2005-06 SCSU MEN'S HOCKEY NEWS

Release Date: Oct. 31, 2005

MOUNTAIN TIME: The St. Cloud State men's hockey team (2-3-1 1-2-1 WCHA) will continue its 2005-06 season with a pair of WCHA road games at #1 Colorado College on Nov. 2-3. The game on Nov. 4 is slated to start at 8:37 p.m. central time, with the Nov. 5 game starting at 8:07 p.m. central time. The games will be broadcast live on KNSI AM 1450 and KCML FM 99.9 out of St. Cloud. Colorado College currently owns a 7-1-0, 2-0-0 WCHA record, and both games will be played at CC's World Arena in Colorado Springs, Colo. (cap. 7,343/200x100). CC leads the all-time series 34-23-3 and the Tigers are 4-1 in the last five meetings.

2005-06 RESULTS: SCSU is 2-3-1, 1-2-1 WCHA in 2005-06. The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team ended its 2004-05 season with a 14-23-3 overall record and an 8-19-1 WCHA record. In the always rugged WCHA, the Huskies placed ninth in 2004-05.



SCSU COACH BOB MOTZKO: Motzko (2-3-1, 1-2-1 WCHA career record) is only the second coach at SCSU since the Huskies moved to the NCAA Division I level in 1987-88. Motzko played served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota from 2001-2005. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1991, Motzko was named assistant coach at Miami University (Ohio). He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994. Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. He then joined the staff at Minnesota in 2001. A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF: Coach Motzko will be assisted in 2005-06 by Fred Harbinson and Eric Rud. Harbinson begins his fourth season as a member of the SCSU coaching corps in 2005-06. Harbinson is a 1995 graduate of Wisconsin-Superior. Rud will begin his first season as an assistant at SCSU in 2005-06. A 1997 graduate of Colorado College, Rud served as an assistant at CC in 2004-05. Eric Bakke will serve as the team's video coordinator in 2005-06, and Jeff Kruger will work as the team's strength and conditioning coach. Dave Wenniger is the team's goalie coach in 2005-06.

POLL POSITION: For the first time in 2005-06, the Huskies have received votes in one of the national Division I college hockey polls. On Oct. 31, the USCHO.com poll listed the Huskies with five votes in the national poll. CC was #1 in the poll, while recent SCSU opponents Northern Michigan (14), Wisconsin (9) and Minnesota (7) also gained poll places. One of SCSU's other pre-Holiday Break opponents - North Dakota - received the number five spot in the poll. CC was also #1 in the USA Today/US Hockey Magazine poll this week.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

TEAM CAPTAINS: Junior defender Casey Borer, a resident of Brooklyn Park, Minn., will serve as a team captain for the Huskies in 2005-06. The alternate captains for this winter are senior forward Konrad Reeder (Vanderhoof, B.C.) and senior forward Brock Hooton (Nanaimo, B.C.). Of note, the last time a junior served as a team captain for the Huskies was Jon Cullen in 2001-02.

HUSKIES DEFEAT #7 GOPHERS: The house was rocking at the NHC on Oct. 28, as SCSU collected a huge 3-2 victory over #7 ranked Minnesota. A sellout crowd of 6,411 witnessed the game, which snapped an 11-game unbeaten streak by the Gophers against the Huskies. Minnesota gained the game's early lead as Andy Sertich scored at 4:27 of the first period.

At the end of the first period, SCSU charged back with a big shorthanded goal by Joe Jensen at the 19:08 mark. In the second period, Minnesota regained the lead when Tom Pohl posted a goal at 15:16. SCSU tied the contest at 1:43 of the third period when T.J. McElroy notched his fourth career goal on a slapshot. Jensen added the assist on the play. Billy Hengen carded the game winner at 5:03 of the third period with assists from Michael Olson and Casey Borer. In the contest, UM outshot the Huskies 39-29. Both teams were held scoreless on the power play, as SCSU went 0-for-2 and Minnesota was 0-for-4. In the nets, junior Bobby Goepfert had 37 saves for SCSU... UM spoiled the sweep hopes with a 3-1 win at the NHC over SCSU on Oct. 29. Minnesota scored three in the second period to ice the contest, as the Gophers outshot the Huskies 42-21 in the match. A lone goal by SCSU sophomore defender Aaron Brocklehurst (Nanaimo, B.C.) on the power play in the third period was the game's bright spot for the Huskies. In the nets, UM's Jeff Frazee charted 20 saves and the victory. SCSU junior Bobby Goepfert (Kings Park, N.Y.) had 39 saves in the contest. The Huskies were 1-of-6 on the power play and Minnesota was 2-of-8 on the power play in the game.

