TOURNEY TIME

The #2 seed Huskies (19-15-5, 12-12-4 WCHA) will open play in the 2008 NCAA Division I East Regional in Albany, NY on Friday, March 28, with a 3 p.m. (CT) game against the #3 seed Clarkson University (21-12-4). The winner of this play-in game will advance to the finals of the regional against the winner of the #1 seed Michigan (31-5-4, 20-4-4 CCHA) and #4 seed Niagara (22-10-4, 12-6-2 CHA) game at 6:30 p.m. (CT) on March 28. The final game will be played at 6 p.m. (CT) on March 29. All games will be played at the Times-Union Arena in Albany, N.Y. The SCSU games will be broadcast live on KCML FM 99.9 (www.lite999.com) and KVSC FM 88.1 (www.kvsc.org). All games at the Final Five will be televised on Fox Sports North (channel 28 on Charter Cable in the St. Cloud area).

HUSKY HEADLINERS:

▲ SCSU will be making its seventh trip to the NCAA tournament in 2008. This also marks the second consecutive NCAA bid for the Huskies, and sixth bid since 2000. SCSU has advanced to the NCAA tournament in 1989, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2007 and 2008.

▲ The Huskies played at Clarkson on Nov. 23-24, 2007 and split a weekend series in Potsdam by scores of (W) 4-1 and (L) 3-2. SCSU is 5-3-0 in the all-time series against CU.

▲ Ryan Lasch is the third SCSU player named as a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 finalist. The WCHA scoring champion in 2007-08, Lasch currently has 25g/28a for 53 points.

2007-08 RECORD: SCSU currently owns a 19-15-5, 12-12-4 WCHA record in 2007-08.

MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

LAST YEAR

The Huskies (22-11-7) placed second in the always rugged Western Collegiate Hockey Association (14-7-7 WCHA), which equals the team's best-ever finish in the regular season standings of the WCHA since SCSU joined the league in 1990-91. SCSU advanced to the 2007 WCHA Final Five for the second consecutive season (10th time in team history), thanks to first round playoff wins over Minnesota Duluth (SCSU won the series 2-1). To complete the season, the Huskies gained their first NCAA Division I tournament bid since 2003. This marked the sixth NCAA bid for the Huskies since 1989. SCSU lost in first round play at the 2007 NCAA East Regional by a score of 4-1 against Maine in Rochester, N.Y. The Huskies were the #2 seed at the Regional tournament.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Senior defender Matt Stephenson, a resident of Midland, Ontario, has been named as the Huskies' captain for 2007-08. Senior forward Nate Dey (Maplewood, Minn.), junior forward Michael Olson (Tisdale, Sask.) and sophomore defender Garrett Raboin (Detroit Lakes) have all been selected as team alternate captains for the 2007-08 season.

POLL POSITION

SCSU were ranked 8th in the latest USCHO.com poll and 8th in the latest USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll. The number 7/8 rank on March 17, was the highest ranking this season for the Huskies. This marks the seventh consecutive week that SCSU was ranked in the top 20...prior to Oct. 22, 2007, SCSU had gained a spot in the college hockey top 20 polls for 36 consecutive weeks...the Huskies ended the 2006-07 season ranked 7th in the final USCHO.com poll and 8th in the final USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll. ...of note, the #2 ranking (on 2/28/07) equals the best ranking the Huskies hit last season...in the WCHA pre-season poll, the Huskies received a sixth place ranking for 2007-08.

NCAA PLAYOFF NOTES

The St. Cloud State men's hockey team will be making its second consecutive trip to the NCAA Division I tournament in 2008. This will mark the seventh time the Huskies have been selected for NCAA tournament play, with the Huskies owning as 0-7 record in tournament play since 1989...in 2007, the Huskies traveled to the East Regional in Rochester, N.Y., where they lost a 4-1 decision against Maine...this will mark the second trip to Albany, N.Y. for the Huskies. In 2000, SCSU advanced to the East Regional in Albany and lost a 5-3 match against Boston University...SCSU has qualified for NCAA tournament play six times since 2000, with the team's other NCAA bid coming in 1989...this will mark Coach Bob Motzko's second NCAA tournament with the Huskies, and the second in his college coaching career.

SCSU vs. CLARKSON

This will mark the first time that SCSU has played Clarkson in the NCAA tournament...SCSU and Clarkson are no strangers as the two programs have played each other four times over the past two seasons. In 2006-07, the Huskies charted a 4-0 and 7-2 series sweep against the Golden Knights at the NHC in St. Cloud. In 2007-08, the Huskies gained a 4-1 win and a 3-2 loss against Clarkson in Potsdam, N.Y...in the all-time series, SCSU owns a 5-3-0 lead, which dates back to a 5-4 loss at Clarkson on Oct. 24, 1987...SCSU netminder Jase Weslosky's first collegiate shutout was a 4-0 win over Clarkson on Nov. 17, 2006 at the NHC. He made 24 saves in that game.

