HUSKIES AT DULUTH FOR SEASON FINALE: The St. Cloud State University football team (3-7 overall, 1-6 North Central Conference) will close out the 2006 season in a North Central Conference match up at the University of Minnesota Duluth (5-4 overall, 3-4 NCC) on Saturday, November 11. The kick-off is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. at Malosky Stadium (4,000) on the UMD campus.

ROAD RECORD: St. Cloud State is 0-4 on the road in 2006, including three conference losses.

RADIO COVERAGE: New in 2006, Husky Football, and Men's and Women's Basketball will air on 1450 AM KNSI. Longtime Sports Announcer Tom Witschen will handle the play-by-play duties for all three sports. Witschen is a 32-year veteran of Minnesota sportscasting, and has announced at both the collegiate and high school level. Most recently, he has been the voice of University of Minnesota volleyball, women's basketball and baseball. He has broadcast the NCAA Final Four in three different sports, volleyball, basketball and hockey. Don Lyons, the sports director at KNSI will provide the color commentary for Husky football and will occasionally fill in on play-by-play for men's and women's basketball. Lyons has been the voice of Husky Hockey on KCML 99.9 FM since 1999 and will continue in that role. He has been a sportscaster since 1984. The pregame show for Saturday's game will begin at 12:20 p.m.

KVSC 88.1 FM will continue its coverage of all home football games in 2006. KVSC Sports Director John Hadden will handle the play-by-play and former SCSU All-American defensive end Charlie Cosgrove will provide color commentary.

RANDY HEDBERG RADIO SHOW: The Randy Hedberg Show will air on Wednesday evenings live from the Gilleland Chevrolet Showroom floor from 7 to 8 p.m. SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg and KNSI Sports Director Don Lyons will talk Husky football on 1450 AM KNSI. Gilleland Chevrolet is located at 3019 Division Street in St. Cloud.

WEB CAST: All games aired on 1450 AM KNSI and 88.1 FM will be carried live on the web. To hear live audio of all Husky football home and away, go to www.1450knsi.com. The KVSC web site for live audio of all home games is www.kvsc.org.

2005 SEASON: The 2005 St. Cloud State University Husky Football team posted an 8-3 overall record. The Huskies were 3-3 in the North Central Conference, good for a fifth place finish. For the first time in league history, there was a four-way tie for the Championship. North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska-Omaha tied for the 2005 NCC Championship. St. Cloud State finished the 2005 season ranked tenth in the NCAA Division II Northwest Region. The Huskies ranked as high as fourth the week of October 17. St. Cloud State spent nearly the entire 2005 season ranked in the national football polls for Division II. The Huskies were ranked as high as eighth in the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll, the week of Oct. 27 but dropped out of the final poll of the season. SCSU was ranked 38th in the final Don Hansen Football Gazette Poll and 22nd in the CollegeSportsReports.com final

AT HUSKY STADIUM

2006 will mark the third season in Husky Stadium for the SCSU football team. St. Cloud State is 12-6 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004 and 3,961 in 2005. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota. 2004 Record: 4-2; 2005 Record: 5-1; 2006 Record: 3-3.

NEW UNIFORM IN 2006

The Huskies will debut new uniforms in 2006. The uniforms will feature a black helmet with a white Husky mascot logo on each side. The jersey is black with white numerals and red piping. The sides of the jersey feature a red stripe and St. Cloud State logos are on each shoulder. The neckline is highlighted with more red piping. The pants are white with red striping on each side.



Husky Recap.....

St. Cloud State vs. North Dakota

University of North Dakota freshman runningback Ryan Chappell scored on a 14-yard run in overtime for a 34-27 NCC win.

North Dakota scored first in the overtime frame and the Huskies upset bid of the tenth-ranked UND team ended when SCSU failed to convert on their overtime possession.

