Season Opener: The St. Cloud State University football team will kick off the 2008 season on Thursday, Aug. 28 at Augustana College in a Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference game. The Huskies and Vikings will take to the field for a 6:00 p.m. kick-off at Howard Wood Field (10,000) in Sioux Falls, SD. This will mark the conference opener for both teams. Augustana and St. Cloud

State are two of the four new schools to join the NSIC in 2008-09. Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State University, Mankato round out the newcomers.

Series Record: St. Cloud State leads the all-time series, 20-11. The Huskies lost to Augustana 44-18 on Oct. 13, 2007 in St. Cloud, and have lost two straight in the series. The Huskies are 7-3 against the Vikings over the last ten games.

Season Openers: The Huskies have won six straight season opening games and are 7-3 over the last ten years in the opener.

Coach Underwood Debut: St. Cloud State first year head coach Scott Underwood (Augustana, 1988) will make his collegiate head coaching debut against his alma mater. Underwood was named the Husky head coach last March following seven seasons as the defensive coordinator. Underwood played defensive back for the Vikings for four seasons and was an assistant coach with the Vikings for five seasons (1988-93).

NSIC Opener: The Husky football game marks the first official contest for a St. Cloud State in its new conference, the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC). The acceptance to the NSIC is a homecoming of sorts for St. Cloud State University athletics. The SCSU men's athletics department was a charter member of the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) in 1932. The Northern Sun Conference (NSC) for women's sports was formally announced in 1979-80 and SCSU was a charter member of that organization. Later the two combined to become the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference for men's and women's athletics. SCSU women's teams captured four NSC basketball and tennis championships, and one volleyball championship from 1979 to 1984. From 1932 to 1980, the SCSU men's program captured a total of 66 conference titles in the NIC in the sports of wrestling, track and field, golf, cross country, baseball, football, and basketball.

HUSKY COACHING STAFF

SCSU Head Coach Scott Underwood: Scott Underwood (Augustana College, 1988) was introduced as Head Coach of Husky Football on March 25, 2008.

Underwood had served as the acting head coach of the Huskies since December and had been the defensive coordinator/recruiting coordinator/defensive backs coach since 2001.

Underwood is the 12th head football coach in the history of the program and replaces Randy Hedberg, who coached the Huskies from 1999 to 2007, and is currently a member of the Southern Illinois University football coaching staff.

The Husky defense, led by Underwood has ranked among the best in the North Central Conference for the last seven seasons. In 2002, SCSU led the NCC in rushing defense, giving up 77.1 yards per game. Ten defensive players have earned All-North Central Conference first team honors with Underwood, including Charlie Cosgrove, the 2005 Defensive Lineman of the Year. The Huskies were co-winners of the NCC title in 2002 and hosted a first round NCAA Division II playoff game in 2004, the year that Husky Stadium opener.

Success has followed Underwood at each of his coaching stops. Prior to joining the St. Cloud State staff in 2001, Underwood was the inside linebackers coach at the University of North Dakota for four seasons, and coached two NCAA playoff teams. From 1993 to 1996, he served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Sioux Falls. The University of Sioux Falls advanced to the playoffs during three of those seasons and won the NAIA Division II National Championship in 1996.

Underwood began his coaching career at his alma mater, Augustana College, where he spent five seasons as the defensive secondary coach, following a four-year career at defensive back for the Vikings from 1984 to 1988. In 1988, Underwood coached in an NCAA playoff game. In 1989, with Underwood as an assistant coach, the Vikings advanced to the NCAA playoffs, losing to St. Cloud State at Selke Field.

A native of Marion, Iowa, Underwood has a bachelor's degree in social sciences from Augustana College and a master's degree in health, physical education, and recreation from the University of South Dakota.

Last Season: St. Cloud State competed in the North Central Conference for the last time. The Huskies posted a 4-7 overall record and finished eighth in the league with a 1-7 mark. Augustana College also closed out its long run as a member of the NCC. The Vikings posted a 4-7 overall record and 2-6 league mark.