NATIONAL LEADERS

Garrett Roe ranks second in the nation for NCAA Division I rookies with 44 points this season...Jase Weslosky ranks sixth in the nation with a save rate of .931 this season...Ryan Lasch's 13 power play goals this season rank fourth in the nation, and Andreas Nodl's 11 power play goals rank seventh this season...Lasch ranks eighth in the nation with 25 goals this season...SCSU is the third least penalized team in the nation this season with a low total of 10.9 PIM per game...SCSU's power play rate of 23.2% ranks fourth among DI squads this winter, and its penalty kill rate of 87.1% ranks eighth in the nation.

The Last Time Out...

March 20: Minnesota 3, SCSU 2 - WCHA Final Five

The St. Cloud State Huskies lost a 3-2 decision against Minnesota on March 20, in the play-in game of the 2008 WCHA Final Five. The game was played before 19,232 fans at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn. This total was a new tournament record for fans at the Thursday play-in game.

The Gophers scored their first goal :25 into the game, and then grabbed the game winner with just :13 left in the game to gain the 3-2 victory. In between, SCSU's Garrett Raboin and Tony Mosey each had goals in the first and third periods.

UM gained its 1-0 lead at :25, with a goal by Tony Lucia as assists were added by Evan Kaufmann and Derek Peltier. At 7:33 of the first period, the Huskies tied the score at 1-1 with a power play goal by Garrett Raboin. Ryan Lasch and Aaron Brocklehurst each had assists on the play. This was Raboin's first career power play goal for the Huskies.

In the second period, UM moved the score to 2-1 with a power play marker by Kaufmann at 4:35. Blake Wheeler and Cade Fairchild each had assists on the play.

In the final period, Tony Mosey scored his fifth goal of the season with a sterling pass from Lasch at 15:34. The other assist was added by Raboin. In the closing minute of play, Mike Howe scored at 19:47 for the Gophers, as Derek Peltier and David Fisher had assists.

In the game, SCSU was 1-of-7 on the power play and UM was 1-of-5. Jase Weslosky made 26 saves in the game and Alex Kangas had 25 saves for the Gophers.

This snapped a seven-game unbeaten streak by the Huskies against the Gophers, and it was the first time since Oct. 29, 2005, that the Huskies had lost a game to the Gophers. Of note, this was SCSU's third consecutive trip to the WCHA Final Five.



MORE NEWS AND NOTES...

HOBEY CANDIDATE

Ryan Lasch continues to lead the team in scoring with 53 points in 2007-08. He ranks sixth in the nation at 1.36 ppg, and he is third in the nation with 53 points (25g/29a)...Lasch was recently selected as the third Hobey Baker top 10 finalist from SCSU. He joins other SCSU Hobey finalists Mark Hartigan (2002) and Bobby Goepfert (2007).

WCHA HONORS

Ryan Lasch (first team), Andreas Nodl (second team) and Garrett Roe (second team) were all named for All-WCHA honors in 2008. This marks Nodl's second year as a All-WCHA selection, as he was named to the All-WCHA third team in 2007. Roe was named to the All-WCHA Rookie team in 2008, and Lasch was named the league's scoring champion this winter with 34 points (17g/17a)...Lasch currently owns a nine-game point streak headed into the NCAA regional..SCSU players named to the All-WCHA Academic team this season were Matt Stephenson, Aaron Brocklehurst, Marty Mjelleli, Garrett Raboin, Jon Ammerman, Ryan Lasch, John Swanson and Brent Borgen. WCHA Scholar-Athletes this year were Raboin, Ammerman and Borgen.

WESLOSKY NEARS THE RECORD

Goalie Jase Weslosky currently owns a 2.12 GAA and a .931 save rate. The current team record for GAA in a season is 2.20, which was set by Bobby Goepfert in 2005-06. The current team for save percentage in a season is .926, which was set by Scott Meyer in 2000-01...the Huskies have allowed 92 goals this season. The current team record for fewest goals allowed in a season is 94, which was set in 2000-01...the Huskies have only allowed 18 power play goals this season. The current team record for power play goals allowed in a season is 26 in 1999-00.

RECORDS ALREADY IN THE BOOKS

Senior Nate Dey has now played in a team record 158 games during his career at SCSU. He broke the old record of 156 games set by Geno Parrish from 1996-00. Of note, Parrish is the older brother of NHLer Mark Parrish (Minnesota), who played at SCSU from 1995-97...Ryan Lasch has five game winning goals this season, which ties the team's season record for most GWGs.

A FEW MORE NOTES

In two seasons at SCSU, Ryan Lasch and Andreas Nodl have combined for 182 points. Lasch's two-year total of 92 points is one shy of the team record for best start in a career. Team career scoring leader Jeff Saterdalen had 93 points in his first two years as a Husky in 1988-89 and 1989-90. Saterdalen finished his career with 179 points at SCSU... the Huskies advanced to the recent WCHA Final Five with a pair of wins over Wisconsin in first round play. In the WCHA Final Five play-in game on March 20, the Huskies lost a 3-2 decision to Minnesota before 19,232 fans at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul. The game set a new attendance record for the Thursday game at the Final Five. In the game, Garrett Raboin and Tony Mosey scored for the Huskies while Raboin and Lasch each had two points in the game...the goal for Mosey snapped a 12-game goal scoring drought, as his last goal was scored on Jan. 25 at Minnesota State...the goal for Raboin was his second career goal at SCSU, and his first power play goal as a Husky.