The team's combined for 722 yards in total offense as UND accounted for 437 yards. Chappell finished the day with 150 yards on 23 carries and three touchdowns to lead UND. Quarterback Reed Manke completed 26 of 37 pass attempts for 217 yards and one touchdown. Brady Trenbeath had ten catches for 92 yards and Weston Dressler tallied seven receptions for 53 yards.

St. Cloud State sophomore quarterback Jon Quesnel (Eagan) completed 18 of 29 passes for 266 yards and one touchdown. Sophomore runningback Kenneth Patrick (Milwaukee, WI) caught six passes for 20 yards and sophomore wide receiver Zach Stove (Eagan) caught five passes for a career high 128 yards.

It was a classic North Central Conference contest as both teams scored on their opening drives with Chappell scoring his first of three touchdowns at 10:43 of the first quarter. SCSU answered with a 30-yard field goal from sophomore Jon Gutierrez (Beloit, WI). After SCSU forced UND to punt, the Huskies took their next drive 63 yards on two plays culminating in a 50-yard pass play from Quesnel to sophomore wide receiver Nate Johnson (Austin) and the Huskies led 10-7 at the end of the first quarter.

St. Cloud State went up 13-7 at 12:28 of the second quarter on a 42-yard Gutierrez field goal. Three and a half minutes later UND scored as Dressler caught a two-yard pass to give UND a 14-13 lead. The Huskies took the lead when senior defensive tackle Jordan Kroll blocked Brandon Hellevang's 48-yard field goal attempt and junior defensive back Philip Hedlof (Blomkest) returned the block 59 yards for a touchdown and SCSU led 20-14 at the 7:01 mark. With 2:09 left in the half, Chappell scored on a 19-yard run and UND led 21-20 at halftime.

A 23-yard Hellevang field goal opened the second half. The Huskies answered again, this time on a two-yard touchdown run by Patrick and led 27-24 with 5:12 left in the third quarter.

After exchanging possession four times, SCSU had an opportunity to increase the lead but were thwarted when a 35-yard field goal attempt was blocked by UND with 10:46 left in the fourth quarter. UND took possession and worked their way down field with a 15 play 66 yard drive that took seven minutes and 38 seconds off the clock, and culminated in a 31-yard Hellevang field goal with 1:40 left in regulation. After the Huskies were forced to punt, UND took over with 1:02 on the clock and with three-tenths of a second left attempted a 48-yard field that missed left and short, and took the game to overtime.

2006 Husky Notes.....

SCSU Head Coach Randy Hedberg:



SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) kicks off his eighth season with the Huskies in 2006.

He has a current seven plus year record of 43-43 at SCSU and is 88-66-2 overall in 16 years as a collegiate coach.

He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the

NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an 8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Marshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).

Assistant Coaching Staff: The 2006 assistants include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary), Steve Gruit (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Eric Mattson (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Brian Frana (Offensive Line), Michael Rowe (Defensive Backs), Josh Stephan (Linebackers), Joe Ford (Linebackers), Denny Honnold (Running Backs), and Michael Morrissey (Tight Ends).

ALL-TIME RECORD: The 2006 season marks the 84th in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 381-320-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the North Central Conference (1989, 2002), 14 Northern Intercollegiate Conference crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

2006 Team Captains: Senior defensive backs #21 Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) and #6 Mitch Denne (St. Cloud), along with junior left tackle #77 Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) will serve as captains of the 2006 Huskies.

Pre Season Honors: Three Husky football players have been named to the 2006 Football Gazette Preseason All-America Team. Senior Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud), a 6-2, 190, safety; senior Jordan Kroll (Mukwonago, WI), a 6-4, 270, defensive tackle, and senior Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) a 5-10, 180, cornerback, have been honored by Don Hansen's Football Gazette.



Husky Notes.....

Denne Makes the Tackle: Senior free safety Mitch Denne (St. Cloud) led the Huskies in tackles against UND last week with ten which equals his season high. He recorded his fourth interception of the season and 15th of his collegiate career at UNO two weeks ago. Denne stands alone in second place on the all-time interception chart at SCSU behind Dan Neubauer who recorded 19 during his career from 1977 to 1980.



