### 2005 SCSU FOOTBALL TEAM NEWS

Release Date: FINAL RELEASE



**Season Record:** The 2005 St. Cloud State University Husky Football team posted an 8-3 overall record. The Huskies were 3-3 in the North Central Conference, for a fifth place finish. For the first time in league history, there was a four-way tie for the Championship. North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska-Omaha tied for the 2005 NCC Championship.

**2006 Schedule:** SCSU will play 11 games including six home contests and open at home on Thursday, August 31 at 6:00 p.m. against the University of Minnesota-Crookston. Two new schools will join the North Central Conference in football this season as affiliate members. Central Washington University and Western Washington University will give the NCC an eight game conference schedule. In the non-conference schedule, the Huskies open with Minnesota-Crookston, travel to Missouri Western College on September 9 and will play the University of Mary at home on September 16 in the first ever game between the two teams.

**Media Coverage:** Husky Football aired on **AM 1240 WJON**. Sports Director Jay Caldwell completed his eighth season as play-by-play announcer for the Husky broadcast. He was joined in the booth by Joe Erickson as the color analyst.

**Huskies Tenth in Northwest Region:** St. Cloud State finished the 2005 season ranked tenth in the NCAA Division II Northwest Region. The Huskies ranked as high as fourth the week of October 17. The final region rankings were: 1. Grand Valley State (National Champions), 2. Nebraska-Omaha, 3. Saginaw Valley State, 4. North Dakota, 5. Minnesota Duluth, 6. Northwood, 7. South Dakota, 8. Central Washington, 9. Ashland, 10. St. Cloud State, 11. Concordia-St. Paul, 12. Winona State.

**Huskies in the National Polls:** St. Cloud State spent nearly the entire 2005 season ranked in the national football polls for Division II. The Huskies were ranked as high as eighth in the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll, the week of Oct. 27 but dropped out of the final poll of the season. SCSU was ranked 38th in the final Don Hansen Football Gazette Poll and 22nd in the CollegeSportsReports.com final poll.

2005 Husky Notes...

SCSU Head Coach Randy Hedberg: SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) completed his seventh season with the Huskies in 2005. He has a current record of 40-36 at SCSU and is 85-59-2 overall in 16 years as a collegiate coach. He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002,



which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an 8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant

coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).

Assistant Coaching Staff: The 2005 assistants include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary), Steve Gruit (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Derek Johnson (Running Backs), Eric Mattson (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Ryan Mills (Tight Ends), Andrew Tippins (Defensive Line), Brian Frana (Offensive Line), Michael Rowe (Defensive Backs), Josh Stephan (Linebackers).

At Husky Stadium: The 2005 season marked the second year in SCSU's new home, Husky Stadium, located on the banks of the Mississippi River. St. Cloud State posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004 and 3,961 in 2005. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota.



Pre-Season All-American Honors: Several Huskies received 2005 preseason All-American honors. Leading the way was junior defensive back Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud) who was named to three preseason teams. Denne was honored as a Street & Smith's Division II preseason All-American, a Don Hansen Football Gazette preseason All-American and CollegeSportsReport.com Division II preseason All-American. Senior running back Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) was honored twice by Don Hansen and CollegeSportsReport.com. Senior quarterback Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud) and senior wide receiver Ed DeShazer (Milwaukee, WI) were named to the 2005 Don Hansen Football Gazette preseason All-American team.

2005 Team Captains: Four Huskies served as captains in 2005. Representing the offense was #16 senior quarterback Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud) and #78 senior right tackle Jon Scovill (Wayzata). On defense the Huskies were represented by #54 senior linebacker Mark Henderson (Madison, WI) and #18 senior defensive end Charlie Cosgrove (Minneapolis).

### 2005 Husky Notes...

**All-Time Record:** The 2005 season marked the 83rd in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 381-320-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the NCC (1989, 2002), 14 NIC crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

**The Randy Hedberg Show:** The Randy Hedberg Show aired on Tuesday nights throughout the 2005 SCSU football season on AM 1390 The Fan. The program originated from the Ground Round in St. Cloud and featured SCSU head football coach Randy Hedberg, WJON Sports Director and SCSU football play-by-play announcer Jay Caldwell, and color analyst Joe Erickson.

