2004-05 SCSU MEN'S HOCKEY NEWS

WILDCATS BACK AT THE NHC: The St. Cloud State men's hockey team (1-0-1) will open its 2004-05 home season on Oct. 15-16, with a two game series against non-conference rival Northern Michigan (0-0-0). Game time both nights at the National Hockey Center (5,763 cap.) in St. Cloud, is slated for 7:07 p.m. This marks the first time since the first time since 1996-97 that NMU will play at the NHC. A former member of the WCHA, NMU is now a member of the CCHA and this marks the official season opener for the Wildcats, who were 21-16-4 last year. Last weekend, NMU lost to York University 1-0, and tied the NTDP U-18 team 3-3 in Marquette, Mich. Both of those games were considered exhibition matches.

2003-04 RESULTS: The Huskies finished their season with an 18-16-4, 12-12-4 WCHA/6th place). This was the fifth consecutive season that SCSU has finished above the .500 mark.

SCSU COACH CRAIG DAHL: SCSU head coach Craig Dahl is in his 18th season with the Huskies, and has been the team's only head coach since SCSU moved to the DI level in 1987-88. Dahl's record at SCSU is 325-286-50, and his all-time collegiate coaching record is 401-373-52. He will begin his 24th year as a collegiate head coach in 2004-05. Dahl served for one season as an assistant coach to Herb Brooks at SCSU in 1986-87, and prior to that he had head coaching

assignments at UW-River Falls and Bethel College. Dahl is a 1976 graduate of Pacific Lutheran University.

ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: Coach Dahl will be assisted in 2004-05 by Brad Willner and Fred Harbinson. Willner, a 1995 graduate of Lake Superior State, will begin his fifth season with the Huskies in 2004-05. Harbinson begins his third season as a member of the SCSU coaching corps in 2004-05. Harbinson is a 1995 graduate of Wisconsin-Superior.

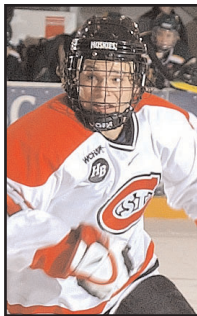

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

SCSU BREAKS THE ICE: In the season opener at the 2004 Icebreaker Tournament in Durham, N.H., SCSU skated to a 1-1 tie against St. Lawrence (0-0-1). SLU got on the board first with a tally by Matt Macdonald at 1:03 of the first period on an unassisted goal. The Huskies got back on track with a goal by Konrad Reeder at 10:53. Reeder's goal was unassisted and it was his seventh career goal at SCSU. The first period offense proved to be it for the game as SCSU sophomore goalie Tim Boron turned in a top shelf performance with 30 saves in the contest. At the other end, SLU's Mike McKenna made 24 saves in the game as SLU outshot the Huskies 31-25. The game was filled with penalties but the Huskies and Saints were flawless on the penalty kill. SCSU was 10-of-10 with its penalty kill, which included three with a two-man advantage. SLU gained entry to the Icebreaker title game against New Hampshire by virtue of its one goal in the post-game shootout. Mike Wallmann netted the lone goal in the shootout, while the Huskies were unable to score on any of their five chances. Boron made four solid saves, and appeared to have stopped Wallmann but his shot managed to trickle over the line after Boron's initial save.

WIN OVER OHIO STATE: T.J. McElroy provided the game winning goal at 4:18 of the third period, to lift the Huskies to a 3-1 win over Ohio State University (ranked #12 at the time) in the third place game of the Ice Breaker on Sunday, Oct. 10. After a scoreless first period, which featured six power play opportunities for the Buckeyes, the Huskies broke the ice with a 5x3 power play goal by Dave Iannazzo at 7:55 of the second. Iannazzo was assisted on the play by Matt Gens and Justin Fletcher. Into the third period, SCSU maintained its 1-0 lead before McElroy's winning tally. He scored on the picture perfect play with assists from Joe Jensen and Andrew Gordon. OSU broke the shutout by goalie Jason Montgomery with a goal at 7:12 from Sam Campbell. To ice the game, Gordon collected his first collegiate goal at 14:57 of the third with an assist from Iannazzo, who was named to the All-Tournament team. OSU outshot the Huskies 35-24, as Montgomery put in a top shelf performance with 34 saves. Of note, this was Montgomery's first start since a 7-6 loss to Minnesota State on Jan. 24, 2004. SCSU was perfect on the penalty kill at 10-of-10 and it was 1-of-7 on the power play.

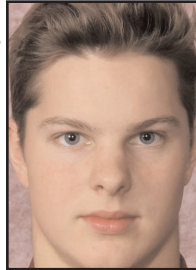

FIRST TIMER AT SCSU: First year forward Andrew Gordon scored his first collegiate points this weekend with a goal and an assist in SCSU's 3-1 win over Ohio State on Oct. 10 at the Ice Breaker in Durham, N.H.

PERFECT PENALTY KILL & OTHER NOTES: Lots of penalties were called this weekend at the Ice Breaker but SCSU passed the test. In the two games combined, the Huskies were a perfect 20-of-20 on the penalty kill vs. OSU and St. Lawrence. The 19 combined power play opportunities in the St. Lawrence game already surpassed last year's season high of 18...former SCSU skater Colin Peters (2000-04) stopped by to see his old teammates play OSU at the Ice Breaker. Peters made the short trip to Durham from Manchester, NH, where he is currently in camp with the Manchester (AHL) squad.

Did you know that Northern Michigan was the first opponent to play at the NHC back in 1989-90. The Huskies opened the NHC with a 5-4 win against NMU on Dec. 16, 1989. Prior to the 1989-90 season, SCSU played its home games at the nearby Municipal Athletic Complex rink in St. Cloud...the three St. Cloud area players on the SCSU roster this season is an all-time high for the Huskies since 1987-88... The Huskies will meet up with former WCHA rival Northern Michigan for the first time since the 1997 WCHA playoffs. Northern Michigan is currently a member of the CCHA...head coach Walt Kyle is in his third year at NMU and he is a 1981 graduate of NMU...the Wildcats return 19 letterwinners from 2003-04...Nathan Oystreich has been selected as the NMU captain for this season, the defender from Regina, Sask. had 28 points in 2003-04...NMU opened its season with a pair of exhibition games in Marquette. Against the NTDP squad on Oct. 8, NMU owned a 3-0 lead going into the third before the game ended in a 3-3 tie. Dusty Collins and Matt Ciancio each had two points (1g/1a) for NMU in the game.
