## 2005-06 SCSU MEN'S HOCKEY NEWS

Release Date: Oct. 4, 2005

**A NEW SEASON AT SCSU:** The St. Cloud State men's hockey team will kick-off its 2005-06 season on Saturday, Oct. 8, with a 7:07 p.m. exhibition game against the University of Alberta. This will mark the first time that the Huskies have played Alberta. The Golden Bears will end a three-game road trip to Minnesota with the game against SCSU. On Oct. 6, Alberta plays at Minnesota and on Oct. 7, UA will play at Minnesota State, Mankato. The game will also mark the start of a new era at SCSU, as the Huskies will be led by coach Bob Motzko in 2005-06. He replaces longtime SCSU coach Craig Dahl, who stepped down prior to the start of the 2005-06 season.

**2004-05 RESULTS:** The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team ended its 2004-05 season with a 14-23-3 overall record and an 8-19-1 WCHA record. In the always rugged WCHA, the Huskies placed ninth in 2004-05.



**SCSU COACH BOB MOTZKO:** Motzko will become only the second coach at SCSU since the Huskies moved to the NCAA Division I level in 1987-88. Motzko played served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota from 2001-2005. A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1983-85. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl. Motzko went on to serve

as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1991, Motzko was named assistant coach at Miami University (Ohio). He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994. Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. He then joined the staff at Minnesota in 2001. A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

**ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF:** Coach Motzko will be assisted in 2005-06 by Fred Harbinson and Eric Rud. Harbinson begins his fourth season as a member of the SCSU coaching corps in 2005-06. Harbinson is a 1995 graduate of Wisconsin-Superior. Rud will begin his first season as an assistant at SCSU in 2005-06. A 1997 graduate of Colorado College, Rud served as an assistant at CC in 2004-05. Eric Bakke will serve as the team's video coordinator in 2005-06, and Jeff Kruger will work as the team's strength and conditioning coach.

**A PIONEER AT SCSU:** Former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl completed his 18th season with the Huskies in 2004-05. The first coach to lead SCSU into NCAA Division I hockey in 1987-88, Dahl helped establish one of the nation's top DI collegiate hockey programs at SCSU. Dahl's record at SCSU was 338-309-52, and his all-time collegiate coaching record was 414-396-54. Dahl served for one season as an assistant coach to Herb Brooks at SCSU in 1986-87, and prior to that he had head coaching assignments at UW-River Falls and Bethel College. Dahl is a 1976 graduate of Pacific Lutheran University. The WCHA coach of the year in 1998, Dahl led the Huskies to five NCAA tournament berths and the 2001 WCHA Final Five championship. Many of Dahl's former players have gone onto to play professional hockey at all levels, including current NHL standouts Bret Hedican, Mark Parrish, Matt Cullen, Ryan Malone, Tyler Arnason and Duvie Westcott.

**HUSKY HOCKEY ON THE AIR:** Once again in 2005-06, KNSI AM 1450 and KCML FM 99.59 will carry SCSU hockey live over the radio (and on the web at www.1450knsi.com). Don Lyons will call the play-by-play with color commentary provided by SCSU All-American Dave Reichel...select home and away games will also be broadcast live on KVSC 88.1. ## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**TEAM CAPTAINS:** Junior defender Casey Borer, a resident of Brooklyn Park, Minn., will serve as a team captain for the Huskies in 2005-06. The alternate captains for this winter are senior forward Konrad Reeder (Vanderhoof, B.C.) and senior forward Brock Hooton (Nanaimo, B.C.). Of note, the last time a junior served as a team captain for the Huskies was Jon Cullen in 2001-02.

**TOP DOGS:** Billy Hengen set a team-high in 2004-05 with five points in SCSU's win over Princeton on Oct. 29, 2004. SCSU had a player score two goals in a game 10 times last year season (which was a team-high). Dave Iannazzo scored two goals in four games (Minnesota on Feb. 25, MSU on Feb. 18, MTU on Nov. 13 and Yale on Oct. 30). Joe Jensen scored two goals in two games in 2004-05 (SHU on Jan. 28 and MTU on Nov. 13). Hengen was the team's leader for assists in a game with four against Princeton on Oct. 29. Jensen hit a team-high with eight shots in a game against UMD on Jan. 14 and Nov. 26. Tim Boron's top save effort as a sophomore was 42 vs. Boston College on Dec. 29. T.J. McElroy led SCSU with five penalties vs. UMD on Jan. 15. The five penalties for McElroy ties a team record for most penalties in a game by a defenseman. Ryan LaMere also had five penalties in SCSU's game vs. MSU on Oct. 26, 2001.

**A TOUGH DRAW:** The Huskies were certainly tested last year. In fact, SCSU played 23 of its 40 games this season against nationally ranked opponents. Included in that batch were a total of 16 games played against the four WCHA team playing in the 2005 Frozen Four (Minnesota, Colorado College, Denver and North Dakota). Out of the league, SCSU posted an impressive win over Ohio State and tied national power Maine (1-1 with a win in the shoot out) and a 2-1 double OT loss to Boston College (in a game that would have normally ended in a tie if it weren't for the OT format at the the Florida College Hockey Classic).

