2004 SCSU FOOTBALL TEAM NEWS

Release Date: October 18, 2004



THE GAME: #6 St. Cloud State (7-1, 3-1 North Central Conference) plays host to the University of Nebraska-Omaha (6-2, 3-0 North Central Conference) in a North Central Conference match-up on Saturday, October 23. The kick-off is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. at Husky Stadium (4,198).

HOMECOMING/STADIUM DEDICATION: Saturday is Homecoming 2004 on the SCSU Campus and the formal dedication of Husky Stadium will take place in a ceremony at half-time of the Husky football game. Saturday is also Husky Football Senior Day.

THE SERIES: This will be the 25th meeting in the all-time series between the Huskies and the Mavericks since the 1974 season. UNO leads the series 13-11. Last season, the Mavericks defeated the Huskies 39-36 in Omaha. UNO has a 4-1 advantage over the last five games, with SCSU's last win in 2002, a 47-19 victory, in a game played in St. Cloud.

HOMECOMING RECORD: The Huskies are 51-24 all-time in Homecoming games. This will be the second time that UNO will be part of an SCSU Homecoming date. The Huskies hosted UNO in 1985 and SCSU won that game 20-10. St. Cloud State has won three of its last four Homecoming Games.

IN THE POLLS: The Huskies were ranked in all four NCAA Division II Football polls released last week. SCSU was sixth in both the AFCA poll and the D2football.com poll. In polls released early this week SCSU slipped to 21st in the Don Hansen Football Gazette Top 40 poll and UNO was ranked 35th. The Huskies are 17th in this weeks Dopke.com college sports report and UNO is 32nd.

SCSU THIRD IN REGION POLL: The Huskies moved up to second in the NCAA Division II Northwest Region poll released on Oct. 11. Grand Valley State was ranked first and Nebraska-Omaha eighth in the region.

ON THE RADIO: Husky football can be heard this season on WJON AM 1240. SCSU graduate Jay Caldwell will call the play-by-play. Former SCSU standout Dave Dahlstrom will provide color commentary. The weekly Randy Hedberg show on WJON AM 1240 can be heard at 4:40 p.m. on Thursday during the season. St. Cloud Sports Saturday, which features SCSU sports, can be heard on The FAN 1390 AM on Saturday mornings from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon. Husky home football games can also be heard on KVSC Radio, 88.1 FM

HUSKY PARK: New in 2004 is the Husky Park located on Herb Brooks Way just south of the National Hockey Center. Husky Park will host pre-game festivities two hours prior to each home game. The pre-game festivities will include food, Husky merchandise, displays and games sponsored by local businesses, a live pre-game by Regent Broadcasting, and to top it all off a live concert featuring popular local bands.

2003 HUSKY RECORD: St. Cloud State posted a 7-4 overall record and finished fourth in the NCC with a 4-3 mark in 2003. The Huskies posted a 3-4 record on the road during the season.

SCSU HEAD COACH RANDY HEDBERG: SCSU head coach Randy Hedberg (Minot State 1977) is in his sixth season as head coach with the Huskies. He netted his 75th career coaching win against UND on October 2 and his 30th with the Huskies. He has a current record of 31-31 at SCSU and is 76-54-2 overall in 14 plus years of coaching (totals include 2004 record). Since arriving at SCSU, Hedberg coached teams posted a 3-8 record in 1999, 1-9 in 2000, 4-7 in 2001 and 9-2 in 2002. The Huskies won the NCC title in 2002, which marks the second time in team history that SCSU has won the NCC title. In 2003, SCSU went 7-4. The Parshall, N.D. native has been the head coach at Minot State (1982-89), and assistant coach at Central Missouri State (1990-95) and an assistant coach at North Dakota (1996-98). Hedberg was an honorable mention All-America quarterback at Minot State. He was drafted by Tampa Bay of the NFL in 1977, and played with the Bucs through 1978. He also played with the Oakland Raiders (1979) and Green Bay Packers (1980).



ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: The assistants this year include Paul Rudolph (Off. Coordinator/Off. Line), Scott Underwood (Def. Coordinator/Secondary), Steve Gruit (Defensive Line), Steve Crutchley (Wide Receivers), Brian Bergstrom (Linebackers/Strength & Conditioning), Curt Baldus (Tight Ends/Strength & Conditioning), Derek Johnson (Defensive Backs), Derek Moore (Offensive Line), Brian Webb (Runningbacks/Strength & Conditioning), Andrew Tippins (Defensive Ends), Eric Mattson (Linebackers), Ryan Mills (Tight Ends/Volunteer).

