2005-06 SCSU MEN'S HOCKEY NEWS

Release Date: Oct. 17, 2005

WCHA AND NHC SEASON OPENER: The St. Cloud State men's hockey team (1-1-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) will open its 2005-06 WCHA schedule and also its regular season home schedule with a pair of games against #13 University of Wisconsin (1-1-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 21-22 at the National Hockey Center (cap. 5,763/200x100) in St. Cloud. The games will be broadcast live on KNSI AM 1450 and KCML FM 99.9 out of St. Cloud. KVSC FM 88.1 will also carry the games live this weekend. The games will also be televised on Charter Communications Cable Television in St. Cloud and FSN-Wisconsin out of the Madison area. The Badgers lead the all-time series 31-20-6, which started back on Dec. 13, 1988.

2004-05 RESULTS: The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team ended its 2004-05 season with a 14-23-3 overall record and an 8-19-1 WCHA record. In the always rugged WCHA, the Huskies placed ninth in 2004-05.



SCSU COACH BOB MOTZKO: Motzko (1-1-0 career record) will become only the second coach at SCSU since the Huskies moved to the NCAA Division I level in 1987-88. Motzko played served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota from 2001-2005. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1983-85. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl. Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1991, Motzko was named assistant coach at Miami University (Ohio). He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994. Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. He then joined the staff at Minnesota in 2001. A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: Coach Motzko will be assisted in 2005-06 by Fred Harbinson and Eric Rud. Harbinson begins his fourth season as a member of the SCSU coaching corps in 2005-06. Harbinson is a 1995 graduate of Wisconsin-Superior. Rud will begin his first season as an assistant at SCSU in 2005-06. A 1997 graduate of Colorado College, Rud served as an assistant at CC in 2004-05. Eric Bakke will serve as the team's video coordinator in 2005-06, and Jeff Kruger will work as the team's strength and conditioning coach.

CRAIG DAHL APPRECIATION NIGHT: Former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl, who completed his 18th season with the Huskies in 2004-05, will be honored during SCSU's "Craig Dahl Appreciation Night" on Oct. 22. A variety of activities planned by SCSU will honor Dahl's legacy at the University. The first coach to lead SCSU into NCAA Division I hockey in 1987-88, Dahl helped establish one of the nation's top DI collegiate hockey programs at SCSU. Dahl's record at SCSU was 338-309-52, and his all-time collegiate coaching record was 414-396-54. Dahl served for one season as an assistant coach to Herb Brooks at SCSU in 1986-87, and prior to that he had head coaching assignments at UW-River Falls and Bethel College. Dahl is a 1976 graduate of Pacific Lutheran University. The WCHA coach of the year in 1998, Dahl led the Huskies to five NCAA tournament berths and the 2001 WCHA Final Five championship. Many of Dahl's former players have gone onto to play professional hockey at all levels, including current NHL standouts Bret Hedican, Mark Parrish, Matt Cullen, Ryan Malone, Tyler Arnason and Duvie Westcott.

HUSKY HOCKEY ON THE AIR: Once again in 2005-06, KNSI AM 1450 and KCML FM 99.59 will carry SCSU hockey live over the radio (and on the web at www.1450knsi.com). Don Lyons will call the play-by-play with color commentary provided by SCSU All-American Dave Reichel. Home and away games will also be broadcast live on KVSC 88.1. MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

TEAM CAPTAINS: Junior defender Casey Borer, a resident of Brooklyn Park, Minn., will serve as a team captain for the Huskies in 2005-06. The alternate captains for this winter are senior forward Konrad Reeder (Vanderhoof, B.C.) and senior forward Brock Hooton (Nanaimo, B.C.). Of note, the last time a junior served as a team captain for the Huskies was Jon Cullen in 2001-02.

HUSKIES WIN A THRILLER: SCSU charted a 3-2 overtime win against #12/13 Northern Michigan on Oct. 15. Joe Jensen was the game's hero, as he posted the winning goal with :06 left on the clock with a tally in the OT session - the assist was provided by Andrew Gordon (his third point of the night). The win was the first for SCSU's new coach Bob Motzko. SCSU jumped out quickly in the contest, as the Huskies pressured NMU goalie Derek Janzen with eight first period shots. Janzen withstood the test and held SCSU at bay until the Wildcats could post the game's first goal at 15:58 of the first period. Andrew Contois gave NMU the early lead with a power play goal against SCSU goalie Bobby Goepfert. The Huskies notched their first goal of the new season at 13:43 of the second period, when senior forward Joe Jensen directed home a blast from the blue line by sophomore defender Aaron Brocklehurst on the power play. Andrew Gordon provided the Huskies with a 2-1 lead in the third period with his first goal of the season at 11:32. Assists were carded on the play by Billy Hengen and Chris Anderson. NMU charged back to tie the game when Contois plowed into Goepfert at 12:28 of the third. When the final verdict was provided, the officials awarded NMU with its second goal of the night. In overtime, SCSU killed an early penalty called for too many men on the ice thanks to a sterling glove save by Goepfert. Jensen then provided the last second heroics to bring home the first win for coach Motzko. Goepfert had 25 saves in the game, as SCSU outshot NMU 28-27. On Oct. 14, the Huskies dropped a 3-0 decision against NMU. Tim Boron made 15 saves in the game for SCSU and allowed only two goals, as the Huskies outshot NMU 22-18. NMU scored twice in the first period, and then finished with an ENG at 19:59 of the third.

