## 2006 SCSU FOOTBALL NEWS

Release Date: Sept. 5, 2006



**HUSKIES TRAVEL TO ST. JOSEPH, MISSOURI:** The St. Cloud State University football team (1-0) takes to the road for game two of the 2006 season. The Huskies will play a non-conference game at Missouri Western University on Saturday, September 9 in St. Joseph, Missouri. The kick-off is schedule for 6:00 p.m. at Elliott "Bub" Spratt Memorial Stadium (6,000).

**ROAD RECORD:** St. Cloud State was 3-2 on the road in 2005. This is the first road game of the 2006 season for the Huskies. SCSU is 16-23 in road games played since Randy Hedberg became head coach in 1999.

**MEDIA COVERAGE:** New in 2006, Husky Football, and Men's and Women's Basketball will air on 1450 AM KNSI. Longtime Sports Announcer Tom Witschen will handle the play-by-play duties for all three sports. Witschen is a 32-year veteran of Minnesota sportscasting, and has announced at both the collegiate and high school level. Most recently, he has been the voice of University of Minnesota volleyball, women's basketball and baseball. He has broadcast the NCAA Final Four in three different sports, volleyball, basketball and hockey. Don Lyons, the sports director at KNSI will provide the color commentary for Husky football and will occasionally fill in on play-by-play for men's and women's basketball. Lyons has been the voice of Husky Hockey on KCML 99.9 FM since 1999 and will continue in that role. He has been a sportscaster since 1984. The pregame show for Saturday's game against Missouri Western will begin at 5:20 p.m.

**KVSC 88.1 FM** will continue its coverage of all home football games in 2006. Ben Bardsen will handle the play-by-play and Eric Aadlund will provide color commentary.

**RANDY HEDBERG RADIO SHOW:** The Randy Hedberg Show will air on Wednesday evenings live from the Gilleland Chevrolet Showroom floor from 7 to 8 p.m. SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg and KNSI Sports Director Don Lyons will talk Husky football on 1450 AM KNSI. Gilleland Chevrolet is located at 3019 Division Street in St. Cloud.

**WEB CAST:** All games aired on 1450 AM KNSI and 88.1 FM will be carried live on the web. To hear live audio of all Husky football home and away, go to [www.1450knsi.com](http://www.1450knsi.com). The KVSC web site for live audio of all home games is [www.kvsc.org](http://www.kvsc.org).

**LIVE STATS:** St. Cloud State football fans can enjoy live stats on the web for all Husky home games in 2006. Live Stats can be viewed by going to the Husky athletics home page at [www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics](http://www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics) and following the directions.

**2005 SEASON:** The 2005 St. Cloud State University Husky Football team posted an 8-3 overall record. The Huskies were 3-3 in the North Central Conference, good for a fifth place finish. For the first time in league history, there was a four-way tie for the Chammpionship. North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska-Omaha tied for the 2005 NCC Championship. St. Cloud State finished the 2005 season ranked tenth in the NCAA Division II Northwest Region. The Huskies ranked as high as fourth the week of October 17. St. Cloud State spent nearly the entire 2005 season ranked in the national football polls for Division II. The Huskies were ranked as high as eighth in the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll, the week of Oct. 27 but dropped out of the final poll of the season. SCSU was ranked 38th in the final Don Hansen Football Gazette Poll and 22nd in the CollegeSportsReports.com final poll.

### ***AT HUSKY STADIUM***

2006 will mark the third season in Husky Stadium for the SCSU football team. St. Cloud State is 9-3 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004 and 3,961 in 2005. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota.

### ***NEW UNIFORM IN 2006***

The Huskies will debut new uniforms in 2006. The uniforms will feature a black helmet with a white Husky mascot logo on each side. The jersey is black with white numerals and red piping. The sides of the jersey feature a red stripe and St. Cloud State logos are on each shoulder. The neckline is highlighted with more red piping. The pants are white with red striping on each side.