ALL-TIME RECORD: The 2004 season marks the 82nd in the history of SCSU football. Since 1920, SCSU has compiled a 371-318-23 overall record and it has won a total of 18 conference titles, two in the NCC (1989, 2002), 14 NIC crowns and two Minnesota State College Conference titles.

PRE-SEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Senior punter Scott Dirkes (Albany, MN) has been named a 2004 preseason All-American by Don Hansen's Football Gazette. Dirkes is a three-year Husky starter and earned All-North Central Conference Second Team honors in 2003.

2004 TEAM CAPTAINS: Leading the Huskies into the 2004 season will be senior offensive lineman Matt Henry (Eau Claire, WI) and juniors quarterback Daniel Kaczor (St. Cloud), defensive end Charlie Cosgrove (Minneapolis), and line-backer Mark Henderson.

HUSKIES IN THE NFL: Former SCSU standout Ben Nelson was in training camp with the Minnesota Vikings during the 2004 pre-season, and has been named to the practice squad. Todd Bouman (1993-96) is in his second season with the New Orleans Saints. He is in his eighth season in the NFL, and spent the six previous seasons with the Vikings.

Husky Stadium



Husky Stadium opened in August of 2004 and is home to the St. Cloud State University football and soccer teams. Located on the banks of the Mississippi River on the south side of the SCSU campus, the stadium features an OmniGrass playing surface, seating for 4,198 fans, two concession areas, lockerrooms, modern restrooms and a full service press box. A state of the art sound system and scoreboard round out the features. A year round facility, an inflatable dome will enclose the playing surface during the winter months. This will allow SCSU students to use the facility for recreational and intramural sports events. In addition, the Husky baseball and softball teams will conduct practices, and in the case of the softball team, hold tournaments under the dome.

HUSKY SENIORS TO BE HONORED: Ten Huskies make up the senior class of 2004 and will be honored prior to the start of the game Saturday. The seniors include punter Scott Dirkes (Albany), wide receiver and kick-off return man Tim Greene (Kingston, WI), tight end Clint Grundahl (Foley), right tackle Matt Henry (Eau Claire, WI), linebacker Derek Jensen (Underwood), wide receiver and holder Jason Koch (Madison, WI), left tackle Lucas Leao (Burnsville), right guard Jim McCarville (Iola, WI), left guard Cory McClouden (Eden Prairie), and linebacker Chris Schmitz (Sumner, IA). In the last three-plus seasons, this group of players has led the Huskies to a combined overall record of 27-14 and a share of the 2002 North Central Conference Championship crown.

HUSKIES PICKED THIRD IN THE NCC: St. Cloud State has been picked to finish third in the North Central Conference football race in both the preseason media and coaches polls. North Dakota has been tabbed the preseason favorite to win the NCC and Nebraska-Omaha was picked to finish second.

THE HUSKIES LAST WEEK: St. Cloud State's seven game winning streak came to an end Saturday afternoon as the 18th-ranked University of South Dakota Coyotes upset the Huskies 37-21 in Vermillion, SD. The University of South Dakota scored four first half touchdowns and led the Huskies 28-7 at halftime. The Coyotes put their first points on the board at 8:46 of the first quarter on a 12 yard pass play from quarterback Wes Beschorner to flanker Chris Mikkelsen. Beschorner scored on a nine yard run with 2:57 remaining in the first frame and USD led 14-0.

The Huskies missed a scoring chance early in the second quarter when Shaun Braunagel's field goal attempt went wide left. In USD's next series, the Coyotes marched 72 yards completing a 25-yard Beschorner to Derek Gearman pass and followed that up with a 26 yard pass play from Beschorner to running back Stefan Logan for the touchdown. St. Cloud State scored with four minutes left in the half on a 22 yard pass play from junior quarterback Dan Kaczor (St Cloud) to junior receiver Ed DeShazer (Milwaukee, WI). USD held the ball for the final four minutes of the half, culminating with a one-yard pass play from Beschorner to Mikkelsen in the right corner of the end zone. It was only the second time this season that the Huskies had trailed a game at the half as USD led 28-7.

South Dakota took the opening drive of the second half and finished it off with a 40-yard Cody Butler field goal at 10:13. St. Cloud State took the ensuing drive 79 yards and junior running back Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) ran the ball into the end zone on a two-yard play. South Dakota blocked the PAT and led 31-13 at the 6:42 mark. USD fumbled the ball on the following possession and SCSU took over on the home team's eight yard line. Three plays later Kaczor scored on a three yard keeper and then completed a pass to junior Ryan Koch (Madison, WI) for the two-point conversion and closed to within ten points at the 1:36 mark of the third quarter, 31-21. Cody Butler opened the fourth quarter scoring with a 40-yard field goal at the 9:39 mark. St. Cloud State lost control of USD's kick-off and the Coyotes recovered at the 16 yard line. Another Cody Butler field goal, this time from 26 yards out gave USD a 37-21 lead with eight minutes left in the fourth quarter.

