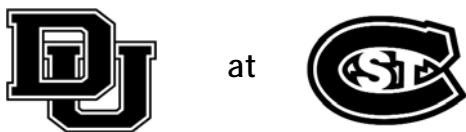

- Currently in his 18th season as head coach at DU and 26th overall in the collegiate ranks.
- Sports a 405-245-58 (.616) mark at DU and 555-369-79 (.594) career record.
- Became the 19th NCAA men's hockey coach to record 500 career victories with a 3-0 win at Minnesota on Oct. 24, 2009.
- Posted 400th career win at DU on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Led DU to back-to-back NCAA title in 2004 & 05.
- Only person to win NCAA title as player, assistant coach and head coach.
- Two-time Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year (1993 & 2005) and four-time WCHA Coach of Year (1995, 2002, 2005 & 2010).
- Led Denver to three WCHA regular-season championships (2002, 2005 & 2010).
- Led Denver to four WCHA playoff titles (1999, 2002, 2005 & 2008).
- Led Denver to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances (1995, 1997, 1999, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010 & 2011).

THIS WEEKEND'S STORYLINES

- Denver returns to the National Hockey Center for the first time since Nov. 15-16, 2008.
- The Pioneers and Huskies have split the last three series between the teams.
- SCSU head coach Bob Motzko and assistant coach Mike Gibbons have both served as assistant coaches at Denver. Motzko was an associate head coach at Denver from 1993-94, while Gibbons worked as an assistant at DU from 1990-94.

FOR OPENERS

- No. 13/14 Denver (7-6-3, 5-4-3 WCHA) ends its five-game road swing at St. Cloud State (6-8-4, 4-5-3 WCHA) for a two-game WCHA series on Fri.-Sat., Dec. 16-17.
- Denver is 4-3-1 against unranked opponents and 2-4-1 on the road.
- DU is tied for sixth with Michigan Tech in the WCHA with 13 points each, while St. Cloud State is ninth at 11 points.
- Sophomore Jason Zucker and junior Drew Shore lead DU in scoring with 23 points (10g, 13a) and 21 points (7g, 14a), respectively. Shore and Zucker led the Pioneers in scoring last season with 46 and 45 points, respectively.
- Zucker, who was named to the Team USA preliminary roster for the IIHF World Junior Championship has scored or assisted on six of Denver's last seven goals.

INJURY REPORT

Goaltender Adam Murray and defenseman John Ryder are out for the fourth straight weekend with lower-body injuries. Beau Bennett is expected to miss 6-8 weeks after successful wrist surgery on Dec. 8.

IN THE POLLS

The Pioneers are ranked No. 13 in the latest *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll and 14th in in the USCHO.com poll. The Pioneers have been ranked in the top 15 since Jan. 23, 2006. The Pioneers are predicted to finish first in the WCHA in the 41st annual *Grand Forks Herald's* preseason coaches poll and second annual 94X media poll.

LAST TIME OUT

Jordan George and Ben Kinne each had a goal and an assist to lead Bemidji State to a 2-1 win over Denver in WCHA action on Dec. 10. Freshman goaltender Andrew Walsh made 36 saves as the Beavers posted their first win against Denver in the all-time series. Freshman Daniel Doremus scored Denver's lone goal and freshman goaltender Juho Olkinuora stopped 22 shots in the loss for Denver. George put the Beavers on the board first with a power-play goal from Kinne and Brad Hunt at 3:26 of the first period. Bemidji State outshot the Pioneers, 9-6, and Andrew Walsh denied Nate Dewhurst on a breakaway. Kinne made it 2-0 with a goal from the low slot at 4:03 of the third. Doremus put the Pioneers on the scoreboard at 11:47 of the final period. Doremus buried a pass after a great individual effort by David Makowski. Nick Shore also assisted on the goal. DU owned the shot battle 37-24, including a 19-5 margin in the third period. DU went 0-for-6 on the power play and 2-for-3 on the penalty kill.