**Final Game vs. Minnesota Duluth:** The University of Minnesota Duluth spoiled 14th-ranked St. Cloud State's post-season playoff hopes with a 45-28 North Central Conference win Saturday afternoon at Husky Stadium. With the win, the Bulldogs claimed at least a share of the North Central Conference title. UMD is 8-3 overall, 4-2 in the NCC and ranked eighth in the Northwest Region. St. Cloud State is 8-3 overall, 3-3 in the NCC and ranked fifth in the region.

St. Cloud State senior running back Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) became the Huskies all-time career rushing leader as he finished the day with 30 carries for 172 yards and a career high four touchdowns. He has 4,920 career rushing yards, surpassing the old mark of 4,889 held by Harry Jackson (1986-89).

A 27-yard pass play from UMD quarterback Ted Schlafke to Vinny Flury and a five-yard run by Greg Aker on the reverse gave the Bulldogs a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. SCSU responded on a one-yard Matt Birkel run with 2:31 in the first and a 58 yard run at the 12:02 mark of the second to tie the game 14-14. UMD found the end zone three more times on a two-yard pass to Flury, a 35-yard completion to Aker and a one-yard pass to Mark Slinden at 2:07 of the second quarter to take a 35-14 lead. The Huskies responded with two more Matt Birkel touchdown runs of one yard and two yards, the last with seven seconds left in the half to get within a touchdown 35-28 at the half.

Minnesota Duluth put three more points on the board with a 35-yard field goal by Britt Baumann at the 4:21 mark of the third quarter. Flury caught one more touchdown pass at 14:17 of the fourth quarter to give the Bulldogs the final winning margin.

The teams combined for 980 yards in total offense, ten touchdowns, one field goal, and ten turnovers, with the Huskies committing six.

Ted Schlafke completed 34 of 52 passes for 430 yards and five touchdowns and rushed for 78 yards. Vinny Flury and Ross Schumacher each had nine receptions for the Bulldogs. Flury finished the game with 140 yards and three touchdowns.

St. Cloud State sophomore quarterback Mike Hammerseng (Minnetonka), making his first collegiate start completed 26 of 49 passes for 320 yards. Senior wide receiver Ryan Koch (Madison, WI) pulled in a career high 11 catches for a career high 145 yards. He tied the single season record for receptions with 73. He also moved into third on the all-time pass receiving yards chart with 2,706 yards and

**Defensive End Eli Bauman:** Senior defensive end Eli Bauman (Sharon, WI) moved from outside linebacker to defensive end in 2005...earned a starting role as a senior...recorded 18 tackles, four tackles for loss, 2.5 quarterback sacks, one break up and two QB hurries in 2005...had a career high five tackles against South Dakota on Oct. 15, 2005...played in 29 career games and finished with 39 career tackles, nine TFL, and 3.5 quarterback sacks.

**SCSU's All-Time Rushing Leader: Senior running back Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) is St. Cloud State's all-time leading rusher with 4,920 yards...** SCSU's all-time leading scorer with 342 points and 57 total touchdowns (a school record)...rushed for 1,558 yards in 2005...rushed for over 100 yards in nine of 11 games this season and went over the 200 yard mark three times...scored at least one touchdown in all but two games...scored a season and career high four touchdowns in final game of collegiate career against Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 5...ranked second in the North Central Conference in rushing...ranked eighth in NCAA Division II scoring, tenth in rushing, and 13th in all-purpose yards for the season... named a preseason All-American by D2Football.com, Don Hansen Football Gazette, and CollegeSportsReports.com...four-year starter... Birkel's 1,000 yard season (in 2005) is the 11th in the history of SCSU football and he is the third Husky to have back-to-back 1,000 yard seasons...went over the 100-yard rushing mark 27 times in his collegiate career and over 200 yards seven times...rushed for a career high 236 yards on November 2, 2002 against the University of Nebraska-Omaha...is the third Husky in school history to rush for over 4,000 yards in a career (Harry Jackson (4,889) and Randy Martin (4,618) are the only other members of SCSU's 4,000 yard club)...career stats include 36 games, 4,920 yards (1st all-time at SCSU), 809 carries (3rd all-time) 57 touchdowns (1st all-time); 62 receptions, 579 yards, three touchdowns; 15 kick-off returns, 397 yards, one touchdown; 5,896 all-purpose yards (3rd all-time)...2005, 2004, and 2002 All-North Central Conference First Team... Top 26 Harlon Hill Candidate in 2005- and 2004...2005 D2Football.com Northwest All-Region First Team...2005 and 2004 Daktronics, Inc., All-Northwest Region First Team...2005 Football Gazette All-Northwest Region team...Was the top vote getter at running back for the Daktronics All-Region team both years...Voted the 2005 and 2004 Harry Jackson Offensive Player of the Year by teammates... invited to 2005 Cactus Bowl...led NCC in rushing, scoring and scoring TDs in 2004.

