HUSKIES HOST MINNESOTA STATE UNIVERSITY MANKATO IN ANNUAL HOME-COMING GAME:

The St. Cloud State University football team (2-5 overall, 0-4 North Central Conference) will play host to Minnesota State University Mankato (0-0, 0-0 NCC) in a North Central Conference game on Saturday, October 21. The kick-off is set for 1:00 p.m. at Husky Stadium (4,100) on the SCSU campus.

HOMECOMING: It's Homecoming Week at St. Cloud State University. This will be the 78th SCSU Homecoming Football game in school history. The Huskies are 52-25 in Homecoming games. Last year, the Huskies defeated the University of South Dakota 24-17 in the Homecoming game. SCSU has won four of the last six Homecoming games. This will be the ninth Homecoming in which Minnesota State University is the Huskies' opponent. SCSU is 6-2 in Homecoming games against MSU and the last time these two teams met in a Homecoming game was in 2001 when the Huskies came away with a 49-28 victory.

TRAVELING TRAINING KIT ON THE LINE: The famed Traveling Training Kit will be on the line Saturday night. The Traveling Training Kit is in the possession of St. Cloud State following the Huskies 18-14 win over the Mavericks last year in Mankato. The coveted kit was initiated in 1978 and signifies the rivalry between the two longest tenured Minnesota members of the North Central Conference, SCSU and MSU.



TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for the game are \$15 for adults and \$5 for youth, ages 2 through 12th grade. SCSU student admission is free with a validated ID. Tickets can be purchased the day of the game, beginning 90 minutes prior to kick-off. Advance single game tickets can be purchased in person at the SCSU Athletic Ticket Office located in the National Hockey Center or by phone at 320-308-2137 or 1-877-SCSUTIX.

HUSKY VILLAGE: For the third straight year, fans can participate in Husky Village activities 90 minutes prior to the start of all home Husky Football games. Husky Village is located south of Husky Stadium on Herb Brooks Way. Activities will include Party Time inflatable games, music sponsored by Leighton Broadcasting, and games for the whole family.

RADIO COVERAGE: New in 2006, Husky Football, and Men's and Women's Basketball will air on 1450 AM KNSI. Longtime Sports Announcer Tom Witschen will handle the play-by-play duties for all three sports. Witschen is a 32-year veteran of Minnesota sportscasting, and has announced at both the collegiate and high school level. Most recently, he has been the voice of University of Minnesota volleyball, women's basketball and baseball. He has broadcast the NCAA Final Four in three different sports, volleyball, basketball and hockey. Don Lyons, the sports director at KNSI will provide the color commentary for Husky football and will occasionally fill in on play-by-play for men's and women's basketball. Lyons has been the voice of Husky Hockey on KCML 99.9 FM since 1999 and will continue in that role. He has been a sportscaster since 1984. The pregame show for Saturday's game against Minnesota State University will begin at 12:20 p.m.

KVSC 88.1 FM will continue its coverage of all home football games in 2006. KVSC Sports Director John Hadden will handle the play-by-play and former SCSU All-American defensive end Charlie Cosgrove will provide color commentary.

AT HUSKY STADIUM

2006 will mark the third season in Husky Stadium for the SCSU football team. St. Cloud State is 11-5 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004 and 3,961 in 2005. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota. 2004 Record: 4-2; 2005 Record: 5-1; 2006 Record: 2-1.

NEW UNIFORM IN 2006

The Huskies will debut new uniforms in 2006. The uniforms will feature a black helmet with a white Husky mascot logo on each side. The jersey is black with white numerals and red piping. The sides of the jersey feature a red stripe and St. Cloud State logos are on each shoulder. The neckline is highlighted with more red piping. The pants are white with red striping on each side.



Husky Recap.....

St. Cloud State vs. Augustana College

Sioux Falls, SD -- It was another heartbreaking loss for the St. Cloud State Huskies as Augustana College scored the winning touchdown with :03 seconds left in the game to give the Vikings a 27-23 win.

