### 2004-05 SCSU MEN'S HOCKEY NEWS

**BACK HOME AGAIN:** The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team (4-3-1, 0-2-0 WCHA) will return home this weekend for a pair of WCHA showdowns against Michigan Tech University (1-6-1, 1-5-0 WCHA) on Friday, Nov. 12 and Saturday, Nov. 13. Game time both nights is slated for 7:07 p.m. in SCSU's National Hockey Center (5,763 cap.). Fans can listen to the game live on KNSI AM 1450/KCML 99.9 FM with Don Lyons calling the play-by-play. You can listen to the game on the Internet at [www.1450knsi.com](http://www.1450knsi.com). The games is also slated to be broadcast on KVSC FM 88.1 ([www.kvsc.org](http://www.kvsc.org)). The games will also be televised live on Charter Communications Channel 65 in the St. Cloud area with Doug Johnson and Roger Buxton calling the shots.

**2003-04 RESULTS:** The Huskies finished their season with an 18-16-4, 12-12-4 WCHA/6th place). This was the fifth consecutive season that SCSU has finished above the .500 mark.



**SCSU COACH CRAIG DAHL:** SCSU head coach Craig Dahl is in his 18th season with the Huskies, and has been the team's only head coach since SCSU moved to the DI level in 1987-88. Dahl's record at SCSU is 328-289-50, and his all-time collegiate coaching record is 404-376-52. He will begin his 24th year as a collegiate head coach in 2004-05. Dahl served for one season as an assistant coach to Herb Brooks at SCSU in 1986-87, and prior to that he had head coaching

assignments at UW-River Falls and Bethel College. Dahl is a 1976 graduate of Pacific Lutheran University.

**ASSISTANT COACHING STAFF:** Coach Dahl will be assisted in 2004-05 by Brad Willner and Fred Harbinson. Willner, a 1995 graduate of Lake Superior State, will begin his fifth season with the Huskies in 2004-05. Harbinson begins his third season as a member of the SCSU coaching corps in 2004-05. Harbinson is a 1995 graduate of Wisconsin-Superior.

## MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**OFFENSIVE POWER:** SCSU, which had struggled on offense during the opening weeks of the 2004-05 season, defeated Princeton University (0-1-0) by a 7-2 tally on Oct. 29. Andrew Gordon got the night going with a power play goal at 13:37 of the first period, as assists were credited to Billy Hengen and Joe Jensen. Mike Doyle gained his first point of the season when he scored at 17:16 on the power play with dishes provided by Dave Iannazzo and Justin Fletcher. Princeton made it 2-1 at :36 of the second, but SCSU rebounded quickly with another power play goal by Gordon at 1:40. At 2:11 of the second, Hengen found the back of the net with assists from Nate Raduns and Matt Hartman. For Hartman, a St. Cloud native, it was his first point as a Husky. SCSU's fourth power play goal of the night was provided by Aaron Brocklehurst at 4:07 of the second. For Brocklehurst, it was his first goal as a collegiate player. The Tigers came back with a goal at 4:26 of the second by Kevin Westgarth. The Huskies continued their offensive outburst at 13:09 of the second as Nate Raduns scored his first collegiate shorthanded goal. SCSU goalie Jason Montgomery was impressive in the nets with 16 saves...On Oct. 30, the Huskies posted a 10-0 win at Yale University. Grant Clifton opened the scoring with a power play goal at 6:56 of the first period. The SCSU scoring continued at 16:28 with a goal by Matt Gens on the power play. To complete the first period, Dave Iannazzo capitalized on a breakaway to post a shorthanded goal at 19:16. Iannazzo returned early in the second period to pad the lead with his second goal of the evening at 3:47. At 7:48 of second, Billy Hengen continued his hot weekend with SCSU's fifth goal. Hengen notched his eighth point of the weekend with his second goal of the night at 15:26 of the second. In the third period, Joe Jensen gained his first goal of the 2004-05 season at 10:00. Gordon then scored his sixth goal of the new season at 12:39 with a power play marker. To round out the attack, Hartman scored his first collegiate goal at 13:11 of the third period. Brock Hooton finished the game with his first goal of the season at 16:05 of the third. In the nets, Tim Boron collected his first career shutout. Boron made 26 saves in the game.

**BIGGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY:** The 10 goals vs. Yale are the most goals scored in a game by SCSU since an 11-3 win over Bemidji State in 2001-02, and the 10-goal margin is the largest margin of victory by SCSU against an NCAA Division I opponent in team history.

**PERFECT PENALTY KILL:** Wow, the Huskies were 14-of-14 on the penalty kill at Princeton and Yale. SCSU is now 64-of-68 on the penalty kill (.941), which is best in the country for teams with more than 25 penalty kill opportunities this season. Last year, SCSU's penalty kill rate was at .845.

### MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

**FIRST TIMERS GALORE:** In the game at Princeton, first collegiate goals were netted by Nate Dey and Aaron Brocklehurst, while Matt Hartman had his first collegiate assist against the Tigers. At Yale, Hartman scored his first college goal, while Brocklehurst added his first assist as a Husky. Tim Boron also posted his first collegiate shutout in the win at Yale with 26 saves.

**SCSU NOTES:** The 17 goals scored in the two consecutive games at Yale and Princeton ties a team record during the DI era for most goals scored in two consecutive games... after opening the season with a tough two-of-51 on the power-play, SCSU rebounded with a solid 7-of-15 rate on the power-play in the two games at Princeton and Yale...Mike Doyle, who has 75 career points at SCSU, snapped a six-game scoring drought this year with his first period power-play goal against Princeton...on the subject of offensive output, the 17 goals in the two games against Yale and Princeton comes after SCSU scored only 11 goals in its first six games of the season combined... freshman Andrew Gordon ranks second in the WCHA among rookies with 1.29 points per game (overall). His six goals this season are third best among league players (overall). After seven games, Gordon has six goals. In comparison, former SCSU player and current NHLer Mark Parrish had just four goals after his seventh college game. Other SCSU alum in the NHL and their first seven game goal totals at SCSU are Mark Hartigan (3), Matt Cullen (3), Ryan Malone (1) and Tyler Arnason (1). Of note, Cullen had 12 points (3g/9a) through his first seven college games and Parrish had 10 points (4g/6a). Gordon has nine points (6g/3a) this year after seven games.

**TEAM CAPTAINS:** Matt Gens and Dave Iannazzo have been selected as team co-captains for the 2004-05 season. The pair were named team captains during the week of Oct. 17-23.

**SOUTH FOR THE HOLIDAYS:** SCSU fans should make plans now to join the Huskies as they travel to sunny Florida for the Everblades Classic Tournament in Ft. Myers, Fla. on Dec. 28-29. The Huskies will play Maine in first round action, while Cornell and Boston College compete in the other first round showdown. **HUSKIES ON TV:** SCSU will have several of its home games this season televised live by Charter Communication Cable channel 65 in the St. Cloud area during 2004-05. **HUSKIES RANKED 7TH:** The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team gained a seventh place ranking in the 2004-05 WCHA pre-season poll conducted by the Grand Forks Herald. The Huskies gained 30 points in the poll, while UMD was the poll's top team with 79 points. The remaining teams in the poll included UND (66), Wisconsin (64), CC (61), Minnesota (51), Denver (45), MSU-Mankato (27), Michigan Tech (17) and UAA (10).