Johnson Streak Continues: Senior tight end Anders Johnson (St. Cloud), who has caught at least one pass in each game this season, continued that trend with two receptions for 11 yards against UND. Johnson leads the Huskies in receptions with 39 this season and is second in receiving yards with 389. He recorded his first touchdown reception of the year and his collegiate career against Augustana College.



Sack Streak Still Alive: A season high six quarterback sacks against UND extended the Huskies consecutive games streak with a sack to 31. Six different players had a hand in the sacks. It was the most sack in a game for the Huskies since SCSU recorded seven against South Dakota on October 15, 2005. The Huskies have recorded a sack in 31 consecutive games, dating back to September 2, 2004. The SCSU defense has found the opposing quarterback 34 times this season. SCSU recorded at least one QB sack in each game of the 2005 season. The SCSU record for most sacks in a season is 40, established in 1991. Last season, the Huskies recorded 39 QB sacks.

LaPointe Team Leader on Defense:

Junior linebacker Aaron LaPointe (Elk River) leads the Huskies in over-all tackles with 63 this season, including a team high 39 assisted tackles. LaPointe recorded eight tackles against UND last Saturday, including one quarterback sack. He recorded his second best season and career totals against UNO two weeks ago with nine tackles. He recorded a career high ten tackles against Western Washington earlier in the season.



Stover on the Fly: Sophomore wide receiver Zach Stover (Eagan) re-recorded a season and career high 128 receiving yards against UND. He caught five passes (his second highest season total). He leads the team with 666 receiving yards and is second in receptions with 35. Stover is the first Husky



Record Setter: Sophomore quarterback Jon Quesnel (Eagan) tenth touchdown pass of the season and 266 yards against UND, his second highest passing total this season. Quesnel threw for a school record 377 yards against Augustana College on Oct. 14. He completed 27 passes in 47 attempts with three touchdown strikes, all career highs for Quesnel, in that game. The old record of 369 yards was set twice by former QB and two-time Harlon Hill Finalist, Keith Heckendorf.



Hedlof Scores One for Special Teams:

Junior cornerback Philip Hedlof (Blomkest) scored a touchdown for the Huskies when he scooped up a blocked field goal attempt by UND and ran it 59 yards for the touchdown and put SCSU ahead 20-14 midway through the second quarter. Senior Jordan Kroll (Mukwonago, WI) made the block.



Gutierrez is a Kick: Sophomore place kicker Jon Gutierrez (Beloit, WI) is the Huskies scoring leader with 66 points this season. He has connected on 13 of 19 field goal attempts, with a career long of 49 yards. He has nailed eighth of ten field goals over the last five games. The 66 points is the most for an SCSU field goal kicker since Shawn Braunagel accounted for 76 points during the 2003 season.



Husky Heartbreakers: The Huskies have lost three league games in the final minute of play or overtime this season. Western Washington returned a block punt for a touchdown with :43 seconds left in the game, Augustana College completed a 51-yard pass play with :03 seconds left, and UND defeated the Huskies in overtime.

North Dakota Selected As Preseason Football Favorite

North Dakota has been picked as North Central Conference football favorite in both the preseason media and coaches polls released today. The two samples agreed on the top spot, but none of the other eight slots were the same in the two polls.

First in a While: Junior DB Philip Hedlof's 61-yard interception return for a touchdown last Saturday against Missouri Western, was the first for a Husky since Tate Wheeler scored on August 27, 2005 on a 13-yard return.

Senior DB Tate Wheeler is the first Husky to return a punt for a touchdown since the 1999 season when Nate Lehman returned a punt, a school record 95 yards for a TD. Wheeler's two TD returns of 42 and 48 yards, within a three-minute span in the second quarter of the season opener against Minnesota-Crookston, set a school record for most punt returns for a TD in a single game.