Re-United: Three of the current members of the Husky coaching staff coached together at Minot State University. Co-Offensive Coordinators Doug Patterson and Ian Shoemaker, along with defensive coordinator Jim Louis were on the Minot State staff together in 2000 and 2001.

D-Coordinator Returns to Alma Mater: St. Cloud State's new defensive Coordinator Jim Louis played linebacker for the Huskies from 1993 to 1997, and also served as a graduate assistant coach. A three-year starter, he earned All-North Central Conference recognition in 1996 as an Honorable Mention player and in 1997 as a Second Team honoree. He was also named to the 1996 and 1997 Academic All-North Central Conference teams. He ranked among the top five in Husky tackles during the 1995, 1996, and 1997 seasons. He was the second leading tackler for the Huskies in 1997 recording 94 that season. Louis currently ranks 14th on the St. Cloud State tackles chart with 236 during his career.

About the Huskies: The Huskies return 40 letterwinners and a total of 17 starters from the 2007 team that posted a 4-7 overall record and finished the North Central Conference (NCC) race with a 1-7 record. Of the returning starters, eight are on offense and eight on defense. The Huskies also boast one of the largest senior classes in school history with 26 seniors listed on the 2008 roster.

Climbing the Charts: After the conclusion of the 2007 season, senior defensive end Ryan Kees (Eagan) is tied for fifth on the Huskies all-time quarterback sacks chart with 14.0 career sacks and senior end Cale (Mukwonago, WI) Pulczinski is tied for eighth with 13.0 in his career. Kees and Pulczinski have also climbed the tackles for loss career chart. Kees ranks fifth with 29.5 and Pulczinski is 14th with 22.5.

By the Numbers - St. Cloud State: St. Cloud State averaged 13.5 points per game in 2007 and 278.9 yards per game in total offense. The Huskies 90.8 yards on the ground and 188.1 yards in the air. The Husky defense intercepted nine passes, recovered 11 fumbles, and had 38 quarterback sacks. The 38 QB sacks was just two shy of the school record 40 set in 1991.

By the Numbers - Augustana College: The Vikings averaged 20.8 points per game and 276.1 yards per game in total offense. Augie



Last Season vs. Augie: The Huskies dropped their fourth straight NCC game against Augustana College, 44-18 on Oct. 13, 2007. St. Cloud State committed seven turnovers in the game, but held the Vikings to 284 yards of total offense. The SCSU defense intercepted four Augustana passes and recorded four quarterback sacks in the game. Fred Williams caught five passes for 142 yards and two touchdowns, including a 70-yard scoring reception. The Huskies threw for a season high 298 yards and ran a season high 75 plays in the game (at that point of the season).

gained 109.5 yards on the ground and 276.1 in the air. Defensively, the Vikings tallied 14 interceptions and 13 fumble recoveries.

Getting Votes: The Huskies received votes in the 2008 preseason American Football Coaches Association Division II Coaches' Poll, released Aug. 13. Valdosta State, the reigning NCAA Division II Champion opens the season at number one. St. Cloud State is one of three conference schools mentioned in the poll. The University of Minnesota Duluth, the preseason NSIC favorite, is ranked 22nd. Winona State University also received votes.

Kees Named to Preseason Team: St. Cloud State senior defensive end Ryan Kees (Eagan) has been named to the Consensus Draft Services (CDS) Division II Preseason All-American Second Team.

SCSU All-Time Record: The 2008 season marks the 86th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 388-335-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.



Husky Stadium

2007 marked the fourth season of Husky Stadium. St. Cloud State is 14-10 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004, 3,961 in 2005, 3,936 in 2006 and 2,742 in 2007. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota. 2004 Record: 4-2; 2005 Record: 5-1; 2006 Record: 3-3; 2007 Record: 2-4