THE OTHER TEAMS

The other two teams in the East Regional this season include #1 nationally ranked and top region seed Michigan - the CCHA champs of 2008 and #4 region seed and 19th ranked Niagara - the CHA champs of 2008...the winner of the games on March 28 will advance to play in the region title game on March 29 in Albany. The winner of the regional will advance to play in the NCAA Frozen Four on April 10-12 in Denver, Colo...SCSU has never played Niagara University in men's hockey...SCSU is 0-2-0 in games played against Michigan. The Huskies lost first round NCAA regional games against the Wolverines in 2001 (4-3) at Grand Rapids, Mich., and they also lost a 4-2 decision against Michigan in 2002, at the regional in Ann Arbor, Mich. This will mark the first time SCSU plays the Wolverines outside of the state of Michigan. Kevin Porter leads the Wolverines with 56 points this season (28g/28a), while Vince Rocco leads Niagara with 45 points (14g/31a).

The Motzko Story

Bob Motzko will begin his third season as head coach with the Huskies in 2007-08. The 2006 and 2007 WCHA Coach of the Year, Motzko has guided the Huskies to two consecutive WCHA Final Five appearances, a second place regular season finish in the WCHA in 2007 and a berth in the 2007 NCAA Division I tournament. In three seasons with the Huskies, Motzko has charted an impressive 63-42-16 overall record and has seen the Huskies ranked among the nation's top 20 teams for more than 41 weeks (including a #7/8 national ranking in the final 2006-07 college polls) during his tenure at SCSU.

In 2006-07, Motzko led the Huskies to a 22-11-7 overall record and a second place record of 14-7-7 in the always rugged WCHA. SCSU advanced to the WCHA Final Five in 2007, and also gained the team's first NCAA bid since 2003. In 2007, Motzko saw SCSU standout Bobby Gopfert named a Hobey Baker Award top 10 finalist. SCSU freshman forward Andreas Nodl was named the 2007 HCA Division I Rookie of the Year and the 2007 WCHA Rookie of the Year. SCSU players have already gained All-America honors twice during Motzko's tenure.

In 2005-06, the Huskies earned a 22-16-4 overall record and a 13-13-2 WCHA record in 2005-06. SCSU ranked 14th in the final national college polls in 2005-06, and the Huskies also advanced to the title game of the 2006 WCHA Final Five - marking SCSU's first trip to the Final Five since 2001-02.

A former SCSU hockey player and graduate of St. Cloud State, Motzko served as a men's hockey assistant coach at the University of Minnesota since 2001. He was part of two NCAA Division I national championship teams in 2002 and 2003, and helped the Gophers win WCHA playoff crowns in 2003 and 2004. His four recruiting classes at Minnesota were considered among the best in the nation, and Motzko helped produce one Hobey Baker Award winner, three first team All-Americans, two second team All-Americans and many All-WCHA honorees at Minnesota.

A 1987 graduate of St. Cloud State University, Motzko was a two-year varsity letterwinner for the SCSU hockey team from 1984-86. Motzko began his coaching career in 1986-87 as an assistant coach for the legendary Herb Brooks at SCSU - and also worked with former SCSU head coach Craig Dahl.

Motzko went on to serve as general manager and head coach of the USHL's North Iowa Huskies from 1987 through 1991. In 1989, Motzko led the North Iowa squad to a United States Junior A national championship and was named that year's USHL Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Motzko was named associate head coach at Miami University (Ohio), where he helped lead the RedHawks to a Central Collegiate Hockey Association title and an NCAA tournament berth in 1992-93. He served for one season as an associate head coach at the University of Denver from 1993-94, before returning to Miami University in 1994.

Motzko was named general manager and head coach of the USHL's Sioux Falls Stampede in 1998. He led the Stampede to a 77-31-6 record in the team's first two seasons in the USHL, and in 2000, Motzko was named the USHL General Manager of the Year. At Sioux Falls, 26 players moved on to college programs around the United States including SCSU standouts Mike Doyle, Joe Jensen and Dave Iannazzo.

A native of Austin, Minn., Motzko and his wife Shelley are the parents of three children. They currently reside in St. Cloud, Minn.

MOTZKO'S STAFF: Motzko will be assisted this winter by third-year coach Eric Rud and first-year coach Mike Gibbons. and first-year volunteer goalie coach Justin Johnson. SCSU's support staff features 13-year veteran equipment manager Jeremiah Minkel, three-year veteran athletic trainer Bryan DeMaine, strength and fitness coordinator Travis Zins and director of hockey operations Mr. Matt Chapman.