Scouting
Minnesota Duluth....

The Bulldogs in 2006: After starting the season with a 4-1 record, the Bulldogs have lost three of their last four game and last week had a bye. UMD's last two losses were to North Dakota and Nebraska-Omaha by identical scores of 38-14.

Last Year: Minnesota Duluth tied for first in the NCC and advanced to the NCAA Division II Football Playoffs. The Bulldogs met conference foe North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA playoffs and lost to UND 23-12 in Grand Forks. UMD finished the season with an 8-4 overall record and 4-2 NCC mark.

Head Coach: University of Minnesota Duluth head coach Kyle "Bubba" Schweigert (James-town College, 1985), is in his third season with the Bulldogs. In his first two seasons, he compiled a 12-11 overall record and led the Bulldogs to the NCC co-championship in 2005.



Team Notes: The Bulldogs average 308.1 yards in offense and are giving up 357.1 yards this season. Sophomore quarterback Ted Schlafke leads the Bulldog offensive attack. He has thrown for 2,235 yards and 15 touchdowns, and completed 221 of 368 pass attempts. He has also rushed for 106 yards this season. Keith Bizzle and Marek Seta have rushed for 165 and 125 yards, respectively. Greg Aker and Tony Doherty lead the receiving corps. Aker has caught a team high 60 passes for 601 yards and four touchdowns. Doherty has 36 receptions for 499 yards and a team high six touchdowns. On the defensive side of the ball, Tyler Yelk has a team high 80 tackles and Tim Garceau five interceptions.

Last Year....

The University of Minnesota Duluth most likely spoiled 14th-ranked St. Cloud State's postseason playoff hopes with a 45-28 North Central Conference win Saturday afternoon at Husky Stadium. With the win, the Bulldogs claimed at least a share of the North Central Conference title. UMD is 8-3 overall, 4-2 in the NCC and ranked eighth in the Northwest Region. St. Cloud State is 8-3 overall, 3-3 in the NCC and ranked fifth in the region.

St. Cloud State senior running back Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) became the Huskies all-time career rushing leader as he finished the day with 30 carries for 172 yards and a career high four touchdowns. He has 4,920 career rushing yards, surpassing the old mark of 4,889 held by Harry Jackson (1986-89).

A 27-yard pass play from UMD quarterback Ted Schlafke to Vinny Flury and a five-yard run by Greg Aker on the reverse gave the Bulldogs a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. SCSU responded on a one-yard Matt Birkel run with 2:31 in the first and a 58 yard run at the 12:02 mark of the second to tie the game 14-14. UMD found the end zone three more times on a two-yard pass to Flury, a 35-yard completion to Aker and a one-yard pass to Mark Slinden at 2:07 of the second quarter to take a 35-14 lead. The Huskies responded with two more Matt Birkel touchdown runs of one yard and two yards, the last with seven seconds left in the half to get within a touchdown 35-28 at the half.

Minnesota Duluth put three more points on the board with a 35-yard field goal by Britt Baumann at the 4:21 mark of the third quarter. Flury caught one more touchdown pass at 14:17 of the fourth quarter to give the Bulldogs the final winning margin.

The teams combined for 980 yards in total offense, ten touchdowns, one field goal, and ten turnovers, with the Huskies committing six.

Ted Schlafke completed 34 of 52 passes for 430 yards and five touchdowns and rushed for 78 yards. Vinny Flury and Ross Schumacher each had nine receptions for the Bulldogs. Flury finished the game with 140 yards and three touchdowns.

St. Cloud State sophomore quarterback Mike Hammerseng (Minnetonka), making his first collegiate start completed 26 of 49 passes for 320 yards. Senior wide receiver Ryan Koch (Madison, WI) pulled in a career high 11 catches for a career high 145 yards. He tied the single season record for receptions with 73. He also moved into third on the all-time pass receiving yards chart with 2,706 yards and is second in career receptions with 192.