A TOUGH DRAW AGAIN: Much like last year, SCSU is slated to play several top rated teams in 2005-06. As of Oct. 17, SCSU's schedule includes games against nine teams that are currently ranked (or have received votes) in the national polls. Those teams include last week's opponent NMU, and the next three opponents #13 Wisconsin, #7/8 Minnesota and #4 Colorado College.

AS SEEN ON TV: A total of 17 SCSU home games will be seen live on Charter Communications Cable Television in the St. Cloud area during the 2005-06 season. The lone games that are not slated to be shown live on Charter Communication Cable Television in 2005-06 are the Alberta game on Oct. 8 and the Robert Morris game on Dec. 18. The remaining 17 home games are scheduled to be televised live. SCSU graduate and Twin Cities sports media personality Clay Matvick will provide the play-by-play this season, with fellow Husky graduate Ryan Dale providing the color commentary. The telecasts are completely produced live by SCSU's mass communications students under the guidance of Husky Productions faculty advisor Gregory Martin.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzko Show will air live on Mondays from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM from JPs Grill and Bar in Sauk Rapids. Don Lyons will serve as the program's host along with Coach Motzko. St. Cloud Times sports writer Kevin Alenspach will also provide his insight each week. The public is invited to attend the weekly show at JPs Grill and Bar (located at Hwy 10 and Golden Spike Road in Sauk Rapids).

HUSKIES GO HOLLYWOOD: A few months ago, Warner Bros. contacted SCSU to obtain permission to use some video footage of an old hockey game in the production of its upcoming major motion picture release "North Country," which stars Woody Harrelson and Charize Theron. The footage from the mid 1990s, features a SCSU-UMD game and Husky Productions student-announcer Clay Matvick. Of note, Matvick is back with the Huskies again this season as the team's television play-by-play announcer on Charter Cable. SCSU fans will learn if the footage made the final cut of the movie when it is released later this month.

WINNING WAYS: Joe Jensen's OT knockout against NMU on Oct. 15, marked his 10th career game winning goal. Jensen now ranks third in the team records for career GWGs along with Husky legend Mark Hartigan (1999-02). Joe Motzko is the team's all-time leader for GWG with 12 from 1999-03, and Tim Hanus is second with 11 from 1988-92. The goals at NMU were Jensen's 31st and 32nd goals of his career. He also has 69 career points, which ranks him 36th on the team charts for career points. He's tied with Pat McGowan, who played at SCSU from 1987-91.

GORDON HITS THREE: Andrew Gordon had three points in the game at NMU, which equals a career game-high for the sophomore from Nova Scotia. Gordon had one goal and two assists in the game at Marquette, and last year he also had three points in a 10-0 win at Yale on 10/30/04.

ANDERSON WITH THE ASSIST: Sophomore defender Chris Anderson, who served as an extra skater on Friday night at NMU, made good on his 2005-06 debut on Oct. 15. Anderson, a resident of White Bear Lake, gained his third career point at SCSU with an assist on Andrew Gordon's goal at 11:33 of the third period. As a rookie at SCSU in 2004-05, Anderson had one goal and one assist in 30 games played. Billy Hengen added the second assist on the play...SCSU's defensive group also helped on Joe Jensen's power play goal on Oct. 15, as Aaron Brocklehurst provided the first assist. A sophomore defender from Nanaimo, BC (one of two SCSU players from Nanaimo this season), Brocklehurst marked three goals and four assists last season. He was making his 2005-06 debut after sitting out SCSU's exhibition game vs. Alberta with an injury.

OTHER FACTS AND FIGURES OF INTEREST: SCSU played nationally ranked NMU tough in its 3-0 loss, which featured a last second empty net goal by the Wildcats. In the game, SCSU outshot the Wildcats 22-18, as SCSU junior goalie Tim Boron had 15 saves in the game. The game marked the first time that NMU has posted a shutout against the Huskies. The last time SCSU opened its regular season with a shutout was a 3-0 loss at Minnesota on Oct. 23, 1998... SCSU's game on Friday, Oct. 28, is slated to be televised live on ESPNU. This marks the first time that SCSU has been on an ESPN channel during the regular season. ESPNU will take the feed of the game provided by SCSU's student-ran Husky Productions. SCSU graduates Clay Matvick and Ryan Dale will provide the call during the game that night from the National Hockey Center against Minnesota. Junior goalie Bobby Goepfert made his SCSU debut on Oct. 15 against NMU. Goepfert, a resident of Kings Park, N.Y., is a transfer from Providence. He was a member of the USA Junior National team in 2003, and is a former USHL league MVP with Cedar Rapids. Goepfert made 25 saves in his first win for the Huskies, and had only one legitimate goal scored against him. The second goal Goepfert allowed against NMU on Oct. 15 came after a pile up in front of the net and was a good reason for instant replay...other Huskies making their playing debuts at SCSU this past weekend were Dan Kronick, David Carlisle, Michael Olson and John Swanson. Of note, Kronick is a junior transfer from Minnesota Duluth... Swanson, Nate Raduns and Matt Hartman are all area residents of St. Cloud.