**Husky Recap.....**

St. Cloud State is coming off a school record 71-0 win over the University of Minnesota-Crookston in the season opener last Thursday. Senior DB Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) returned a school record two punt returns for touchdowns, sophomore DB Matt Jensen (Mequon, WI) collected two interceptions, and the Husky defense collected two fumble recoveries, including one returned for a touchdown by RS first year David Kamin (Menomonee Falls, WI) to lead the Huskies to victory. On the offensive side of the ball, sophomore running back Kenneth Patrick (Milwaukee, WI), in his Husky debut scored the first touchdown of the game and went on to rush for 71 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore Michael Graham (Oakdale), a linebacker turned running back a week prior to the opener, rushed for a game high 90 yards and two touchdowns on eight carries. Junior Dan Kamin (Menomonee Falls) carried the ball ten times for 89 yards and one touchdown, a 53-yard jaunt on his first touch of the game in the first quarter. Junior transfer Derek Sedin (Santa Maria, CA) caught a team high four passes for 63 yards and one touchdown in his Husky debut. Redshirt first year receiver Houston Niesche (Carver) caught the other touchdown pass, a 12-yard strike. Sophomore Zach Stover (Eagan), returning from a broken leg last season caught three passes for 31 yards. St. Cloud State got a good look at two quarterbacks as junior Mike Hammerseng (Minnetonka) and sophomore Jon Quesnel (Eagan) shared duties. Hammerseng completed seven of 12 passes for 80 yards. Quesnel completed six of 11 passes for 92 yards and two touchdowns. The Huskies finished the game with 411 yards of total offense. The SCSU defense held the Golden Eagles to 61 yards of total offense, including -17 on the ground.

**2006 Husky Notes.....**

**SCSU Head Coach Randy Hedberg:** SCSU head coach



Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) kicks off his eighth season with the Huskies in 2006. He has a current seven plus year record of 41-36 at SCSU and is 86-59-2 overall in 16 years as a collegiate coach. He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an

8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).

**Assistant Coaching Staff:** The 2006 assistants include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary), Steve Gमित (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Eric Mattson (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Brian Frana (Offensive Line), Michael Rowe (Defensive Backs), Josh Stephan (Linebackers), Joe Ford (Linebackers), Denny Honnold (Running Backs), and Michael Morrissey (Tight Ends).

**ALL-TIME RECORD:** The 2006 season marks the 84th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 381-320-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

**2006 Team Captains:** Senior defensive backs #21 Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) and #6 Mitch Denne (St. Cloud), along with junior left tackle #77 Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) will serve as captains of the 2006 Huskies.

**SCSU Record in Season Openers:** Following SCSU's season opening win over Minnesota-Crookston last Thursday, Coach Hedberg is 6-2 in season openers since the 1999 season. The Huskies have won five straight season openers. Since joining the North Central Conference in 1983, SCSU is 14-10 overall in season opening games. SCSU is 3-0 in season openers at Husky Stadium.

**Pre Season Honors:** Three Husky football players have been named to the 2006 Football Gazette Preseason All-America Team. Senior Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud), a 6-2, 190, safety; senior Jordan Kroll (Mukwonago, WI), a 6-4, 270, defensive tackle, and senior Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) a 5-10, 180, cornerback, have been honored by Don Hansen's Football Gazette.



**Game and Team Notes.....**

**SCSU/Missouri Western Series:** St. Cloud State leads the all-time series with Missouri Western University 1-0. The Huskies hosted Missouri Western last season and defeated the Griffons 31-28 at Husky Stadium.

**Husky Player Notes.....**

**NCC Player of the Week Tate Wheeler:** St. Cloud State senior DB Tate Wheeler (Neeah, WI) was named the North Central Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance last Thursday against Minnesota-Crookston. Wheeler is the first Husky to return a punt for a touchdown since the 1999 season when Nate Lehman returned a punt, a school record 95 yards for a TD. Wheeler's two TD returns of 42 and 48 yards, within a three-minute span in the second quarter, set a school record for most punt returns for a TD in a single game. In addition, Wheeler finished the game with three tackles, one for a loss and a pass break-up.

**Two Picks for Jensen:** Redshirt first year player Matt Jensen (Mequon, WI) had two interceptions that he picked up in the third and fourth quarters, and has three in his career.

**Two TD's for Graham:** Sophomore running back Michael Graham (Oakdale) scored two touchdowns in his offensive debut against UMC. Graham had TD runs of 35 and 22 yards. He is a linebacker turned running back just one week prior to the season opener. He finished the game with 90 yards rushing on eight carries.

**More Backs:** Sophomore transfer Kenny Patrick (Milwaukee, WI) scored the first touchdown of the game and went on to rush for 71 yards on 12 carries and two touchdowns. Junior Dan Kamin (Menomonee Falls, WI) scored a touchdown on his first touch of the game, a 53 yard carry in the first quarter. He finished the game with 89 yards on ten carries.

**Double QB's:** Junior quarterback Mike Hammerseng (Minnetonka) and sophomore quarterback Jon Quesnel (Eagan), shared the signal calling in the season opener. Hammerseng completed seven of 12 passes for 80 yards. Quesnel completed six of 11 passes for 92 yards and two touchdowns.