**Braunagel Sets Kicking Mark: Senior place kicker Shawn Braunagel (Fargo, ND) became SCSU's career leader in place kicking with 212 career points..his record surpasses the old mark of 205 held by Dan Pridon (1988-91)...Braunagel was eight of 13 in field goal attempts and 38 of 40 in point after touchdown (PATs) in 2005...he finished his career with 27 field goals in 49 attempts and made 131 of 140 PATs...the longest field goal of his career was 41 yards, which he hit twice, against Northern Northern State on Sept. 20, 2003 and on Oct. 12, 2002 against Northern Colorado...named to 2006 All-NCC Second Team and NCC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll.**



### **Husky Senior Player Notes...**

**Offensive Lineman Joe Brennan: Senior right guard Joe Brennan (Glencoe)** played on the offensive line in 2005 and 2004...he moved from a defensive line position to the o-line in 2003 and was a valuable back-up for at both guard and center... Brennan played on an offensive line that made room for SCSU's all-time rushing leader Matt Birkel...the SCSU offense averaged 418.6 yards per game of total offense in 2005.

**Cosgrove Sets Sack Record: Senior linebacker Charlie Cosgrove (Minneapolis)** set career records for sacks during 2005 season (23.5) and tackles for loss with 47.5...2005 North Central Conference Most Valuable Defensive Lineman and First Team All-NCC...2005 AFCA Division II Coaches' All-America Team...2005 Daktronics, Inc., All-Northwest Region First Team...2005 D2Football.com Northwest All-Region First Team...2003 All-North Central Conference First Team...2004 All-North Central Conference Second Team...Two-time NCC Defensive Player of the Week in 2004...Voted SCSU's Outstanding Defensive Player in 2004...2005 Team Captain... starter at defensive end...played and started all 11 games of 2005 season...team leader in quarterback sacks with 7.5 for loss of 55 yards...led team in tackles for loss with 15.5 for 76 yards...ranked fourth on team in tackles with 48, including 23 solo...twice tallied season high eight tackles in a game, which is also his career high...had a season and career high 4.5 TFL against South Dakota...led the NCC in forced fumbles with three...ranked in the top 50 in NCAA DII stats in pass sacks, tackles for loss and forced fumbles.

**DeShazer Gets 2,000 Yards: Senior wide receiver Ed DeShazer (Milwaukee, WI)** caught 139 passes for 2,125 yards and 19 touchdowns during his career to become the sixth Husky to reach 2,000 career yards...his 139 receptions ties him for sixth all-time and his 19 TDs is fifth best among SCSU's all-time receiving list...caught at least one pass in 33 straight games beginning with the final game of the 2002 season and ending with five catches in his final collegiate game...caught a career high seven catches twice in his career against Pittsburg State on Sept. 13, 2003 and Nebraska-Omaha on Oct. 23, 2004...had a career high 123 receiving yards versus South Dakota on Oct. 16, 2004...First Team All-NCC in 2004.

**Linebacker Chad Ely: Senior linebacker Chad Ely (Two Rivers, WI)** was a four-year member of the Husky football team...started his career with the Huskies as a tight end and spent final three seasons on defensive side of the ball...recorded 22 tackles in 2005...had a career high eight tackles against Northern State on Sept. 18, 2004...recorded 55 tackles including 25 solo tackles during career.

**Hackett Streak Continues: Senior tight end John Hackett (Prairie Du Chien, WI)** caught at least one pass in all 11 games his senior season and put together a string of 13 consecutive games where he caught at least one pass...caught 20 passes over the last five games of his career...had a career high seven catches against Augustana on Oct. 8, 2005 and had a career high 87 yards receiving against UND in 2005...made 33 catches for 437 yards and one TD in 2005...caught 50 career passes for 612 yards and two touchdowns...was tight end for two seasons... prior to that played defense and recorded 27 tackles...named to DII Football.com All-Northwest Region Honorable Mention team.

