**2011 Season Preview:** The Huskies return 44 letterwinners from a year ago including 15 starters. Among the starters eight are on offense, six on defense and one special teams. The returning group includes three First Team All-NSIC picks from 2010 in senior center Scott Horvath (Eagan, Minn.), senior linebacker Thomas Gruis (Clear Lake, Iowa) and senior defensive back Tony Kubus (New Prague, Minn.) The Huskies graduated one offensive lineman in three-year starter and All-Conference performer Scott Ferguson and All-American wide receiver Fred Williams. St. Cloud State has several new starters on the defensive line but all bring a great deal of experience to the group.

**Huskies in the Preseason NCAA Polls:** St. Cloud State has received favorable pre-season rankings in 2011. The Huskies are ranked in the top 25 in four NCAA Division II polls. They are:

**SCSU Picked 2nd in the NSIC:** The Huskies have been picked to finish second in the NSIC Preseason Coaches Poll. The defending NSIC and NCAA Division II National Champions of the University of Minnesota Duluth were selected as the overall and north division preseason favorite. The Huskies were selected second overall and second in the north division.

**2011 Team Captains:** Head coach Scott Underwood announced the captains for the 2011 season. The offensive captains are lineman **Matt Theis** and quarterback **Philip Klaphake**. The defensive captains are defensive back **Tony Kubus** and linebacker **Thomas Gruis**.

**Top Returnees:** **Klaphake** will be a second year starter as the Huskies signal caller. Last season he led the team in passing and rushing. He completed 210 passes for 2,918 yards and 24 touchdowns. He carried the ball 155 times for 798 yards and 11 touchdowns. Senior running back **Dante Steward** (Milwaukee, Wis.) returns in the back field. Last season he rushed 132 times for 633 yards and six touchdowns. Several players return at the receiver and tight end spots in 2011. The top returning wide receiver is junior **Tyler Allery** (Lakeville, Minn.). He caught 27 passes for 419 yards and two touchdowns. Senior tight end **Nick Angelotti** (Wauconda, Ill.) had 13 catches for 172 yards and two touchdowns. **Kubus** is the top returning tackler for the Huskies. He led the 2010 defensive unit with 85 tackles including a team high 54 stops. He was a co-leader in tackles for loss with 8.5 and quarterback sacks with 4.0. He recovered a team high five fumbles and picked off three passes.

**NSIC Players to Watch:** St. Cloud State sophomore quarterback Phillip Klaphake (Princeton) and senior defensive back Tony Kubes (New Prague) have been identified as players to watch in the NSIC in 2011.

**Klaphake** was named the 2010 NSIC Offensive Newcomer of the Year and was an All-NSIC North Second Team player. He led the Huskies to a 10-3 overall record and to the second round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He completed 210 passes for 2,918 yards and 24 touchdowns and led the team in rushing with 155 carries for 798 yards and 11 touchdowns. He threw for a season high 335 yards and tied his personal record of four touchdown passes in the win over MSU Moorhead on Nov. 6, a performance that helped establish a season record for total offense by an individual as he rushed and passed for a school record 3,716 yards breaking the old mark of 3,189 yards set during the 2003 season. He is the first Husky since the 2004 season to go over 2,000 yards passing in a single season and the seventh Husky QB in school history to reach the mark in a single season. Klaphake started all 13 games in 2010. Three times he threw four TD passes in a game (one short of the single game school record). In his collegiate debut on Sept. 4 at Augustana College he threw for 319 yards and the following week 301 to become the first Husky to throw back to back games of 300 yards since Keith Heckendorf during the 2003 season. He is the first Husky QB since Mike Hammerseng ( 302



yards Nov. 11, 2006 at Minnesota Duluth) to throw for over 300 yards in a game. Klaphake will be a team captain in 2011.

**Kubes** is a two-time All-NSIC North Division pick and two-time Academic All-NSIC selection. He was named the St. Cloud State Defensive Player of the Year in 2009 and 2010. In 2010 he was the team leader in tackles with 85, tackles for loss with 8.5 and sacks with 4.0. He collected three interceptions, forced four fumbles and accounted for five fumble recoveries. Kubes notched a season high 11 tackles in a 31-26 win over Winona State. He ranked in the top 25 in the NSIC stats in tackles and was second in the league in fumble recoveries. Kubes is a two-year starter in the Huskies defensive backfield and will be a team captain in 2011.



**#1 in Turnover Margin:** The Huskies were ranked #1 in the nation in turnover margin with a rating of 1.77. In addition, Klaphake was ranked fourth in the nation in passing efficiency with a rating of 163.22.



**Husky Stadium**

2010 marked the seventh season of Husky Stadium. St. Cloud State is 28-11 at Husky Stadium since the 2004 season. The Huskies posted a 4-2 record at Husky Stadium in 2004, including a 0-1 mark in an NCAA playoff game in the new facility. The Huskies averaged 3,772 fans in the 4,198 seat facility in 2004, 3,961 in 2005, 3,936 in 2006, 2,742 in 2007, 4,004 in 2008, 4,112 in 2009, and 3,608 in 2010 (includes an NCAA playoff game). SCSU's first sell-out was on October 2, 2004 against the University of North Dakota.

