The #19 St. Cloud State Huskies (3-3-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) will take part in the first WCHA State of Minnesota College Hockey Showcase at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul on Saturday, Nov. 1. The Huskies will play Minnesota Duluth (3-1-2, 0-1-1 WCHA) at 4:07 p.m. down at the Xcel. Fans can listen to both games live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) or KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

THE SCSU TIP SHEET:

- The Huskies were ranked #19 in the latest USCHO.com poll and received votes in the USA Hockey poll. SCSU has been ranked among the top 20 teams in all four USCHO.com polls this season.
■ The Huskies are 4-6 in games played at the Xcel Energy Center since it opened in the winter of 2000-01. This will mark the first trip to the Xcel Energy Center for the Huskies in a non-WCHA Final Five contest.
■ The only time that SCSU and UMD have played a game at the Xcel Energy Center, the Huskies posted a 5-1 victory in the Thursday game at the Final Five in 2006.
■ SCSU sophomore Garrett Roe ranks second in the nation with 11 points this season. He had a goal and an assist in SCSU's 5-3 win at Bemidji State on Oct. 25.
■ Little Falls resident Jared Festler continues to impress in his rookie season with three goals and four assists. Festler ranks first in the nation among DI rookies with seven points this season after six games.
■ The Huskies rank fifth in the nation among DI teams this season with a goals per game average of 4.00.
■ The Huskies and Bulldogs will complete this weekend series with a Nov. 29 date at the DECC in Duluth. Game time that night in the Twin Ports will be 7:37 p.m.
■ SCSU sophomore Mitch Ryan is a transfer from Minnesota Duluth. A resident of Cloquet, Ryan saw action for the first time this season in the games at Bemidji State. He responded quickly to the call with a goal on Oct. 24, and then he completed the weekend with an assist and empty net goal in the Huskies' 5-3 win on Oct. 25.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR: The Huskies (19-16-5) placed fourth in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (12-12-4 WCHA). SCSU gained home ice advantage in the WCHA playoffs, and advanced to the 2008 WCHA Final Five for the third consecutive season (11th time in team history), thanks to first round playoff wins over Wisconsin (SCSU won the series 2-0). To complete the season, the Huskies gained their second consecutive NCAA Division I tournament bid. This marked the seventh NCAA bid for the Huskies since 1989. This was the 12th time since 1987-88 that the Huskies have finished above .500, and the eighth time since 1999-00 that the Huskies have finished above .500.

POLL POSITION: SCSU were ranked 19th in the latest USCHO.com poll for 2008-09, and the Huskies received votes in the latest USA Hockey/USA Today poll this season...in the WCHA pre-season polls (coaches and media), the Huskies received a sixth place ranking for 2008-09... last year, the Huskies were ranked 14th in the final USA Hockey poll and eighth in the final USCHO.com poll...of note, SCSU was ranked sixth in the 2007-08 WCHA preseason poll and it bested the critics with a fourth place finish last year. In 2006-07, the Huskies were ranked fifth and they finished second.

2008-09 TEAM CAPTAINS: Junior defender Garrett Raboin will serve as the team captain this season, while alternate captains for 2008-09 are senior defender David Carlisle, senior forward Michael Olson and junior forward Ryan Lasch. Both Raboin and Olson served as Alternate Captains during the 2007-08 season.

Fans will be able to listen to the games on the web by going to this website at www.lite999.com. Selected Husky games will also be broadcast live on KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org).

LIVE FROM ST. CLOUD: All SCSU home games this season will be televised live on Charter Cable's Mainstreet network (Charter Cable Channel 14 in the St. Cloud area). Rob Hudson and Jay Adkins will provide the play-by-play for Husky Productions this season. Of note, the Charter Mainstreet Network will also carry select Huskies' games throughout the Charter system in Minnesota (and parts of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan) and also on selected Twin Cities cable systems this season. Fans watch the games on Comcast in the Twin Cities can pick up the Charter Mainstreet games on channel 13 (east Metro) or channel 23 (west Metro). About Last Week...

Oct. 24: at Bemidji State 4, SCSU 2

SCSU dropped a 4-2 decision at non-conference rival Bemidji State on Oct. 24. The Huskies outshot the Beavers 35-21 in the match, as BSU goalie Matt Dalton proved to be the game's top star with 33 saves. Both squads skated to a 0-0 deadlock after the first period of play, before BSU gained the upper hand in the second period with an unassisted goal by Travis Winter at :59. The Beavers pushed it to 2-0 with a power play goal at 6:38 of the second by Matt Read. The Huskies got back into the fray at 19:28 with an even-strength goal by Mitch Ryan. In the third period, BSU charted the eventual game winner at 3:24 with a power play tally by Brandon Marino. At 19:39 of the third period, BSU iced the contest with an empty net goal by Ben Kinne. To close the gap, SCSU's Jordy Christian scored his first collegiate point and goal at 19:57 of the third period. In the game, Dalton was the goalie of record for BSU and sophomore netminder Dan Dunn (Oshawa, Ont.) had 17 saves for the Huskies.