It was a back and forth affair with both teams combining for 818 yards in total offense. The Huskies were led by sophomore quarterback Jon Quesnel (Eagan) who threw for a school record 377 yards, completing 28 of 47 passes and connecting on three touchdowns. The old mark of 369 yards was set by Keith Heckendorf twice during his career. Quesnel's top receiver was junior Derek Sedin (Santa Maria, CA) who caught seven passes for 115 yards, both career highs. Senior tight end Anders Johnson (St. Cloud) caught six passes for 76 yards and one touchdown and redshirt first year wide receiver Tyler McKee (New Brighton) made four catches for 42 yards and his first collegiate touchdown.

Augustana quarterback Tommy Flyger threw his second career 300-yard passing game, finishing 16 of 31 for 312 yards and two touchdowns. Chris Pomerleau, who caught the winning touchdown pass, finished the game with three receptions for 138 yards and two TD's.

The Huskies played catch up all afternoon as the Vikings took a 13-0 lead early in the second quarter. SCSU scored with ten seconds left in the first half and Augie led 13-6 at the break. The Huskies then evened the score 13-13 with 1:12 left in the third quarter but with :42 second left in the third, Augustana scored a go ahead touchdown 20-13. The Huskies tied the game at 20-20 early in the fourth on a 21-yard pass play from sophomore quarterback Jon Quesnel (Eagan) to red shirt first year wide receiver Tyler McKee (New Brighton) with 12:34 left. The touchdown reception was the first of McKee's collegiate career.

St. Cloud State took possession of the ball on their own 40 with 2:41 left in the game. The Huskies moved the ball to the Augustana 30 but were stopped on third and 12. Sophomore Jon Gutierrez (Beloit, WI) then nailed a 47-yard field goal with 1:06 left in the game to take a 23-20 lead. Augustana began their final drive on their own 22 with :58 seconds on the clock. Following an incomplete pass, Augie quarterback Tommy Flyger completed two passes to Sam Ward and on a third and four play hit Chris Pomerleau for a seven yard gain and first down with :17 seconds left. Following an Augie timeout and an incomplete pass, with :03 seconds left and second down and ten on the Augie 49, Flyger found Pomerleau on the right side line for a 51-yard strike and the winning touchdown.

2006 Husky Notes.....

SCSU Head Coach Randy Hedberg:



SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) kicks off his eighth season with the Huskies in 2006.

He has a current seven plus year record of 42-41 at SCSU and is 87-62-2 overall in 16 years as a collegiate coach.

He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the

NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an 8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).

Assistant Coaching Staff: The 2006 assistants include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary), Steve Gruit (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Eric Mattson (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Brian Frana (Offensive Line), Michael Rowe (Defensive Backs), Josh Stephan (Linebackers), Joe Ford (Linebackers), Denny Honnold (Running Backs), and Michael Morrissey (Tight Ends).

ALL-TIME RECORD: The 2006 season marks the 84th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 381-320-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

2006 Team Captains: Senior defensive backs #21 Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) and #6 Mitch Denne (St. Cloud), along with junior left tackle #77 Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) will serve as captains of the 2006 Huskies.

Pre Season Honors: Three Husky football players have been named to the 2006 Football Gazette Preseason All-America Team. Senior Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud), a 6-2, 190, safety; senior Jordan Kroll (Mukwonago, WI), a 6-4, 270, defensive tackle, and senior Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) a 5-10, 180, cornerback, have been honored by Don Hansen's Football Gazette.



RANDY HEDBERG RADIO SHOW: The Randy Hedberg Show will air on Wednesday evenings live from the Gilleland Chevrolet Show-room floor from 7 to 8 p.m. SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg and KNSI Sports Director Don Lyons will talk Husky football on 1450 AM KNSI. Gilleland Chevrolet is located at 3019 Division Street in St. Cloud.

HOME RECORD: St. Cloud State is 2-2 at home in 2006. The Huskies posted a 5-1 record at home in 2005 and are 11-5 all-time in home games played at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season.

