**NSIC Debut:** The St. Cloud State University women's basketball team will make its debut in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) on Friday and Saturday, Dec. 5 and 6. On Friday, the Huskies will play at Winona State University and are scheduled for a 6:00 p.m. tip-off in McCown Gymnasium. On Saturday, the Huskies play at Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa with the tip-off scheduled for 6:00 p.m. at the Dorman Gymnasium.

**For the Record:** St. Cloud State is 5-0 following two wins at the UNO Thanksgiving Classic last weekend. The Huskies posted a 73-55 win over Northwest Missouri State on Friday and were 67-54 victors over the University of Nebraska-Omaha on Saturday. Winona State also enters the weekend with a 5-0 record while Upper Iowa brings a 3-2 record into the week.

**Series Records:** The Huskies are 21-7 all-time against Winona State and have won 21 straight in the series which

began in 1969, making it one of the Huskies oldest women's basketball rivalries. The last Husky loss to the Warriors was during the 1975-76 season. The Huskies are 2-0 all-time against Upper Iowa. SCSU swept a series against the Peacocks during the 2005-06 season winning 89-41 and 83-46.

**SCSU Team Captains:** Senior guards Anna Cashman (Faribault) and Katie Tacheny (Woodbury), along with junior guard Megan Foley (St. Cloud) will captain the 2008-09 Huskies.

**End of a Road Stretch:** The Huskies will finish off a six-game road stretch this weekend. After opening the season at home, SCSU has played four straight road games and will add five and six in the upcoming weekend. The Huskies are 4-0 on the road and return home for NSIC action on Dec. 12 and 13 against MSU Moorhead and Minnesota, Crookston.

Head Coach Lori Fish

Lori Fish is a familiar name to the St. Cloud area. Fish grew up in St. Cloud and attended St. Cloud Tech High School. Following her graduation from Tech, she went on to play basketball at South Dakota State and competed against the Huskies in the North Central Conference.



Following the completion of an outstanding collegiate playing career where she gained First Team All-Conference honors as a junior and senior, Fish entered the coaching ranks. She started as a high school coach in Foley, Minn., for two seasons before returning to South Dakota State as a graduate assistant coach. She spent one year at NCAA Division I Eastern Illinois University and returned to SDSU as an assistant. In 1999, Lori Ulferts hired Fish as an assistant to the Husky program and she served as the recruiting and strength and conditioning coordinator under Ulferts for five seasons. In 2004, Fish became a head coach at rival Minnesota State University, Mankato. She quickly distinguished herself as a rising young coach and in 2007-08, her final season with the Mavericks, led her team to a 23-9 record and the championship game of the NCAA Division II North Central Region Tournament.

In four seasons as a collegiate head coach, Fish has compiled a 62-53 overall won/loss record.

Assistant Coaches



St. Cloud State assistant coach **Carol Thelen** is in her third season with the Huskies. An SCSU alumnus and Albany, Minn., native, Thelen had been the head girls basketball coach at DeLaSalle High School in Minneapolis since 1999.



**Darby Noreen** is in her rookie season with the Huskies. An Albany, Minn., native, Noreen was a standout athlete at Albany High School and the College of St. Benedict. She has been an assistant coach at both Albany and St. Ben's.



**Katie Jensen** will serve as a student assistant coach in 2008-09. Jensen played for the Huskies from 2005 to 2007. She is a graduate of English Valleys (IA) High School.

## Game Notes

**About St. Cloud State:** The Huskies are off to a 5-0 start for the first time since the 2005-07 season when SCSU started the season 17-0. As a team, St. Cloud State is shooting 50.7 percent from the field and averaging 83.0 points through five non-conference games. The Huskies are shooting 77.9 percent from the free throw line. Over the weekend the Huskies made 23 of 26 (.885) free throw attempts against Northwest Missouri and 20 of 23 (.870) attempts against Nebraska-Omaha. The Huskies scored the final 13 points of the game against UNO from the free throw line. St. Cloud State has shot 40 percent or better from the field in each of its games this season and has held a rebounding advantage in three games. The Huskies are one of four undefeated teams in the NSIC, joining Minnesota State, MSU Moorhead and Winona State.

**NSIC Preseason Poll:** The 2008-09 NSIC Women's Basketball Coaches Preseason Poll was released on Oct. 22 and the Huskies were picked to finish eighth in the league. Conference newcomer Minnesota State University, Mankato was tabbed the preseason favorite followed by another newcomer Augustana College. Concordia-St. Paul, the defending NSIC champion was picked third.

**About Winona State:** The Warriors are 5-0 overall including 3-0 at home and are coming off two wins at the Hyatt Place Mount Lion Classic hosted by the University of Colorado-Colorado Springs. Winona posted an 83-50 win over Adams State (CO) and a 90-63 win over UC-Colorado Springs. WSU sophomore forward Natalie Gigler was named the MVP of the Classic and senior guard Jenny Steffer was named to the All-Tournament team. The Warriors are led in scoring by junior guard Ana Wurtz who averages 17.0 points per game and is shooting 50 percent from three point range. Gigler with 16.4 points per game and Steffen with 11.6 points per game are the two other players averaging double figures for WSU. The Warriors are shooting 52.5 percent from the field and averaging 88.4 points per game for +33.0 scoring margin. WSU has out rebounded its opponents 40.8 to 36.6. Winona State head coach Scott Ballard is in his fifth season with the Warriors. He has compiled a 49-64 record at WSU and a 318-196 record in 18 seasons as a collegiate head coach. Winona State posted a 21-9 record last season and finished the NSIC race in a third place tie with an 11-7 record.