ABOUT THE 2011-12 PIONEERS

The Pioneers balanced offense is led by junior co-captain Drew Shore, sophomores Jason Zucker, Beau Bennett and Nick Shore, and freshman Joey LaLeggia. Zucker leads DU in goals (10), power-play goals (3), points (23), shots (71) and multi-point games (8). Drew Shore leads DU in assists (14), game-winning goals (3) and plus/minus rating (+8). Nick Shore has 14 points (4g, 10a) and Beau Bennett has added 13 points (4g, 9a). LaLeggia leads NCAA rookie blueliners in goals (6) and ranks second in points (11). Nick Shore is DU's top faceoff man at 55.4 percent. Freshman Juho Olkinuora (2-4-2, 2.16 GAA, .921 Sv%) has started the last five games in place of injured Adam Murray (5-2-1, 3.40 GAA, .902 Sv%), who is out indefinitely with a lower-body injury. Olkinuora stopped 38 shots for his first career win and shutout in DU's 3-0 win over Princeton on Nov. 25 and made 21 saves in a 3-2 win at Bemidji State on Dec. 10. Injured sophomore goaltender Sam Brittain is expected to return to action in mid-January. Brittain earned All-WCHA Rookie Team honors last season by leading DU with a 19-9-5 record, 2.28 goals against average and .921 save percentage. Fifth-year senior John Ryder leads DU with 70 hits and Makowski has blocked a team-leading 23 shots.

SPECIAL TEAMS

DU ranks 12th in the WCHA on the power play at 16.9 percent (12-for-71) and seventh on the penalty kill at 79.7 percent (63-for-75). DU went 0-for-8 with the man-advantage last weekend at Bemidji State and has scored on the power play in seven of 16 games. The Pioneers went 4-for-5 on the penalty kill at Bemidji State, but opponents have scored on the power play in 12 of 16 games. Shawn Ostrow and Joey LaLeggia have scored shorthanded goals for the Pioneers.

TEAM NOTES

DU has outscored its opponents, 26-18, in the second period. The Pioneers are 0-1-3 in overtime games.

THE BENNETT FACTOR

Denver has averaged 4.4 goals per game with Beau Bennett in the lineup and only 1.8 gpg in six games without him. The Pioneers are 1-3-2 without their star forward.

LAST TIME VS. ST. CLOUD STATE

Denver charted a 3-2 loss and 3-2 win against St. Cloud State on March 4-5, 2011 at Magness Arena. Mike Lee stopped 32 shots and Aaron Marvin scored the game-winner for the Huskies on March 4. Sam Brittain made 33 saves and Kyle Ostrow tallied his 100th career point as Denver clinched the No. 2 seed in the WCHA Playoffs during Senior Night on March 5.

ALL-TIME VS. ST. CLOUD STATE

DU is 38-32-4 all-time against St. Cloud State in the series that dates back to 1988. Denver returns to the National Hockey Center for the first time since Nov. 15-16, 2008. DU is 18-12-2 against the Huskies at National Hockey Center, including a 3-3 mark in the last six contests. The Pioneers and Huskies have split the last three series between the teams. The Pioneers are 3-2 in their last five games against St. Cloud State and 5-5 in the last 10.

SCOUTING ST. CLOUD STATE

The St. Cloud State Huskies are 6-8-4 overall and 4-5-3 WCHA entering the series against Denver. The Huskies were idle last week and are winless in their last five games at 0-3-2. The Huskies earned just one point against Nebraska Omaha (Nov. 26-27) and Bemidji State (Dec. 2-3). St. Cloud State is led in points and goals by junior forward Ben Hanowski (12-8=20). Forwards Travis Novak (5-9=14) and Cam Reid (5-9=14) have added 14 points each. The Huskies have been playing in front of freshman Ryan Faragher (4-6-3, 3.05 GAA, .902 Sv%) as starter Mike Lee is out for the season with an injury. Head coach Bob Motzko is in his seventh season at the helm for the Huskies and sports a 126-100-33 record. St. Cloud State ranks 11th in the WCHA on the power play at 17.2% (11-for-64) and 11th on the penalty kill at 74.3% (52-for-70).

SCORING BY CLASS

The Denver sophomore class, led by Jason Zucker (10-13=23), Nick Shore (4-10=14), Beau Bennett (4-9=13), David Makowski (2-7=9) and Jarrod Mermis (3-2=5) leads DU in point scoring with 64 points on 23 goals and 41 assists. The sophomores have accounted for 43.5 percent of DU's point scoring and 41.8 percent of goal scoring after 16 games.

CAREER SCORING LEADERS

Denver boasts three players with 65 or more career points. Drew Shore leads the way with 86 points (34g, 50a) in 97 career games, while Jason Zucker has 68 points (33g, 35a) in 56 career games and Luke Salazar has 65 points (36g, 29a) in 113 career games.

DUAL LEADERSHIP FOR DU IN 2011-12

Redshirt senior Dustin Jackson and junior Drew Shore are co-captaining the Pioneers in 2011-12. Jackson and Drew Shore are the first DU co-captains since Matt Carle and Gabe Gauthier in 2005-06. Senior defenseman John Lee and junior blueliner Paul Phillips are serving as alternate captains. Jackson enters his fifth season with program after missing the 2009-10 season with a broken leg.

