HUSKIES HIT THE ROAD FOR FIRST EVER GAME AT ELLENSBURG, WASHINGTON

The St. Cloud State University football team (2-2 overall, 0-1 North Central Conference) will travel to Ellensburg, Washington for a North Central Conference game against Central Washington University (2-2 overall, 0-2 NCC), Saturday, September 30. Game time is 3:00 p.m. central time (1:00 p.m. Pacific) time at Tomlinson Stadium (4,000).

AWAY RECORD: The Huskies are 0-1 on the road this season. St. Cloud State is 2-1 at home in 2006. The Huskies posted a 5-1 record at home in 2005 and are 11-4 all-time in home games played at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season.

RADIO COVERAGE: New in 2006, Husky Football, and Men's and Women's Basketball will air on 1450 AM KNSI. Longtime Sports Announcer Tom Witschen will handle the play-by-play duties for all three sports. Witschen is a 32-year veteran of Minnesota sportscasting, and has announced at both the collegiate and high school level. Most recently, he has been the voice of University of Minnesota volleyball, women's basketball and baseball. He has broadcast the NCAA Final Four in three different sports, volleyball, basketball and hockey. Don Lyons, the sports director at KNSI will provide the color commentary for Husky football and will occasionally fill in on play-by-play for men's and women's basketball. Lyons has been the voice of Husky Hockey on KCML 99.9 FM since 1999 and will continue in that role. He has been a sportscaster since 1984. The pregame show for Saturday's game against Central Washington will begin at 2:20 p.m. Central Time (12:20 Pacific).

KVSC 88.1 FM will continue its coverage of all home football games in 2006. KVSC Sports Director John Hadden will handle the play-by-play and former SCSU All-American defensive end Charlie Cosgrove will provide color commentary.

RANDY HEDBERG RADIO SHOW: The Randy Hedberg Show will air on Wednesday evenings live from the Gilleland Chevrolet Showroom floor from 7 to 8 p.m. SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg and KNSI Sports Director Don Lyons will talk Husky football on 1450 AM KNSI. Gilleland Chevrolet is located at 3019 Division Street in St. Cloud.

WEB CAST: All games aired on 1450 AM KNSI and 88.1 FM will be carried live on the web. To hear live audio of all Husky football home and away, go to www.1450knsi.com. The KVSC web site for live audio of all home games is www.kvsc.org.

LIVE STATS: St. Cloud State football fans can enjoy live stats on the web for all Husky home games in 2006. Live Stats can be viewed by going to the Husky athletics home page at www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics and following the directions.

2005 SEASON: The 2005 St. Cloud State University Husky Football team posted an 8-3 overall record. The Huskies were 3-3 in the North Central Conference, good for a fifth place finish. For the first time in league history, there was a four-way tie for the Championship. North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska-Omaha tied for the 2005 NCC Championship. St. Cloud State finished the 2005 season ranked tenth in the NCAA Division II Northwest Region. The Huskies ranked as high as fourth the week of October 17. St. Cloud State spent nearly the entire 2005 season ranked in the national football polls for Division II. The Huskies were ranked as high as eighth in the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll, the week of Oct. 27 but dropped out of the final poll of the season. SCSU was ranked 38th in the final Don Hansen Football Gazette Poll and 22nd in the CollegeSportsReports.com final poll.

AT HUSKY STADIUM

2006 will mark the third season in Husky Stadium for the SCSU football team. St. Cloud State is 11-3 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004 and 3,961 in 2005. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota.

NEW UNIFORM IN 2006

The Huskies will debut new uniforms in 2006. The uniforms will feature a black helmet with a white Husky mascot logo on each side. The jersey is black with white numerals and red piping. The sides of the jersey feature a red stripe and St. Cloud State logos are on each shoulder. The neckline is highlighted with more red piping. The pants are white with red striping on each side.



Husky Recap.....

St. Cloud State vs. University of South Dakota

University of South Dakota red shirt freshman quarterback Noah Shepard threw two touchdown passes and senior running back Stefan Logan rushed 21 times for 121 yards to lead the nationally ranked Coyotes to a 20-10 North Central Conference win over the Huskies at Husky Stadium.

Shepard finished the game with five completions in eight attempt and 59 yards. Junior quarterback Carter Black completed seven of 14 passes for 91 yards and another touchdown. Brooks Little caught four passes for 52 yards. The Coyotes ran 62 plays and gained 331 yards in total offense and held the Huskies to 160 yards of total offense.

St. Cloud State scored the first touchdown of the game on their second drive. The Huskies marched 71 yards down the field and scored on a one yard run by junior quarterback Mike Hammerseng. Hammerseng was injured on the scoring play and did not return to the game. South Dakota tied the game at 7-7 on a one yard Shepard to David Cronin pass play just 12 seconds into the second quarter. The Huskies took a 10-7 lead on a 32 yard field goal by Jon Gutierrez. USD finished the first half scoring with a four yard pass play from Black to Tyler Evans with 3:16 left in the half. The only score of the second half was a 16 yard touchdown pass from Shepard to Desmond Allison.

Senior tight end Anders Johnson was the bright spot for the Husky offense. He caught a career high eight passes for 69 yards, with his longest play a 17-yard reception. He made two catches for first downs in the Huskies final drive of the game, where SCSU came up short and Gutierrez's 39-yard field goal attempt missed left. The Huskies managed 48 rushing yards led by sophomore Kenneth Patrick with 35 yards. Sophomore Jon Quesnel replaced Hammerseng at quarterback and completed 11 of 21 passes for 78 yards.

