2006 SCSU FOOTBALL NEWS

Release Date: April 3, 2006

Spring Drills: The 2006 edition of Husky Football will began spring practice on Sunday, April 2 and conclude on Saturday, April 29 with a Spring Game at Husky Stadium.

2005 Season Record: The 2005 St. Cloud State University Husky Football team posted an 8-3 overall record. The Huskies were 3-3 in the North Central Conference, for a fifth place finish. For the first time in league history, there was a four-way tie for the Championship. North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota Duluth and Nebraska-Omaha tied for the 2005 NCC Championship.

The 2006 Huskies: St. Cloud State returns 46 letterwinners including 13 starters in 2006. Four starters return on offense, seven on defense and two on special teams.

2006 Schedule: SCSU will play 11 games including six home contests and open at home on Thursday, August 31 at 6:00 p.m. against the University of Minnesota-Crookston. Two new schools will join the North Central Conference in football this season as affiliate members. Central Washington University and Western Washington University will give the NCC an eight game conference schedule. In the non-conference schedule, the Huskies open with Minnesota-Crookston, travel to Missouri Western College on September 9 and will play the University of Mary at home on September 16 in the first ever game between the two teams.

All-Time Record: The 2005 season marked the 83rd in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 381-320-22 overall record and has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the NCC (1989, 2002), 14 NIC crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

At Husky Stadium: The 2005 season marked the second year in SCSU's new home, Husky Stadium, located on the banks of the Mississippi River. St. Cloud State posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1

mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. In 2005, SCSU went 5-1 at Husky Stadium. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004 and 3,961 in 2005. SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota.





SCSU Head Coach Randy Hedberg:

SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) completed his seventh season with the Huskies in 2005. He has a current record of 40-36 at SCSU and is 85-59-2 overall in 16 years as a collegiate coach. He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2, 2004 and his 30th with the Huskies. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2004 SCSU posted an 8-3 record, and hosted the University of North Dakota in the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95), and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).



Assistant Coaching Staff: The 2006 assistants include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary/Recruiting Coordinator), Steve Gruit (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Eric Mattson (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Brian Frana (Offensive Line), Michael Rowe (Defensive Backs), Josh Stephan (Defensive Line), Joe Ford (Linebackers), Denny Honnold (Running backs), Derek Johnson (Running Backs) and Ryan Mills (Tight Ends) will be with the Huskies for spring drills.

Senior Pat Neumuth (Waukesha, WI) and sophomore Brian Cristan (Mahtomedi) return at punter and sophomore Jon Gutierrez (Beloit, WI) will be the place kicker in 2006. Neumuth and Cristan shared punting duties in 2005. Neumuth booted 28 punts for 1,029 yards and Cristan had 14 punts for 508 yards. Gutierrez was used primarily for kick-offs and was one-of-two in field goals and three-of-three in PATs. Gutierrez replaces Shawn Braunagel (Fargo, ND) who has completed his eligibility. Braunagel is SCSU's career leader in place kicking with 212 career points. He finished his career with 27 field goals and 131 of 140 PATs.

2006 Husky Football Outlook

St. Cloud State returns most of its experience on the defensive side of the ball in 2006 as 17 players including seven starters return from the 2005 defensive two-deep. The Huskies will be solid up front with four returning players in senior defensive lineman Jordan Kroll (Mukwonago, WI) and senior defensive tackle Joe Niehaus (Osakis) on the inside and sophomore Ryan Kees (Eagan) and senior Barrett Flatt (Hastings) on the outside. Kroll, Niehaus and Flatt are returning starters and Kees was the back-up end to All-Conference player Charlie Cosgrove last season. Cosgrove led the Huskies in tackles for loss with 15.5 and quarterback sacks with 7.5 and became SCSU's all-time leader in both categories. Kroll tallied 36 tackles, 12 tackles for loss and 6.5 quarterback sacks in 2005. Niehaus notched 30 tackles, 4.5 TFL, and 2.5 quarterback sacks. Flatt made 26 tackles, 9.5 TFL and six sacks.

At linebacker, the coaching staff has moved two players to the inside in sophomore Jeremy Garding (St. Cloud) and senior Kelly Gilchrist (Minneapolis). Gilchrist started at WILL backer last season and tallied 32 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. They will be competing with junior Aaron LaPointe (Elk River), sophomore Nolan Oliver (Moorhead), and junior Ross Olson (Fargo, ND) on the inside. LaPointe was a starter last season who tallied 43 tackles and had one interception, and Oliver was the back-up to All-NCC player Mark Henderson. Henderson led the Huskies in tackles the last three seasons, including a team high 86 in 2004. Olson missed the season after suffering a season ending injury during the preseason. Garding and Gilchrist are very athletic, can run well, and will be valuable additions on the inside. Outside, the Huskies have three players vying for positions in sophomores Matt McLagan (Minneapolis) and Michael Graham (Oakdale), and redshirt first year David Kamin (Menomonee, Falls, WI). McLagan and Graham saw playing time during the 2005 season.