**Catch the Ball:** Junior transfer Derek Sedin (Santa Maria, CA) caught a game high four passes for 63 yards and one touchdown in his Husky debut. Sophomore Zach Stover (Eagan), also in his Husky debut caught three passes for 31 yards. Redshirt first year player Houston Niesche (Carver) recorded his first collegiate touchdown, a 12-yard reception in the fourth quarter.

**Husky Defense:** Led by junior tackle Treg Swanson (Pierz), SCSU recorded 11 tackles for loss and three quarterback sacks in the game. Swanson recorded a game high seven tackles, three TFL and one quarterback sack.

**Sack Streak Continues:** The Husky defense has recorded at least one quarterback sack in 22 straight games, dating back to September 2, 2004. SCSU recorded at least one QB sack in each game of the 2005 season.

**When They Last Met:** Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) rushed for 227 yards and two touchdowns and sophomore quarterback Mike Hammerseng (Minnetonka) playing in the second half for the injured senior Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud) completed 11 of 16 passes for 154 yards and two touchdowns to lead St. Cloud State to a 31-28 non-conference win over Missouri Western State University on October 29, 2005. Hammerseng connected with senior wide receiver Ryan Koch (Madison, WI) on a 10-yard pass play with :38 seconds left in the game to put the Huskies ahead 31-28. Missouri Western started their next drive on their 28 and on the first play of the drive quarterback Michael Burton was intercepted by SCSU's Matt Jensen. The Griffons got the ball back with :10 seconds remaining and threw two incomplete passes to end the game. St. Cloud State took a 21-17 lead into the fourth quarter and Missouri Western made it interesting when quarterback Michael Burton scored on a one-yard run at 12:23 to take a 21-17 lead. SCSU answered with a two-yard touchdown run from Birkel to take back the lead 24-21. But that's not all, MWSU running back Jeremiah White capped off a nine play, 84 yard drive with a 15-yard touchdown run and the Griffons took the lead 28-24 with 3:30 remaining. SCSU then went on its final scoring drive that spanned 62 yards on 12 plays including three Husky penalties for the win. Ryan Koch finished the game with seven receptions for 84 yards and one touchdown. Junior cornerback Tate

<b>North Dakota Selected As Preseason Football Favorite</b>		
North Dakota has been picked as North Central Conference football favorite in both the preseason media and coaches polls released today. The two samples agreed on the top spot, but none of the other eight slots were the same in the two polls.		
This season's media poll marks the 52nd time that the media have made their predictions about the nine-team league that spans five states. The media have correctly picked the NCC champion in 15 of the past 24 seasons. In all, the media have successfully chosen the NCC champion 27 times in the 51 years in the poll's existence.		
The NCC coaches have made predictions for the past 23 years. They have picked the champion 12 times.

Burton completed 17 of 28 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns.

Missouri Western.....

Missouri Western in 2005: The Griffons posted a 9-3 overall record and finished in a second place tie with a 6-2 record in the MIAA race.

Head Coach: Missouri Western University head coach Jerry Partridge (Missouri Western) is in his tenth season at the helm of the Griffons. Partridge has a current 63-40 overall record, including the first win of the 2006 season. His team won the MIAA conference title in 2003, the first ever MIAA title in football for MWU. He has led his program to two 9-win seasons in 2003 and again in 2005.



Missouri Western Notes: Missouri Western is coming off a 32-29 double overtime non-conference victory over Central Oklahoma last Saturday in Edmond, Oklahoma. Central Oklahoma led 13-7 at halftime and went ahead 16-7 early in the third quarter. Missouri Western scored twice in the final five minutes of the third quarter to take a 20-16 lead. UCO went ahead 23-20 on a pass play early in the fourth quarter. The Griffons tied the game at the 6:25 mark on Dustin Strickler's 23 yard field goal. The team's exchanged field goals in the first overtime and UCO went ahead 29-26 with a field goal in the second overtime. MWSU answered with a five yard pass play for the winning touchdown. Missouri Western tallied 389 yards in total offense, gaining 149 yards on the ground and 240 in the air. The Griffons held Central Oklahoma to 166 yards of offense, 72 on the ground and 94 passing. Senior tailback Jeremiah White rushed for 128 yards on 24 carries. Senior quarterback Michael Burton threw for 240 yards and four touchdowns on 17 of 30 pass attempts. Senior split end Jarrett Brooks caught seven passes for 129 yards and three of those touchdowns.