2005 SEASON: The 2005 St. Cloud State University Husky Football team posted an 8-3 overall record. The Huskies were 3-3 in the North Central Conference, good for a fifth place finish. For the first time in league history, there was a four-way tie for the Championship. North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska-Omaha tied for the 2005 NCC Championship. St. Cloud State finished the 2005 season ranked tenth in the NCAA Division II Northwest Region. The Huskies ranked as high as fourth the week of October 17. St. Cloud State spent nearly the entire 2005 season ranked in the national football polls for Division II. The Huskies were ranked as high as eighth in the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll, the week of Oct. 27 but dropped out of the final poll of the season. SCSU was ranked 38th in the final Don Hansen Football Gazette Poll and 22nd in the CollegeSportsReports.com final poll.

Husky Notes.....

Quesnel Sets Record: Sophomore quarterback Jon Quesnel (Eagan) threw for a school record 377 yards against Augustana College. He completed 27 passes in 47 attempts with three touchdown strikes, all career highs for Quesnel. The old record of 369 yards was set twice by former QB and two-time Harlon Hill Finalist, Keith Heckendorf. Quesnel also went over the 1,000 yard passing mark for the season and has 1,084 yards and eight TD passes. He engineered a 99-yard scoring drive late in the first half, connecting on seven of nine pass attempts, including the Huskies longest play of the day, a 51-yard pass



play to Derek Sedin.

Sedin Sets Personal Marks: Junior wide receiver Derek Sedin (Santa Maria, CA) caught a career high seven passes for 115 yards and one touchdown, including the longest Husky pass play of the day, a 51-yard connection that helped set up the Huskies first TD.

First TD for McKee: Redshirt first year wide receiver Tyler McKee (New Brighton) caught his first collegiate touchdown pass and finished the game with four catches for 42 yards. His touchdown tied the game early in the fourth quarter.

Johnson Still Streaking, Gets First TD: Senior tight end Anders Johnson (St. Cloud), who has caught at least one pass in each game this season, recorded his first touchdown reception of the year and his collegiate career against Augustana. Johnson finished the game with six catches for 76 yards. He leads the team in receptions with 28 this season.

Sack Streak Still Alive: Sophomore defensive end Ryan Kees (Eagan) kept the Huskies consecutive games with a sack streak alive, recording the only SCSU sack of the game. Kees found AC quarterback Tommy Flyger and dropped him for a ten-yard loss. Kees leads the Huskies in quarterback sacks with seven this season and TFL with ten. He is also the team leader in forced fumbles with three. The Huskies have recorded a sack in 28 consecutive games, dating back to September 2, 2004. The SCSU defense has found the opposing quarterback 22 times this season. A season high five QB sacks were recorded against Missouri Western on Sept. 9. Five is the most since the Husky defense recorded seven against South Dakota last season. SCSU recorded at least one QB sack in each game of the 2005 season. The SCSU record for most sacks in a season is 40, established in 1991. Last season, the Huskies recorded 39 QB sacks.



Hedlof Leads 'D': Junior cornerback Philip Hedlof led the Husky defense with six tackles on Saturday, all solo efforts. He has tallied 35 tackles this season and had a team high 27 solo stops.

LaPointe Team Leader on Defense: Junior linebacker Aaron LaPointe (Elk River) leads the Huskies in overall tackles with 42 this season, including a team high 26 assisted tackles. He recorded a career high ten tackles against Western Washington two weeks ago.

North Dakota Selected As Preseason Football Favorite

North Dakota has been picked as North Central Conference football favorite in both the preseason media and coaches polls released today. The two samples agreed on the top spot, but none of the other eight slots were the same in the two polls.

Team Numbers: The Huskies recorded 415 yards in total offense against Augustana College, marking the third time this season that SCSU has reached the 400-yard mark. The Huskies gained 411 against UM-Crookston in the season opener and 454 against the University of Mary. Last season, the Huskies had seven games of 400 or more yards, one of 500, and one of 600.

First in a While: Junior DB Philip Hedlof's 61-yard interception return for a touchdown last Saturday against Missouri Western, was the first for a Husky since Tate Wheeler scored on August 27, 2005 on a 13-yard return.

Senior DB Tate Wheeler is the first Husky to return a punt for a touchdown since the 1999 season when Nate Lehman returned a punt, a school record 95 yards for a TD. Wheeler's two TD returns of 42 and 48 yards, within a three-minute span in the second quarter of the season opener against Minnesota-Crookston, set a school record for most punt returns for a TD in a single game.