AS SEEN ON TV: A total of 17 SCSU home games will be seen live on Charter Communications Cable Television in the St. Cloud area during the 2005-06 season. The lone games that are not slated to be shown live on Charter Communication Cable Television in 2005-06 are the Alberta game on Oct. 8 and the Robert Morris game on Dec. 18. The remaining 17 home games are scheduled to be televised live. SCSU graduate and Twin Cities sports media personality Clay Matvick will provide the play-by-play this season, with fellow Husky graduate Ryan Dale providing the color commentary. The telecasts are completely produced live by SCSU's mass communications students under the guidance of Husky Productions faculty advisor Gregory Martin.

A FEW MORE THOUGHTS ON UM WIN: The win by SCSU over Minnesota marked the first time in 11 outings that the Huskies have gained a win over the Gophers. The last time SCSU posted a win over Minnesota was a 4-3 victory on Jan. 3, 2003 at Mariucci Arena. The win also snapped an eight-game losing streak by the Huskies against Minnesota, dating back to a 1-1 tie on March 8, 2003 at Minnesota. Finally, the win for the Huskies on Oct. 28 over #7 Minnesota was SCSU's first win over the Gophers at the National Hockey Center since a 5-2 decision on March 3, 2001

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

THE BOB MOTZKO SHOW: The Bob Motzkko Show will air live on Mondays from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on KNSI 1450 AM from JPs Grill and Bar in Sauk Rapids. Don Lyons will serve as the program's host along with Coach Motzko. St. Cloud Times sports writer Kevin Al-lenspach will also provide his insight each week. The public is invited to attend the weekly show at JPs Grill and Bar (located at Hwy 10 and Golden Spike Road in Sauk Rapids).

HUSKIES GO HOLLYWOOD: A few months ago, Warner Bros. contacted SCSU to obtain permission to use some video footage of an old hockey game in the production of its major motion picture release "North Country," which stars Woody Harrelson and Charlize Theron. The footage from the mid 1990s, features a SCSU-UMD game and Husky Productions student-announcer Clay Matvick. Of note, Matvick is back with the Huskies again this season as the team's television play-by-play announcer on Charter Cable.

JENSEN NETS SHG: Senior forward Joe Jensen, who now leads the Huskies with five points (3g/2a) this season, was the star of the game on Oct. 28. He netted a shorthanded goal and an assist on T.J. McElroy's game tying goal in the third period. Jensen now ranks 34th on the SCSU career charts with 72 points (33g/39a) along with current NHLer Mark Parrish (1995-97) and George Awada (1995-99). The SHG was his third as a Husky. Did you know that Jensen played junior hockey for current coach Bob Motzko at Sioux Falls.

HENGEN HITS GWG: Senior forward Billy Hengen gained his first goal of the season and also the game winner in the Oct. 28 game. He netted the GWG at 5:03 of the third, which was his first GWG since Nov. 1, 2003 vs. Princeton. On the play, rookie forward Michael Olson posted his first career assist at SCSU and junior defender Casey Borer gained his first point of 2005-06 with the second assist. Borer now has 20 points in his storied career at SCSU.

WCHA POW: Junior goalie Bobby Goepfert was a busy man this weekend for the Huskies. He made a total of 76 saves in the two games against the Gophers, with 37 saves coming in the win on Oct. 28. He completed the weekend with 39 saves in a tough 3-1 loss on Oct. 29 at the NHC. For his efforts, Goepfert was named the WCHA Defensive Player of the Week for Oct. 31.

SWANSON SCORES FIRST POINT IN FRONT OF HOMETOWN FANS: Freshman forward John Swanson gained his first collegiate point with an assist on Aaron Brocklehurst's goal on Oct. 29. Swanson is a resident of St. Cloud and attended nearby Tech H.S. before playing junior hockey with Lincoln and Chicago of the USHL...Brocklehurst's goal was his first of the 2005-06 season, and he now has 4g/4a in his two seasons with the Huskies. The second assist on his goal was credited to Nate Dey, which was his first point of 2005-06. Last year, Dey was the team's Rookie of the Year with 5g/7a. He is the first Minnesota Mr. Hockey award recipient to play at SCSU.

TOUGH ON DEFENSE: The Huskies have not allowed more than three goals in a game this season, and the squad owns a tough 2.43 GAA, against three nationally ranked opponents this season (NMU, UW and UM). SCSU has only allowed five power play goals this season and it is 32-of-37 on the penalty kill against three nationally ranked teams.

PACKIN' THE PLACE: Always a hot ticket in St. Cloud, a total of 12,919 fans packed the National Hockey Center for the games against Minnesota. Both games were sellouts with 6,411 attending on Oct. 28 and 6,508 in the house on Oct. 29.

ESPN DEBUT: The Huskies made their regular season debut on an ESPN affiliate this past weekend as the game on Oct. 28 was picked up by ESPN. The game feed was provided by SCSU's Husky Productions and Charter Cable Communications. This student-produced programming features the play-by-play voice of SCSU graduate Clay Matvick.