Player Notes:

1,000 Yard Club for Matt Birkel: Junior runningback Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) entered the 1,000 yard rushing club three weeks ago against the University of North Dakota. Birkel has rushed for at least 120 yards in all but one game this season. Birkel was held to 66 yards rushing against the University of South Dakota last weekend. This season, Birkel has rushed 195 times for 1,219 yards and 14 touchdowns. He has scored at least one touchdown in every game and two touchdowns in six games. He is averaging 152.4 yards per game rushing. He has also caught 15 passes for 138 yards and one touchdown. He is the first running back to go over the 1,000 yard mark in a season since Randy Martin reached the milestone during the 1996 season. He is the sixth player in the history of SCSU football to rush for over 1,000 yards and it has only been done ten times. He has rushed for over 100 yards in seven straight games and 15 times in his career. His career high rushing is 236 yards in a single game (vs. UNO, Nov. 2, 2002). He has gone over the 200 yard mark three times in his career, including a 212-yard performance against Minnesota State on Sept. 25. He had an NCC season high 35 rushing attempts against UND on October 2. Birkel was named the NCC Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 27. Last week he ranked fourth in NCAA Division II in rushing and was sixth in scoring and all-purpose yards. This week he ranks third in the NCC in rushing with 138.8 yards per NCC game, is seventh in total offense, third in all-purpose yards, and second in scoring and scoring touchdowns. He currently ranks third on the SCSU all-time rushing list with 2,892 yards. He has rushed for 29 touchdowns in his career.

Daniel Kaczor: The junior quarterback maintained his solid passing game against South Dakota completing 16 of 25 passes for 231 yards and one touchdown. He is a two-time NCC Offensive Player of the Week this year and is 7-1 in eight collegiate starts at quarterback. He passed for a career record 302 yards and 19 completions against Augustana College. In back to back weeks, he engineered come from behind wins over North Dakota and Augustana College. For the season, Kaczor has completed 117 of 197 pass attempts for 1,807 yards and 19 touchdowns. He tied the school record for touchdown passes in a game with five against Western Washington earlier this year. Kaczor completed a season and career high 73-yard touchdown pass to Tim Greene in the third quarter of the Northern State game. Against MSU, he rushed for a career high 84 yards and one touchdown. He has thrown for over 200 yards six times this season. This week, he leads the NCC in passing average per game with 232.8 yards per outing and total offense with 250.2 yards. He is second in the NCC in passing efficiency with a 152.9 mark.

Ryan Koch: Junior receiver Ryan Koch (Madison, WI) has caught 105 career passes as a Husky. Last Saturday, he pulled down five passes for 79 yards at USD. The five catches equaled his season high. He is tied with Ed DeShazer for receptions this year with 28, and has five touchdowns. He ranks fifth in the NCC in receiving yards per game at 60.5 and is eighth in receptions per game with 3.50. In NCC play, he has caught 14 passes for 242 yards and one touchdown. In his career, he has caught 105 passes for 1,472 yards and 18 touchdowns. He has caught at least one pass in each of the Huskies eight games in 2004.



Husky Notes Continued...

Ed DeShazer: Junior receiver Ed DeShazer (Milwaukee, WI) equaled his season high with six receptions for 123 yards and one touchdown against USD on Saturday. He leads the team with Ryan Koch in receptions with 28 and is the team leader in receiving yards with 545 this season. He has caught a team leading eight touchdowns passes. He has caught at least one pass in each of the Huskies eight games this season. For his career, DeShazer has 90 catches for 1,428 yards and 15 touchdowns. This week he leads the NCC in receiving yards per game with 92.8 and is third in receptions per game with 3.50.

Tim Greene: The senior wide receiver from Kingston, Wisconsin was ranked 35th in kickoff returns in last week's NCAA Division II statistics report. This season he has ten kickoff returns for 238 yards. He also has 12 catches for 268 yards and three touchdowns. He caught two passes for ten yards against USD last week. He ranks second among SCSU players in all-purpose yards with 72.5 per game this season.

Mitchell Denne: A sophomore, Denne (St. Cloud, MN) topped the defensive stats against South Dakota with 11. He also recorded his third interception of the season and sixth of his career. He has started at free safety in all eight games this season and leads the team on defense with 55 tackles and three interceptions. Denne ranks fourth in the NCC in tackles this week.

Mark Henderson: Junior linebacker Mark Henderson (Madison, WI) returned to the line-up against USD and had five tackles. He ranks second overall on the team with 51 tackles this season. He has 4.5 TFL, 1.5 sacks, and one interception this year.