**The Series:** This marks the first meeting between the Huskies and Vulcans.

**About U Cal:** California University of Pennsylvania is an NCAA Division II program with membership in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC). Cal U is located in California, Pennsylvania in the southwest corner of the state, 30 miles south of Pittsburgh. Cal U offers 18 sports, eight men's and ten women's. The university has an enrollment of 9,017. The school colors are red and black. The football team plays in Adamson Stadium with a capacity of 6,500.

**About Vulcan Football:** The Vulcans posted a 10-2 record in 2010, finished 6-1 in the PSAC West and tied for the division title, and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Division II Football Playoffs. Cal U returns 14 starters including eight starting defensive players. Among the returning leaders are running backs Lamont Smith and Trey Johnson. Smith, a junior led the Vulcans in rushing last season with 241 carries for 1,166 yards and 12 touchdowns. A sophomore, Johnson had 58 carries for 340 yards in 2010. Senior Chedrick Cherry returns at wide receiver. He caught a team high 56 passes for 795 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2010. Smith had 20 catches for 215 yards. The Vulcans will have a new face at quarterback in junior Peter Lalich. He replaces Josh Portis who completed 205 passes for 2,651 yards and 33 touchdowns. Portis made his professional debut with the Seattle Seahawks on Aug. 12. Defensively, the Vulcans return three of their top four tacklers from a year ago. Senior linebacker and three-year starter Brett Diamond led Cal U with 64 tackles last season. He also notched nine tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. Junior safety Rontez Miles had a team leading 12 tackles for loss along with 60 tackles. Senior safety Shawn Anderson led the team with five interceptions last season.

The Vulcans have won at least a share of six straight (three outright) PSAC West titles. In addition, Cal U has appeared in the NCAA playoffs in each of the last four seasons, compiling a 7-4 post season record with three straight trips to the NCAA semifinals from 2007 to 2009.

**Head Coach:** John Luckhardt (Purdue/1970) begins his tenth season with the Vulcans in 2011. He has compiled a 78-30 record at U Cal and a career record of 215-67-2 that spans 26 seasons. Luckhardt is the program's winningest coach with 78 victories. He has led the Vulcans to three NCAA Regional Championships, two appearances in the PSAC Championship Game, three top-10 finishes and six-consecutive PSAC West titles.

**Scott Underwood** (Augustana College, 1988) was introduced as Head Coach of Husky Football on March 25, 2008. He is the 12th head football coach in the history of Husky football and had been the Huskies defensive coordinator since 2001.

In his three seasons at the helm, he has compiled a 24-11 overall record. He has guided the Huskies to a 22-7 record in Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) games.

In 2008, his first season at the helm, Underwood guided the Huskies to a 7-4 overall record, fourth place in the NSIC with a 7-3 mark and second place in the NSIC North Division with a

5-1 record. The Huskies had a senior class of 25 players and the seven wins marked the most victories for the Huskies since winning eight games in 2005.

The 2009 season was almost identical to 2008. The Huskies were 7-4 overall, tied for third overall in the NSIC with a 7-3 record, and placed second in the NSIC North with a 5-1 mark. The Huskies played a non-conference game at the University of Maine and nearly defeated the Division I Black Bears, losing 34-27 in overtime.

2010 was an historic season for Husky football. St. Cloud State played a school record 13 games and tied the school record for wins with 10-3 mark. For the third time in school history, the team advanced to the NCAA Division II Playoffs. The Huskies won the first game on their home turf, 42-28 over Hillsdale College. In the second round, St. Cloud State traveled to NSIC rival Minnesota Duluth. The Bulldogs won that game, 20-17 in overtime and went on to win the national championship.

The Husky defense, led by Underwood ranked among the best in the North Central Conference in the last seven seasons of the league. In 2002, SCSU led the NCC in rushing defense, giving up 77.1 yards per game. Ten defensive players have earned All-North Central Conference first team honors with Underwood, including Charlie Cosgrove, the 2005 Defensive Lineman of the Year. The Huskies were co-winners of the NCC title in 2002 and hosted a first round NCAA Division II playoff game in 2004, the year that Husky Stadium opener.

Success has followed Underwood at each of his coaching stops. Prior to joining the St. Cloud State staff in 2001, Underwood was the inside linebackers coach at the University of North Dakota for four seasons, and coached two NCAA playoff teams. From 1993 to 1996, he served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Sioux Falls. The University of Sioux Falls advanced to the playoffs during three of those seasons and won the NAIA Division II National Championship in 1996.

Underwood began his coaching career at his alma mater, Augustana College, where he spent five seasons as the defensive secondary coach, following a four-year career at defensive back for the Vikings from 1984 to 1988. In 1988, Underwood coached in an NCAA playoff game. In 1989, with Underwood as an assistant coach, the Vikings advanced to the NCAA playoffs, losing to St. Cloud State at Selke Field.

A native of Marion, Iowa, Underwood has a bachelor's degree in social sciences from Augustana College and a master's degree in health, physical education, and recreation from the University of South Dakota.