Oct. 25: SCSU 5, at Bemidji State 3

SCSU brought home a 5-3 victory at Bemidji State on Oct. 25. Jared Festler continued his hot hand in 2008-09 with a pair of power play goals for the Huskies, including the game-winning goal at 19:21 of the second period. The victory snapped a three-game losing skid to the Huskie. Bemidji State jumped to a 1-0 lead in the first period with a power play goal by Cody Bostock at 17:18. In the second period, the Huskies' slumbering offense woke up with a four-goal rally that pushed the score to 4-1. Garrett Roe started the ball rolling with a power play goal at 8:33. Festler added his first goal of the night with a power play marker at 13:23 of the second. Aaron Marvin made it 2-1 with his second goal of the season at 17:14 at second. Mosey gained the game playmaker with his third assist of the night, while the second assist went to Mitch Ryan. The eventual game-winner was marked by Festler at 19:21 of the second period on the power play. In the third period, BSU charged back into the game with two goals before the Huskies iced the victory with an empty net goal by Ryan at 19:51 of the third period. Jase Weslosky had 28 saves and the victory for the Huskies.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

FLYING HIGH: Following in the tradition set by the Huskies over the past three seasons with high-scoring rookies Andreas Nodl and Garrett Roe, SCSU freshman forward Jared Festler continues to score at a torrid pace in 2008-09. Festler is currently tied for the national lead among DI rookies with seven points this season with three goals and four assists. Festler was the star of the Huskies' 5-3 win on Oct. 25, as he had two power play goals - including the game-winner in the second period. Festler is a resident of nearby Little Falls, Minn., the boyhood home of famed aviator Charles Lindbergh.

TIES THE RECORD: Sophomore forward Tony Mosey capped a solid weekend up north with his three assists in the second period against BSU on Oct. 25. The three helpers ties a team record for the Huskies for most assists in a single period. Mosey has one goal and four assists for five points this winter.

FIRST TIME AT SCSU: Freshman forward Jordy Christian added his first collegiate point and goal on Oct. 24, with a goal against Bemidji State. Of note, his date Ed Christian played college hockey at North Dakota.

COUNTDOWN TO 100: 2008 Hobey Baker award finalist Ryan Lasch was held off the scoresheet against BSU, but he only needs four points to join the 100-point club at SCSU. He now has 42 goals and 54 assists for a total of 96 career points. He needs just four more points to become the 21st player to join SCSU's 100-point club during the DI era. The last player to break the 100-point barrier at SCSU was Joe Jensen, who had 100 points from 2002-2006.

TWO POINTS: Sophomore forward Aaron Marvin is the sister of Minnesota hockey player Gigi Marvin. He snapped a three-game scoring drought on Oct. 25, with a goal and an assist against BSU. In 2008-09, Marvin now has two goals and three assists for five points this winter. Marvin's grandfather is Hockey Hall of Famer Cal Marvin.

AMONG THE BEST: The SCSU power play unit ranks eighth in the nation with a conversion rate of 22.4 percent this season. SCSU is 11-of-49 on the advantage, and the Huskies were three-of-nine on the power play during the game on Oct. 25.

AMONG THE BEST II: SCSU ranks fifth in the nation at 4.00 goals per game, which equals 24 goals in six games this season. The Huskies have outscored their opponents 24-17 in 2008-09.

TOP GUN: Sophomore forward Garrett Roe ranks third in the country with 11 points this season. Roe snapped a two-game scoring drought with one goal and one assists against BSU on Oct. 25. In 2008-09, Roe already has two goals and nine assists.

SCSU-BSU: The Huskies split a weekend series at Bemidji State University on Oct.24-25. To open the weekend, SCSU dropped a tough 4-2 decision at the Glas Fieldhouse. The Huskies snapped a three-game losing streak on Oct. 25, with a big 5-3 victory over the Beavers. SCSU is now 11-1-0 in the all-time series against Bemidji State since the Huskies moved to the DI level in 1987-88.

DOGFIGHT IN ST. PAUL: SCSU will be looking to snap a two-game losing streak against Minnesota Duluth this weekend at the Xcel. In their two meetings last season, the Bulldogs won a pair of games at the DECC by scores of 2-1 and 4-2 on Oct. 19-20, 2007. SCSU is 2-3 in the last five meetings against UMD, and it is 7-3-0 in the last 10 meetings between the two teams. SCSU leads the all-time series against UMD by a tally of 50-35-5, which dates back to 1946-47 with an 8-1 Husky win. At the NCAA Division I level, SCSU owns a 47-31-4 record since 1987-88. Coach Bob Motzko is 9-3-0 in games played against UMD during his career with the Huskies.

RANDOM THOUGHTS: SCSU's Ryan Lasch has played in an impressive 86 consecutive games for the Huskies since his rookie season in 2006-07. Senior John Swanson has now played in 70 consecutive games and the team's other Ironman is junior Garrett Raboin, who has played in 68 consecutive games...SCSU is 3-1-0 when it scores on the power play this season...Garrett Roe and Jared Festler each have three multi-point games this season for the Huskies...the last time SCSU played at the Xcel Energy Center, they suffered a 3-2 loss to Minnesota on March 20, 2008 in the Thursday game of the 2008 WCHA Final Five.

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his fourth season as head coach with the Huskies in 2008-09. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to three consecutive WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 and 2008 NCAA Division I tournaments. In three seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 66-46-16 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 42 weeks during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2007-08, Motzko led the Huskies to a 19-16-5 overall record and a fourth place finish in the WCHA at 12-12-4. SCSU gained home ice in the WCHA playoffs and earned trips to the 2008 WCHA Final Five and the 2008 NCAA tournament. Ryan Lasch was a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist and an AHCA All-American in 2008. In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Goepfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors three-times during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United State Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. 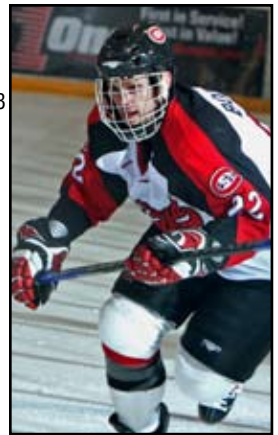
