The Game: The St. Cloud State University Husky football team will host the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater on Saturday, Sept. 15 at Husky Stadium (4,198) on the SCSU campus. The kick-off is at 6:00 p.m. for this non-conference game.

The 2007 Records: St. Cloud State is 2-0 overall following non-conference wins over Northern State (17-7) and the University of Mary (16-13). The University of Whitewater is 1-0 after a season opening 41-7 win over Lake-land College (WI) on Sept. 1. UW-Whitewater is an NCAA Division III school competing in the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC). The Warhawks are ranked #2 in the first d3football.com poll of the 2007 season.

The Series: This is the first meeting between these two teams.

SCSU Head Coach: SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) is in his ninth season with the Huskies in 2007. He has a current won/loss record of 45-44 at SCSU and is 90-67-2 overall in 16 plus years as a college coach. He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an 8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).



2007 Team Captains: Seniors Philip Hedlof (Blomkest) and Derek Sedin (Santa Maria, CA), along with juniors Ryan Kees (Eagan) and Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) will captain the 2007 Husky football team.

SCSU All-Time Record: The 2007 season marks the 85th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 384-328-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

Husky Hits.....

Husky Recap: The Huskies improved to 2-0 on the season with a 16-13 win at the University of Mary last Saturday. Junior placekicker Brian Cristan (Mahtomedi) kicked a 36-yard game winning field goal with :55 seconds left in regulation to secure the win for the Huskies. He booted two other field goals of 20 and 25-yards, and junior Nate Johnson (Austin) caught a five-yard TD pass for the Huskies first score of the game.

Cristan Named NCC Special Teams Player of the Week: Junior Brian Cristan was named the North Central Conference Special Teams Player of the Week on Monday by the league office. Cristan punted and did the place-kicking in SCSU's 16-13 win over the University of Mary on Saturday. Cristan was three-for-three in his first collegiate field goal attempts. He made kicks of 20, 25, and 36 yards, and the latter turned out to be the game winning field goal with :55 seconds left in the game. The field goal attempts were the first by Cristan in a game since his senior year in high school. In addition, he handled the kick-offs and punting for the Huskies. He punted five times for 212 yards, and knocked one inside the 20.

Hedberg Hits 90: SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg recorded his 90th career win against U-Mary on Saturday night. He has a 90-67-2 career record in his 16th year as a collegiate head coach.

Sack Attack: Make it 34 straight. For the 34th straight game, the SCSU defense recorded a quarterback sack...the Husky defense found the U-Mary quarterback four times in the game, extending SCSU's consecutive games with a quarterback sack to 34, dating back to Sept. 2, 2004... the SCSU defense found the opposing quarterback 36 times in 2006...the SCSU record for most sacks in a season is 40, established in 1991, and in 2005, the Huskies recorded 39 QB sacks. The Huskies have notched nine QB sacks in the first two games of the 2007 season.

A Career Night: Senior linebacker Chris Streit (Sauk Rapids) tallied a career high nine tackles on Saturday night. He recorded his previous career high of seven tackles twice during the 2006 season. He also recorded his first QB sack of his collegiate career. Junior DE Ryan Kees (Eagan) also had a career high with seven tackles on the night, including a team high two tackles for losses.

Two Picks for Jensen: Junior DB Matt Jensen (Mequon, WI) intercepted two passes, a career and game high for him. He has six career INT's at SCSU.

Career Catch for Nate Johnson: Junior WR Nate Johnson (Austin) caught a career high six passes and recorded the second TD reception of his career against Mary. Johnson tallied 68 receiving yards. The TD reception came on a five yard play late in the first quarter and put the Huskies on the scoreboard first, 7-0. Johnson netted 12 catches during the 2006 campaign.

On the Ground: The backfield trio of juniors Kenneth Patrick (Milwaukee, WI) and Adam Luckey (Murrieta, CA), and redshirt Jake Machacek (Eagan) combined for 173 yards rushing against Mary. Patrick led the way with 17 carries for 80 yards. Machacek hit the ground 13 times for 62 yards and Luckey tallied 31 yards on eight carries. The Huskies have rushed for over 100 yards in each of the two games this season, as compared to four games of 100+plus rushing yards in 2006.

Husky Stadium



2007 will mark the fourth season of Husky Stadium. St. Cloud State is 12-6 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium, followed by a 3-3 home mark in 2006. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004, 3,961 in 2005, and 3,936 in 2006. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota. 2004 Record: 4-2; 2005 Record: 5-1; 2006 Record: 3-3.

Final Year of the NCC

The 2007-08 school year will mark the final year of league competition in the North Central Conference for the St. Cloud State University athletics program. St. Cloud State University, Minnesota State University Mankato, Augustana College and the University of Minnesota Duluth will join the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in the fall of 2008. The University of Nebraska-Omaha will join the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, while the University of South Dakota and the University of North Dakota have elected to seek NCAA Division I status. The St. Cloud State men's program joined the North Central Conference in 1981. The Huskies made their presence known in the league winning 13 tennis championships (1986, 90, 91, 93, 94, 97, 98, 99, 2002, 03, 04, 05, 06) four swimming and diving championships (1982,83, 84, 85), four basketball championships (1986,87,88, 2001), three golf championships, two football (1989 and 2002), and one title each in cross-country (1983), and baseball (1991). The SCSU women's program joined the NCC in 1984, and won five conference tennis titles (1985, 87, 88, 90, 91), three softball titles (1998, 2003, 2004), and one basketball championship (1989).

UWWNotes: The Warhawks, currently ranked #2 in the D2football.com national poll, have been the NCAA Division III national runner-ups for two straight years (2006 and 2005). Last season, UWW posted a 14-1 overall record, wentt 10-0 in the regular season, won the WIAC title with a 7-0 record and advanced to the NCAA Division III championship game where the Warhawks fell to Mount Union, 35-16. The Warhawks have gone undefeated in regular season games in each of the last two years. UWW, the two-time defending WIAC Champion has been picked to win the WIAC for the third straight year according to a poll of the league sports information directors. Returning All-Americans top the roster for UWW in 2007. Senior runningback Justin Beaver rushed for 1,369 yards and four touchdowns in 2006. A two-time All-American, he was a Gagliardi Trophy Finalist in 2006, and was the all-time single season rushing leader in D3 football. He led NCAA DIII in rushing in 2005. Sophomore placekicker Jeff Schebler is a 2007 Street & Smith Division III Preseason All-American. Last season, he ranked fifth in NCAA DIII in field goals per game with 1.2 per game. He made 18 of 21 field goal attempts last season with a long of 49 yards. UWW opened the 2007 season with a 41-7 non-conference win at Lakeland College. The win upped the UWW's regular season win streak to 21 games. In that game, Beaver rushed for 138 yards and two touchdowns. Quarterback Danny Jones completed 17 of 27 passes for 213 yards and one touchdown.
