The Game: The St. Cloud State University Husky football team will travel to Bismarck, North Dakota for a non-conference game against the University of Mary on Saturday, Sept. 8. The kick-off is scheduled for 6:00 p.m. at the Bismarck Community Bowl (7,000).

The 2007 Records: St. Cloud State is 1-0 overall following its 17-7 season opening win over Northern State University last Thursday. Mary opened its season last week with a 26-19 loss to Augustana College of the North Central Conference. The Marauders are members of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC), the league SCSU will join beginning next fall.

The Series: This will mark the second meeting between these two teams. Last year, the Marauders lost to the Huskies 27-14 in St. Cloud.

SCSU Head Coach: SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) is in his ninth season with the Huskies in 2007. He has a current won/loss record of 44-44 at SCSU and is 89-67-2 overall in 16 plus years as a collegiate coach. He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an 8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).



2007 Team Captains: Seniors Philip Hedlof (Blomkest) and Derek Sedin (Santa Maria, CA), along with juniors Ryan Kees (Eagan) and Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) will captain the 2007 Husky football team.

SCSU All-Time Record: The 2007 season marks the 85th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 384-328-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

Husky Hits.....

Husky Recap: The Huskies opened the 2007 season with a 17-7 victory over Northern State University last Thursday at Husky Stadium. With the win, SCSU is 7-2 in season openers under Hedberg and have won six straight season opening games. The Huskies scored first on a three-yard Jake Machacek run in the first quarter. SCSU added a passing touchdown from Jon Quesnel to Derek Sedin in the third and a 29-yard Justin Delgado field goal in the fourth to account for all of the Husky scoring. SCSU finished the game with 383 yards of total offense and gave up 225 yards to Northern State. The Huskies gained 183 yards on the ground and allowed NSU 76 rushing yards. SCSU gained 245 yards in the air and held the Wolves to 149 passing yards.

Sack Attack: For the 33rd straight game, the SCSU defense recorded at least one quarterback sack...the Husky defense found NSU's quarterback five times in the game, that extended SCSU's consecutive games with a quarterback sack to 33, dating back to Sept. 2, 2004... the SCSU defense found the opposing quarterback 36 times in 2006...the SCSU record for most sacks in a season is 40, established in 1991, and in 2005, the Huskies recorded 39 QB sacks.

A Career Night: Junior DE Cale Pulczynski (Mukwonago, WI) and junior DB Bryce Kieffer (Dennison) led the team with seven tackles, career highs for both players...Pulczynski also had a career high two QB sacks.

First Pick: Junior DB Matt McLagan (Minneapolis) recorded the first interception of the season for the Huskies and the first of his collegiate career against Northern State...he returned the pick for a 14-yard gain.

On the Run: Junior RB Kenneth Patrick (Milwaukee, WI) tallied 193 yards in all-purpose yardage...he rushed for a career high 94 yards, returned punts for 75 yards, and caught three passes for 24 yards...RFY RB Jake Machacek (Eagan) scored the Huskies first touchdown of the season and the first of his career, a three yard run midway through the first quarter...he finished the game with nine carries for 32 yards.

In the Air: Senior starting QB Mike Hammerseng (Minnetonka) completed 12 of 17 passes for 177 yards against Northern State, the second most passing yards in his career...his career best was a 14 of 26 passes for 302 yards against Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 11, 2006...junior QB Jon Quesnel (Eagan) played the second half against Northern State...he completed seven of nine passes for 68 yards and one touchdown.

Play of the Game: Junior punter Brian Cristan (Mahtomedi) executed the play of the game...Cristan fielded a snap over his head, ran to the outside under pressure, and booted a kick that was downed on the NSU three-yard line...Cristan punted three times and averaged 37.3 yards per punt Thursday night...he had a long punt of 43 yards, two that fell inside the 20 and one touchback.

2007 will mark the fourth season of Husky Stadium. St. Cloud State is 12-6 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium, followed by a 3-3 home mark in 2006. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004, 3,961 in 2005, and 3,936 in 2006. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota. 2004 Record: 4-2; 2005 Record: 5-1; 2006 Record: 3-3.

Final Year of the NCC

The 2007-08 school year will mark the final year of league competition in the North Central Conference for the St. Cloud State University athletics program. St. Cloud State University, Minnesota State University Mankato, Augustana College and the University of Minnesota Duluth will join the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in the fall of 2008. The University of Nebraska-Omaha will join the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, while the University of South Dakota and the University of North Dakota have elected to seek NCAA Division I status. The St. Cloud State men's program joined the North Central Conference in 1981. The Huskies made their presence known in the league winning 13 tennis championships (1986, 90, 91, 93, 94, 97, 98, 99, 2002, 03, 04, 05, 06) four swimming and diving championships (1982,83, 84, 85), four basketball championships (1986,87,88, 2001), three golf championships, two football (1989 and 2002), and one title each in cross-country (1983), and baseball (1991). The SCSU women's program joined the NCC in 1984, and won five conference tennis titles (1985, 87, 88, 90, 91), three softball titles (1998, 2003, 2004), and one basketball championship (1989).

2006 Game Recap: St. Cloud State defeated Mary 37-14 on Sept. 16, 2006 in St. Cloud. The Husky offense tallied 454 yards and allowed 308 yards to Mary. SCSU's Michael Graham scored two rushing touchdowns. Graham finished the game with 155 rushing yards on 12 carries. Mike Hammerseng passed for 170 yards completing nine of 17 pass attempts, and Zach Stover caught four passes for 100 yards. The Huskies led 10-0 late in the first quarter

U-Mary Notes: The Marauders lost to Augustana College 26-19 on Sept. 25. U-Mary jumped to a 19-7 lead over Augustana, but the Vikings scored 19 points in the final 6:24 of the game to take away the win. U-Mary gained 338 yards in total offense and allowed 266 yards. Jamal Lomax rushed for 107 yards on 24 carries and Blair Sandy completed 23 of 39 passes for 228 yards.
