The Game: The St. Cloud State University Husky football team plays host to Central Washington University in a North Central Conference game at 6:00 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 29 at Husky Stadium (4,192) on the SCSU campus.

The 2007 Records: St. Cloud State is 3-1 overall and 0-1 in the NCC following a 31-0 conference loss at South Dakota last Saturday. Central Washington is 2-1 overall and 1-1 in the NCC, and coming off a 43-21 league win over Minnesota Duluth.

The Series: This will be only the second game between these two teams. Central Washington won the only contest, a 24-14 victory in Ellensburg, WA last year.

1977 and 1987 Team Reunion Weekend: The 1977 and 1987 Husky football teams have been invited back to campus for a reunion this weekend. The Husky football reunion activities begin at 9:00 p.m. Friday night with a social at the Green Mill Restaurant. The Husky Gridiron Club will host a luncheon at 12 noon at Anton's Restaurant in Waite Park on Saturday, and the weekend will end with a Green Mill social following the game.

SCSU Head Coach: SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) is in his ninth season with the Huskies in 2007. He has a current won/loss record of 46-45 at SCSU and is 91-68-2 overall in 16 plus years as a collegiate coach. He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an 8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D.



native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).

2007 Team Captains: Seniors Philip Hedlof (Blomkest) and Derek Sedin (Santa Maria, CA), along with juniors Ryan Kees (Eagan) and Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) will captain the 2007 Husky football team.

SCSU All-Time Record: The 2007 season marks the 85th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 384-328-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

Husky Hits.....

Husky Recap: The Huskies dropped to a 3-1 overall record and 0-1 NCC mark last Saturday, following a 31-0 loss at South Dakota. The first half belonged to the Coyotes as USD scored on four of five drives and led 28-0 at the half. SCSU held the Coyotes to a second half field goal, but were never able to finish off a scoring drive.

A Career Effort: Junior wide receiver Zach Stover (Eagan) caught a career high nine passes for the Huskies last Saturday and finished the day with 70 receiving yards. He has caught 15 passes for 122 yards this season.

Collegiate Debut: Redshirt first-year quarterback Jake Kranz (Hastings) made his collegiate debut in the third quarter of SCSU's loss last Saturday at South Dakota. Kranz finished the afternoon ten of 24 passing for 96 yards with a long completion of 22 yards.

Solid D From Merritt: Redshirt first year defensive tackle Chuck Merritt (Aurora, IL) notched two QB sacks, the first of his collegiate career and finished the game against South Dakota with five tackles, one forced fumble and 3.5 tackles for loss. Merritt has nine tackles this season.

Huskies on Defense: The Husky defense has only allowed six points on two field goals in the third quarter this season. SCSU has given up 22 second half points as compared to 45 in the first half this season. Junior defensive back Tyler Krueger (Milwaukee, WI) leads the team in tackles with 25 this season. Junior defensive end Ryan Kees (Eagan) leads the team in tackles for loss with 6.5. At the other end, Cale Pulczynski (Mukwonago, WI) leads the team in sacks with 3.5.

In the NCC: The Husky defense leads the league in two overall statistics categories. SCSU leads the NCC in scoring defense allowing 16.8 points per game (in four games) and sacks with 14 overall.

Sack Attack: Make it 36 straight. The Husky defense extended its consecutive games with a quarterback sack streak to 36 last Saturday with three sacks. The streak dates back to Sept. 2, 2004... the SCSU defense found the opposing quarterback 36 times in 2006...the SCSU record for most sacks in a season is 40, established in 1991, and in 2005, the Huskies recorded 39 QB sacks. The Huskies have notched 14 QB sacks in 2007.

In the Polls: Central Washington is ranked in two of the NCAA Division II football polls this week and receiving votes in the third. The Wildcats are 25th in the D2football.com poll, 32nd in the Football Gazette Polls and receiving votes in the AFCA DII Coaches Poll. Grand Valley State University is the unanimous number one football team in Division II.

2007 will mark the fourth season of Husky Stadium. St. Cloud State is 12-6 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium, followed by a 3-3 home mark in 2006. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004, 3,961 in 2005, and 3,936 in 2006. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota. 2004 Record: 4-2; 2005 Record: 5-1; 2006 Record: 3-3.

Final Year of the NCC

The 2007-08 school year will mark the final year of league competition in the North Central Conference for the St. Cloud State University athletics program. St. Cloud State University, Minnesota State University Mankato, Augustana College and the University of Minnesota Duluth will join the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference in the fall of 2008. The University of Nebraska-Omaha will join the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, while the University of South Dakota and the University of North Dakota have elected to seek NCAA Division I status. The St. Cloud State men's program joined the North Central Conference in 1981. The Huskies made their presence known in the league winning 13 tennis championships (1986, 90, 91, 93, 94, 97, 98, 99, 2002, 03, 04, 05, 06) four swimming and diving championships (1982,83, 84, 85), four basketball championships (1986,87,88, 2001), three golf championships, two football (1989 and 2002), and one title each in cross-country (1983), and baseball (1991). The SCSU women's program joined the NCC in 1984, and won five conference tennis titles (1985, 87, 88, 90, 91), three softball titles (1998, 2003, 2004), and one basketball championship (1989).

Wildcat Notes: Wildcat coach Beau Baldwin was introduced as the Wildcat head coach last January. A former Wildcat quarterback, Baldwin had spent the last four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Washington University and the nine previous seasons as a CWU assistant. The Wildcats are coming off a 43-21 win over the University of Minnesota Duluth. Central Washington used a season high 459 yards of offense and held UMD to 251 yards of total offense to secure their first league win of the season. Sophomore placekicker/punter Garret Rolsma was named the Special Teams Player of the Week in the NCC following his performance against the Bulldogs. He was three of three in field goal attempts including a career long 45-yard field goal, four of four on PATs, and had three punts for 101 yards. The Wildcats boast a strong passing game, averaging 311.7 yards per game. Junior QB Mike Reilly, a preseason All-American has completed 75 of 112 passes for 923 yards and ten touchdowns this season. He leads the NCC in total offense. His top target has been returning All-NCC wide receiver Johnny Spevak who has caught 22 passes for 228 yards and four touchdowns. Johnny Lopez rushed for 100 yards against UMD and has 239 yards rushing and two touchdowns this season. Defensively, linebacker Bret Stray leads the NCC in sacks with three and tackles for loss with four. He has tallied 13 tackles this season. CWU will return to the Great Northwest Athletic Conference (GNAC) as a football member for the 2008 season. From 2001 to 2005, prior to their move to the NCC Central Washington, along with NCC member Western Washington University, played football in the GNAC. Football members include Central Washington University, Dixie State College, Humboldt State University, Western Oregon University, and Western Washington University. Except for football, CWU athletics currently compete in the GNAC.
