2004 SCSU FOOTBALL TEAM NEWS

Release Date: August 30, 2004



THE GAME: St. Cloud State (1-0, 0-0 North Central Conference) versus the University of Minnesota-Crookston (0-0, 0-0 Northern Sun Conference) in a non-conference match-up of Minnesota teams. Game time is 7:00 p.m. at Husky Stadium (4,198).

HUSKY PARK: New in 2004 is the Husky Park located on Herb Brooks Way just south of the National Hockey Center. Husky Park will host pre-game festivities from 5 to 7 p.m. The pre-game festivities will include food, Husky merchandise, displays and games sponsored by local businesses, a live pre-game by Regent Broadcasting, and to top it all off a live concert featuring the popular local band Fred Savage and the Unbeatables, presented by UpNext Street Edition.

THE SERIES: This will be the second meeting between the Huskies and Golden Eagles of the University of Minnesota-Crookston. SCSU leads the series 1-0. 2003: SCSU 66, at UMC 7

PRE-SEASON POLL: The Huskies are ranked 36th in the Don Hansen Preseason NCAA Division II Top 40 poll.

NEXT WEEK: The Huskies will host Western Washington in non-conference action at Husky Stadium on Saturday, September 11. The kick-off is scheduled for 6:00 p.m.

HUSKY STADIUM: Husky Stadium opened in August of 2004 and is home to the St. Cloud State University football and soccer teams. Located on the banks of the Mississippi River on the south side of the SCSU campus, the stadium features an OmniGrass playing surface, seating for 4,198 fans, two concession areas, locker-rooms, modern restrooms and a full service press box. A state of the art sound system and scoreboard round out the features. A year round facility, an inflatable dome will enclose the playing surface during the winter months. This will allow SCSU students to use the facility for recreational and intramural sports events. In addition, the Husky baseball and softball teams will conduct practices, and in the case of the softball team, hold tournaments under the dome.

ON THE RADIO: Husky football can be heard this season on WJON AM 1240. SCSU graduate Jay Caldwell will call the play-by-play. Former SCSU standout Dave Dahlstrom will provide color commentary. The weekly Randy Hedberg show on WJON AM 1240 can be heard at 4:40 p.m. on Thursday during the season. St. Cloud Sports Saturday, which features SCSU sports, can be heard on The FAN 1390 AM on Saturday mornings from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon.

HOME OPENERS: The Huskies are 4-1 in home openers under head coach Randy Hedberg. Since joining the NCC in 1983, SCSU is 18-3 overall in home opening games.

2003 HUSKY RECORD: St. Cloud State posted a 7-4 overall record and finished fourth in the NCC with a 4-3 mark in 2003. The Huskies posted a 3-4 record on the road during the season.

SCSU HEAD COACH RANDY HEDBERG: SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) is in his sixth season as head coach with the Huskies. He has a current record



of 24-30 at SCSU and is 69-53-2 overall in 14 years of coaching. Since arriving at SCSU, Hedberg coached teams posted a 3-8 record in 1999, 1-9 in 2000, 4-7 in 2001 and 9-2 in 2002. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2003, SCSU

went 7-4. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), and assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95) and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).

ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: The assistants this year include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary), Steve Gमित (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Brian Bergstrom (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Curt Baldus (Tight Ends/Strength & Conditioning), Derek Johnson (Defensive Backs), Derek Moore (Offensive Line), Brian Webb (Runningbacks/Strength & Conditioning), Andrew Tippins (Defensive Ends), Eric Mattson (Linebackers), Ryan Mills (Tight Ends/Volunteer).

ALL-TIME RECORD: The 2004 season marks the 82nd in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 371-318-23 overall record and it has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the NCC (1989, 2002), 14 NIC crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

2004 TEAM CAPTAINS: Leading the Huskies into the 2004 season will be senior offensive lineman Matt Henry (Eau Claire, WI) and juniors quarterback Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud), defensive end Charlie Cosgrove (Minneapolis), and linebacker Mark Henderson.