**AS SEEN ON TV:** A total of 17 SCSU home games will be seen live on Charter Communications Cable Television in the St. Cloud area during the 2005-06 season. The lone games that are not slated to be shown live on Charter Communication Cable Television in 2005-06 are the Alberta game on Oct. 8 and the Robert Morris game on Dec. 18. The remaining 17 home games are scheduled to be televised live. SCSU graduate and Twin Cities sports media personality Clay Matvick will provide the play-by-play this season, with fellow Husky graduate Ryan Dale providing the color commentary. The telecasts are completely produced live by SCSU's mass communications students under the guidance of Husky Productions faculty advisor Gregory Martin.

**WISE GUYS:** The Huskies placed a school-record 12 players on the All-WCHA Academic team in 2004-05. The previous high of 10 players was set in 2003-04. The list of honorees this season included Casey Borer, Tim Boron, Mike Doyle, Billy Hengen, Gary Houseman, Dave Iannazzo, Joe Jensen, T.J. McElroy, Nate Raduns, Konrad Reeder, Josh Singer, Peter Szabo.

## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**HUSKIES END SEASON AT CC:** St. Cloud State ended its 2004-05 season on March 11-12, with a pair of losses at the World Arena against #2 seed Colorado College. The Huskies entered the WCHA playoffs as the #9 seed, and lost on March 11 by an 8-2 margin against the Tigers. On March 12, the Huskies lost a tough 4-2 match against Colorado College. On the first night at CC, Nate Raduns scored in the first period and Billy Hengen added a goal in the second, but it wasn't enough to offset CC's scoring blitz - that included for goals in the first period. In total, CC posted 45 shots on goal and SCSU had 31 in the game. On the second night, the offense cooled a bit as the Huskies gained an early lead with a first period marker by Konrad Reeder. CC tied the score at 1-1, before SCSU gained a 2-1 lead going into the final period. CC charged back to gain the win with three goals in the final period. In the game, Tim Boron had 27 saves for the Huskies...of note, this marked the first time SCSU and CC had met in first round play in the WCHA tournament. SCSU is now 19-15-0 in first round action in the WCHA tournament and this was only the seventh time that SCSU had gone on the road for the first round of the WCHA tournament, which was won by Denver.

**THE LEADER BOARD:** Dave Iannazzo led the club in 2004-05 with 16 goals, 16 assists and 32 points...on the all-important plus/minus rankings, defender Chris Anderson proved to be a fast learner as he led the club with a +10...Joe Jensen ranked second on the squad with 12 goals and 26 points. Jensen, who was third on the team with 14 assists, also led the team this year with 130 shots on goal and three game winners (tied with Grant Clifton)...Justin Fletcher led the crew with six power play goals and also led the team with 39 penalties and 86 penalty minutes...Jensen, Gens and Nate Dey played in all 40 games for the Huskies this season...Tim Boron was SCSU's top netminder last year. He played in 1812:26 minutes and notched 855 saves. He also had a .904 save rate and a 3.01 goals against average...Fletcher was SCSU's top defensive scorer with 8g/14a for 22 points...Andrew Gordon brought home SCSU's freshmen scoring leader title with 9g/8a for 17 points...Iannazzo led the team with two SHGs last season.

**LOOKING AHEAD TO 2005-06:** SCSU will return three of its top four scorers - including Joe Jensen (12g/14a), Justin Fletcher (8g/14a) and Billy Hengen (7g/15a) in 2005-06. SCSU will also return six of its top 10 scorers from 2004-05. SCSU's junior class accounted for 73 points (31g/42a), while the Husky freshmen had 25g/40a and the sophomores had 20g and 43 assists. Both of SCSU's netminders from 2004-05 are here this winter, including Tim Boron, who had a .904 save percentage and a 3.00 GAA as a sophomore in 2004-05. Boron posted 855 saves this winter, which places him fifth in the team records for most saves in a season. Jason Montgomery was SCSU's second netminder in 2004-05 with a .886 save percentage and a 2.92 GAA. They will be joined by highly touted transfer Bobby Goepfert, who played his first two seasons at Providence. Of note, Goepfert played two games during his PC days at the National Hockey Center. In those games, SCSU posted a 2-1 and 5-3 win over the Friars in 2002-03.

**IN THE WCHA LAST YEAR:** Dave Iannazzo was 22nd in the league (WCHA games only) with 23 points. He also ranked 16th with 11 goals and 36th with 12 assists. Peter Szabo ranked 30th with 13 assists last year. Justin Fletcher ranked 17th with four power play goals this year and Iannazzo was tied for fourth in the loop with two SHGs to his credit and 10th with two GWG (along with Szabo and Grant Clifton). Fletcher ranked 10th among league defenders with 14 WCHA points and Matt Hartman was 17th among league freshmen with eight WCHA points...SCSU's penalty kill was ranked 7th in the league at .786.

**OTHER FACTS AND FIGURES OF INTEREST:** Did you know that Joe Jensen, a junior, has an excellent shot at joining SCSU's 100-point club in 2005-06. Jensen currently has 67 career points (30g/37a) this season and only needs 33 points next year to hit the century mark...SCSU's 109 goals scored in 2004-05 was the team's lowest goal output as a DI program. SCSU's trials on offense were offset by another superb season on defense. The Huskies allowed just 121 goals, which is SCSU's seventh best effort on defense since 1987-88. SCSU's 2.98 goals against average also ranks fifth best in the team's DI history...