The safety position returns to solid ground with seniors Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud), Justin Biebighauser (Nisswa) and Tate Wheeler (Neenah, WI) working the two positions. A key position for the Huskies, as the safety is responsible for making most of the defensive calls. Denne missed several games last year because of injury and finished the season with 34 tackles and one interception. Denne has 11 career interceptions which ranks him eighth on SCSU's all-time list. Wheeler is the Huskies leading returner in tackles as he notched 83 last season. He also led the team in interceptions with four. Biebighauser has 38 tackles and three interceptions in 2005. At the corners, the Huskies return junior Philip Hedlof (Blomkest), sophomores Tyler Krueger (Milwaukee, WI), Matt Jensen (Mequon, WI), and Darius Dotch (St. Paul), and redshirt first year Marcus Jenkins (Long Branch, NJ), an athletic group of players. Hedlof, a starter, was third in team tackles last season with 61 and had one interception. Krueger notched 30 tackles and three interceptions. Jensen and Dotch had some valuable playing time during the season. The Husky defense accounted for 16 interceptions in 2005.

Offensively, the Huskies return a strong nucleus of players on the offensive line. The skill positions will have several new faces as quarterback Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud), running back Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI), and wide receivers Ryan Koch (Madison, WI), Ed DeShazer (Milwaukee, WI), and Daryn Ploeckelman (Mukwonago, WI) have completed their eligibility. Kaczor led the Huskies to the 2004 NCAA playoffs. In two seasons as a starter, he threw for 4,625 yards and 43 touchdowns, only the seventh Husky to pass for over 4,000 yards in a career. Birkel is SCSU's all-time rushing leader with 4,920 yards. DeShazer (139 catches, 2,125 yds, 19 TDs), Koch (192 catches, 2,706 yds, 33 TDs) and Ploeckelman (66 catches, 834 yds, 8 TDs) combined for 5,665 receiving yards and 60 touchdowns during their careers.

Junior Mike Hammerseng (Minnetonka) and sophomore Jon Quesnell (Eagan) are competing at the quarterback position. Hammerseng stepped in at quarterback during the tenth game of the season and started the final game when Kaczor suffered a season ending shoulder injury. He led the Huskies to a 31-28 win on Oct. 29, completed 11 of 16 passes for 154 yards and two touchdowns. In his first collegiate start the following week against Minnesota Duluth, Hammerseng completed 26 of 49 passes for 320 yards. Quesnell was given a medical redshirt after breaking both wrists on a special teams play early in the season.

The new quarterback will be well defended as the offensive line returns five players including three starters. Junior Matt Plautz (Appleton, WI) and sophomores Adam Koss (Stoughton, WI) and Ryan Knoll (St. Paul) are the returning starters. Gone are left tackle Jon Scovill (Wayzata) and center Henry Smith (Minneapolis). The Huskies return senior tight ends Aaron Frana (Mantorville) and Anders Johnson (St. Cloud). Frana is a transfer and Johnson saw playing time behind departed senior John Hackett Prairie Du Chien, WI, and made four catches for 36 yards in 2005.

At wide receiver, the Huskies have added two junior college transfers in Tony Parker (Little Falls) and Derrick Sedin (Santa Maria, CA) and look forward to the return of sophomore Zach Stover (Eagan) who missed last season with a leg injury. Among the returning receivers are junior Ryan Jensen (Underwood), and sophomores Cody Rysewyk (Green Bay, WI) and Nate Johnson (Austin). Jensen made 13 catches for 126 yards and one touchdown in 2005. Rysewyk had four catches for 74 yards and one TD, and Johnson had two catches for 85 yards and one touchdown.

At running back the Huskies have to find a replacement for SCSU's all time rushing leader Matt Birkel. Junior Dan Kamin (Menomonee Falls, WI) has been a capable back-up but didn't play in 2005 because of an injury. During the 2004 season, Kamin rushed for 237 yards and three touchdowns. Junior Drew Meyer (Champlin) and sophomore Tyson DesCamps (Aberdeen, SD) were back-ups to Birkel in 2005. Meyer rushed 65 times for 337 yards and DesCamps carried the ball 38 times for 85 yards.