HUSKIES IN THE NFL: Former SCSU standout Ben Nelson was in training camp with the Minnesota Vikings during the 2004 pre-season. Todd Bouman (1993-96) is in his second season with the New Orleans Saints. He is in his eighth season in the NFL, and spent the six previous seasons with the Vikings.

Aug. 26 vs. Wayne State: Offense-Cory McLouden; Defense-Joe Niehaus; Special Teams-Ryan Koch; Defensive Scout-Matt McLagan; Offensive Scout-Rudy Moravek; Husky Lifters-Jacob Johnson and Ed DeShazer.



PRE-SEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Senior punter Scott Dirkes (Albany, MN) has been named a 2004 pre-season All-America by Don Hansen's Football Gazette. Dirkes is a three-year Husky starter and earned All-North Central Conference Second Team honors IN 2003. Last fall, he punted the ball 49 times for 2,021 yards and set a season record for best punting average with 41.2 yards per punt mark. He ranked second in the NCC and 19th in NCAA punting in 2003. His current career punting average of 38.8 places him second on the SCSU career chart for punting average.



HUSKIES PICKED THIRD IN THE NCC: St. Cloud State has been picked to finish third in the North Central Conference football race in both the preseason media and coaches polls. North Dakota has been tabbed the preseason favorite to win the NCC and Nebraska-Omaha was picked to finish second.

KACZOR IS SOLID: Junior quarterback Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud) made his first collegiate start last Thursday night and led the Huskies to a 45-14 non-conference win over Wayne State College. Kaczor, who replaces the graduated two-time Harlon Hill Finalist and All-American Keith Heckendorf, completed 18 of 34 passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns. He hit junior wide receiver Ed DeShazer (Milwaukee, WI) for a 72-yard touchdown strike, the longest completion of his career.

RUNNING GAME ON: The SCSU ground attack was in top form at Wayne State as junior Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) and sophomore Dan Kamin (Menomonee, WI) combined for 244 yards rushing. Birkel carried the ball 27 times for 164 yards and two touchdowns. It was the ninth time in his career that Birkel has gone over 100 yards in a game. Kamin had the longest TD run of the game with a 53 yard trot in the second quarter. Last season, he set a school record for the longest TD run with a dash of 96 yards against Minnesota State.

A BIG CATCH: Junior receiver Ed DeShazer has had big TD catches in back-to-back season openers. Last season, DeShazer pulled in a 65 yard TD catch against the University of Minnesota-Crookston. He followed that up last Thursday with a 53-yard TD reception against Wayne State.

BIG D: The SCSU defense recovered a fumble and had an interception against Wayne State. Sophomore free safety Mitchell Denne (St. Cloud) had an interception, the fourth of his career. He had a team high three interceptions last season. Senior inside linebacker Derek Jensen (Underwood) had a fumble recovery, the first of his collegiate career.

2004 Outlook

The Golden Eagle football team returns many key players from a defense that broke the record for forced turnovers last season and an offense that brings many explosive players who have an abundance of game experience.

Among the defensive returnees are senior Adam Koplín, junior Nate Spatz, and sophomore Mark Larson on the defensive line. At linebacker, UMC returns seniors Andy Barnum and Justin Buzby and juniors Justin Reed and Nate Emery. In the secondary, senior Shane Beck and juniors Jay Schreiber, Brandon Moore, Nick Starcevic, and Danny Deibler return.

Offensively, the Golden Eagles return five offensive linemen in juniors Eric Scott and Al Huttunen and sophomore Rich Stangle, Pat Stansbery and Pat Dreher. Two tight ends, senior Adam Brunzke and sophomore Pat McCabe, also return. Returning at running back is senior Nick Greschner, junior RJ Rollins and sophomore Matt Eggl. Aaron McGoy, Guy Rodrigue, and Ben Aho, all return at wide receiver.
