## 2006 SCSU FOOTBALL NEWS

Release Date: October 23, 2006



**HUSKIES TRAVEL TO NEBRASKA-OMAHA:** The St. Cloud State University football team (3-5 overall, 1-4 North Central Conference) will play at #8-ranked University of Nebraska-Omaha (6-1 overall, 5-0 North Central Conference) on Saturday, October 28. The Mavericks are ranked second in this week's NCAA Division II Northwest Region Poll and are one of two undefeated teams remaining in league play. The kick-off is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. at Al F. Caniglia Field (9,500) in Omaha, Nebraska.

**ROAD RECORD:** St. Cloud State is 0-3 on the road this season. The Husky losses were at Missouri Western, Central Washington and Augustana College.

**RADIO COVERAGE:** New in 2006, Husky Football, and Men's and Women's Basketball will air on 1450 AM KNSI. Longtime Sports Announcer Tom Witschen will handle the play-by-play duties for all three sports. Witschen is a 32-year veteran of Minnesota sportscasting, and has announced at both the collegiate and high school level. Most recently, he has been the voice of University of Minnesota volleyball, women's basketball and baseball. He has broadcast the NCAA Final Four in three different sports, volleyball, basketball and hockey. Don Lyons, the sports director at KNSI will provide the color commentary for Husky football and will occasionally fill in on play-by-play for men's and women's basketball. Lyons has been the voice of Husky Hockey on KCML 99.9 FM since 1999 and will continue in that role. He has been a sportscaster since 1984. The pregame show for Saturday's game against the University of Nebraska-Omaha will begin at 12:20 p.m.

**KVSC 88.1 FM** will continue its coverage of all home football games in 2006. KVSC Sports Director John Hadden will handle the play-by-play and former SCSU All-American defensive end Charlie Cosgrove will provide color commentary.

**LIVE STATS AT HOME:** St. Cloud State football fans can enjoy live stats on the web for all Husky home games in 2006. Live Stats can be viewed by going to the Husky athletics home page at [www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics](http://www.stcloudstate.edu/athletics) and following the directions.

**RANDY HEDBERG RADIO SHOW:** The Randy Hedberg Show will air on Wednesday evenings live from the Gilleland Chevrolet Showroom floor from 7 to 8 p.m. SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg and KNSI Sports Director Don Lyons will talk Husky football on 1450 AM KNSI. Gilleland Chevrolet is located at 3019 Division Street in St. Cloud.

**WEB CAST:** All games aired on 1450 AM KNSI and 88.1 FM will be carried live on the web. To hear live audio of all Husky football home and away, go to [www.1450knsi.com](http://www.1450knsi.com). The KVSC web site for live audio of all home games is [www.kvsc.org](http://www.kvsc.org).

**HOME RECORD:** St. Cloud State is 3-2 at home in 2006. The Huskies posted a 5-1 record at home in 2005 and are 12-5 all-time in home games played at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season.

**2005 SEASON:** The 2005 St. Cloud State University Husky Football team posted an 8-3 overall record. The Huskies were 3-3 in the North Central Conference, good for a fifth place finish. For the first time in league history, there was a four-way tie for the Championship. North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska-Omaha tied for the 2005 NCC Championship. St. Cloud State finished the 2005 season ranked tenth in the NCAA Division II Northwest Region. The Huskies ranked as high as fourth the week of October 17. St. Cloud State spent nearly the entire 2005 season ranked in the national football polls for Division II. The Huskies were ranked as high as eighth in the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll, the week of Oct. 27 but dropped out of the final poll of the season. SCSU was ranked 38th in the final Don Hansen Football Gazette Poll and 22nd in the CollegeSportsReports.com final

### AT HUSKY STADIUM

2006 will mark the third season in Husky Stadium for the SCSU football team. St. Cloud State is 12-5 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004 and 3,961 in 2005. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota. 2004 Record: 4-2; 2005 Record: 5-1; 2006 Record: 2-1.