**About Upper Iowa:** The Peacocks are 3-2 overall and are 2-1 on their home court. Upper Iowa played Bemidji State and Southwest Minnesota State in the Sanford Health/NSIC Holiday Hoopsfest last Saturday and Sunday. The Peacocks opened the Hoopsfest with a 112-108 overtime win over Bemidji State as junior guard Andrea Downs exploded for 41 points that included a 20 of 21 effort from the free throw line. On Sunday, Southwest Minnesota State defeated the Peacocks 74-61. Upper Iowa is led in scoring by senior guard Britney Iredale and Downs. Iredale averages 19.4 points and Downs 19.0 points per game. Junior Lene Lox averages in double figure scoring with 13.2 points per game. Iredale is the top rebounder for the team with 8.6 boards a game. The Peacocks average 84.4 points per game and are shooting 45.3 percent from the field. Upper Iowa opponents hold the rebounding edge 43.0 to 39.0 thus far in the season. Mike Brown is serving as the interim head coach of the Peacocks. For the last three years, Brown has served as an assistant coach with the Peacocks. He compiled a 115-78 record as head coach of Iowa Central Community College prior to joining the Upper Iowa coaching staff. Last season Upper Iowa posted a 7-23 overall record and finished ninth in the NSIC with a 3-15 mark.

**#3 Katie Tacheny Notes:** Guard and senior captain Katie Tacheny (Woodbury) combined for 24 points in last weekend's wins in Omaha...she was seven of eight from the free throw line against UNO and made four straight from the charity stripe in the final ten seconds of the game...has started 50 straight games for the Huskies...scored a career high 20 points against Dakota State on Nov. 22...is averaging 14.2 points per game and leads the team with 15 steals.



**#10 Krystal Scott Notes:** Senior guard Krystal Scott (Rosemount) has played in a team high 90 games...has started 14 straight games including the final nine of the 2007-08 season...scored 11 points in win over Northwest Missouri State on Friday...equaled her career high with 14 points against Dakota State on Nov. 22...made of seven of eight field goal attempts in the game.



**#11 Talisha Barlow Notes:** Sophomore guard Talisha Barlow (Little Canada) has played in every game, 33 straight, of her collegiate career and made 28 starts...leads the team in scoring with 16.6 points per game...combined for 24 points over the weekend at the UNO Classic including 17 points against Nebraska-Omaha...has scored in double figures in four games this season...had a career high seven steals in the season opener against UW-Oshkosh on Nov. 15...scored career high 24 points against Lake Superior State on 12/22/07, making ten of 13 field goal attempts...tallied her first collegiate double-double vs UNO with 21 points/ten rebounds on 2/14/08.



**#21 Anna Cashman Notes:** Senior guard and captain Anna Cashman (Faribault) scored a season high 17 points in win over Nebraska-Omaha on Saturday...made eight of eight from the free throw line, including six straight free throws in the final 45 seconds of the game...leads the Huskies with eight three-point baskets this season...led the 2007-08 team with 46 three-point field goals...scored a career high 23 points vs. UW-Stout on 11/17/07, hitting eight of 12 field goals...twice during the 2007-08 season she made five three-point baskets in a game.



**#23 Danielle Ellison Notes:** Senior forward Danielle Ellison (St. Paul) started the 32nd game of her career last Saturday...has played in 61 career games as a Husky...scored a season high 11 points against Henderson State on Nov. 21...scored her career high 18 points against Chico State on 12/28/07.



**#32 Rachel Booth Notes:** Sophomore center Rachel Booth (Minneapolis) scored a season and game high 19 points in the Huskies 73-55 win over Northwest Missouri State on Friday...shot seven of ten from the field and was five of six from the free throw line...also had six rebounds, all on the defensive boards, two blocked shots and a career high four steals...Saturday, had a season and game high eight rebounds in win over Nebraska-Omaha to go with eight points, and two blocks...has played in 32 of the 32 games of her collegiate career...missed the final game of her rookie season due to an injury...starter in 30 collegiate games...has scored in double figures in 23 games of her collegiate career...recorded her first collegiate double-double in an 18 point, 17 rebound effort against Sonoma State on 12/29/07.

**A New League:** In 2008-09, the Huskies athletic program joins the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC), a 14-school league representing schools from Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska and Iowa. With the expanded conference, the Huskies will play a 20-game league schedule and follow the regular season with the NSIC Tournament. It also means that SCSU will not play every team twice in 2008-09. The Huskies will play Bemidji State, Concordia-St. Paul, Minnesota, Crookston, Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, Southwest Minnesota State University and Winona State University twice.

**Not a Stranger to the NSIC:** St. Cloud State is no stranger to the NSIC as the university was a charter member of the Northern Sun Conference, the predecessor to the current league. The SCSU men's athletics department was a charter member of the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) in 1932. The Northern Sun Conference (NSC) for women's sports was formally announced in 1979-80 and SCSU was a charter member of that organization. Later the two combined to become the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference for men's and women's athletics. SCSU women's teams captured four NSC basketball and tennis championships, and one volleyball championship from 1979 to 1984.
