All 11 players in uniform for the game played at least ten minutes, including five players making their collegiate debuts with the Huskies. First year players Becca Friestleben (Victoria), Amy Frye (Hudson, WI), Christina Steele (Apple Valley), Aaryn Booker (Minneapolis), and sophomore transfer Marlayna Graff (Harris) all had playing time.

St. Cloud State in the Pepsi Tip-Off: This will be the Huskies third appearance in the Pepsi Tip-Off. SCSU competed in the Classic in 2005 and 2007. The Huskies are 3-1 in games played in the Pepsi Tip-Off.

About Henderson State: The Lady Reddies are members of the Gulf South Conference and posted a 15-12 overall record last season and finished 6-8 in the conference. Josh Matthews is in his third season as head coach of the Lady Reddies and has a 34-22 record with Henderson State and a 135-74 career record in seven seasons of coaching. Henderson State University is located in Arkadelphia, Arkansas. The team returns three starters from last season including sophomore guard Jazmine Ellis who led the team in scoring last season with 12.2 points per game.

About Dakota State: Dakota State University is located in Madison, South Dakota and is a member of the Dakota Athletic Conference. The Lady T's are NAIA affiliates. Last season DSU posted a 21-11 overall record and finished in a first place tie in the DAC with an 11-3 mark. Head coach Joe Reints is in his first season with the Lady T's. He compiled a 69-33 record in three seasons as head coach at Lambuth University, and NAIA Division I program.

NSIC Preseason Poll: The 2008-09 NSIC Women's Basketball Coachs Preseason Poll was released last week and the Huskies were picked to finish eighth in the league. Conference newcomer Minnesota State University, Mankato was tabbed the preseason favorite followed by another newcomer Augustana College. Concordia-St. Paul, the defending NSIC champion was picked third.

Not a Stranger to the NSIC: St. Cloud State is no stranger to the NSIC as the university was a charter member of the Northern Sun Conference, the predecessor to the current league. The SCSU men's athletics department was a charter member of the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) in 1932. The Northern Sun Conference (NSC) for women's sports was formally announced in 1979-80 and SCSU was a charter member of that organization. Later the two combined to become the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference for men's and women's athletics. SCSU women's teams captured four NSC basketball and tennis championships, and one volleyball championship from 1979 to 1984.

Player Notes

#3 Katie Tacheny Notes: Guard and senior captain Katie Tacheny (Woodbury) has started 46 straight games for the Huskies...she opened the 2008-09 season with a six of ten shooting performance from the field and equaled her career high in scoring with 18 points against UW-Oshkosh...went four of five from three-point range and two of two from the free throw line...had six steals (equals her career high).



#10 Krystal Scott Notes: Senior guard Krystal Scott (Rosemount) has played in a team high 86 games...has started ten straight games including the final nine of the 2007-08 season...opened the 2008-09 season with four points, two rebounds and two assists against UW-Oshkosh.



#11 Talisha Barlow Notes: Sophomore guard Talisha Barlow (Little Canada) has played in every game, 29 straight, of her collegiate career and made 24 starts...scored a game high 22 points and eight rebounds in the season opening win over UW-Oshkosh last Saturday...had a career high seven steals in the game and shot ten of 15 from the field...played a total of 21 minutes...scored career high 24 points against Lake Superior State on 12/22/07, making ten of 13 field goal attempts..tallied her first collegiate double-double vs UNO with 21 points/ten rebounds on 2/14/08.



#21 Anna Cashman Notes: Senior guard and captain Anna Cashman (Faribault) did not play in the season opener against UW-Oshkosh, and has been sidelined with an injury...led the 2007-08 team with 46 three-point field goals...scored a career high 23 points vs. UW-Stout on 11/17/07, hitting eight of 12 field goals...twice during the 2007-08 season she made five three-point baskets in a game.



#23 Danielle Ellison Notes: Senior forward Danielle Ellison (St. Paul) started the 28th game of her career last Saturday...has played in 57 career games as a Husky...opened the 2008-09 season with nine points and three rebounds...scored her career high 18 points against Chico State on 12/28/07.



#32 Rachel Booth Notes: Sophomore center Rachel Booth (Minneapolis) has played in 28 of the 29 games of her collegiate career...missed the final game of her rookie season due to an injury...starter in 28 collegiate games including the 2008-09 season opener...scored 12 points and had seven rebounds, including five on the offensive boards against UW-Oshkosh last Saturday...has scored in double figures in 21 games of her collegiate career...recorded her first collegiate double-double in an 18 point, 17 rebound effort against Sonoma State on 12/29/07.



#34 Megan Foley: Junior guard and team captain, Foley (St. Cloud) played 19 minutes in the 2008-09 season opener and dished out three assists...also blocked a game high two shots...played in 13 games in 2007-08 and scored her career high eight points against Lake Superior State on 12/22/07.

#2 Becca Friestleben Notes: First year guard Becca Friestleben (Victoria) made her collegiate debut last Saturday and scored six points and handed out two assists in 16 minutes of play... holds Holy Family Catholic High School all-time scoring record (boys and girls) with 2,515 career points...led State in three-point baskets made three years in a row.



#13 Marlayna Graff Notes: Sophomore post Marlayna Graff (Harris), a transfer who sat out the second half of the Huskies 2007-08 season, finally got some playing time on the Husky hardcourt. Graff had six points and five rebounds against UW-Oshkosh...named a NJCAA Division III Preseason Second Team All-American in the fall of 2007 prior to her transfer to St. Cloud State.



#35 Amy Frye Notes: First year forward Amy Frye (Hudson, WI) played ten minutes of the season opener... scored 262 points, pulled down 128 rebounds, had 37 steals, and 24 blocked shots during her senior campaign at Hudson (WI) High School.



#43 Christina Steele Notes: First year post Christina Steele (Apple Valley) scored eight points in her collegiate debut last Saturday...three-time First Team All-Lake Conference in high school... holds record for most points in a season with 504...team rebounding leader for three straight years.



#45 Aaryn Booker Notes: First year forward Aaryn Booker (Minneapolis)...had a solid outing against UW-Oshkosh, scoring nine points and pulling down seven rebounds...Booker and Rachel Booth player high school ball at DeLaSalle High School...all-time scoring and rebounding leader at DeLaSalle with 1,226 career points and 787 career rebounds.



Sidelined for the Season: Sophomore guard Jordi Gerking (Spirit Lake, Iowa) and first-year post Lauren Carew (Fargo, ND) will take medical redshirts in 2008-09. Both suffered knee injuries during the preseason.