### NEW UNIFORM IN 2006

The Huskies will debut new uniforms in 2006. The uniforms will feature a black helmet with a white Husky mascot logo on each side. The jersey is black with white numerals and red piping. The sides of the jersey feature a red stripe and St. Cloud State logos are on each shoulder. The neckline is highlighted with more red piping. The pants are white with red striping on each side.



**Husky Recap.....**

**St. Cloud State vs. Minnesota State**

St. Cloud State ended a four-game North Central Conference losing streak with a 16-3 Homecoming win over Minnesota State University Mankato Saturday. With the win, the Huskies retain the famed Traveling Training Kit, the longtime trophy that goes to the winning team of this rivalry.

St. Cloud State sophomore Jon Gutierrez (Beloit, WI) kicked three goals of 27, 33 and 47 yards to lead the Huskies in the win. Sophomore running back Kenny Patrick (Milwaukee, WI) rushed 12 times for 66 yards and scored the only touchdown of the game on a 33-yard run at 8:44 of the third quarter. Sophomore quarterback Jon Quesnel (Eagan) threw for 174 yards, completing 17 of 30 pass attempts. Sophomore wide receiver Zach Stover (Eagan) caught five passes for 54 yards. Senior tight end Anderson Johnson (St. Cloud) and sophomore running back Michael Graham (Oakdale) each caught three passes. Sophomore cornerback Tyler Krueger (Milwaukee, WI) had a team high nine tackles and a forced fumble. The Huskies recorded three quarterback sacks to extend their consecutive games with a sack to 29.

St. Cloud State finished the game with 321 yards of total offense and held Minnesota State to 233 yards, including 32 on the ground.

Minnesota State quarterback Ben King completed 24 of 40 passes for 192 yards and Bryan Alberty caught eight passes for 38 yards. Ben Spencer kicked a 39 yard field goal with 2:03 left in the first quarter to give the Mavericks an early 3-0 lead.

The Huskies touchdown scoring drive in the third quarter came after sophomore cornerback Matt Jensen (Mequon, WI) intercepted the ball at the MSU 42. After three rushing plays, the Huskies faced fourth and one, and Kenny Patrick broke open for a 33 yard touchdown run.

**2006 Husky Notes.....**

**SCSU Head Coach Randy Hedberg:**



SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) kicks off his eighth season with the Huskies in 2006.

**He has a current seven plus year record of 43-41 at SCSU and is 87-64-2 overall in 16 years as a collegiate coach.**

He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the

NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an 8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).

**Assistant Coaching Staff:** The 2006 assistants include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary), Steve Gruit (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Eric Mattson (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Brian Frana (Offensive Line), Michael Rowe (Defensive Backs), Josh Stephan (Linebackers), Joe Ford (Linebackers), Denny Honnold (Running Backs), and Michael Morrissey (Tight Ends).

**ALL-TIME RECORD:** The 2006 season marks the 84th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 381-320-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

**2006 Team Captains:** Senior defensive backs #21 Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) and #6 Mitch Denne (St. Cloud), along with junior left tackle #77 Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) will serve as captains of the 2006 Huskies.

**Pre Season Honors:** Three Husky football players have been named to the 2006 Football Gazette Preseason All-America Team. Senior Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud), a 6-2, 190, safety; senior Jordan Kroll (Mukwonago, WI), a 6-4, 270, defensive tackle, and senior Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) a 5-10, 180, cornerback, have been honored by Don Hansen's Football Gazette.



**Husky Notes.....**

**Gutierrez Named NCC Player of the Week:**

For the second time this season, sophomore place kicker Jon Gutierrez (Beloit, WI) has been named the North Central Conference Special Teams Player of the Week. Gutierrez made three-of-three field goals to lead the Huskies. He nailed kicks of 27, 33, and 47 yards.

It is the second time this season that Gutierrez had made three field goals in a game. The 47 yard effort was the second longest of his career. The school record for most field goals



in a game is four, held by Matt Hemenway, who went four-of-five against UNO during the 1994 season. Gutierrez made three-of-three field goal attempts earlier this year in a non-conference win over Mary. He is the first Husky to make three field goals in a game since Neil Fish, a St. Cloud native, made three-of-four attempts in a 43-28 win over Augustana College on October 18, 1997.

