#16 HUSKIES OPEN 2007-08 WCHA SEASON AT MINNESOTA DULUTH

The #17 St. Cloud State University men's hockey team (1-0-1, 0-0-0 WCHA) will open its 2007-08 WCHA season on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 19-20, with a pair of 7:07 p.m. games at Minnesota Duluth. The games will be played at the DECC (5,333 cap./190x85).

- ▲ *SCSU is 9-1-0 vs. UMD in the last 10 outings in the series.*
- ▲ *The Huskies own a 50-33-5 all-time series lead, which dates back to 1946-47. SCSU is 47-29-4 in the series since it moved to the DI level in 1987-88.*
- ▲ *The Huskies are currently ranked #16 in the latest USCHO.com poll.*
- ▲ *The Huskies and UMD both received votes in the latest USA Hockey poll.*
- ▲ *The last time SCSU and UMD played, the result was an epic 3-2 triple OT win by the Huskies in the third game of the 2007 WCHA First Round Playoffs. SCSU's Andreas Nodl charted the game winner in that contest - which lasted 111:33 minutes.*

2007-08 RECORD: SCSU currently owns a 1-0-1, 0-0-0 WCHA record in 2007-08.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR

The Huskies (22-11-7) placed second in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (14-7-7 WCHA), which equals the team's best-ever finish in the regular season standings of the WCHA since SCSU joined the league in 1990-91. SCSU advanced to the 2007 WCHA Final Five for the second consecutive season (10th time in team history), thanks to first round playoff wins over Minnesota Duluth (SCSU won the series 2-1). To complete the season, the Huskies gained their first NCAA Division I tournament bid since 2003. This marked the sixth NCAA bid for the Huskies since 1989. SCSU lost in first round play at the 2007 NCAA East Regional by a score of 4-1 against Maine in Rochester, N.Y. The Huskies were the #2 seed at the Regional tournament.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Senior defender Matt Stephenson, a resident of Midland, Ontario, has been named as the Huskies' captain for 2007-08. Senior forward Nate Dey (Maplewood, Minn.), junior forward Michael Olson (Tisdale, Sask.) and sophomore defender Garrett Raboin (Detroit Lakes) have all been selected as team alternate captains for the 2007-08 season.

POLL POSITION

SCSU received a #16 ranking in the latest USCHO.com poll, and it received votes in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll. The Huskies ended the 2006-07 season ranked 7th in the final USCHO.com poll and 8th in the final USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll. SCSU has gained a spot in the college hockey top 20 polls for 36 consecutive weeks - dating back to Jan. 30, 2006...of note, the #2 ranking (on 2/28) equals the best ranking the Huskies hit last season. The last time SCSU was higher in the polls, was a second place ranking on Feb. 25, 2002...in the WCHA pre-season poll, the Huskies received a sixth place ranking for 2007-08.

FIRST TIMERS AT SCSU

Several rookies gained their first collegiate points over the weekend for the Huskies. Freshman Tony Mosey made a big impact with two goals and two assists on the weekend, while rookie Garrett Roe had one goal and two assists on Oct. 12. Freshman Aaron Marvin also had his first assist as a Husky in the game on Oct. 12. Sophomore netminder Jase Weslosky posted his first collegiate point with an assist against CC on Oct. 12.

HOMETOWN HERO

St. Cloud resident Matt Hartman hit a career-high with his three-point effort on Oct. 12. Hartman had two goals and one assist in the win over Canisius. He also had three points against Yale on Oct. 30, 2004, during his freshman season at SCSU. The two goals also are a career-best for Hartman. He now has 22 goals in his career at SCSU. Hartman played prep hockey at nearby Apollo H.S.

GREAT EFFORT

Sophomore Jase Weslosky made 20 saves in the 7-0 win over Canisius. This marked the second shutout for Weslosky during his career with the Huskies. Last year, Weslosky posted a no-hitter against Clarkson at the NHC on Nov. 16, 2006. As a freshman, Weslosky was 5-1-0, with a 2.68 GAA. He served as a top back-up to All-American netminder Bobby Goepfert in 2006-07.

READY FOR ACTION

Sophomore Craig Gaudet played in just four games last year for the Huskies. In his two games this past weekend, Gaudet performed well as he notched one goal, one assist and a +2 ranking on the all important plus/minus ranking. Last year, Gaudet scored one goal during his rookie campaign.