#### **Henderson a Team Leader: Senior linebacker Mark Henderson (Madison, WI)**

was a three-year starter and two-year team captain for the Huskies...led the Huskies in tackles for the third straight season with 86 in 2005...had a career high 18 tackles twice during his career against Western Washington on Sept. 11, 2004 and Nebraska-Omaha on Oct. 23, 2004...an All-NCC first team selection, Academic All-NCC, and NCC Commissioner's Honor roll pick...other honors included D2Football.com Northwest Region Honorable Mention team and ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Five Football team...finished his senior season with 41 solo and 48 assisted tackles...ranks eighth on the all-time tackle chart at SCSU with 265 career tackles...three-time Academic All-NCC team member...2004 All-NCC Second team and 2003 All-NCC First team.

#### **Ironman Cory Johnsen Lehr: Senior noseguard Cory Johnsen Lehr (Aberdeen, SD)**

played in every game during the last three seasons of his collegiate career...All-NCC Second Team in 2004...finished the 2005 season with 12 tackles including 4.5 tackles for losses and two quarterback sacks...his career totals include 76 tackles, 18.5 TFL and 8.5 quarterback sacks.

#### **Kaczor Career Comes to Early End: Senior quarterback Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud)**

suffered a season ending broken collar bone on Oct. 29, 2005 against Missouri Western late in the second quarter...Kaczor had started 21 games for the Huskies and posted an 18-5 record since succeeding Keith Heckendorf...in 2005 he completed 159 of 257 passes for 2,007 yards and 18 touchdowns...is the seventh Husky quarterback to pass for over 4,000 yards in a career...is the sixth quarterback to throw for over 2,000 yards in a season which has been done 12 times in Husky football, including back to back 2,000 yard seasons for Kaczor...currently ranks fourth in all-time passing yards with 4,625 and is tied for second with 43 touchdown passes...in his career he has completed 340 of 576 passes for 4,625 yards and 43 touchdowns...career game highs include 38 pass attempts (twice), 22 pass completions and 312 passing yards...led the Huskies to the 2004 NCAA Division II football playoffs, the first postseason appearance for SCSU since 1989...two-year team captain and two-year starter...was back-up to Harlon Hill Finalist Keith Heckendorf for two seasons...Honorable Mention All-NCC in 2005 and Second Team All-NCC in 2004...two-time Academic All-NCC pick...2005 NCC Commissioner's Honor Roll...two-time ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Five Football Second Team...Don Hansen Football Gazetteer NCAA DII Preseason All-America Team in 2005.

**Koch Catches Academics and Athletics: Senior wide receiver Ryan Koch (Madison, WI)** had an outstanding football career on and off the field...is one of the most decorated athletes in terms of academic achievement at SCSU...in 2005, Koch caught a team high 73 passes for 1,028 yards and 13 touchdowns...tied the SCSU single season record for receptions (73) and led the NCC in receptions per game (7.0)...led the Huskies with 30 punt returns for 197 yards...had five kick-off returns for 114 yards...caught a season and career high 11 passes on Nov. 5 against Minnesota Duluth and had a season and career high 145 receiving yards against UMD that same day...caught at least four passes in every one of the Huskies 11 games and caught at least one touchdown pass in all but three games...in his career, Koch ranks second all-time in receptions with 192 and touchdowns with 33...

ranks third all-time in receiving yards with 2,706... recorded at least one pass reception in the 42 games he played during his career (total of 44 games played from 2002-05)...averaged 4.6 receptions per game, 14.1 yards per catch and 64.4 receiving yards per game in his career...recorded 60 career punt returns for 433 yards and five kick-off returns for 114 yards...tallied 3,274 all-purpose career yards and ranks seventh all-time in scoring with 204 points...was a 2005 National Football Foundation Draddy Trophy Finalist (known to many as the academic Heisman), an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American First Team member, ESPN The Magazine All-District Five Academic team member, 2005 All-North Central Conference First Team, Academic All-NCC First Team, NCC Commissioner's Honor Roll...D2Football.com All-Northwest Region Second Team selection, 2005 CollegeSportsReports.com All-Division II Offensive First Team...his career honors include two-time ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American First Team College Division...two-time ESPN The Magazine All-District Five Academic First Team...four-time Academic All-NCC...two-time All-NCC first team in 2005 and 2003...All-NCC Second Team in 2004.