2006 Husky Notes.....

SCSU Head Coach Randy Hedberg:



SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) kicks off his eighth season with the Huskies in 2006. **He has a current seven plus year record of 42-38 at SCSU and is 87-61-2 overall in 16 years as a collegiate coach.** He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an

8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).

Assistant Coaching Staff: The 2006 assistants include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary), Steve Gruit (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Eric Mattson (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Brian Frana (Offensive Line), Michael Rowe (Defensive Backs), Josh Stephan (Linebackers), Joe Ford (Linebackers), Denny Honnold (Running Backs), and Michael Morrissey (Tight Ends).

ALL-TIME RECORD: The 2006 season marks the 84th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 381-320-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

2006 Team Captains: Senior defensive backs #21 Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) and #6 Mitch Denne (St. Cloud), along with junior left tackle #77 Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) will serve as captains of the 2006 Huskies.

SCSU Record in Season Openers: Following SCSU's season opening win over Minnesota-Crookston last Thursday, Coach Hedberg is 6-2 in season openers since the 1999 season. The Huskies have won five straight season openers. Since joining the North Central Conference in 1983, SCSU is 14-10 overall in season opening games. SCSU is 3-0 in season openers at Husky Stadium.

Pre Season Honors: Three Husky football players have been named to the 2006 Football Gazette Preseason All-America Team. Senior Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud), a 6-2, 190, safety; senior Jordan Kroll (Mukwonago, WI), a 6-4, 270, defensive tackle, and senior Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) a 5-10, 180, cornerback, have been honored by Don Hansen's Football Gazette.



Husky Notes.....

Sack Streak Continues: For the fourth straight week the Husky defense has recorded a quarterback sack, extending its consecutive streak to 25 games. The SCSU defense has found the opposing quarterback 14 times this season, including a season high five QB sacks against Missouri Western. The Huskies recorded two against South Dakota last Saturday. Five is the most since the Husky defense recorded seven against South Dakota last season. The Husky defense has recorded at least one quarterback sack in 24 straight games, dating back to September 2, 2004. SCSU recorded at least one QB sack in each game of the 2005 season. The SCSU record for most sacks in a season is 40, established in 1991. Last season, the Huskies recorded 39 QB sacks.

Career Hits: Two Huskies had career performances in Saturday's game against South Dakota.

Senior tight end Anders Johnson (St. Cloud) caught a career high eight passes for 69 yards. He had a previous career high of five receptions twice during the 2003 season. He currently ranks second on the team in receptions with 12.

Sophomore punter Brian Cristan (Mahtomedi) booted six punts for an average of 43.5 yards per kick on Saturday. He nailed a 76-yard punt in the second quarter, the longest of his career, and second longest in school history. The school record is a 78 yard punt by Barrie Lasure in 1967. Cristan's previous high was a 48-yard punt.

Sack Attack Led by Kees: Sophomore linebacker Ryan Kees (Eagan) leads the Huskies in QB sacks. He has a team high four this season, including a career high two QB sacks at MWSU, just one shy of the single game record of three. Kees has recorded at least one QB sack in three Husky games this season and has five in his career. He also leads the team in tackles for loss with five.

Hedlof Gets Second Pick: Junior defensive back Philip Hedlof (Blomkest) recorded his second interception of the season and third of his career on Saturday. Hedlof, Tate Wheeler and Matt Jensen each have two INT's this season.

Wheeler Leads in Tackles: Senior free safety Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) recorded a game high 11 tackles against the Coyotes on Saturday, including a tackle for loss. Wheeler is the leading tackler for the Huskies this season with 29, including a team high 17 solo stops. He has recorded 173 career tackles

USD Puts Stop to Offense. The Husky offense was held to a season low 160 yards of total offense on Saturday. That's the fewest yards for a Husky team since the 2001 season when Nebraska-Omaha held SCSU to 89 yards in a 45-0 win.

NCC Loss: The loss to USD marked the first conference opening loss for SCSU since the 2000 season when SCSU opened league play with a 37-7 loss to North Dakota State.

Scoring Edge: Despite a 2-2 record, the Huskies have outscored their opponents 132-61, holding a scoring edge in every quarter. The Huskies have not allowed fourth quarter score this season.

First in a While: Junior DB Philip Hedlof's 61-yard interception return for a touchdown last Saturday against Missouri Western, was the first for a Husky since Tate Wheeler scored on August 27, 2005 on a 13-yard return.

Senior DB Tate Wheeler is the first Husky to return a punt for a touchdown since the 1999 season when Nate Lehman returned a punt, a school record 95 yards for a TD. Wheeler's two TD returns of 42 and 48 yards, within a three-minute span in the second quarter of the season opener against Minnesota-Crookston, set a school record for most punt returns for a TD in a single game.

Scouting Central Washington....

New to the NCC: Central Washington, along with Western Washington, has joined the North Central Conference as an affiliate member in football.

Central Washington in 2005: The Wildcats posted an 8-2 overall record and won the GNAC with a 6-0 mark.

Head Coach: Central Washington University head coach John Zamberlin (Pacific Lutheran, 1979) is in his tenth season with the Wildcats.



In the Polls: Central Washington has been in the NCAA Division II football polls this season.

Wildcat Team Notes: Central Washington opened the 2006 season with the NCC opener against the University of North Dakota, losing 28-14 in Ellensburg.

Like the Huskies, the Wildcats have outscored their opponents this season despite a .500 record.

The Wildcats are averaging 331.8 yards

per game in offense, with 216.0 of those yards coming in the air.

Wildcat Player Notes: Junior Johnny Lopez has been the top rusher for the Wildcats. He averages 74.2 yards per game and has 74 carries and one touchdown.

...St. Cloud State ranks third in scoring offense (4 gms) in this week's NCC stats report, averaging 33.0 points per game.