ZUCKER SELECTED WCHA PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY THE MEDIA

Sophomore Jason Zucker was selected as the WCHA Preseason Player of the Year by the media in the 94X poll. Zucker claimed WCHA Rookie of the Year honors last season after finishing second in WCHA goals (20) and third in points (36). Zucker ranked second in the nation in rookie scoring at 1.12 points per game.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON?

Denver freshman forward Ty Loney is the son of former NHLer and two-time Stanley Cup Champion Troy Loney. Troy Loney played in the NHL for 12 seasons, spending 10 with Pittsburgh, one with Anaheim and a half-season each with the New York Islanders and the New York Rangers. Troy Loney won back-to-back Stanley Cups with Pittsburgh in 1991 and 1992. He registered 197 points on 87 goals and 110 assists in 624 career NHL games.

ROOKIE CLASS LOADED WITH TALENT

Defensemen Scott Mayfield, Josiah Didier and Joey LaLeggia, and forwards Zac Larraza, Daniel Doremus and Ty Loney headline the 2011-12 DU freshmen class. Mayfield is a physical two-way defenseman and 2011 NHL second round draft pick of the New York Islanders. Didier is a hard-nosed blueliner and 2011 NHL fourth round draft selection of Montreal. LaLeggia led all BCHL defensemen in scoring the past two seasons, while Larraza was a standout member of the U.S. National Development Team Program. Doremus tallied 35 points for Sioux Falls of the United

CARLE RETURNS FOR FOURTH SEASON

Senior David Carle returns for his fourth and final season as student assistant coach. Carle was forced to retire from competitive hockey prior to the 2008 NHL Entry Draft and his freshman season at DU after being diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM). The disease is a thickening of the myocardium, which is the leading cause of sudden cardiac death in young athletes. Carle has made an impact with the Pioneers, helping the team to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments and 78 wins. He served as video coordinator for the gold-medal Team USA Under-17 Team at the 2011 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament in Ann Arbor, Mich.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH

The 2011-12 DU roster sports eight Coloradans. Josiah Didier (Littleton), Daniel Doremus (Aspen), Chris Knowlton (Colorado Springs), John Ryder (Colorado Springs), Luke Salazar (Thornton), Drew Shore (Denver), Nick Shore (Denver) and Matt Tabrum (Colorado Springs) all hail from the Centennial State.

NHL DRAFT PICKS

The Pioneers boast 10 NHL Draft picks on this year's roster. Beau Bennett (1st round/Pittsburgh), Scott Mayfield (2nd/N.Y. Islanders), Drew Shore (2nd/Florida), Jason Zucker (2nd/Minnesota), Nick Shore (3rd/Los Angeles), Sam Brittain (4th/Florida), Josiah Didier (4th/Montreal), John Lee (5th/Florida), Paul Phillips (7th/Chicago) and Zac Larraza (7th/Phoenix) have all been selected by NHL clubs. Student assistant coach David Carle was also selected in the seventh round in the 2008 NHL Entry Draft by Tampa Bay. DU ranks third in the WCHA in current NHL Draft picks behind Minnesota (17) and North Dakota (15).

BAND OF BROTHERS

Denver has two sets of brothers for the second consecutive season. Beau and Wade Bennett join Drew and Nick Shore as DU brother tandems in 2011-12. The Bennett's are the seventh pair of brothers to play hockey on the same team at Denver, joining David and Evan Wylie (1951-53), Jim and Wayne Wiste (1966-67), Tom and Jim Peluso (1972), Ken and Dave Berry (1981), Kyle and Shawn Ostrow (2009-11) and Drew and Nick Shore (2010-12).

MORE BROTHERLY LOVE

Senior defenseman John Lee is the younger brother of former North Dakota and current Ottawa Senators defenseman Brian Lee. Student assistant coach David Carle is the younger brother of former Pioneer and current Philadelphia Flyers defenseman Matt Carle.

FUTURE FAMILY MATTERS

Forward Quentin Shore (Denver, Colo.), and defensemen Nolan Zajac (Winnipeg, Manitoba) and Dakota Mermis (Alton, Ill.) have inked National Letters of Intent to play for the Pioneers beginning in 2012-13. All three players have family ties to the Pioneer program. Shore is the younger brother of current Pioneers Drew and Nick Shore and Mermis is the younger brother of DU sophomore Jarrod Mermis. Zajac is the son of former Pioneer Tom Zajac, who played at DU from 1973-76. Shore has tallied six points (4g, 2a), including two game-winning goals in 22 games for the U.S. Under-18 Team in 2011-12. Zajac has a combined eight points (2g, 6a) in 20 games for Cedar Rapids and Omaha of the United States Hockey League in 2011-12. Mermis has six points (3g, 3a) in 18