#### **From Hardcourt to Gridiron: Offensive lineman Scott Peters (Litchfield)**

made the move from the basketball court to the gridiron in the spring of 2005...was a three-year member of the SCSU basketball team...played all but one game on the offensive line during the 2005 season...the one exception was due to injury.

**Senior Wide Receiver Daryn Ploeckelman: Senior wide receiver Daryn Ploeckelman (Mukwonago, WI)** was a four-year member of the Husky football team...he caught 17 passes for 189 yards and two touchdowns during his senior season and made at least one reception in ten of the 11 games he played...he finished his career with 66 catches for 834 yards and eight touchdowns...his career long 70 yard reception was for a touchdown against the University of Minnesota-Crookston on August 28, 2003...three-year starter...winner of 2004 Ed Johnson Commitment to Excellence Award.

#### **Senior Offensive Lineman Jon Scovill: Senior lineman Jon Scovill (Wayzata)**

was a three-year starter at left tackle for the Huskies and never missed a start...2002 recipient of the Ed Johnson Commitment to Excellence Award...his line play opened the way for Matt Birkel, SCSU's all-time leading rusher who ran for 4,920 career yards...the SCSU offense averaged 418.6 yards per game in 2005, 426.2 yards per game in 2004, and 463.2 yards per game in 2002.

**Senior Linebacker Clint Walters: Senior linebacker Clint Walters (Burnsville)** played for the Huskies in 2004 and 2005 after transferring from Rochester Community College...originally a defensive back, Walters was moved to linebacker in 2005...tallied 15 tackles in 2005 and 11 in 2004.

**Season Notes....**

**Husky Sacks:** The Huskies recorded at least one quarterback sack in each game of the 2005 season. SCSU set a school record with nine QB sacks at Western Washington on September 10. The Husky defense accounted for 39 total sacks this year. The school record for sacks in a season is 40, which was posted during the 1991 season.

**Hammerseng Answers Call:** Sophomore quarterback **Mike Hammerseng (Minnetonka)** had only played in a total of four non-conference games in his two-year career as a Husky until October 29th. With just under two minutes left in the first half, Hammerseng replaced the injured Daniel Kaczor and guided SCSU to a thrilling win over Missouri Western. Hammerseng completed 11 of 16 passes for 154 yards and two touchdowns. His touchdown passes were for 43 yards to Ed DeShazer in the third quarter and ten yards to Ryan Koch in the fourth quarter. He engineered three scoring drives for the Huskies. The following week, he started at quarterback against Minnesota Duluth. In that game, he completed 26 of 49 passes for 320 yards and three interceptions.

**Three Others Complete Eligibility:** St. Cloud State had 16 seniors on the 2005 roster. In addition, three other players finished their careers with the Huskies. **Senior defensive back Chad Kruckman (Glencoe)** spent the season as a student assistant coach following a career ending injury. Kruckman played in 28 games as Husky and recorded 171 tackles including 91 solo stops. **Junior right tackle Scott Peters (Litchfield)** will graduate this spring. He made the move from the basketball court to the gridiron in the spring of 2005. Peters was a three-year member of the SCSU basketball team. During the 2005 football season, he played all but one game (due to injury) on the offensive line. **Junior center Henry Smith (Minneapolis)** will also graduate in 2006. Smith was the starting center in 2004 and 2005.

**In the NCAA Statistics:** Seniors Matt Birkel and Ryan Koch, and junior Tate Wheeler ranked in the top 20 of six NCAA statistical categories. Birkel ranked eighth in scoring, averaging 10.9 points per game, tenth in rushing with 141.6 yards per game, and 13th in all-purpose yards with 174.4 per game. Koch ranked 11th in receptions per game with 6.6 and 18th in receiving yards per game with 93.5. Wheeler ranked 18th in passes defended with 1.5 per game.

**Starting Streak:** The Huskies got off to a 5-0 start for the second straight year and the eighth time in the history of Husky football. In 2004, the Huskies started the season on a 7-0 roll, the second best in school history. Eight times since 1993, the Huskies have posted 5-0 record to start the season (2005, 2004, 1976, 1967, 1953, 1942, 1941, 1933). The best start was 8-0 during the 1967 season.