Scouting

Minnesota State University....

Mavericks in 2006: After starting the season with a 2-1 record, the Mavericks have lost four straight games, including a 16-13 overtime loss to Minnesota Duluth last Saturday.

Last Year: The Mavericks posted a 2-9 overall record and were 0-6 in the NCC.

Head Coach: Minnesota State University head coach Jeff Jamrog (Nebraska, 1987) is in his third season at the helm of the Mavericks. In his first two seasons, MSU has posted an 8-14 record. In 2004, his first with the Mavericks, Jamrog turned the team around from a 0-11 record in 2003 to 6-5 in 2004, the first MSU winning season since 1994.



Mavericks Team Notes: After trailing Minnesota Duluth 13-0 last Saturday, Minnesota State scored 13 fourth quarter points to send the game into overtime, but lost on a 26-yard field goal by Britt Bauman of UMD, 16-13. The Mavericks attempt of a 22-yard field goal to send the game into a second overtime was blocked. MSU was the victim of five turnovers, including two interceptions and three lost fumbles. The Mavericks average 64.9 yards per game rushing and 238.4 passing.

Player Notes: Running back Bryan Alberty is the top rusher for the Mavericks, averaging 39.3 yards rushing per game. The Maverick quarterbacks, Ben King and Joshua Bryant have played in six and seven games, respectively. King did not start last week due to an injury. This season, King has complete 152 of 270 passes for 1,552 yards and ten touchdowns. Bryant, who started last week, has completed ten of 21 passes for 108 yards and two touchdowns. Against UMD, he rushed for 171 yards and completed nine of 19 passes for 88 yards and one touchdown. Ben Spencer was two of three in field goal attempts for MSU last Saturday, hitting a 27-yard attempt and knocking in a 36-yard attempt with 1:14 left in regulation to tie the game.

Last Year....

The #12/#13 ranked St. Cloud State Huskies scored twice in the final 11 minutes in a driving rain with thunder and lightening to post an 18-14 come from behind win over Minnesota State in the NCC opener played September 24 in Mankato. SCSU trailed 14-3 heading into the fourth quarter when senior Matt Birkel scored on touchdown runs of ten yards at 10:57 and three-yards at 2:30 to give SCSU the win. SCSU's senior quartet of quarterback Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud), running back Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI), and wide receivers Daryn Ploeckelman (Mukwonago, WI) and Ryan Koch (Madison, WI) played key roles in the Huskies final drive of the fourth quarter, which was played in a driving rain with thunder and lightening in the area. Koch started the drive with a 17 yard rush on a reverse. Kaczor rushed the ball to the MSU 39 on an 11 yard draw play. He followed that with back to back pass completions to Ploeckelman for ten and six yards. Then Birkel went to work with three straight carries of 12, eight and a three-yard touchdown run and 2:30 remaining in the game. The SCSU defense held MSU to five plays and the series ended on the MSU 20 yard line, ensuring the Husky victory. MSU took the opening drive 84 yards on ten plays and ate up 4:39 on the clock, culminating with a Sean Treasure two-yard run to give the Mavericks an early 7-0 lead. SCSU's only score of the first half was a 26-yard Shawn Braunagel (Fargo, ND) field goal at 14:56 of the second quarter. For the first time this season, SCSU gave up points in the first half. Treasure put the Mavericks ahead 14-3 on a three- yard run at 12:08 of the second quarter. The team's played a scoreless third quarter. Birkel rushed for 100 yards in his eighth straight game and 23rd of his career, finishing with 26 carries for 100 yards and two touchdowns. He also caught four passes for 18 yards. DeShazer finished the game with six catches for 81 yards, Koch had five catches for 72 yards, and Ploeckelman had four catches for 49 yards. Senior linebacker Mark Henderson (Madison, WI) led the Huskies with ten tackles, including six solos, one TFL, and one pass defended. Junior safeties Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud) and Justin Biebighauser (Nisswa) each recorded an interception. Sophomore Philip Hedlof (Blomkest, WI) had a fumble recovery.