**Krueger Leads Defense:** Sophomore defensive back Tyler Krueger (Milwaukee, WI) recorded a season high nine tackles against MSU. Krueger has recorded nine tackles in a game three times in his career with the Huskies. He led all players with six solo stops in the game.

**Patrick Leads Ground Attack:** Sophomore running back Kenneth Patrick (Milwaukee, WI) rushed for 66 yards including a 33 yard touchdown run. The 33-yard run was the longest of the season for Patrick. The touchdown was the fourth of the season for Patrick and ties him for the team lead in rushing TDs.



Patrick also pulled in two passes for 31 yards, including a long of 20 yards.

**Johnson Streak Continues:** Senior tight end Anders Johnson (St. Cloud), who has caught at least one pass in each game this season, continued that trend with three receptions for 33 yards against MSU. Johnson leads the Huskies in receptions with 31 this season and is tied for second in receiving yards with 301. He recorded his first touchdown reception of the year and his collegiate career against Augustana College last week.

**Sack Streak Still Alive:** With four quarterback sacks against MSU on Saturday, the Husky sack streak has been extended to 29 consecutive games. Senior DB Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI), sophomore DE Cale Pulczynski (Mukwonago, WI), senior DT Jordan Kroll (Mukwonago, WI)

and junior DT Treg Swanson (Upsala), all had a hand in quarterback sacks against the Mavericks. The Huskies have recorded a sack in 29 consecutive games, dating back to September 2, 2004. The SCSU defense has found the opposing quarterback 26 times this season. A season high five QB sacks were recorded against Missouri Western on Sept. 9. Five is the most since the Husky defense recorded seven against South Dakota last season. SCSU recorded at least one QB sack in each game of the 2005 season. The SCSU record for most sacks in a season is 40, established in 1991. Last season, the Huskies recorded 39 QB sacks.

**Denne Climbs INT Chart:** Senior defensive back Mitch Denne (St. Cloud) and sophomore corner Matt Jensen (Mequon, WI) each had an interception for the Huskies against MSU. Denne has three this season and 14 in his career which ties him for second on the all-time INT chart. The career record is 19 held by Dan Neubauer (1977-80). Jensen's interception and 15-yard return set up the Huskies only touchdown of the game. Denne returned his interception 14 yards early in the fourth quarter. Both Jensen and Denne have three interceptions this season.



**LaPointe Team Leader on Defense:** Junior linebacker Aaron LaPointe (Elk River) leads the Huskies in overall tackles with 46 this season, including a team high 30 assisted tackles. He recorded a career high ten tackles against Western Washington three weeks ago. Against MSU, LaPointe was credited with a 25-yard rush for a first down on a fake punt attempt. The play helped set up a 27-yard field goal attempt by Gutierrez that tied the game at 3-3 early in the second quarter.



**Record Setter:** Sophomore quarterback Jon Quesnel (Eagan) threw for a school record 377 yards against Augustana College on Oct. 14. He completed 27 passes in 47 attempts with three touchdown strikes, all career highs for Quesnel. The old record of 369 yards was set twice by former QB and two-time Harlon Hill Finalist, Keith Heckendorf.

**First in a While:** Junior DB Philip Hedlof's 61-yard interception return for a touchdown last Saturday against Missouri Western, was the first for a Husky since Tate Wheeler scored on August 27, 2005 on a 13-yard return.

**North Dakota Selected As Preseason Football Favorite**

North Dakota has been picked as North Central Conference football favorite in both the preseason media and coaches polls released today. The two samples agreed on the top spot, but none of the other eight slots were the same in the two polls.

Senior DB Tate Wheeler is the first Husky to return a punt for a touchdown since the 1999 season when Nate Lehman returned a punt, a school record 95 yards for a TD. Wheeler's two TD returns of 42 and 48 yards, within a three-minute span in the second quarter on the season opener against Minnesota-Crookston, set a school record for most punt returns for a TD in a single game.