Chris Schmitz: Senior linebacker Chris Schmitz (Sumner, IA) had five tackles against USD on Saturday. Schmitz has 39 tackles this season, including 6.5 for lost yards and two quarterback sacks. He ranks seventh in the NCC in tackles this week.

Charlie Cosgrove: Junior defensive end Charlie Cosgrove (Minneapolis) recorded his third quarterback sack of the season against USD on Saturday. Cosgrove has tallied 28 tackles this season, including six for losses and three quarterback sacks. He currently ranks fifth on SCSU's all-time tackles for losses chart with 28 and is tied for fourth on the all-time quarterback sack chart with 14.

IN THE NCC: Two of the top offensive games in the NCC will meet up Saturday at Husky Stadium. This week in the NCC statistics, Nebraska-Omaha ranks first in scoring offense with 34.0 points per game and SCSU is second with 29.0 points per game. SCSU leads the league in passing offense with 232.8 yards per game and UNO is fifth with 131.0 yards per game. UNO is first in rushing offense with 247.0 yards per game and SCSU is third with 170.0 yards. SCSU is first in total offense with 402.8 yards per game while UNO is third, averaging 378.0 yards per game. UNO leads the league in passing efficiency with a 163.9 rating and SCSU is second at 152.9. UNO is first in turnover margin and the Huskies second. Defensively, UNO is third in scoring defense giving up 19.0 points per game and SCSU is fourth allowing 22.0 points per game. UNO is fifth in passing defense and SCSU is seventh. UNO is third in rushing defense and SCSU is fourth.

NCAA INDIVIDUAL LEADERS: St. Cloud State continues to be ranked among the statistics leaders in NCAA Division II football. For the fifth week in a row, three Huskies are listed among the individual national leaders in the report released Tuesday, October 11. Junior running back Matt Birkel (Ellsworth, WI) is fourth in the nation in rushing with a 164.7 yards per game average. He has 176 carries for 1,153 yards and 13 touchdowns this season. He also ranks sixth in scoring with 12.0 points per game and sixth in all-purpose yards with an average of 181.7 yards per game. Junior quarterback Dan Kaczor (St. Cloud) is seventh in the NCAA in passing efficiency with a 165.6 rating. He has completed 101 of 172 passes for 1,576 yards and 18 touchdowns. He also ranks 30th in total offense with 243.7 yards per game. Senior return man and wide receiver Tim Greene (Kingston, WI) is ranked 35th in kick-off returns. He has ten returns for 238 yards.

NCAA TEAM LEADERS: As a team, the Huskies are ranked 11th in total offense with 463.7 yards per game, 12th in scoring offense with 39.3 points per game, 18th in rushing offense, averaging 236.9 yards per game, 22nd in scoring defense giving up 16.4 points per game, 27th in rushing defense and 29th in turnover margin.

Nebraska-Omaha Notes: The University of Nebraska-Omaha moved into first place in the NCC with a 44-20 win over Augustana College last Saturday. The Mavericks got off to a fast taking the opening drive in for a touchdowns and converted three of Augustana's five turnovers into three touchdowns. The first half scoring all belonged to UNO as Jamar Day scored on runs of 14 and two yards, and linebacker Taiwo Onatolu intercepted an Augie pass and returned it 52 yards for TD and UNO led 19-0 at the end of the first quarter. In the second quarter Day ran 65 yards for a touchdown, Andy Severson booted a 47-yard field goal and Zac Herold caught a 15-yard pass from Brian Masek and UNO led 34-0 at the half. In the third quarter Severson booted a 40-yard field goal and Taiwo Onatolu returned his second interception 34 yards for a TD. Augie would score three straight times to get its 20 -points on the board after UNO finished all of its scoring. UNO compiled 354 yards in total offense to Augustana's 320 yards. The Mavericks passed for 58 yards. Day finished the day with 27 carries for 226 yards and three touchdowns. Taiwo Onatolu had five tackles and Kenny Onatolu had seven tackles for the Mavs.

After posting a 2-2 record over the first four games of the season, UNO has won four straight games including NCC wins over South Dakota, Minnesota Duluth and Augustana. UNO is averaiga 254 yards per game on the ground and 149.9 yards per game in the air. The Mavericks are allowing 130.6 yards rushing and 206.8 yards passing this season. UNO is averaging 403.9 yards per game in total offense and giving up 337.4 yards per game.

Head Coach: Nebraska-Omaha head coach Pat Behrns (Dakota State, 1972) is in his 11th season with the Mavericks. He has a current won/loss record of 77-45 at UNO and is 112-71 in 14 seasons as a collegiate head coach. UNO has won three NCC titles under Behrns in 1996, 1998 and 2000, have made four NCAA Division II playoff appearances.