The Last Time Out

Oct. 12: at SCSU 7, Canisius 0

SCSU kicked off its 2007-08 season in top order with a 7-0 shutout over visiting Canisius on Oct. 12. SCSU started its homecoming weekend with a goal by Matt Hartman at 1:46 of the first period. The Huskies gained a 2-0 lead in the game with a goal by Garrett Roe at 7:54 of the first period. SCSU completed its first period attack with a goal by Aaron Brocklehurst at 16:09. In the second period, Tony Mosey padded the SCSU lead with his first collegiate goal at 7:34. Hartman continued the hit parade with a power play goal at 13:21. In the third period, Roe notched his third point of the night with an even strength goal at 2:21. To complete the evening, Nate Dey charted his 21st career goal at 3:34 of the third. In the game, Hartman, Roe and Mosey all had three points to their credit. The Huskies outshot the Griffins 44-22, as netminder Jase Weslosky posted his second career shutout with 20 saves. On the power play, SCSU was 3-of-7 and CC was 0-of-6.

Oct. 13: at SCSU 3, Canisius 3 OT

St. Cloud, Minn. -- SCSU skated to a 3-3 overtime tie against Canisius on Oct. 13. SCSU jumped out to a quick 1-0 lead at 3:40 of the first period with a goal by Craig Gaudet. He was assisted on the play by John Swanson and Andreas Nodl. The Huskies padded their lead to 2-0 with a power play marker by senior forward Nate Dey at 6:09 of the first period. Ryan Lasch and senior defender Aaron Brocklehurst added assists on the play. To complete the SCSU attack, Tony Mosey continued his impressive debut weekend with his second goal of the season at 4:08 of the second period. Gaudet and Lasch each had assists on the play. Canisius got back into the game at 10:13 of the second with a goal by Chris Forsman. In the third period, CC kept battling back with a goal at 3:21 by David Kasch. David Cianfrini tied the game at 4:03 of the third period to make it 3-3. In the game, SCSU outshot the Griffins 46-13. Bryce Luker was the goalie of record with 43 saves for CC. B.J. O'Brien made his first collegiate start for the Huskies and posted 10 saves in the contest.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Tony Mosey was named the WCHA Rookie of the Week on Oct. 16. His efforts against Canisius included two goals and two assists. Of note, the Huskies gained 10 WCHA player of the week honors in 2006-07 and that total equalled a team season-high that was also hit in 2001-02. SCSU gained three Rookie of the Week awards in 2006-07.

TOUGH AGAINST THE BULLDOGS

Senior Nate Dey has charted seven goals and one assist during his career against UMD. Ryan Lasch in his freshman season at SCSU had five goals and four assists against UMD, while Andreas Nodl notched four goals and four assists. He also had the game winner in the triple OT game last year. Of note, Jase Weslosky charted a win against Minnesota Duluth last year, as he had 18 saves in that game.

DQ CUP READY TO GO FOR 2007-08

SCSU won the coveted DQ Cup in 2006-07. This award is sponsored by Dairy Queen, and it is presented to the WCHA team from the state of Minnesota that has the best win-loss record in action against other WCHA teams from the state of Minnesota. SCSU was 7-2-3 last season in WCHA games against Minnesota, Minnesota Duluth and Minnesota State Mankato. The Huskies' win rate of .708 those games aced out second place Minnesota (5-2-3, .650). The DQ Cup race will start anew this season with the Husky-Bulldog series in Duluth. The DQ Cup is slated to pay a visit to the DECC this weekend.

THE LAST TIME

The Huskies have already equalled their top offensive output from the 2006-07 season. Last year, SCSU scored a 7-2 win over Clarkson at the NHC - which was its top offensive output of the season. The last time the Huskies won by a seven-goal margin was a 7-0 victory over Robert Morris on Dec. 17, 2005 at the NHC.

THE HOUSE WAS A ROCKING

The Huskies averaged 5,971 fans (8th in the nation) at their home games in 2006-07, which equals a total of 125,396 fans at 21 games this season. This marks the 11th consecutive season that SCSU has drawn over 100,000 fans to its home games and it is the second largest number of fans for a single-season of SCSU hockey. The team's single-season attendance record of 128,641 fans was set in 1997-98 (23 games). The Huskies continued to pack them in this past weekend as 6,051 fans attended on Oct. 12 and 6,037 attended on Oct. 13 (it was SCSU Homecoming).

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his third season as head coach with the Huskies in 2007-08. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to two consecutive WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 NCAA Division I tournament. In two seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 44-27-11 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 30 weeks (including a #7/8 national ranking in the final 2006-07 college polls).

In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Gopfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors twice during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United States Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by third-year coach Eric Rud and first-year coach Mike Gibbons, and first-year volunteer goalie coach Justin Johnson. SCSU's support staff features 13-year veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, three-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and director of hockey operations Mr. Matt Chapman.