Nebraska-Omaha....

Mavericks in 2006: After suffering a 31-0 loss to Northwest Missouri State University in the second game of the season, #9-ranked Nebraska-Omaha has ticked off five straight wins. Among the wins, a 21-20 victory over highly ranked North Dakota.

Last Year: The Mavericks posted an 8-3 overall record and tied for the North Central Conference title with a 4-2 league mark. UNO advanced to the first round playoffs of the NCAA Division II tournament and lost to Saginaw Valley State, 24-21.

Head Coach: University of Nebraska-Omaha head coach Pat Behrns (Dakota State, 1972) is in his 13th season with the Mavericks. He has a current overall won/loss record of 93-50 with the Mavericks and has led UNO to five NCC titles and five NCAA playoff appearances.



UNO Last Week: The Mavericks are coming off a 38-14 NCC win at Minnesota Duluth last Saturday. UNO tail back Kyle Kasperbauer and quarterback Zach Miller each scored two touchdowns to lead the Mavericks. UNO scored twice in the first six minutes of the game and led 17-7 at the end of the first quarter. The Mavericks led 24-14 at the half, played through a scoreless third quarter, and then added two fourth quarter touchdowns to put the game away.

Mavericks Team Notes: The Mavericks bring a high powered offensive attack to the NCC, including the top ground game in the league. UNO is averaging 405.1 yards per game, including 299.4 yards on the ground. UNO has scored 23 rushing touchdowns. The Mavericks have attempted 99 passes this season and average 106.1 yards per game in the air.

Player Notes: Senior tail back Kyle Kasperbauer and junior quarterback Zach Miller lead the UNO ground attack. Kasperbauer has 151 carries for 846 yards and nine touchdowns. Miller has 108 carries for 802 yards and 11 touchdowns. Both average over 100 yards per game in rushing, with Kasperbauer at

120.9 yards and Miller at 114.6. Miller has attempted 61 passes this season, completing 36 for 481 yards and three touchdowns. Sophomore wide receiver Troy Kush has caught a team high 21 passes for 384 yards and all four UNO receiving touchdowns.

The University of Nebraska-

Omaha upset St. Cloud State 38-21 in a key North Central Conference game played in Omaha on October 22. The 24th ranked (D2football.com) Mavericks jumped out to a 21-0 lead in the second quarter but the Huskies came back with 21 points of their own to tie the game with 4:22 left in the third quarter. Nebraska-Omaha scored the go ahead touchdown on a 26-yard run by running back Kyle Kasperbauer with :01 second left in the third quarter. UNO increased the lead to 31-21 on a 39-yard Andy Severson field goal with 6:03 left in the fourth quarter. The final blow came on a 19-yard Kasperbauer touchdown run, his third of the day with 2:10 left in the game. Kasperbauer finished the game with 35 carries for 179 yards and three touchdowns. SCSU was led by senior wide receiver Ryan Koch. Koch had a career high ten catches for 124 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore wide receiver Ryan Jensen caught his first touchdown pass of his career with the Huskies. SCSU quarterback Daniel Kaczor finished the game with 20 of 38 passing for 231 yards and three TDs. He equaled his career high in pass attempts with 38. SCSU defensive end Charlie Cosgrove notched one quarterback sack for a career total of 22. He is .5 sacks short of tying the school record. Junior defensive back Tate Wheeler led the Huskies with 15 tackles. Nebraska-Omaha rolled up 428 yards on offense and held the Huskies to 317 yards. St. Cloud State scored its first touchdown of the game with 1:13 left in the second quarter, a 15-yard pass play from Daniel Kaczor to wide receiver Ryan Koch, capping a four play, 42 yard drive that took :41 seconds. The Mavericks took a 21-7 lead into halftime but the Huskies found the end zone less than four minutes into the third quarter when Kaczor found Koch on a five yard touchdown pass at 10:56. St. Cloud State tied the score 21-21, capping a 12 play, 82-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown pass from Kaczor to sophomore wide receiver Ryan Jensen at the 4:22 mark.
