ROCKY MOUNTAIN VISIT: The St. Cloud State men's hockey team (2-1-1) will open its 2004-05 WCHA season with a trip to defending national champion University of Denver (1-2-0) in Denver, Colo. on Oct. 22 (8:37 p.m.) and Oct. 23 (8:07 p.m.). This will be the WCHA opener for Pioneers, which won its sixth NCAA title in 2004. The games will be broadcast live on KNSI AM 1450/KCML 99.9 with Don Lyons providing the play-by-play. Both games will also be televised on Fox Sports Net-Rocky Mountain (channel 645 on DirecTV) and CSTV (channel 610 on DirecTV). Denver leads the all-time series 26-24-4, which dates back to Nov. 29, 1988.

2003-04 RESULTS: The Huskies finished their season with an 18-16-4, 12-12-4 WCHA/6th place). This was the fifth consecutive season that SCSU has finished above the .500 mark.

SCSU COACH CRAIG DAHL: SCSU head coach Craig Dahl is in his 18th season with the Huskies, and has been the team's only head coach since SCSU moved to the DI level in 1987-88. Dahl's record at SCSU is 326-287-50, and his all-time collegiate coaching record is 402-374-52. He will begin his 24th year as a collegiate head coach in 2004-05. Dahl served for one season as an assistant coach to Herb Brooks at SCSU in 1986-87, and prior to that he had head coaching assignments at UW-River Falls and Bethel College. Dahl is a 1976 graduate of Pacific Lutheran University.

ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: Coach Dahl will be assisted in 2004-05 by Brad Willner and Fred Harbinson. Willner, a 1995 graduate of Lake Superior State, will begin his fifth season with the Huskies in 2004-05. Harbinson begins his third season as a member of the SCSU coaching corps in 2004-05. Harbinson is a 1995 graduate of Wisconsin-Superior.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

SCSU SPLITS WITH NMU: SCSU posted a 2-1 win over Northern Michigan on Oct. 15, in the team's home opener at the NHC. The Huskies scored the first goal of the contest at 6:22 of the second period, when freshman Andrew Gordon posted his second tally of the year with assists from Joe Jensen and Justin Fletcher. The game's second goal was posted by Matt Gens on the power play at 11:05. He was assisted on the play by Dave Iannazzo and Nate Raduns. Northern Michigan broke SCSU goalie Tim Boron's shutout in the third period when it scored on a power play goal at 14:41 by Andrew Contois. Assists were provided on the play by Jamie Milam and Nathan Oystrick. Boron carded 18 saves in the game while his NMU counterpart Tuomas Tarkki had a total of 32 saves in the match. The Huskies dominated the shot charts 34-19 over NMU, which included 12 shots on goal in the first period and 14 shots on goal in the third period.

On the power play, SCSU was one-of-nine and NMU was one-of-seven...a third period rally by NMU spelled a 4-2 loss for the St. Cloud State University men's hockey team on Saturday, Oct. 16 in St. Cloud. SCSU opened the night's offense with a first period goal by Billy Hengen at 1:56 of the first period as assists were provided by Nate Dey (his first collegiate point) and Gary Houseman. NMU responded at 7:59 with a power play goal by Pat Bateman, which tied the game going into the second period.

In the second period, SCSU regained its lead with an even strength tally by Andrew Gordon. The assist went to junior Joe Jensen. NMU ended the game with three goals in the third. SCSU outshot the Wildcats 35-31 in the match, as junior Jason Montgomery was the goalie of record for the Huskies with 27 saves to his credit. Bill Zaniboni made 33 saves for NMU. On the power play, SCSU was 0-of-9 and NMU was 3-of-6.

FIRST POINT: Freshman forward Nate Dey, the first Minnesota Mr. Hockey award winner to play at SCSU, scored his first point on an assist of Billy Hengen's goal on Oct. 16. Of note, Dey's sister Stacy Dey plays for the SCSU women's team.

HOT STREAK SCSU rookie forward Andrew Gordon has been on fire during the past three games. Gordon has posted goals in three consecutive games, including a pair in the series against NMU. A resident of Porter Lake, N.S., Gordon is the early season point leader at SCSU with 3g/1a. The last time that a SCSU player had a goal in three consecutive games was Billy Hengen with goals against MTU (Oct. 25) and Princeton (Oct. 31 & Nov. 1) last year. The last SCSU player to post goals in more than three consecutive games was Jon Cullen from 11/23-12/4/02...SCSU's other scoring streak leader is Joe Jensen, with assists in his last three games this year. In his career at SCSU, Jensen has 18g/26a for a total of 44 points.

STREAK SNAPPED: The loss to Northern Michigan on Oct. 16, snapped a three-game undefeated string for the Huskies this year and also snapped a six-game win streak over NMU that dated back to Jan. 19, 1996.

HENGEN SCORES AND OTHER NOTES: Billy Hengen, who had a breakout season in 2003-04 with 8g/15, posted his first goal of 2004-05 during SCSU's loss to NMU on Oct. 16...sophomore forward Gary Houseman posted his first assist of the new season on Oct. 16...sophomore goalie Tim Boron, who has been rotating ice time with junior netkeeper Jason Montgomery, continues to play well in 2004-05, with a 1-0-1 record and a 0.96 goals against average...the 35 shots on goal in the NMU game on Oct. 16 is a season-high for the Huskies. The three shots allowed in the second period against NMU on Oct. 15 is also a single-period season-high for the Huskies...SCSU debuted its new video scoreboards at the NHC on Oct. 15. These scoreboards were made by Daktronics and they replace the old boards that have been in use since the NHC opened in Dec. 1989...SCSU also formally dedicated "Herb Brooks Way" at the game on Oct. 16. Earlier this year, the city of St. Cloud gave approval to rename the street just south of the NHC to Herb Brooks Way, in honor Brooks - who coached at SCSU from 1986-87 and also helped the Huskies make the move to the DI level in 1987-88.

The last NCAA title was brought home to Denver in 1969...Denver SID Erich Bacher was a former graduate assistant at St. Cloud State...Gabe Gauthier is the team's top returning scorer with 18g/25a in 2003-04...DU will have to replace departed netminder Adam Berkoehl, the USA Hockey College Player of the Year and Frozen Four MVP...last year, Joe Jensen scored a shorthanded goal against Denver at the National Hockey Center on Dec. 13...Denver opened its year with a non-conference loss to Minnesota at the Xcel Center in the annual Hall of Fame game. Last week-end, the Pioneers dropped a 6-2 decision at Boston College but rebounded with a 4-2 win at Northeastern on Oct. 16...senior forward Jon Foster leads Denver with four goals this season...sophomore goalie Glenn Fisher (3.00 GAA) and freshman Peter Mannino (5.01 GAA) have shared duties this year.
