Future Huskies Named To All-Star Game

Eagan, Minn. – A trio of future St. Cloud State football players were recently selected to play in the 2009 Minnesota High School Football All-Star Game to be played at 7:00 pm on June 27, 2009 in Husky Stadium on the campus of St. Cloud State University.

The All-Star game is sponsored by the Minnesota Football Coaches Association, and features the top senior football players from the entire state competing for either the Metro or Outstate squads.

Todd Bestgen out of Rochester and Rochester Lourdes H.S. will play for the Outstate team, as will Chad Peterson from Winona and Winona H.S. Playing for the Metro will be Tate Christopherson of Maple Grove and Osseo H.S.

Bestgen is a 5-foot-11, 215 pound linebacker and Peterson is a 5-foot-10, 195 pound wide receiver and defensive back. The two will be helping their outstate teammates take on the metro squad, which includes Christopherson who is a 6-foot-1, 200 pound quarterback and defensive back.

All three will begin their tenure at St. Cloud State next season, in the Fall of 2009. The three are among the 86 players selected from around the state to compete in the 36th annual installment of the All-Star game. Combined the players represent 76 schools and 31 conferences.

The incumbent crop of the 2009 Husky gridders are currently in the midst of spring practice, which will culminate with the annual Spring Game in Husky Stadium on Saturday, April 25 at 1:00 pm.

St. Cloud State University is the largest member of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MnSCU) system. Founded in 1869, and located 70 miles northwest of the Twin Cities in St. Cloud, Minn. along the banks of the scenic Mississippi River, SCSU boasts an enrollment of nearly 17,000 students and is a member of NCAA Division II athletics where they compete in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC).
